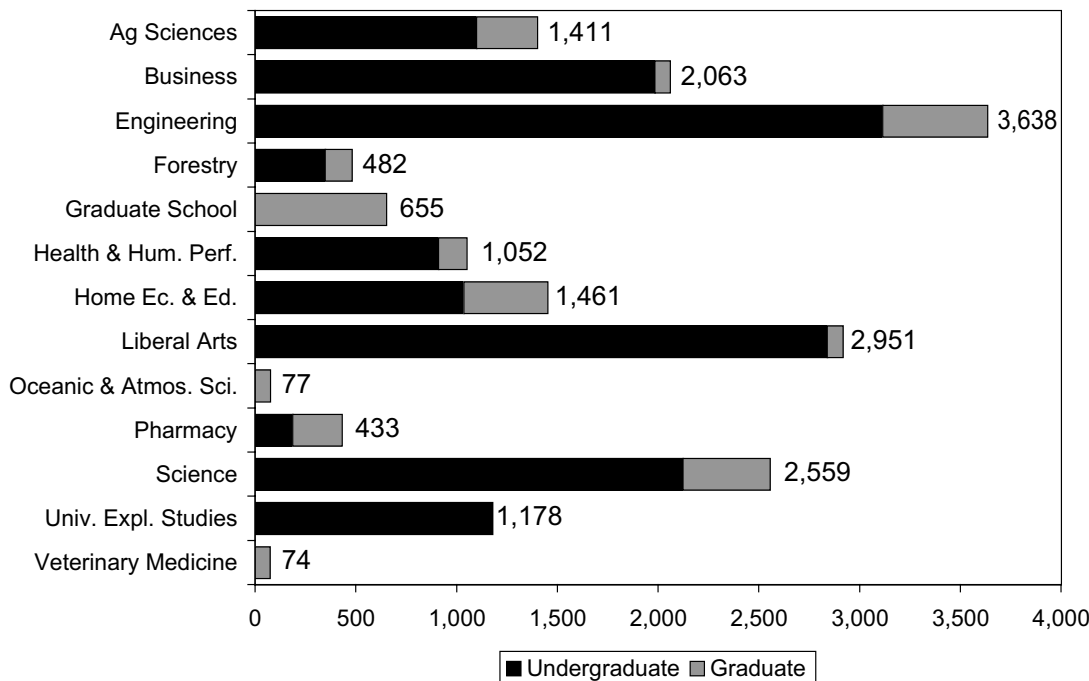

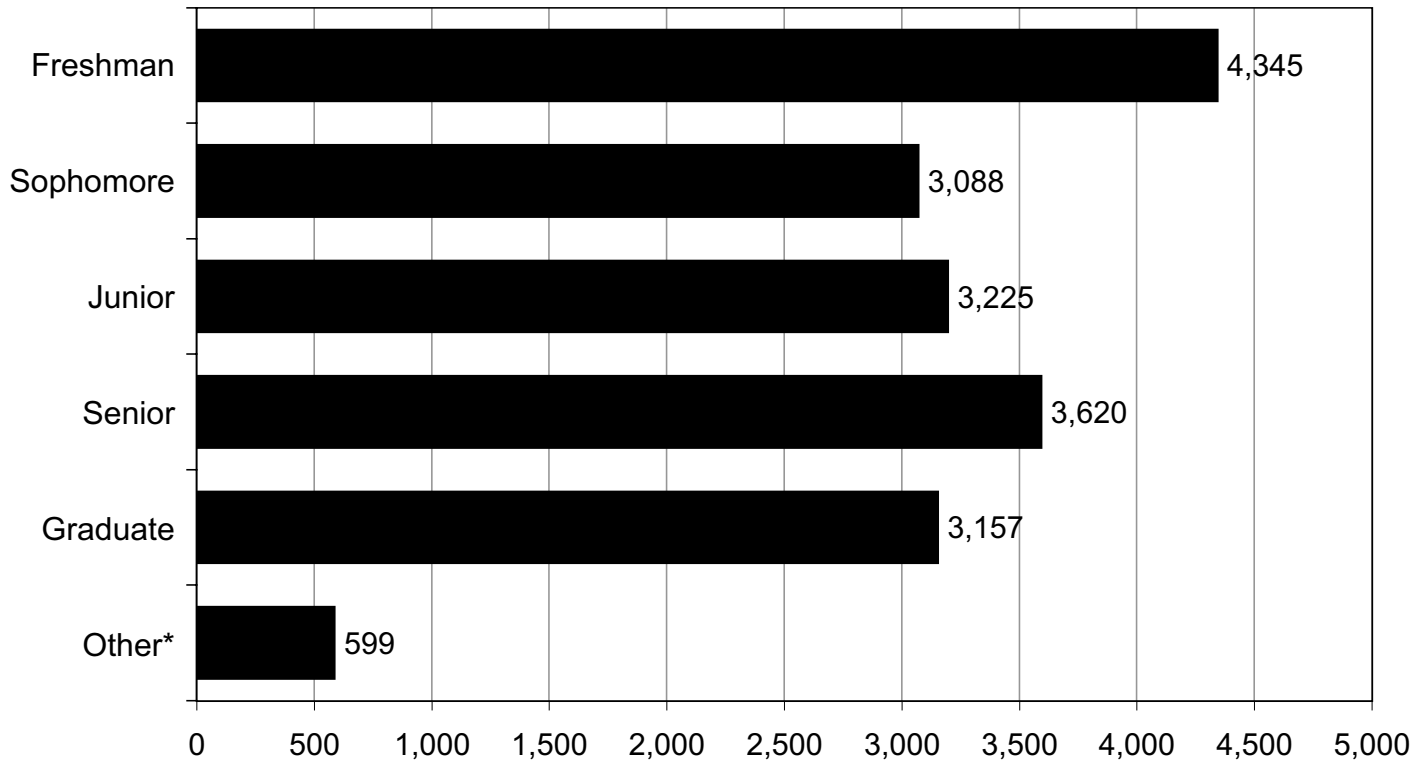

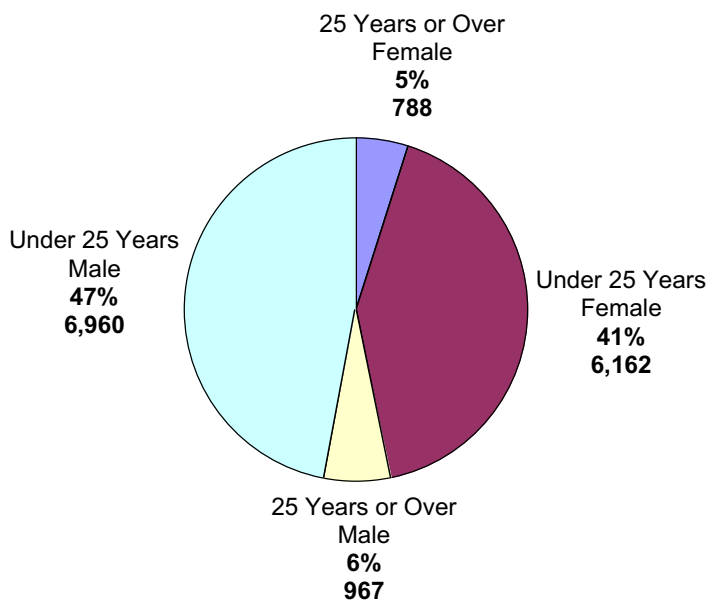
