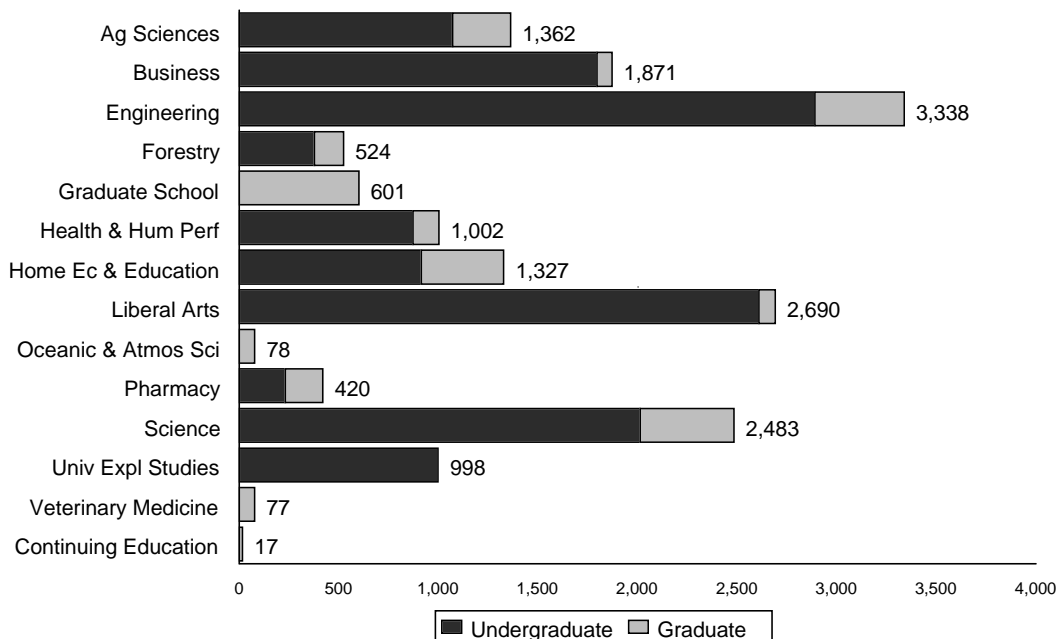

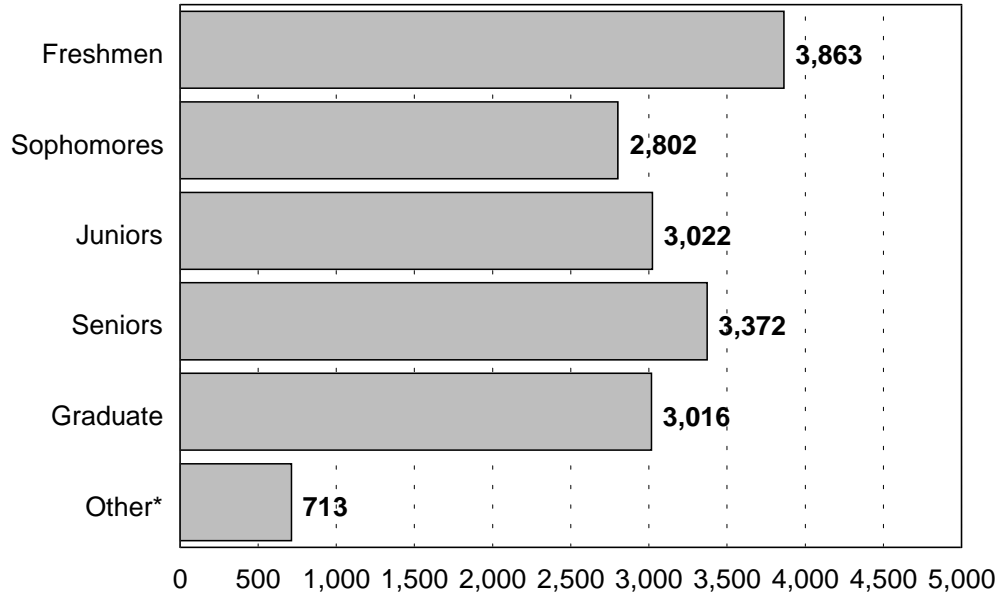

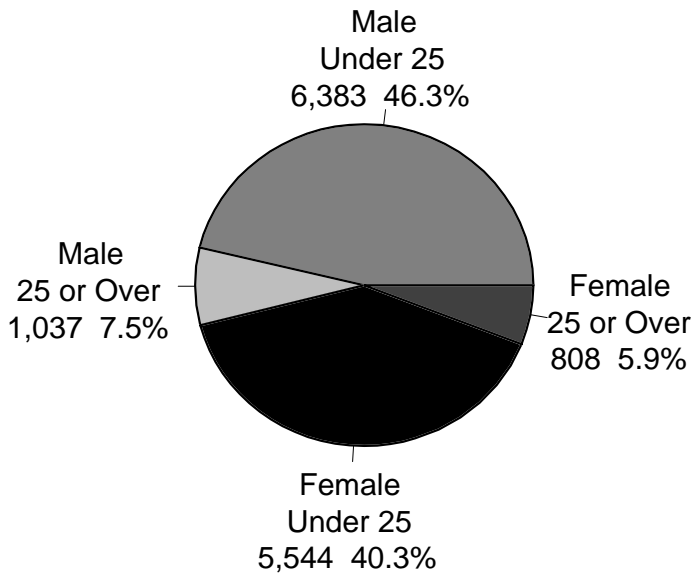
## Headcount Enrollment By Class



