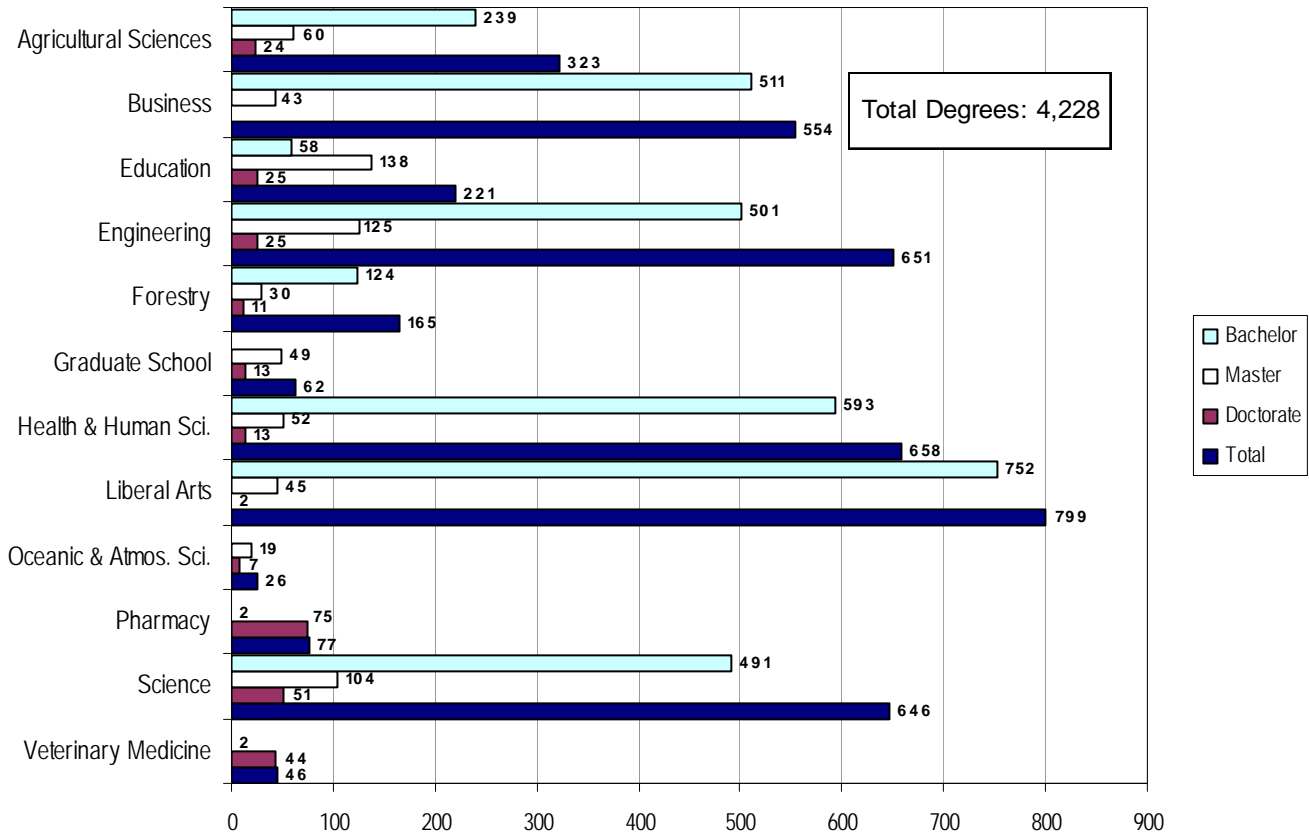

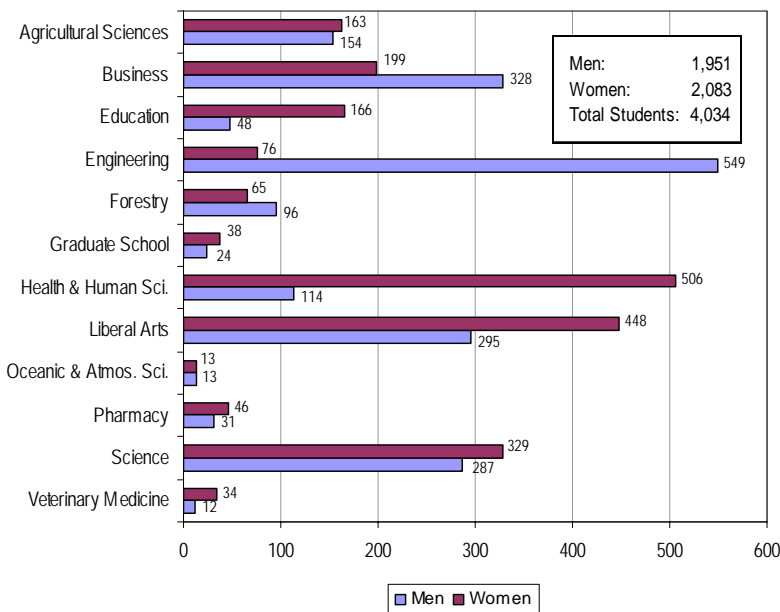
Degrees Conferred by Academic Unit and Degree Type