Headcount Enrollment by Class



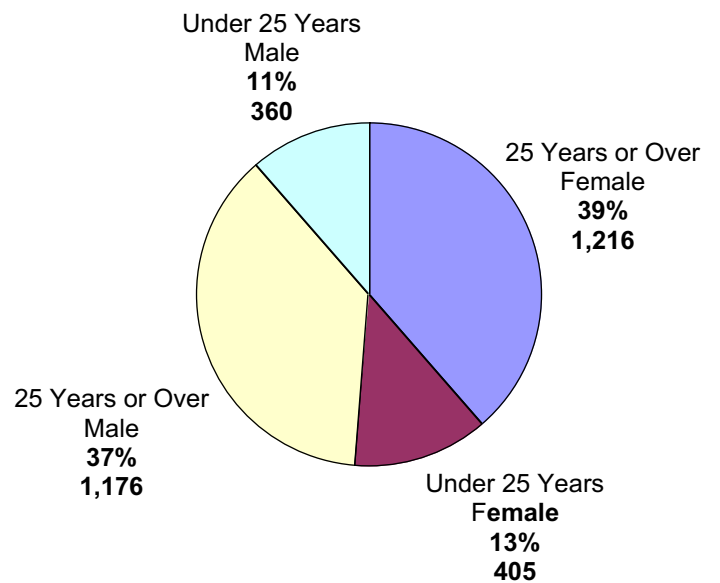

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