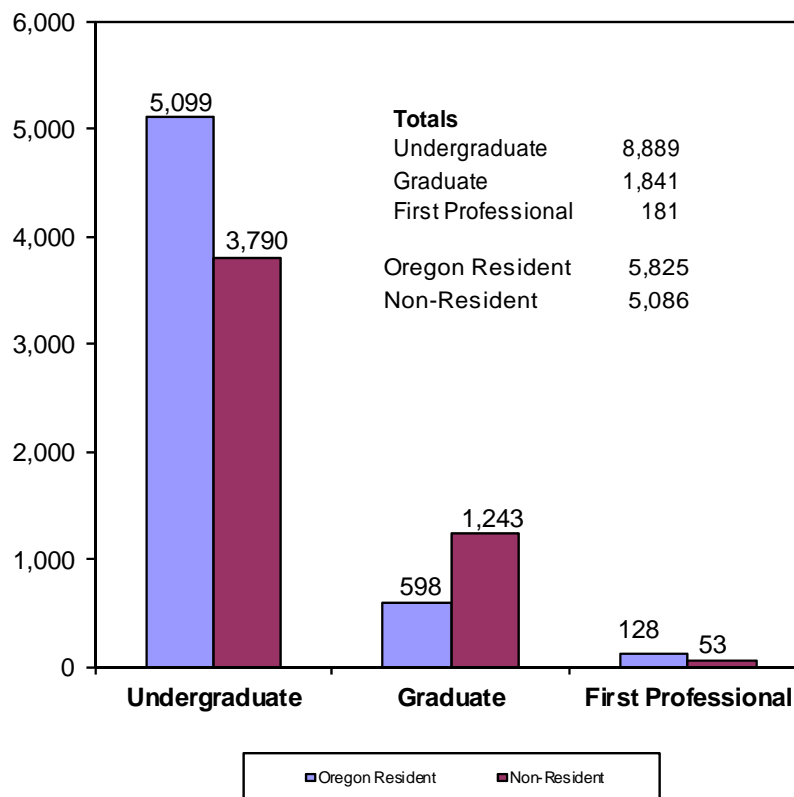

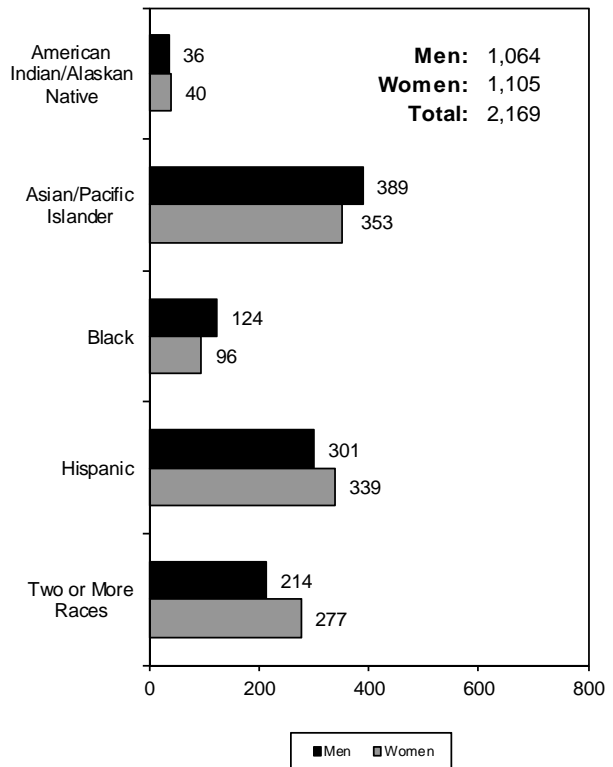

U.S. Minorities by Gender

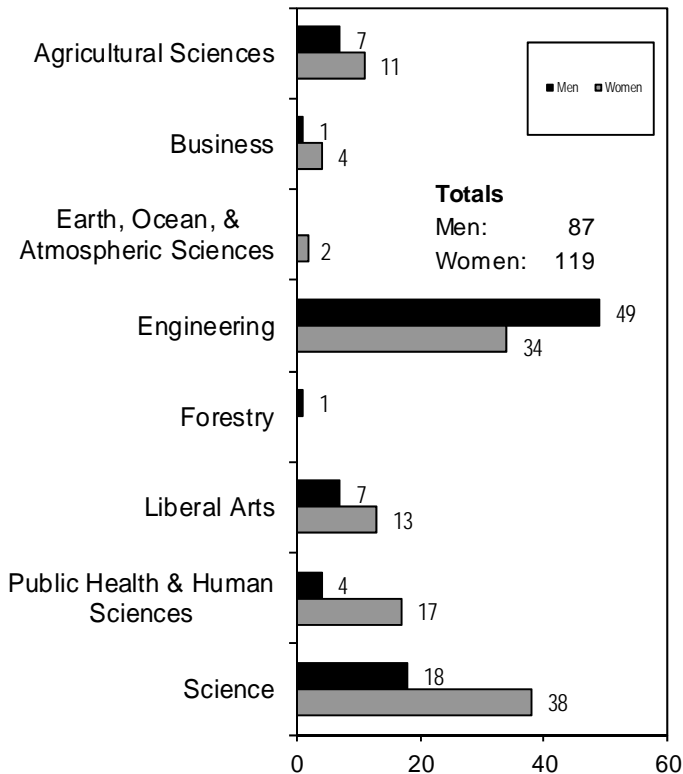

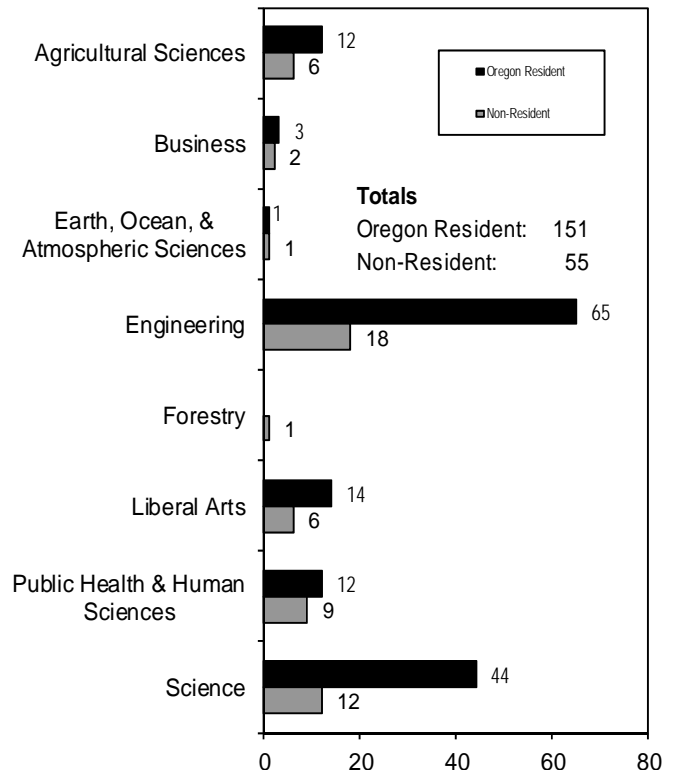

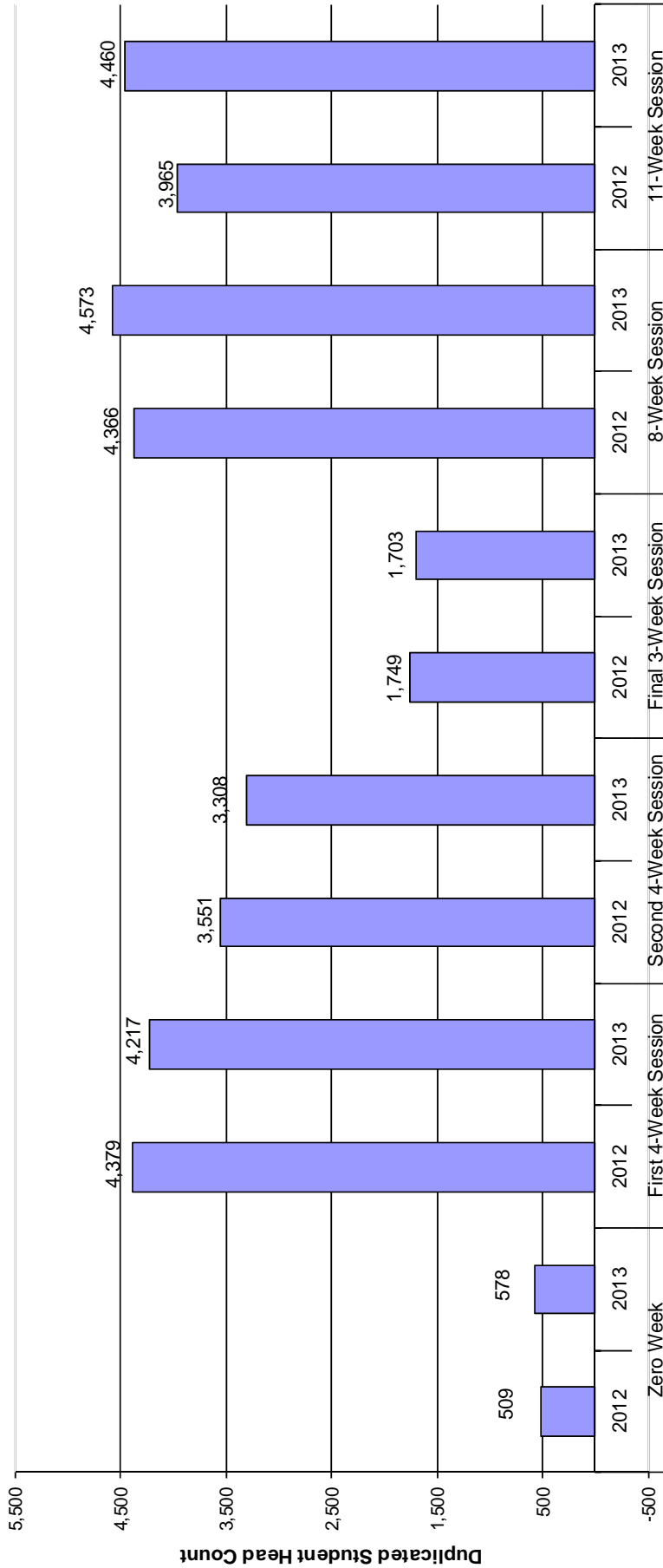

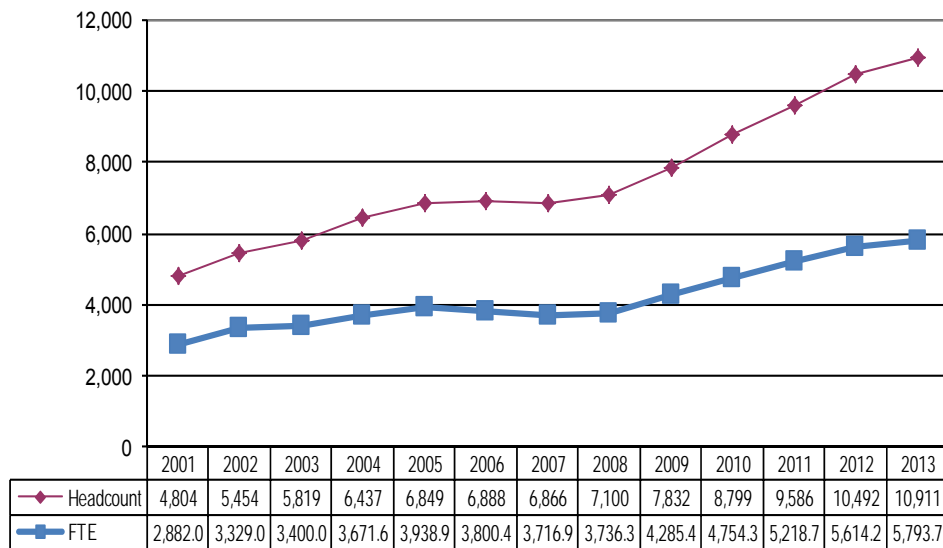
Highlights

- The Summer Session 2013 total enrollment of 10,911 was 419 more than Summer 2012 - an increase of 4.0%.
- There were more male students than female students in Summer 2013. Female students accounted for 49.2% of total students, while male students accounted for 50.8%.
- 73% of students were enrolled on a part-time basis.
- The College of Engineering had the largest unduplicated student enrollment (2,074) when compared to the other academic units.
- About 55.7% of the total student credit hours (81,580) were from the College of Science (28.0%) and the College of Liberal Arts (27.7%).
- OSU Extended Campus had a total enrollment of 5,642 students. These students were enrolled for 29,893 credit hours. About 39.0% of those credit hours were from the College of Liberal Arts.
- 96 new undergraduate students from high school enrolled for courses.
- The percentage of U.S. minority students was 19.9%.

- For Summer 2013, more students (4,573) enrolled in the Eight Week Session (June 24 - August 16). The Eleven Week Session (June 24 - September 6) had (4,460) students (second-largest enrollment).