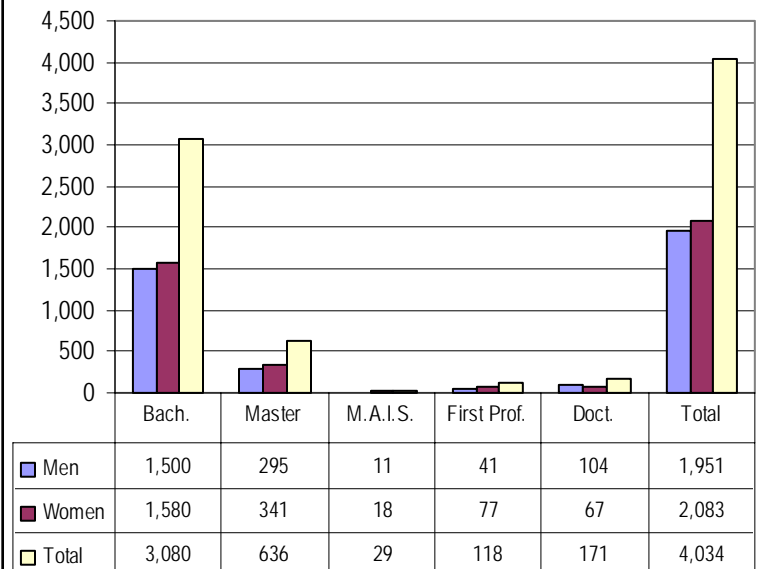

By Academic Unit and Gender



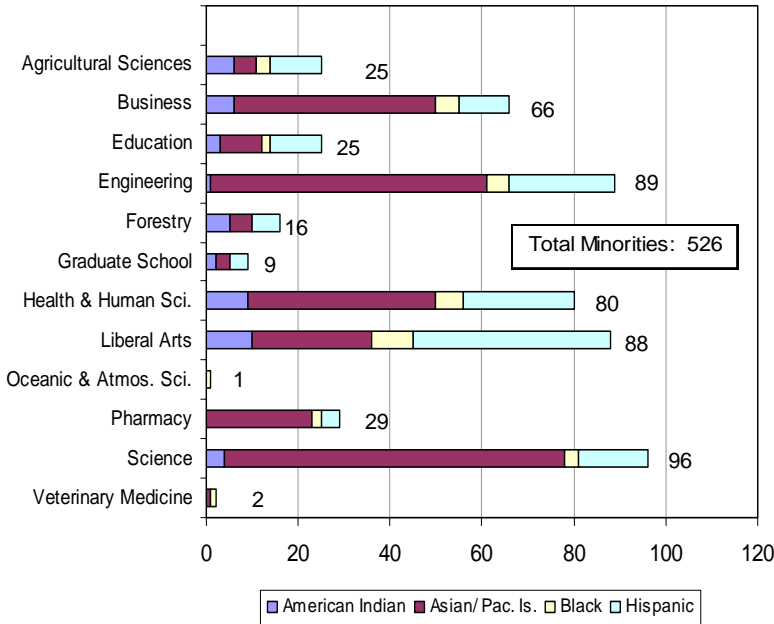
By Gender and Degree Type



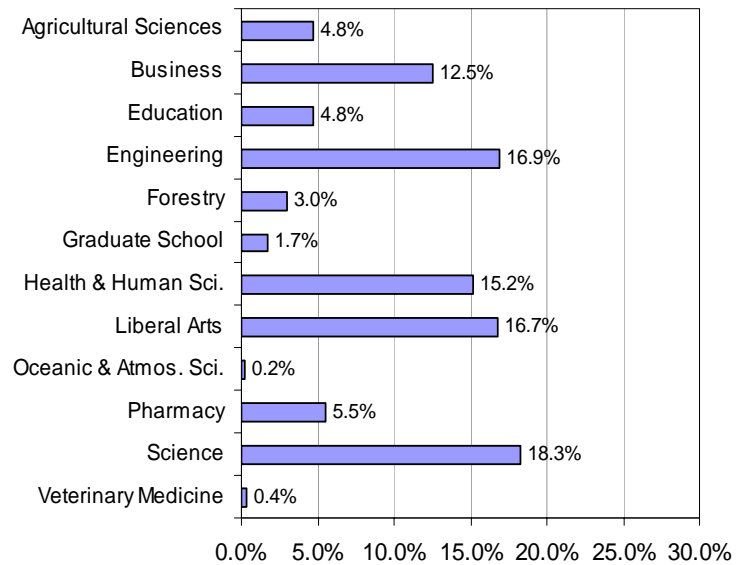

Percentage of Total U.S. Minority Graduates



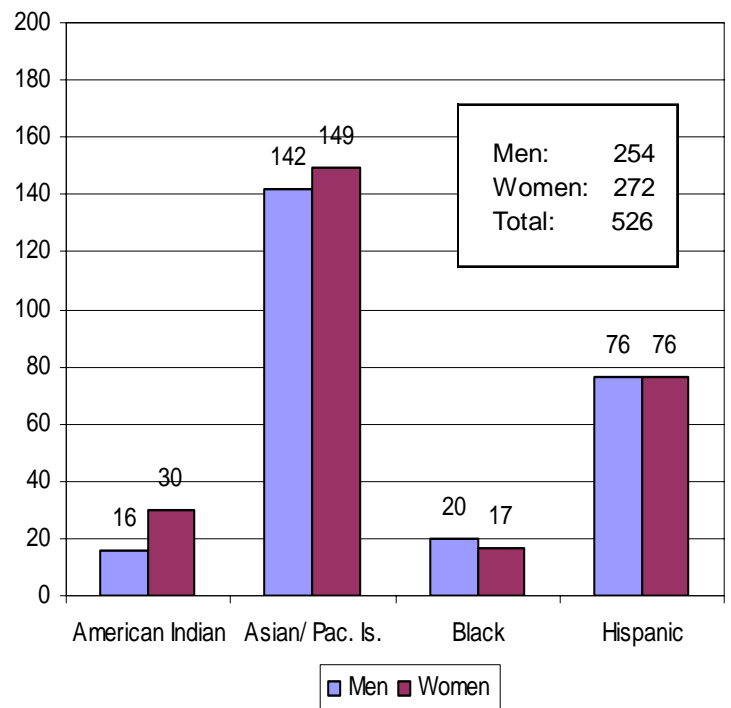

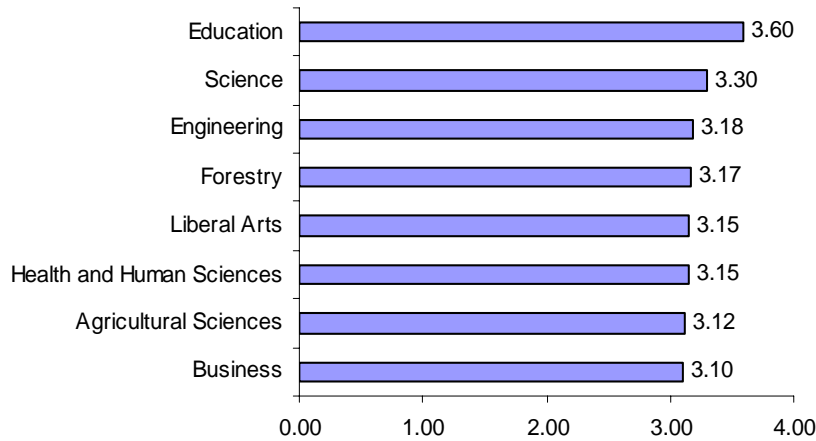

Grade Point Average of Graduates

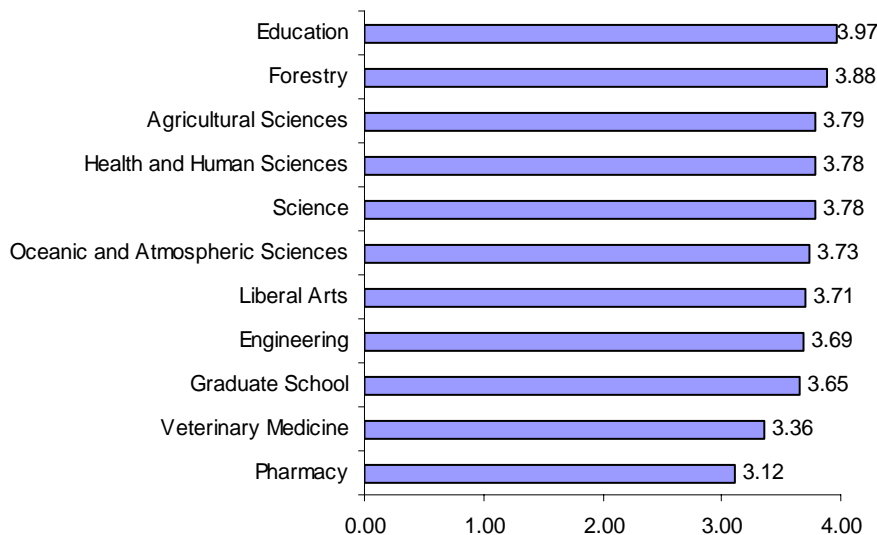

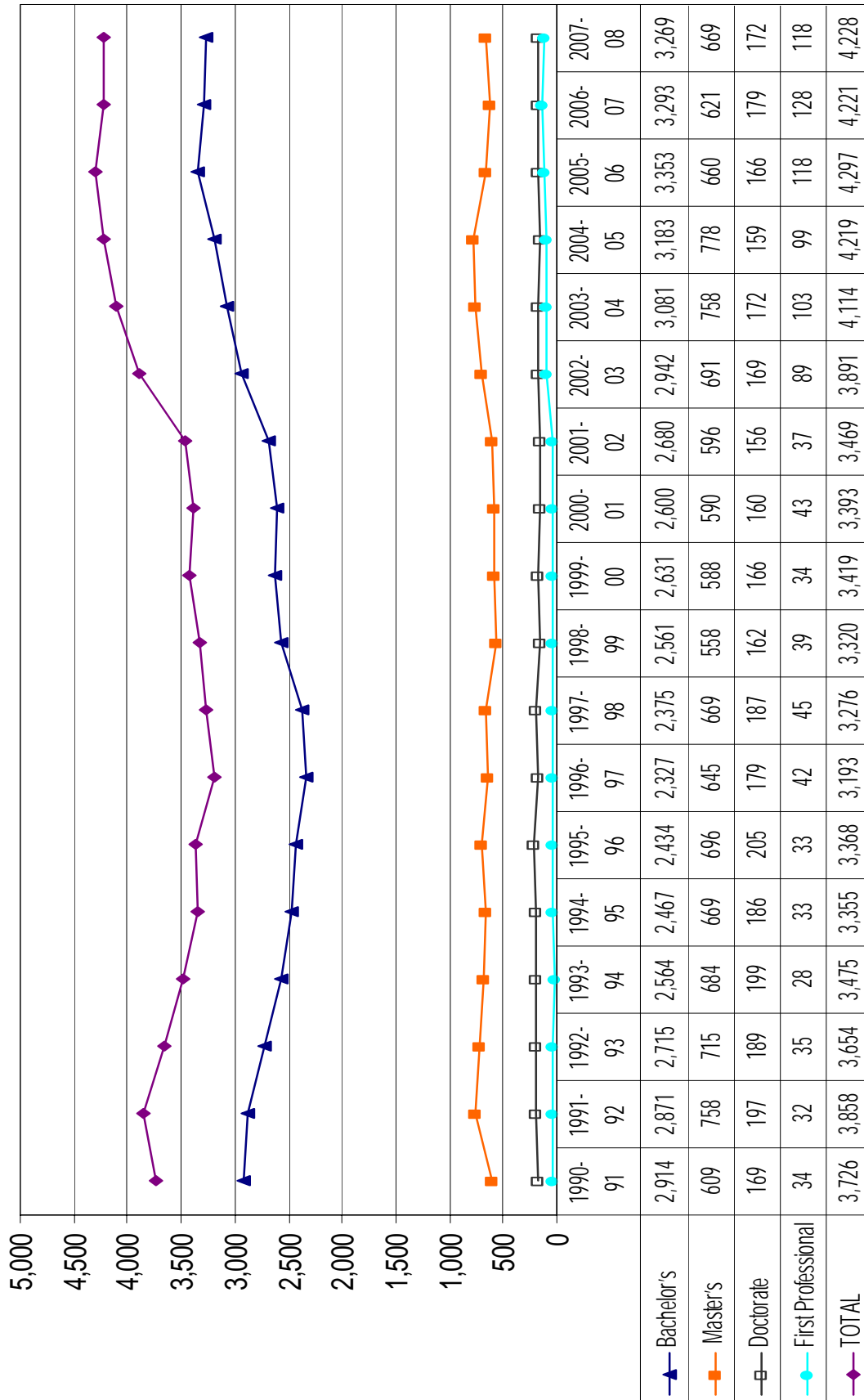

Highlights