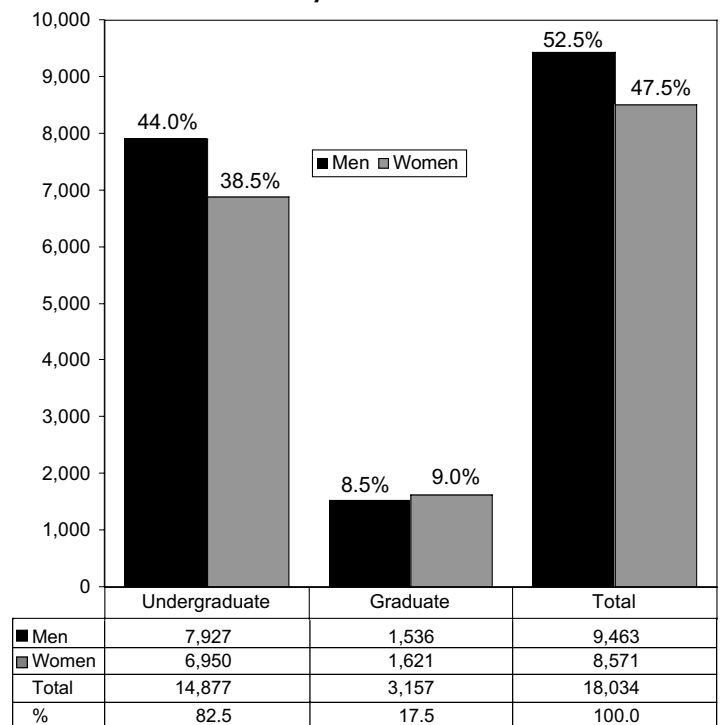

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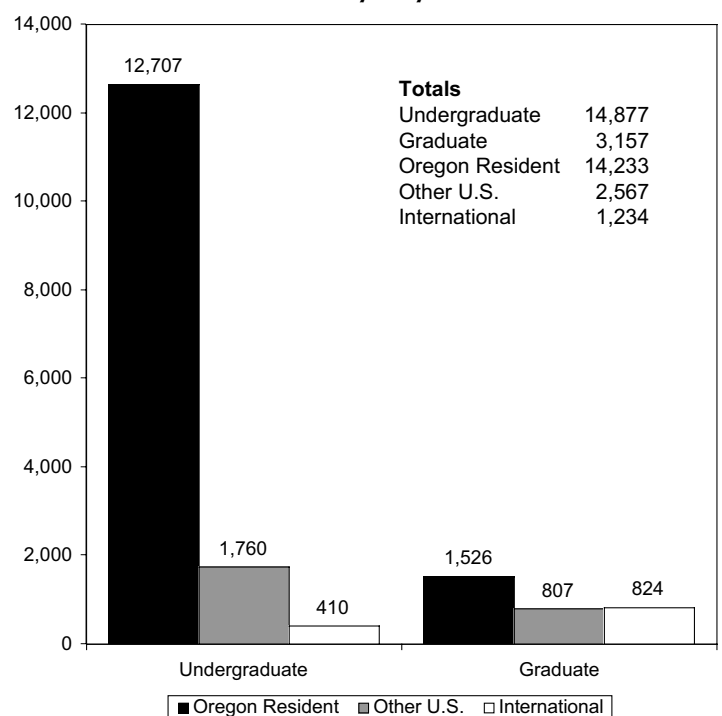

