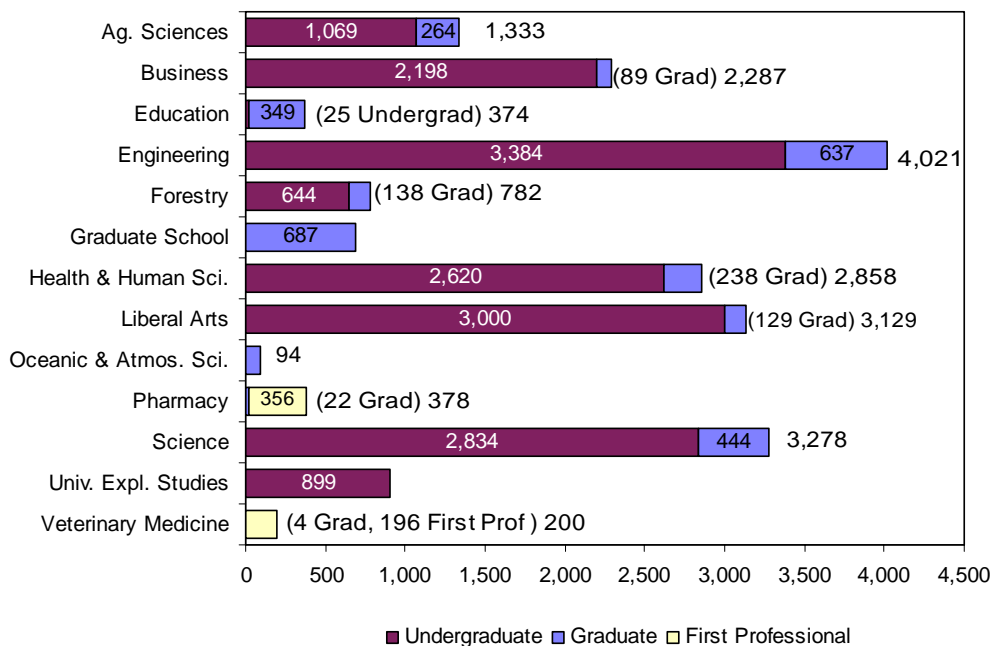

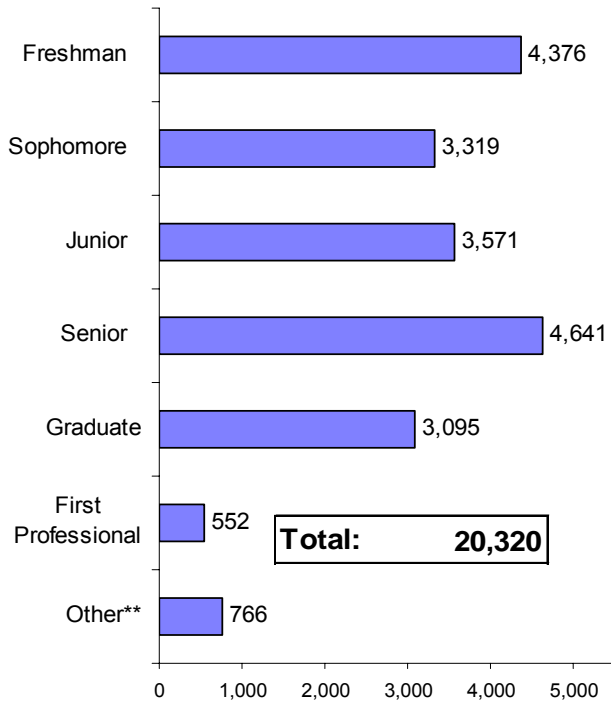

Headcount Enrollment by Class Standing



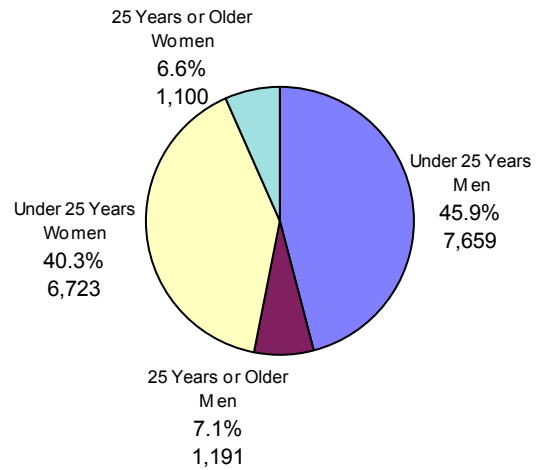

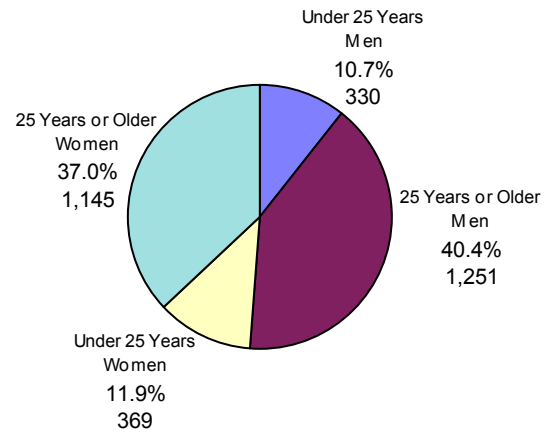

