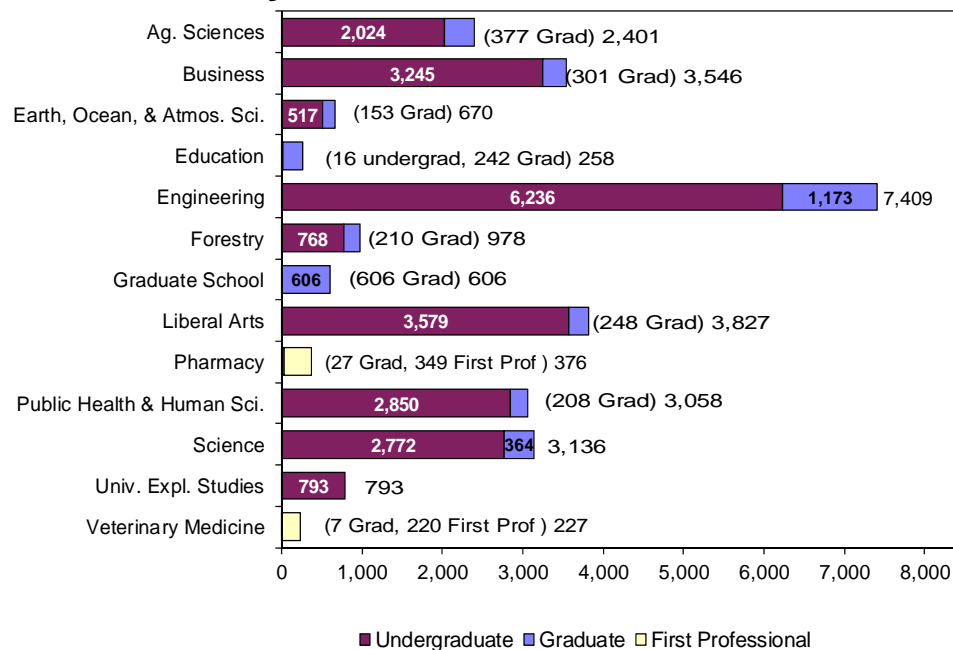

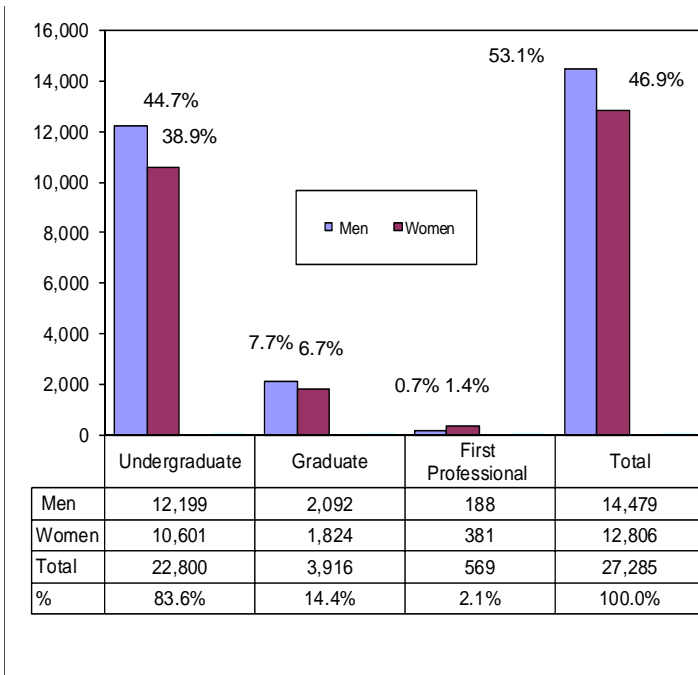

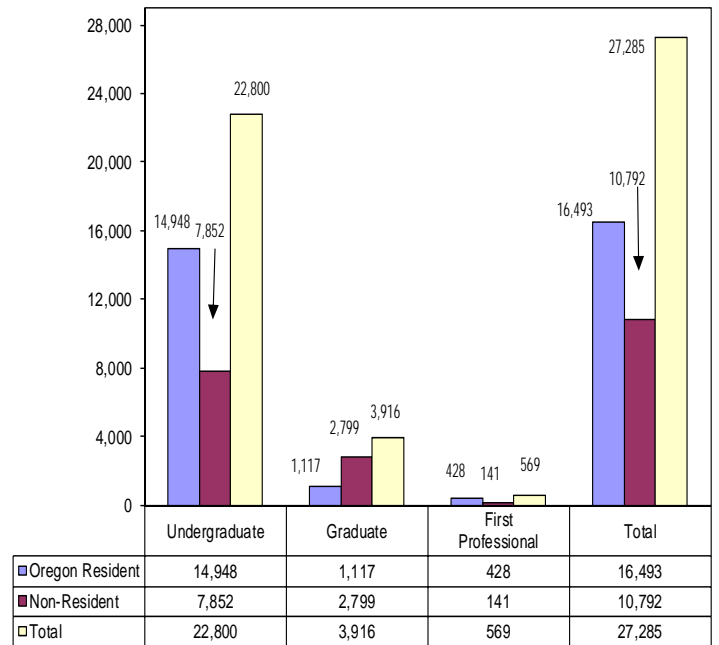

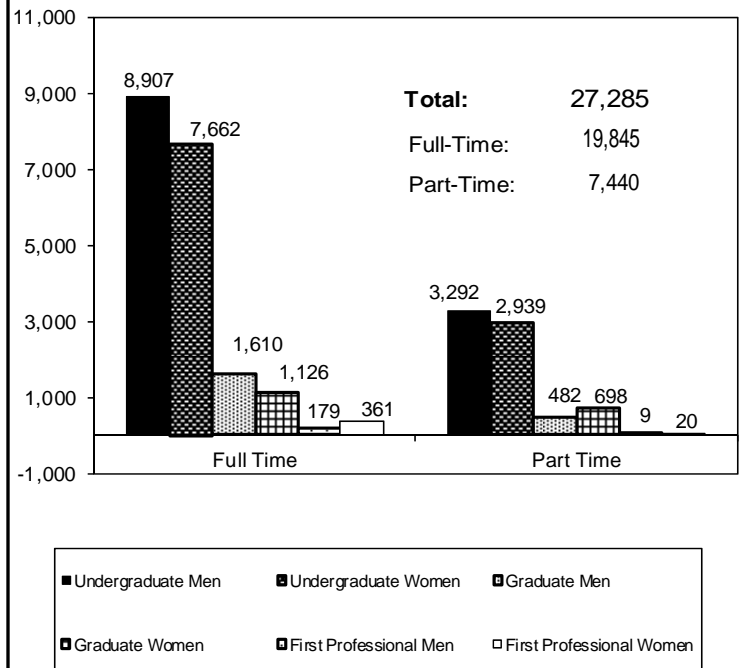

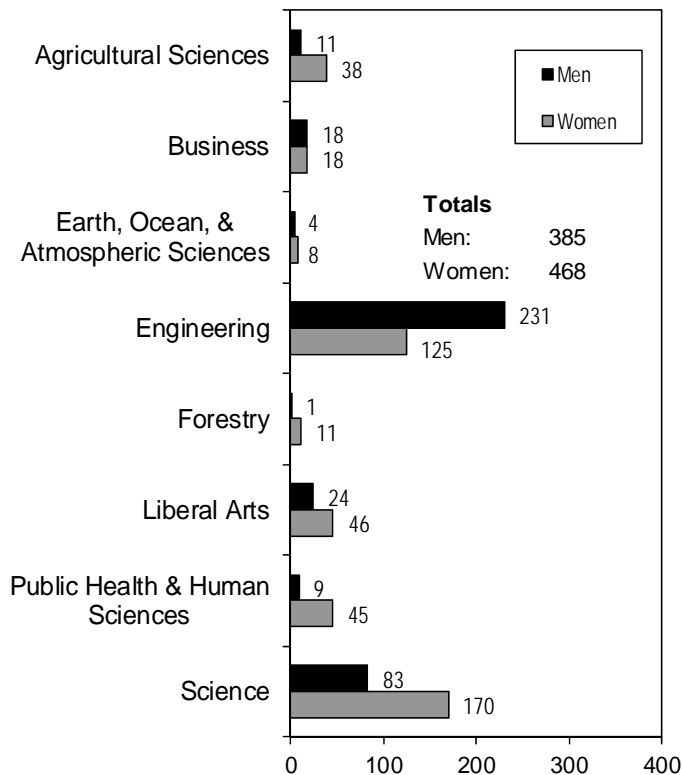

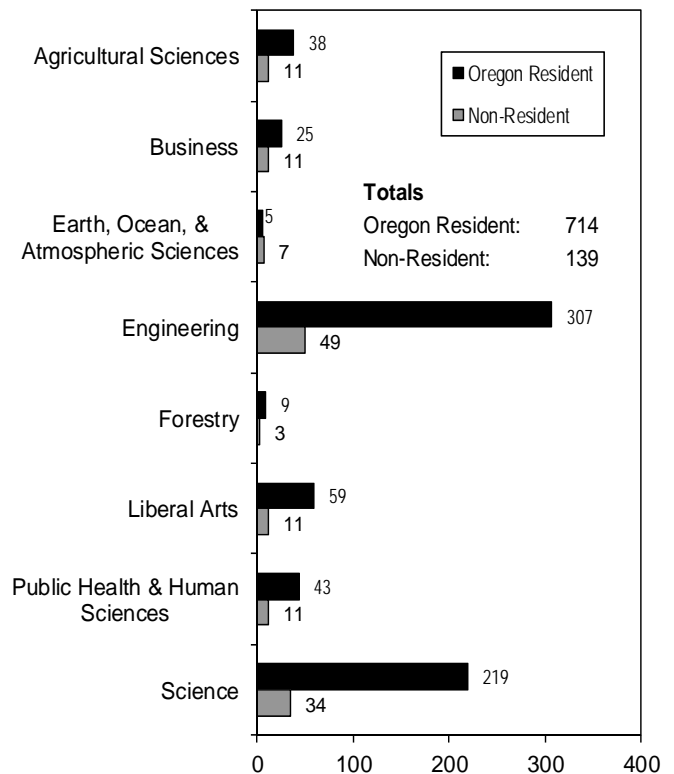

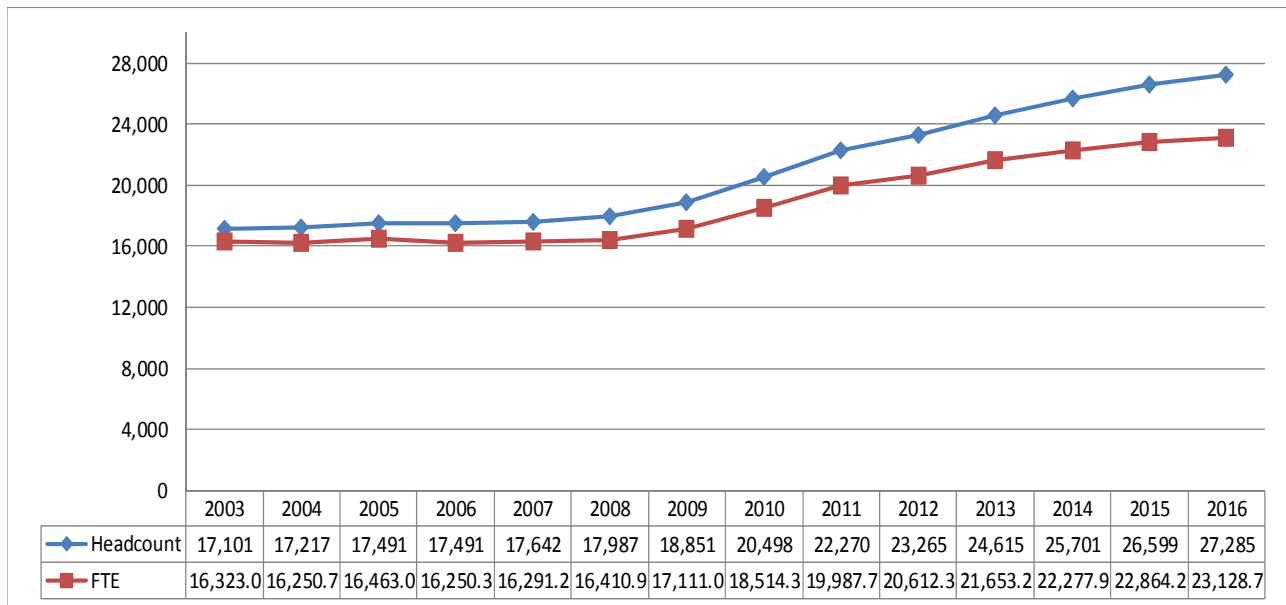

## Highlights

- When Spring 2015 and Spring 2016 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 686 students, or 2.6% (from 26,599 to 27,285). At the same time, the total student FTE increased by 264.5, or 1.2% (from 22,864.2 to 23,128.7), and the student credit hours increased by 3,882, or 1.2% (from 323,442 to 327,324).
- When compared to Spring 2015, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 749 students, or 3.4% (from 22,051 to 22,800); the graduate