Residency by Level

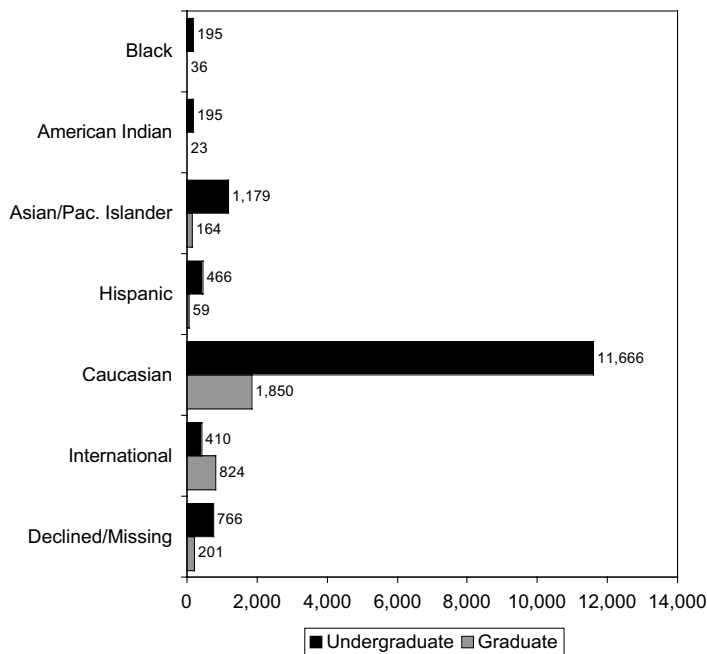

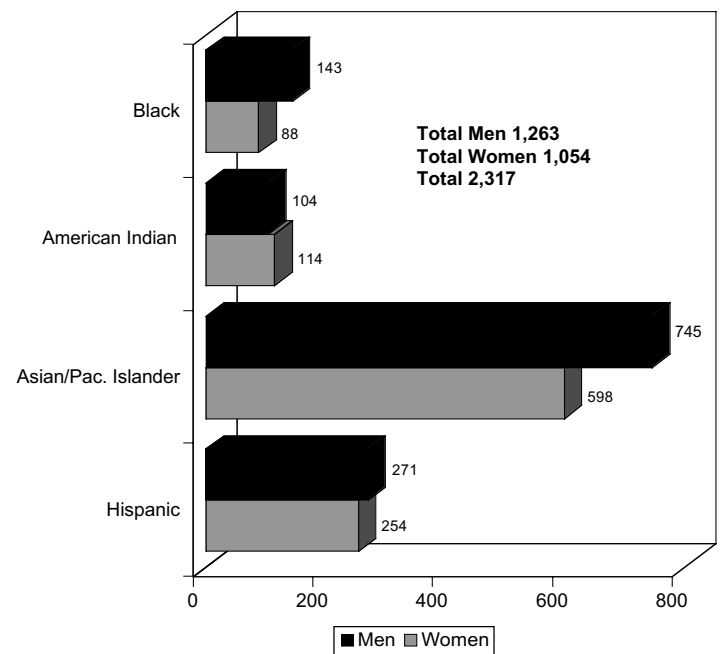

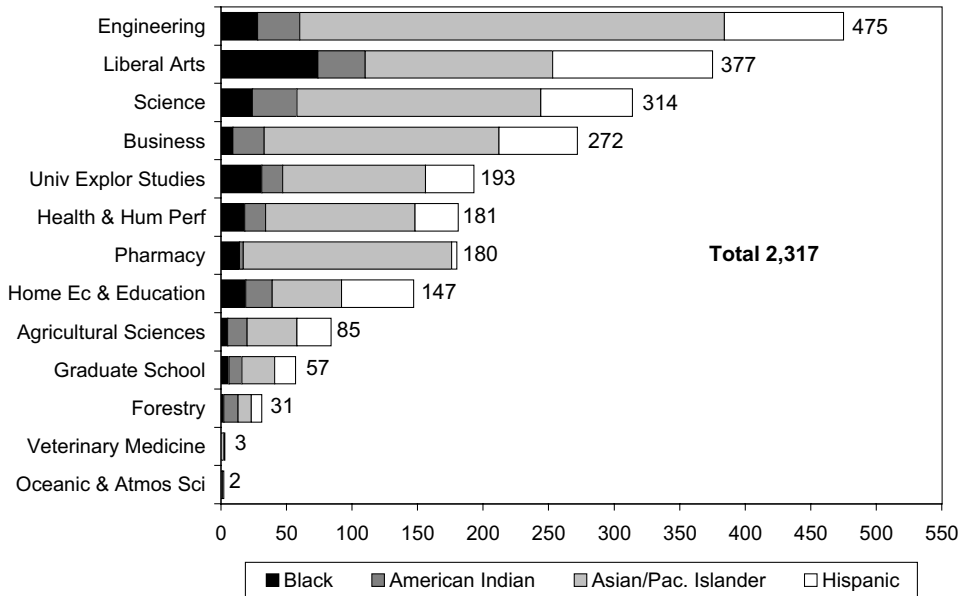
