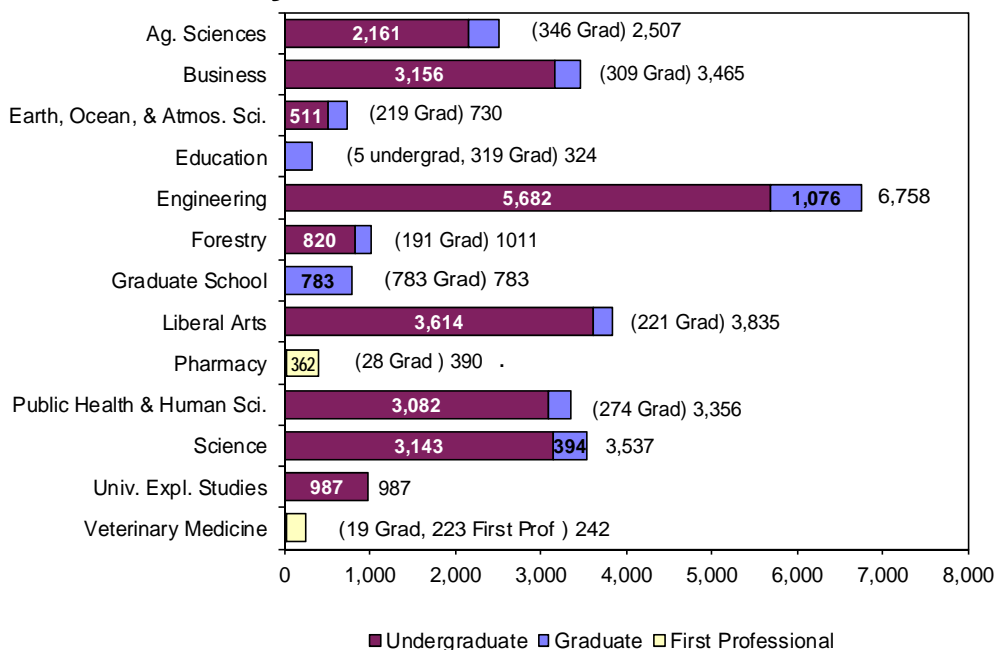

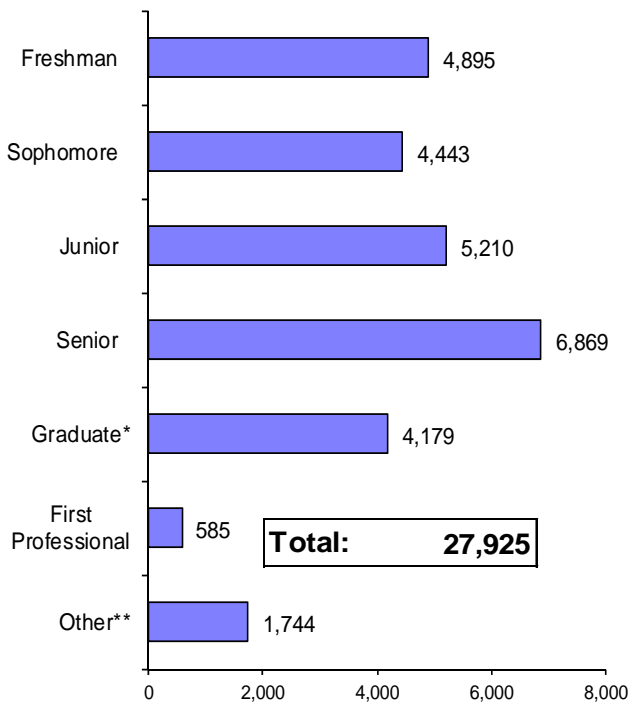

## Headcount Enrollment by Class Standing



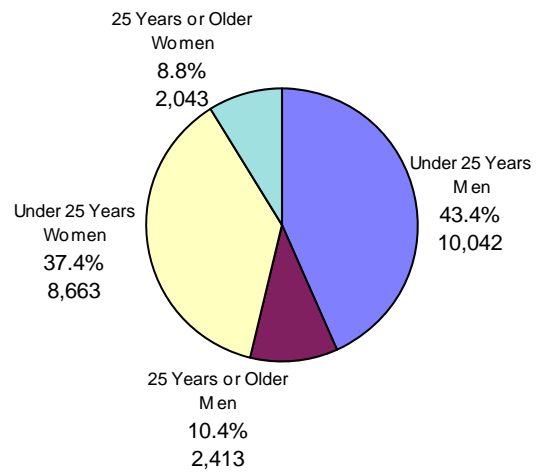

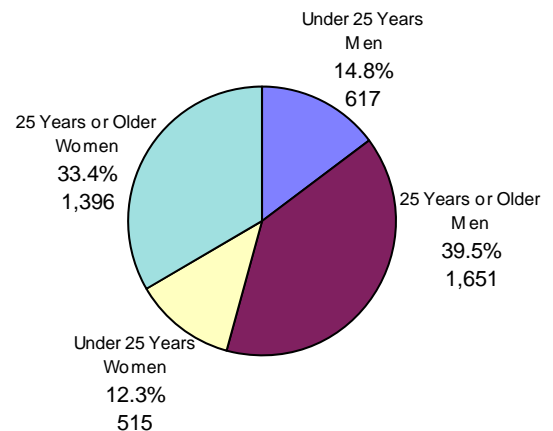

## Enrollment by Gender and Student Level

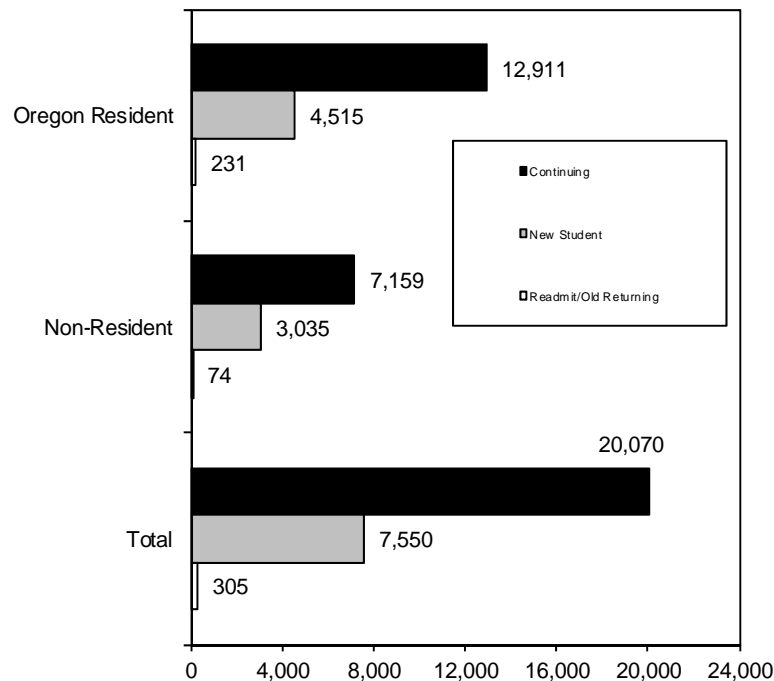

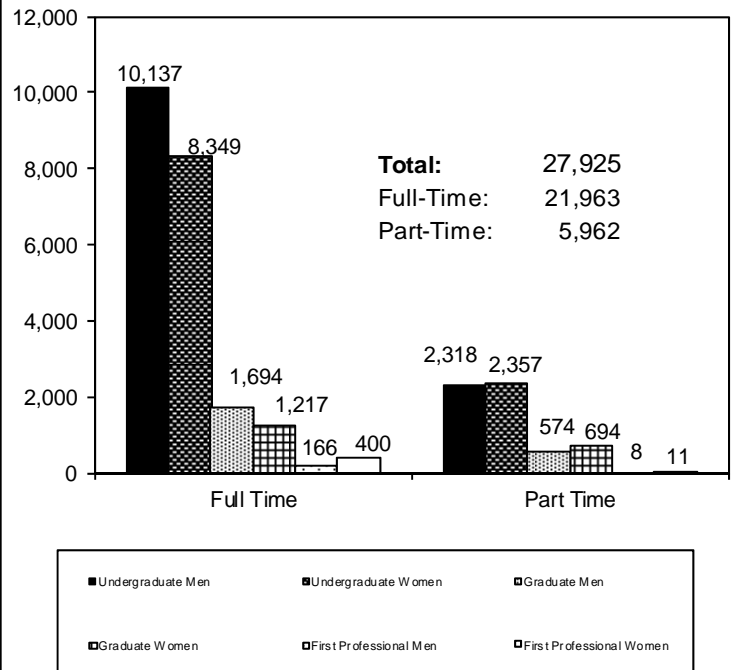

## Student Enrollment Full Time and Part Time, by Gender



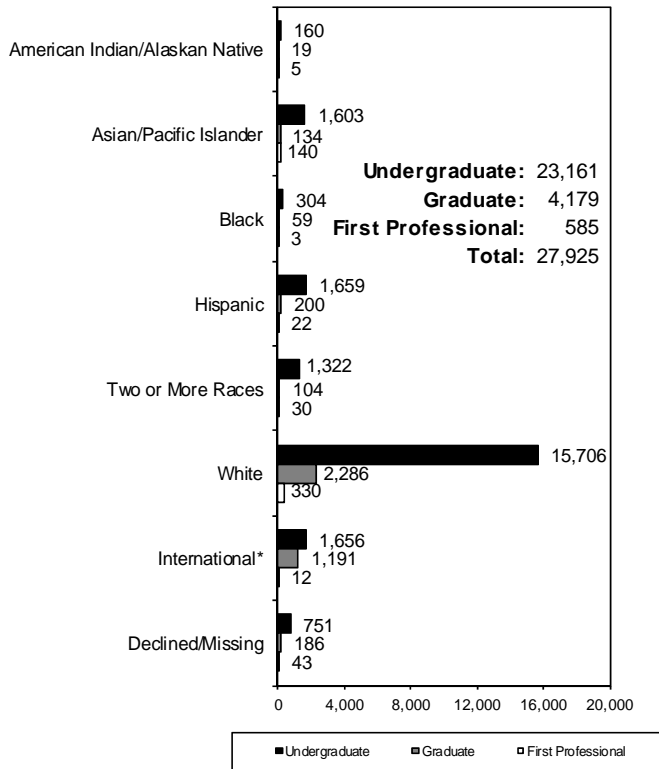

