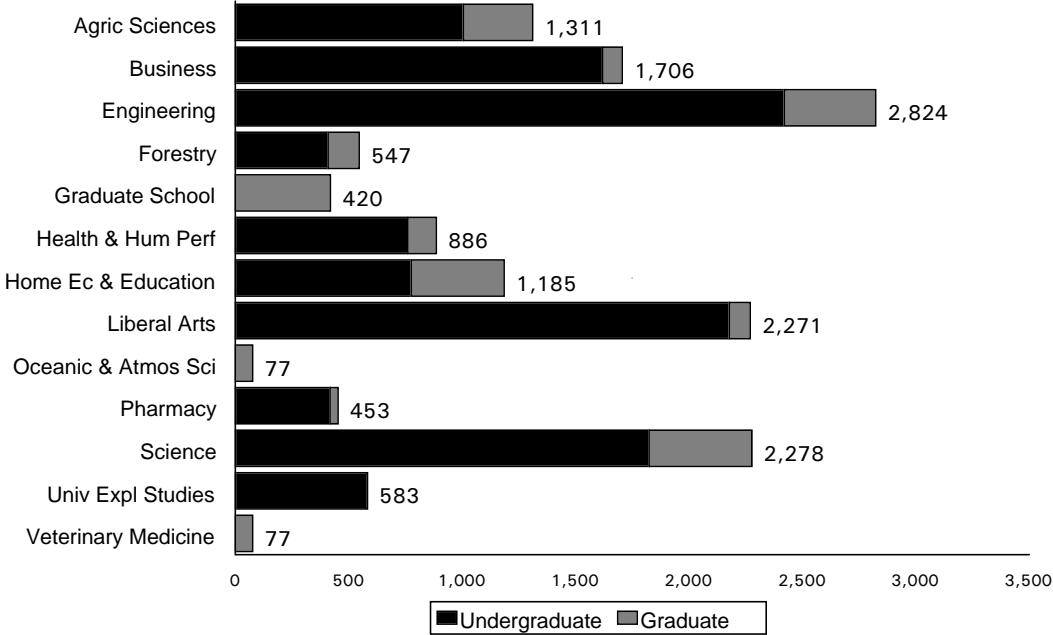

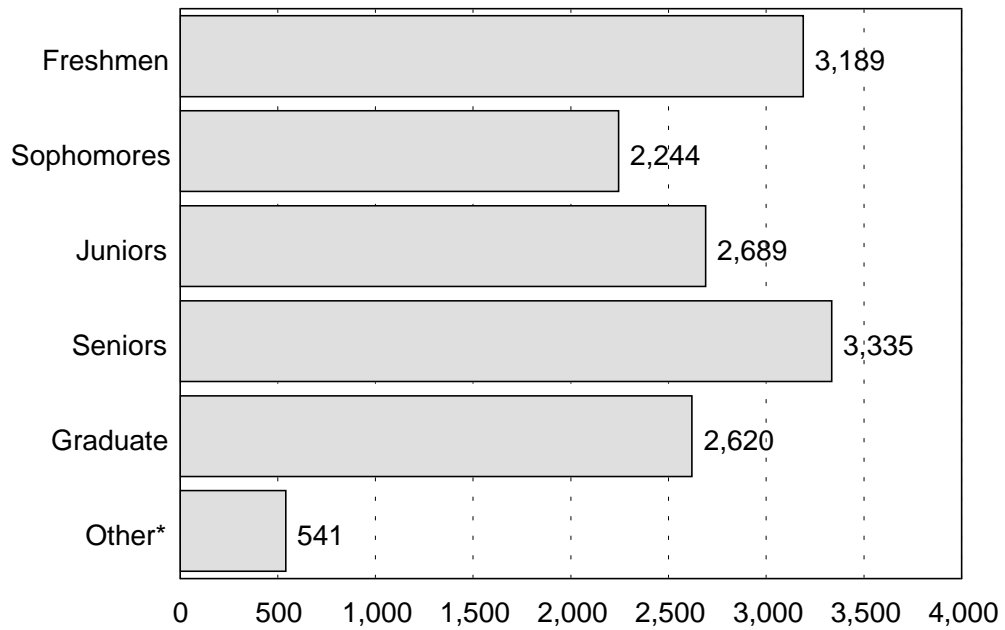

## Headcount Enrollment By Class

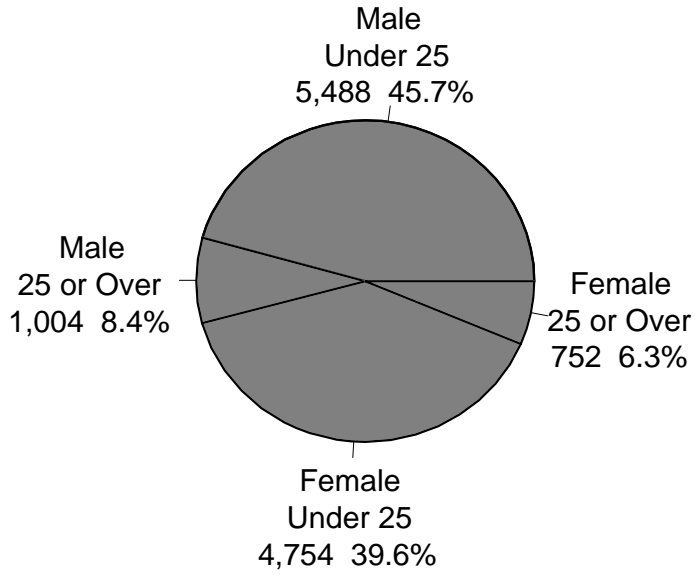