enrollment decreased by 1.7% (from 3,985 to 3,916); the first professional enrollment increased by 1.1% (from 563 to 569).
- When compared to Spring 2015, Oregon residents increased by 1.2%; non-residents increased by 4.7%.
- International student enrollment increased by 3.1%.
- For Spring 2016, the percentage of U.S. minority students was 23.1% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 7.5% when compared to Spring 2015 (from 5,861 to 6,303).
- The College of Engineering, College of Liberal Arts, and College of Business had the largest student enrollments (7,409, 3,827, and 3,546 respectively) when compared to the other academic units.

- OSU Extended Campus had 10,943 students, an increase of 10.4% compared to Spring 2015. These students took 58,608 credits, of which 31.0% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 17.6% were from the College of Engineering.
- During Spring 2016, a total of 1,119 students received services from OSU Cascades Campus.
- Other increases that occurred when comparing Spring 2015 and Spring 2016 are as follows:
  - Part-time students: 9.7%
  - Undergraduate students age 25 and older: 6.9%
  - Female students: 2.9%
  - Undergraduate students under age 25: 2.5%
  - Male students: 2.3%
  - First Professional students 25 and older: 1.1%
  - First Professional students under age 25: 1.1%
  - Graduate students age 25 and older: 0.2%
  - Full-time students: 0.1%
- Other decreases that occurred when comparing Spring 2015 and
  - Graduate students under age 25: -8.2%