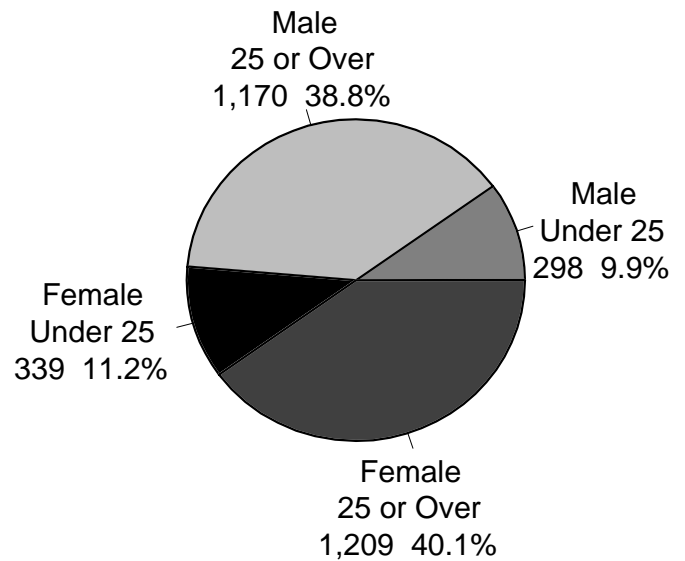

### Ethnicity - All Students By Level

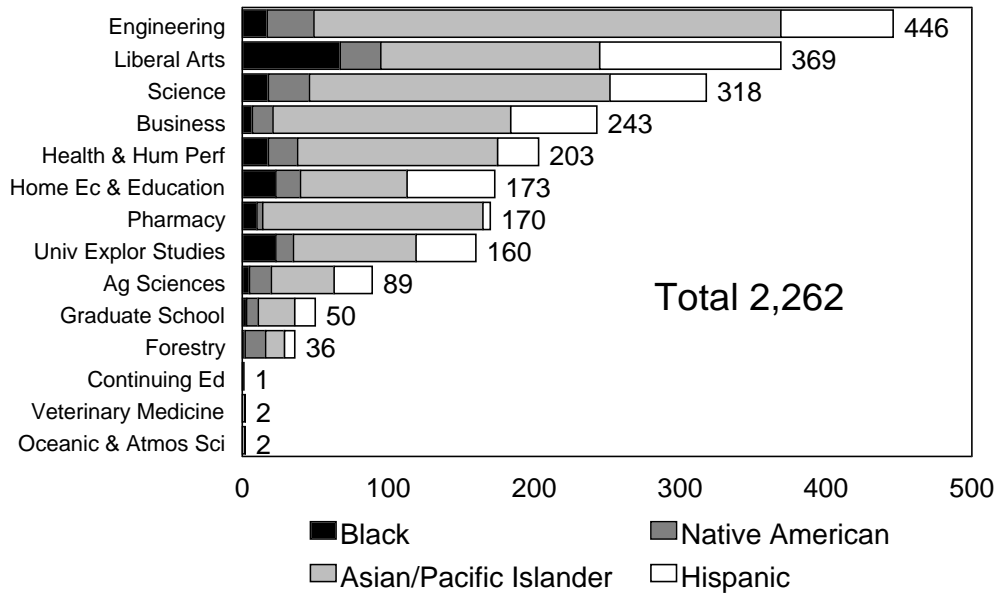


### U. S. Minorities By Gender