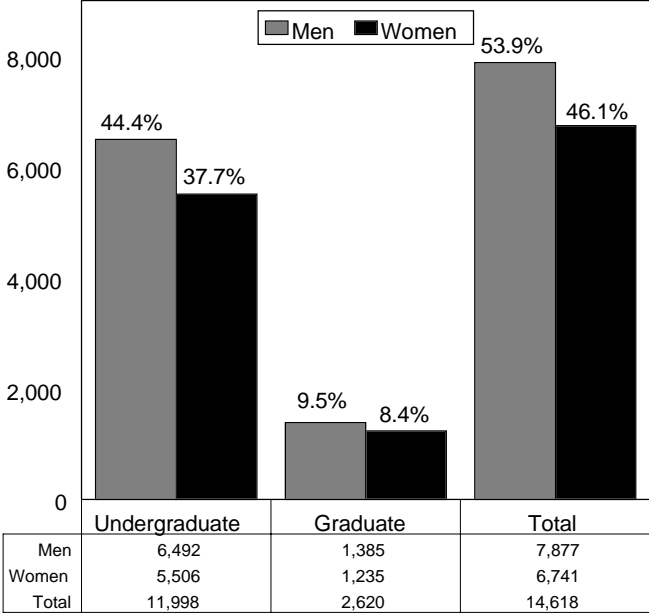

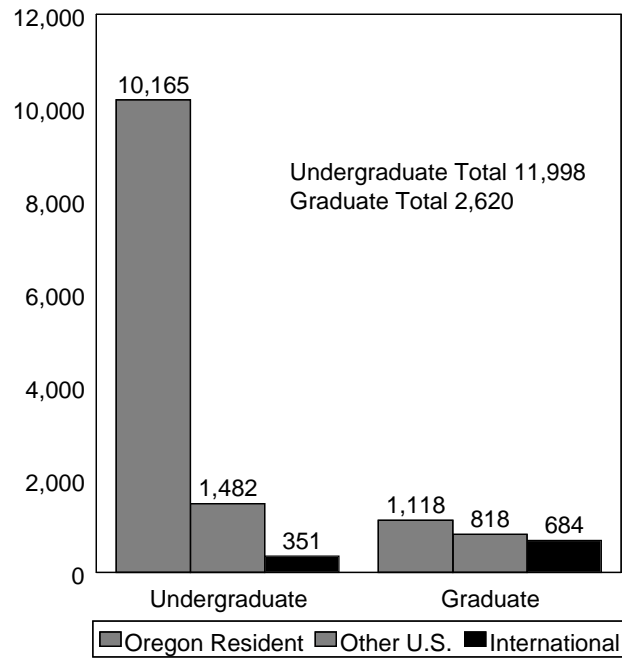

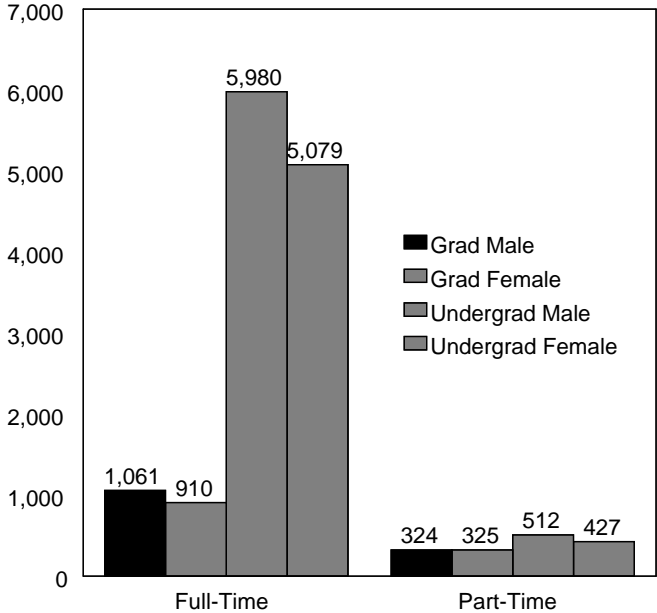
## New Students\* By Residency

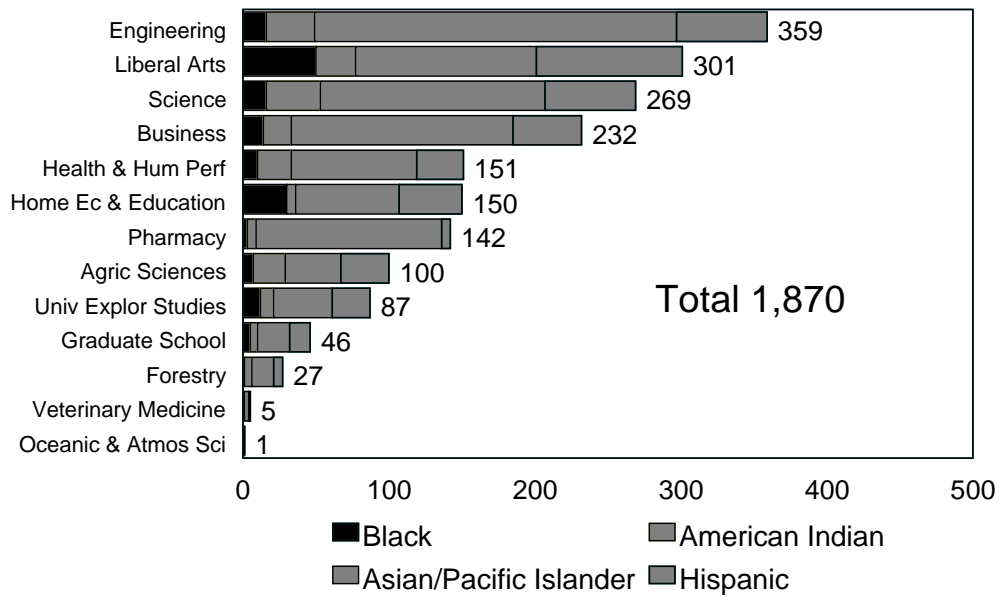