Ethnicity - All Students - by Level



U.S. Minorities by Gender



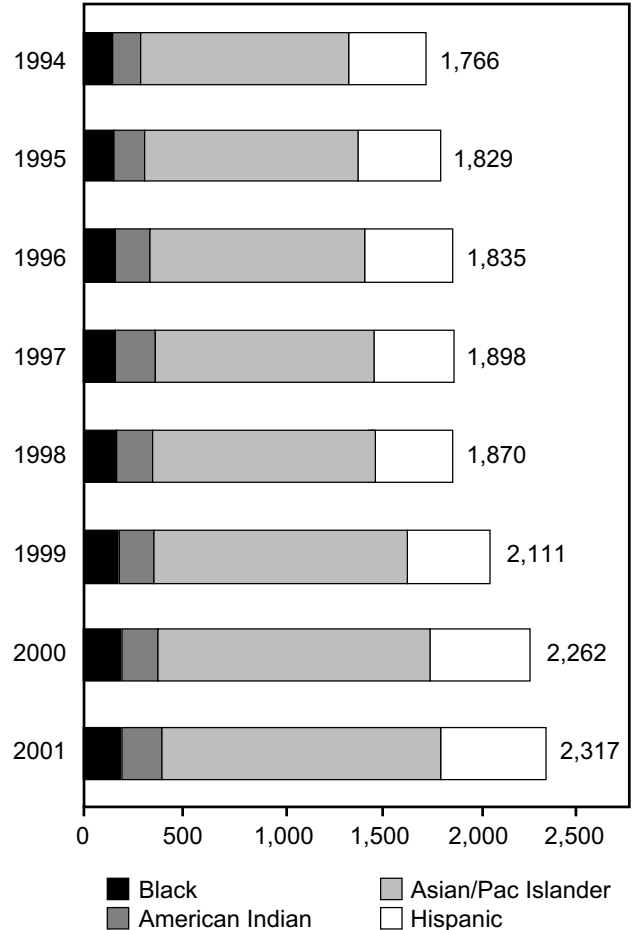

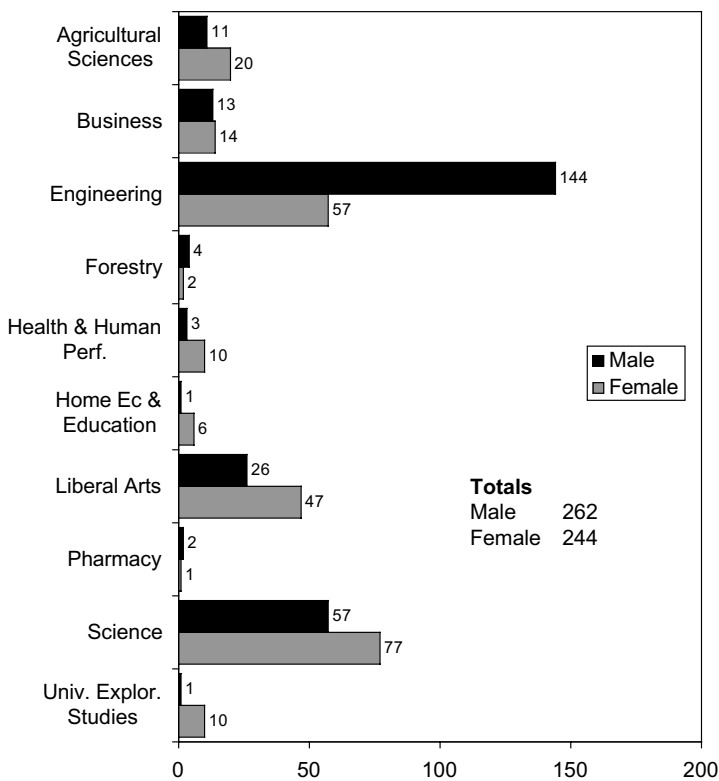