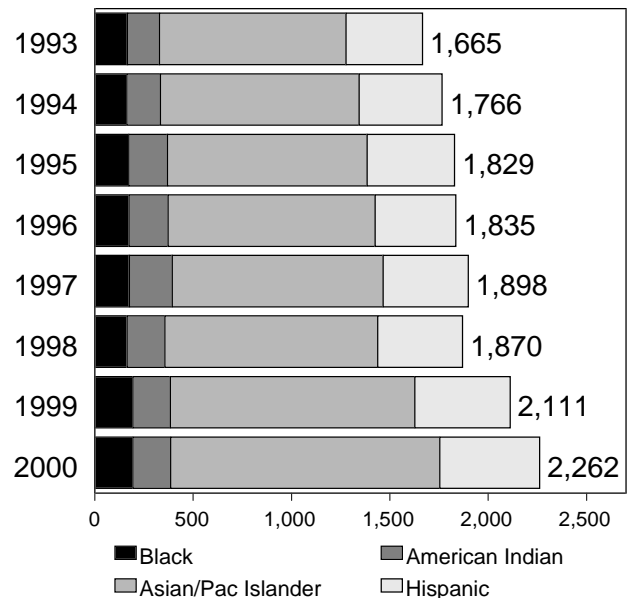

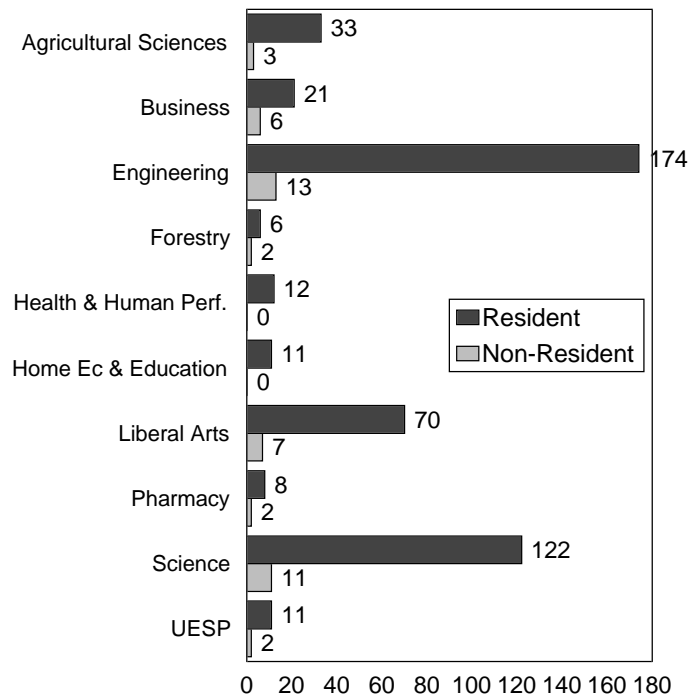

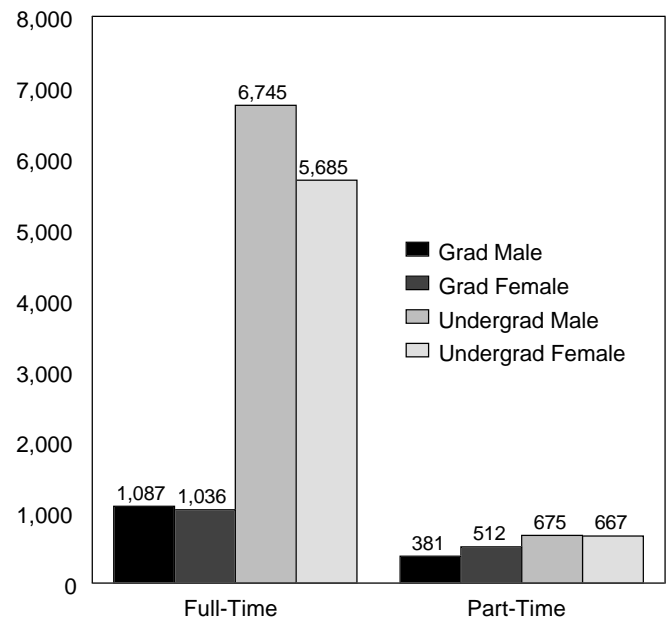

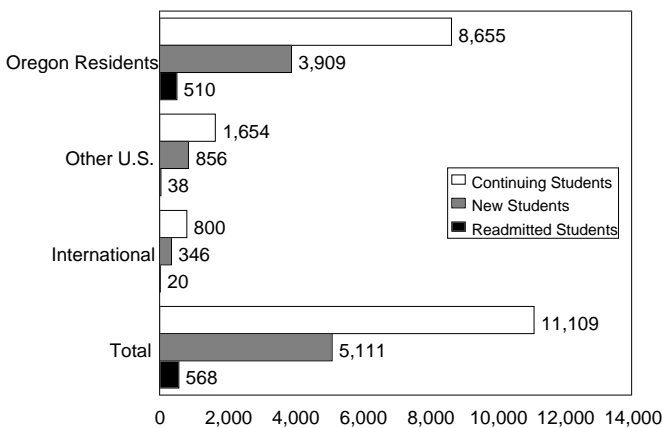