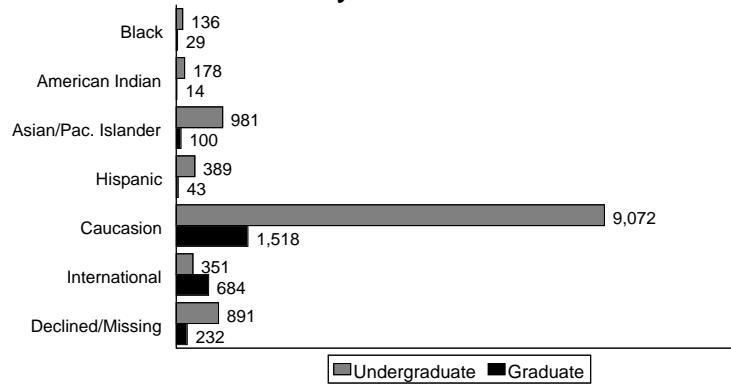

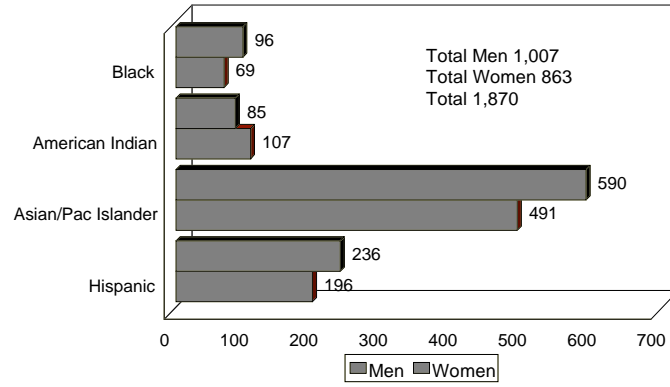
## Ethnicity - All Students By Level

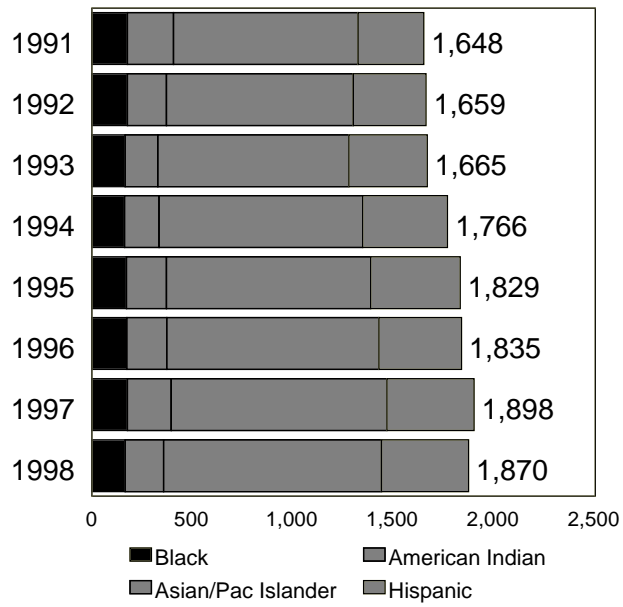