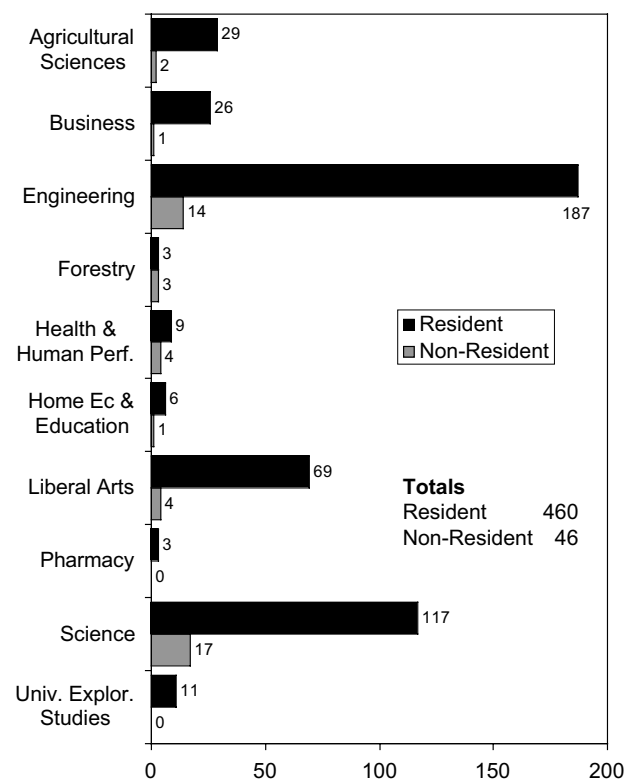

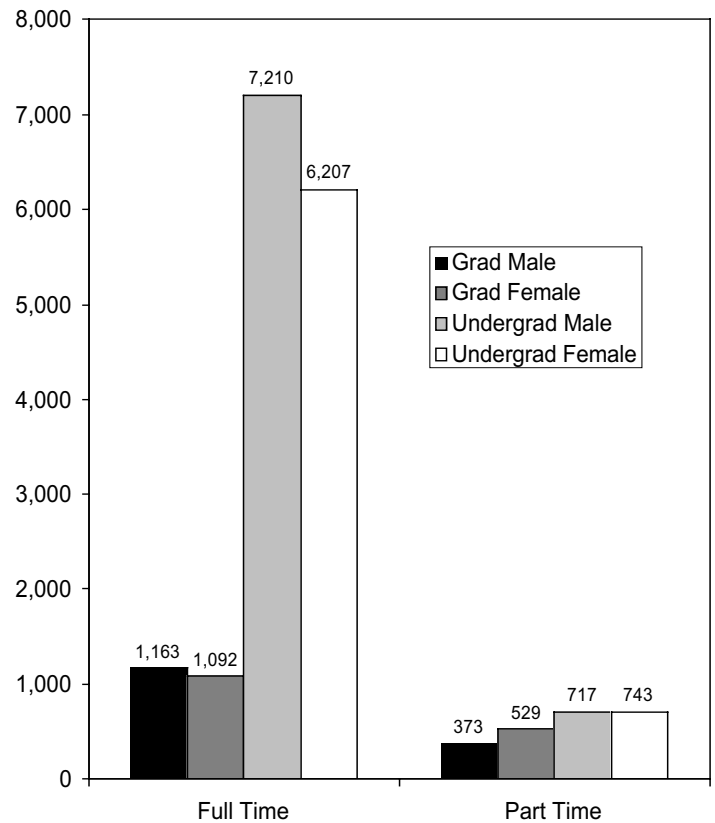

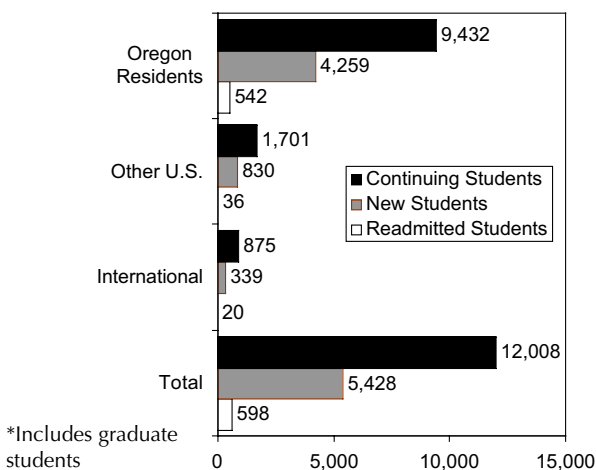