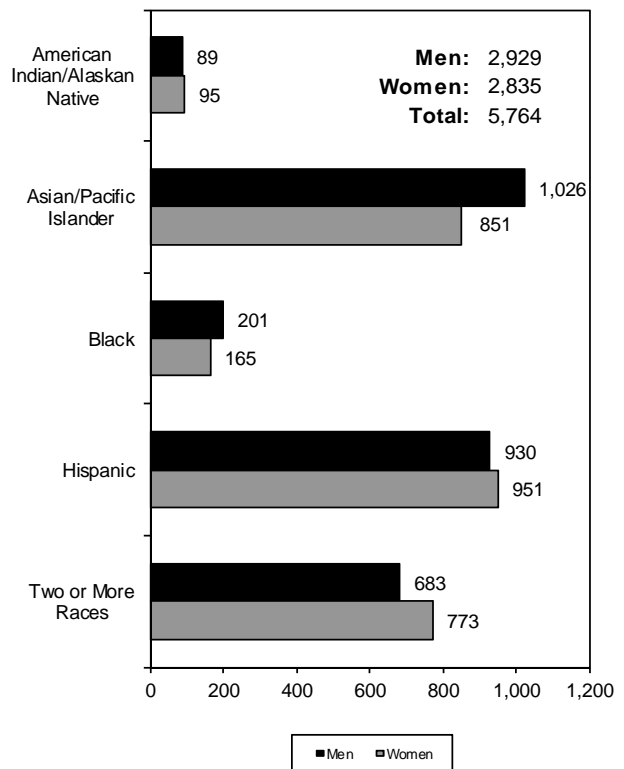

### Ethnicity — All Students — by Level

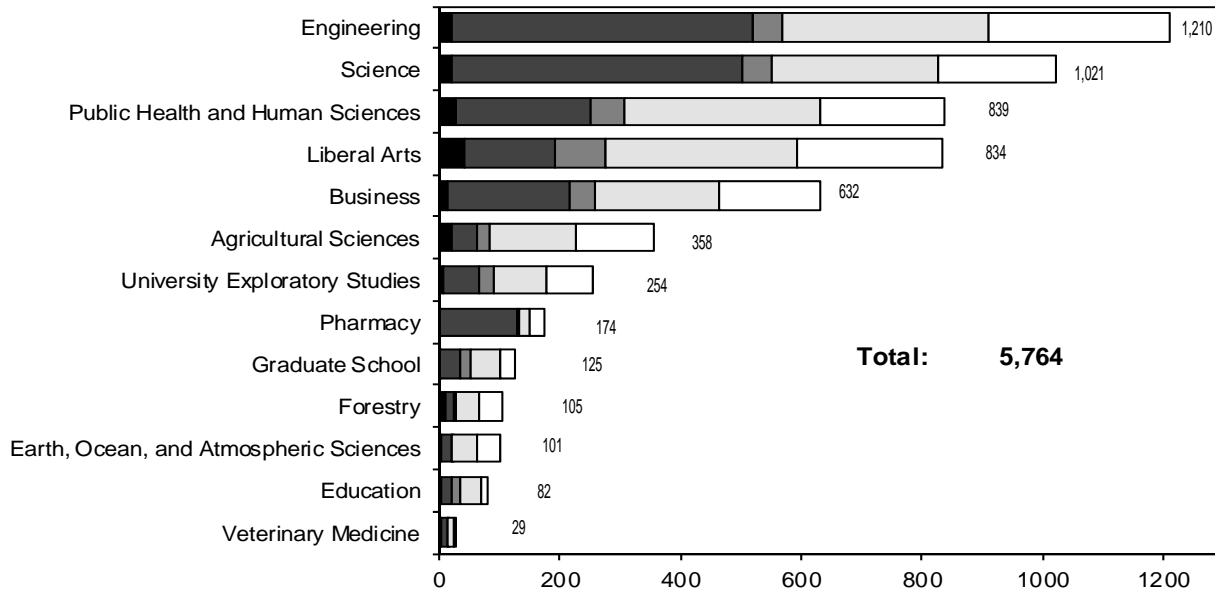


### U.S. Minorities by Gender

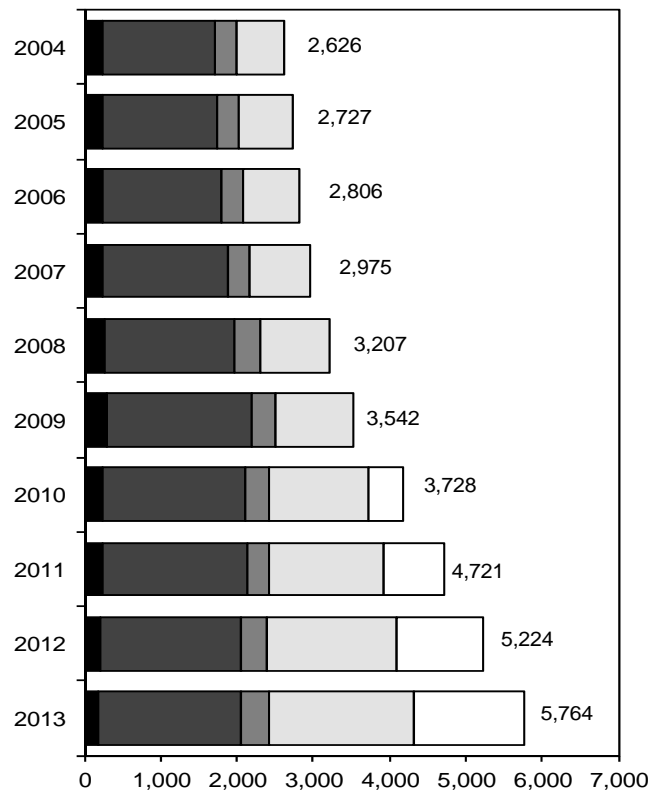

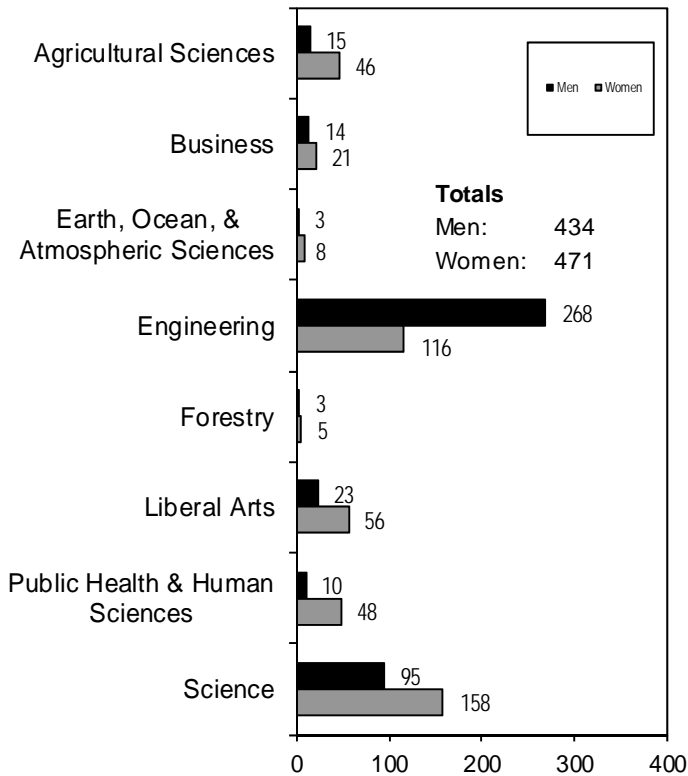

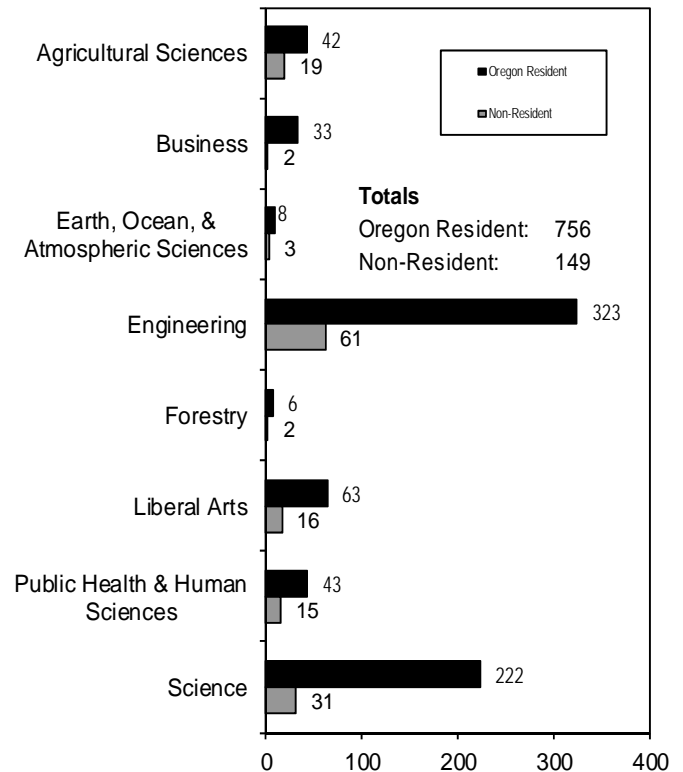

## Highlights

- For Fall 2013, total enrollment was 27,925 students.
- When Fall 2012 and Fall 2013 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 1,532 students or 5.8% (from 26,393 to 27,925), the FTE increased by 4.2%, and the Student Credit Hours increased by 4.3%.
- The number of part-time students increased by 12.3% (from 5,307 to 5,962).
- When compared to Fall 2012, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 1,349 students, or 6.2% (from 21,812 to 23,161); the graduate enrollment increased by 4.7% (from 3,993 to 4,179); the first professional enrollment decreased by 0.5% (from 588 to 585).
- When compared to Fall 2012, Oregon residents increased by 1.0%; non-resident increased by 15.3%; and international student enrollment increased by 21.0%.
- University Honors College had an enrollment of 905.
- INTO OSU had a total enrollment of 1,294: 536 in Academic English program, 71 INTO OSU General Pathways, 270 INTO OSU Graduate Pathways, and 141 in OSU-Student-Cap, and 276 in Undergraduate Pathway program.
- The College of Engineering had the largest student enrollment (6,758) when compared to the other academic units.
- OSU Extended Campus had 7,763 students, an increase of 15.0% compared to 2012. These students took 39,353 credits, of which 35.5% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 16.1% were from the College of Agricultural Sciences.
- The percentage of U.S. minority students was 20.6% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 10.3% when compared to Fall 2012 (from 5,224 to 5,764).