- The number of degrees awarded during the 2007-08 academic year was 4,228. In all, OSU has awarded 195,717 degrees through 139th annual commencements.
- Compared to 2006-07, the total number of degrees awarded increased by .2%. The number of Bachelor degrees decreased by .7%; First Professional degrees decreased by 7.8%; Master's degrees increased by 7.7%; and Doctoral degrees decreased by 3.9%.
- 1 student received five degrees; 1 student received four degrees; 7 students received three degrees; and 173 students received two degrees.
- The College of Liberal Arts awarded the largest number of degrees (799) when compared to the other academic units.
- The average age for Bachelor, Master, M.A.I.S, First Professional, and Doctorate degree recipients was 25.0, 30.6, 30.0, 29.6, and 36.2, respectively.
- The College of Science had the largest percentage of U.S. minority graduates: 18.3%.
- The number of U.S. minority graduates was 526 or 12% of all graduates in 2007-08. More U.S. minority women (272) than men (254) earned degrees in 2007-08 at OSU.
- 82.1% of the graduates were Oregon residents; 17.9% of the graduates were non-residents.
- The grade point average (GPA) for students receiving Bachelor, Master, M.A.I.S, First Professional, and Doctorate degrees was 3.17, 3.73, 3.87, 3.20, and 3.79, respectively.
