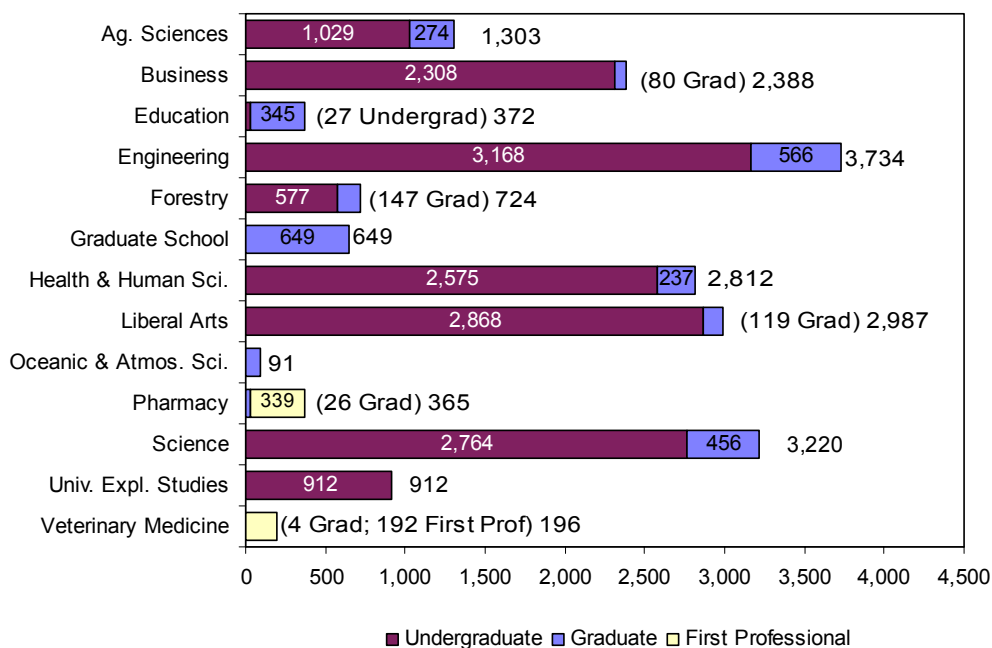

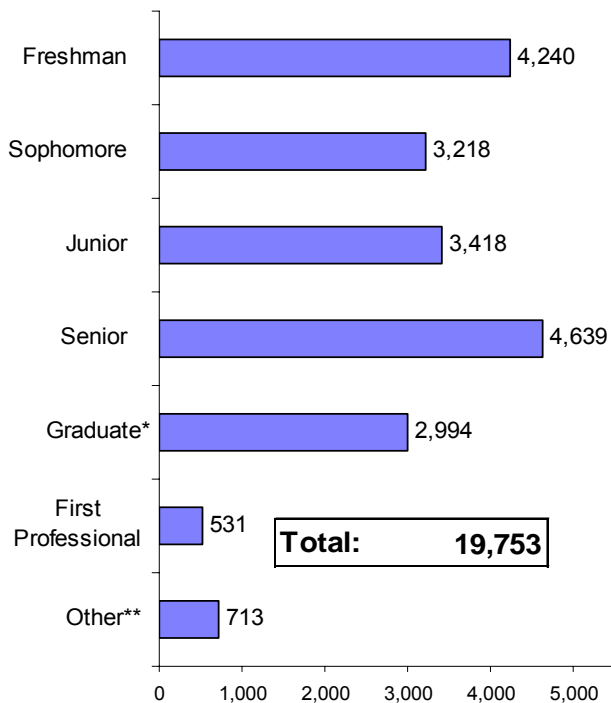

## Headcount Enrollment by Class Standing



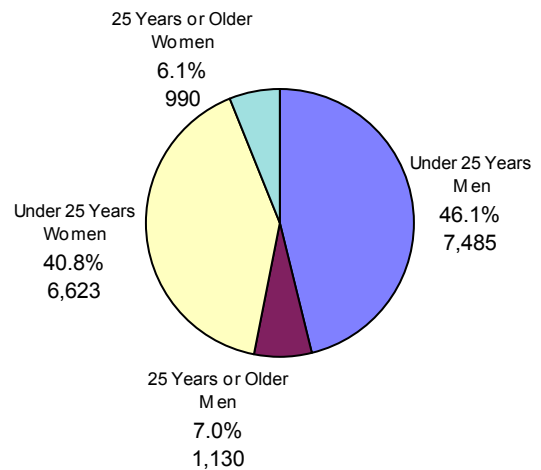

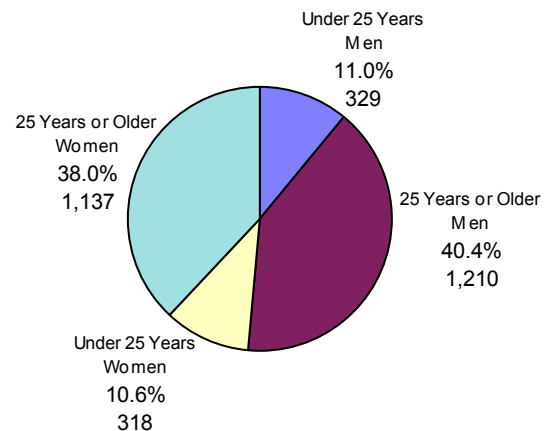

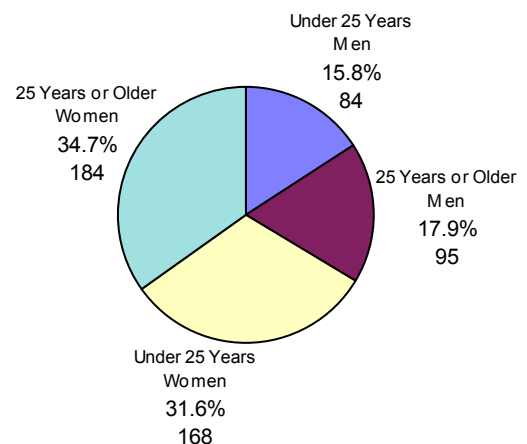

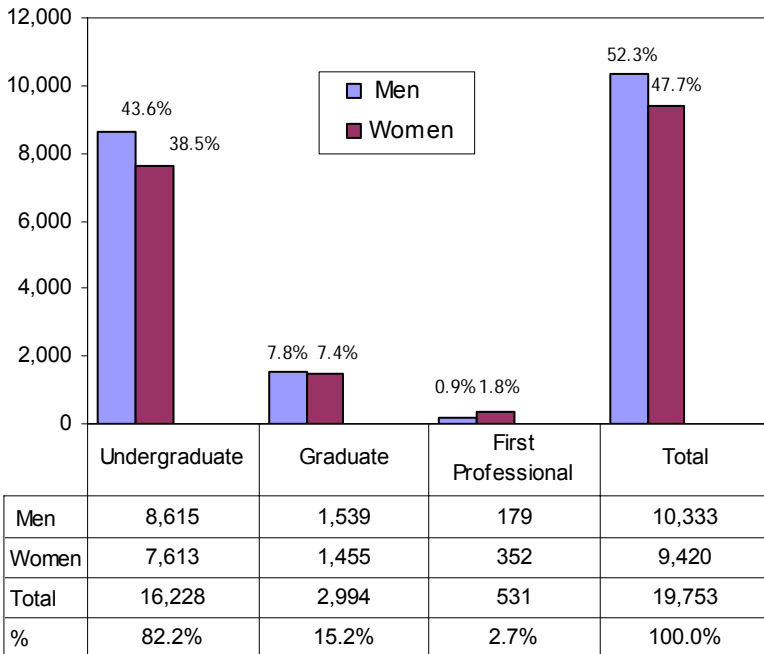

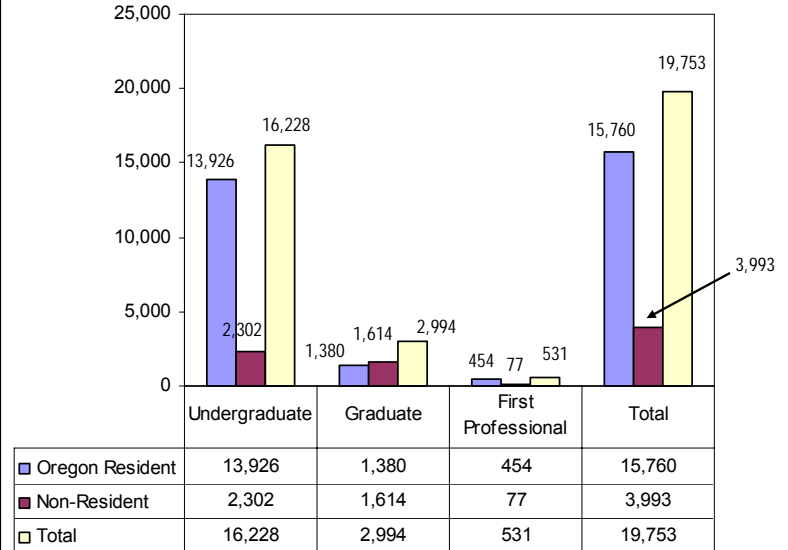

## Enrollment by Gender and Student Level

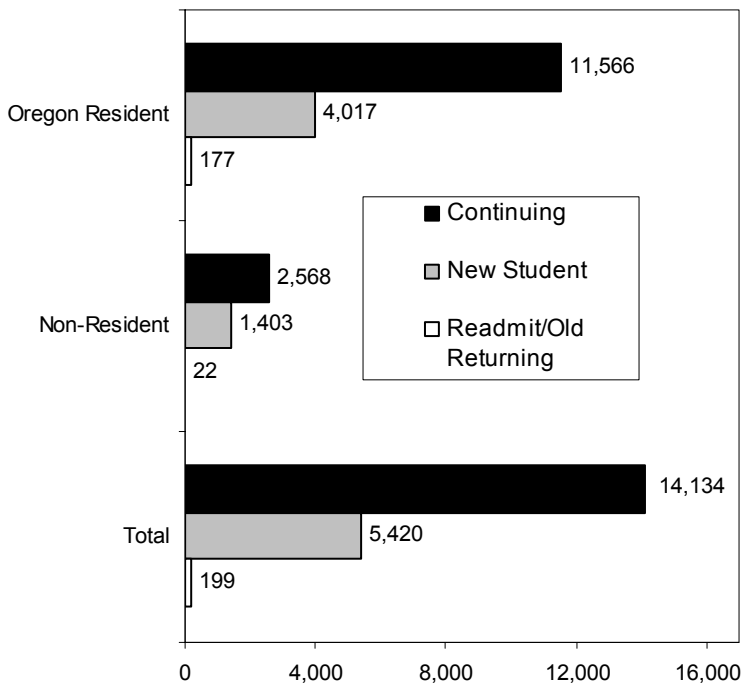

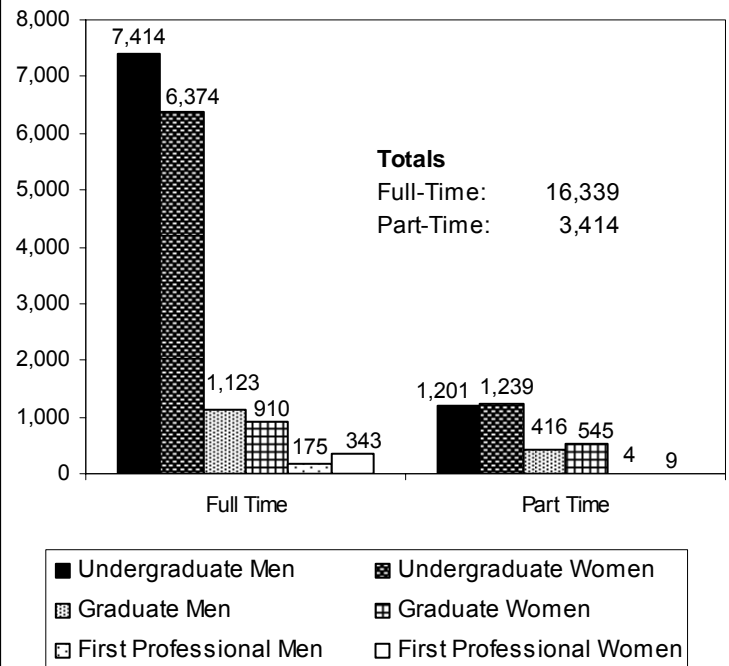

## Student Enrollment Full Time and Part Time, by Gender



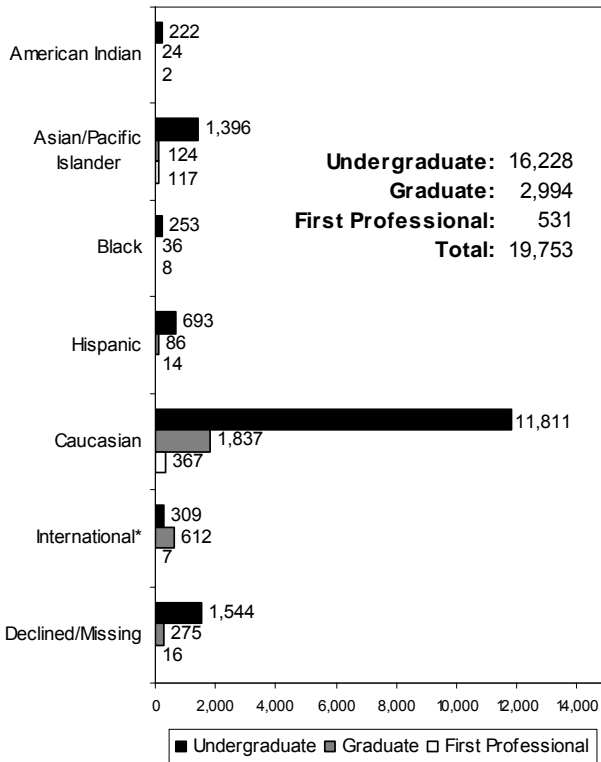

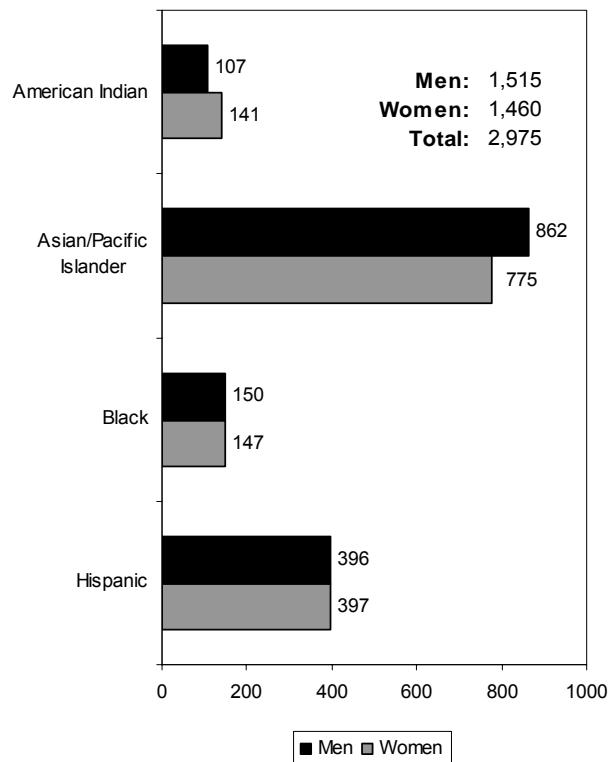

### Ethnicity — All Students — by Level

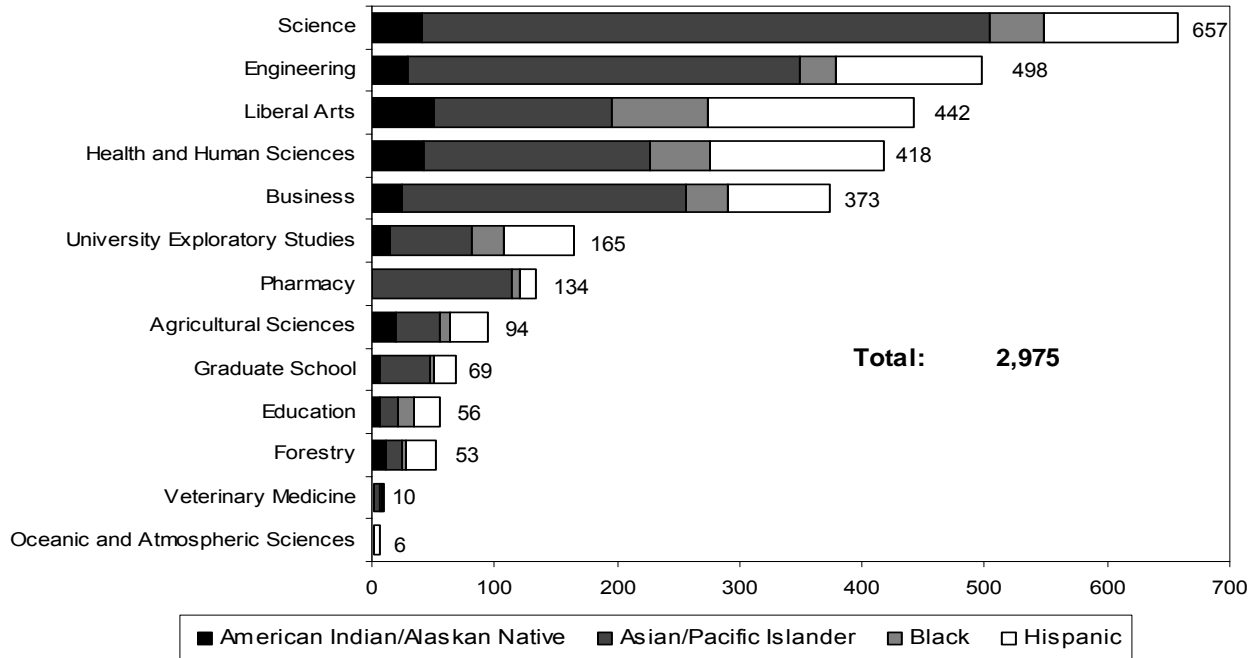


### U.S. Minorities by Gender

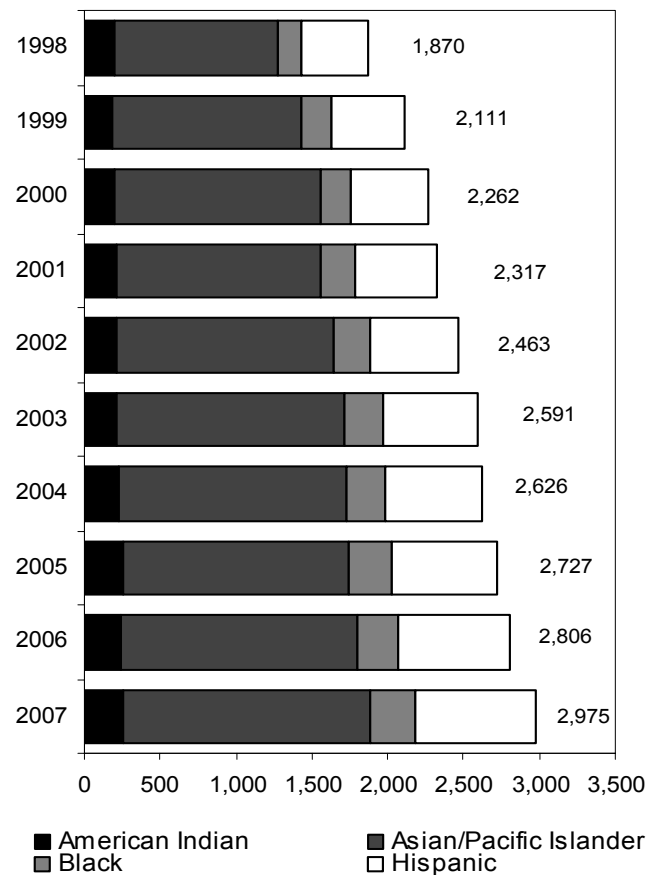

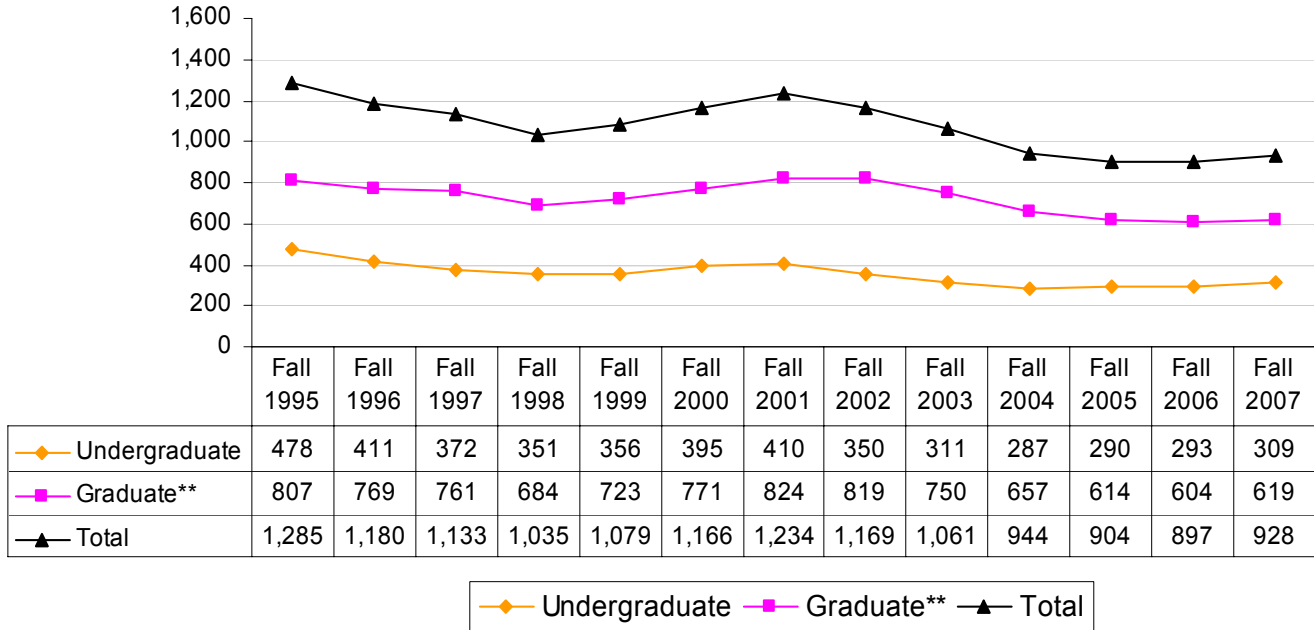

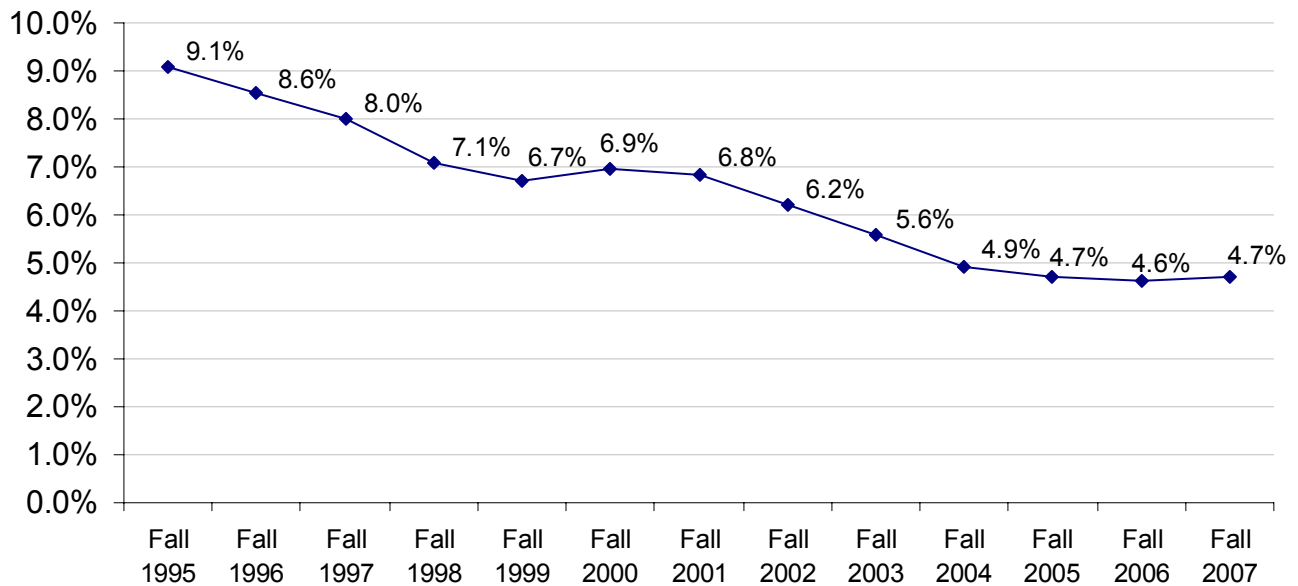

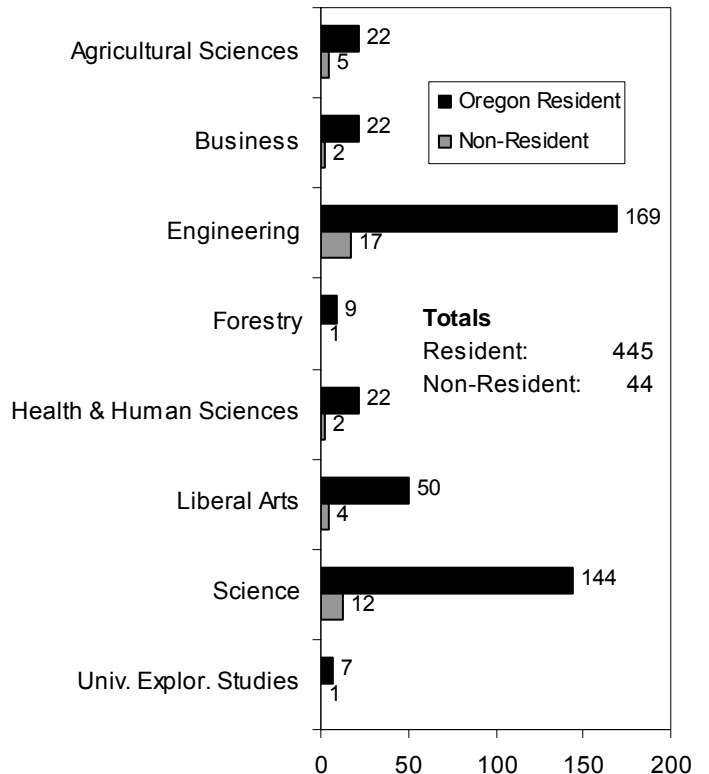

## Highlights

- For Fall 2007, total enrollment was 19,753 students.
- When Fall 2006 and Fall 2007 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 391 students or 2.0% (from 19,362 to 19,753), the FTE increased by 1.0%, and the Student Credit Hours increased by 1.1%.
- The number of part-time students increased by 7.1% (from 3,188 to 3,414).
- When compared to Fall 2006, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 399 students, or 2.5% (from 15,829 to 16,228); the graduate enrollment decreased by 0.2% (from 3,001 to 2,994); the first professional enrollment decreased by 0.2% (from 532 to 531).
- When compared to Fall 2006, Oregon residents increased by 0.3%; non-resident students including those from other U.S. states and international students increased by 9.4%; and international student enrollment increased by 3.5%.
- University Honors College had an enrollment of 489.
- The College of Engineering had the largest student enrollment (3,734) when compared to the other academic units.
- OSU Extended Campus had 3,170 students, an increase of 17.2% compared to 2006. These students took 13,377 credits, of which 40.1% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 27.5% were from the College of Science.
- The percentage of U.S. minority students was 15.1% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 6.0% when compared to Fall 2006 (from 2,806 to 2,975).