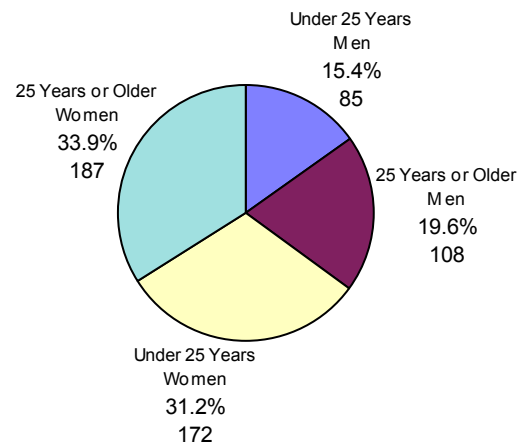

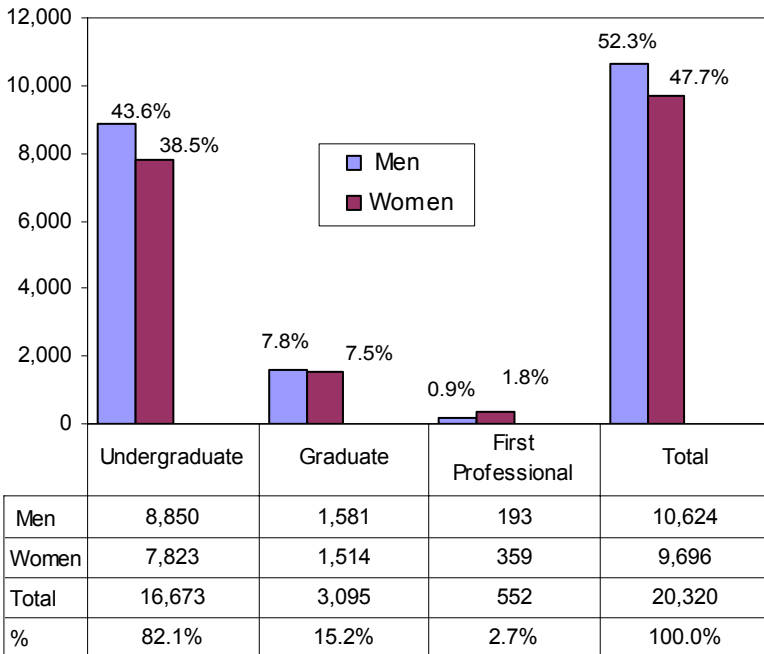

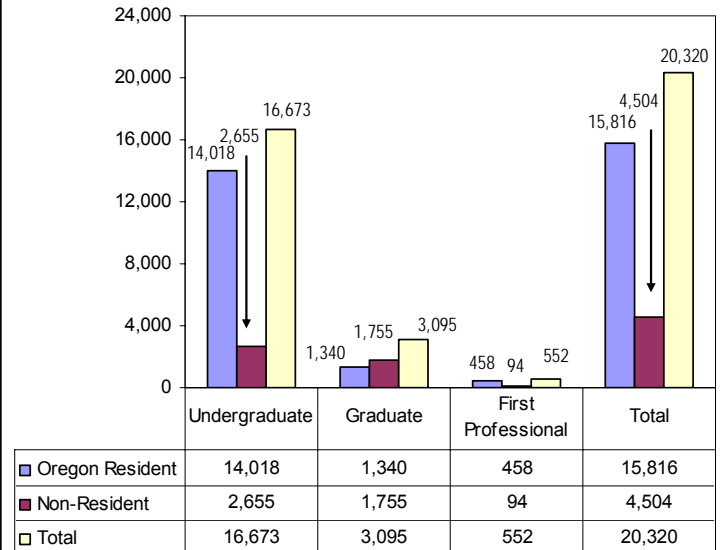

Enrollment by Gender and Student Level

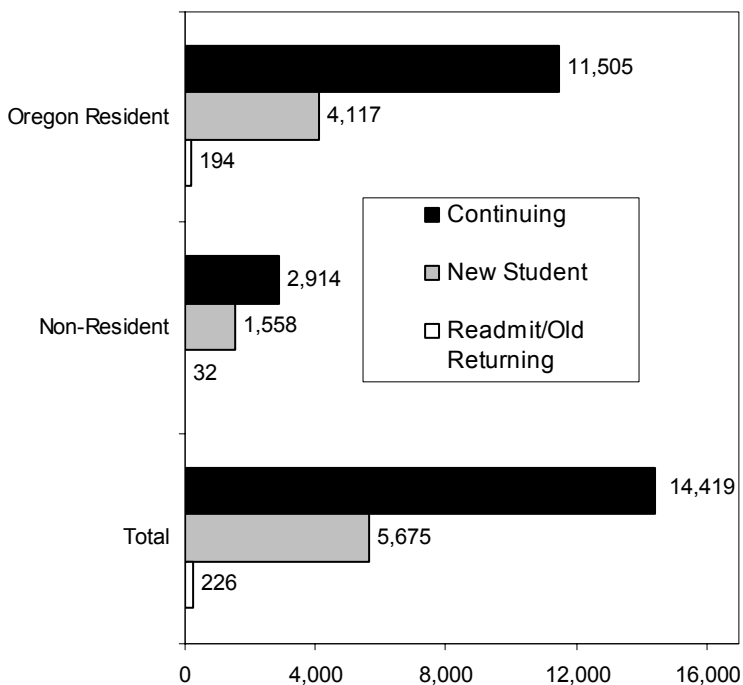


By Residency* and Student Level

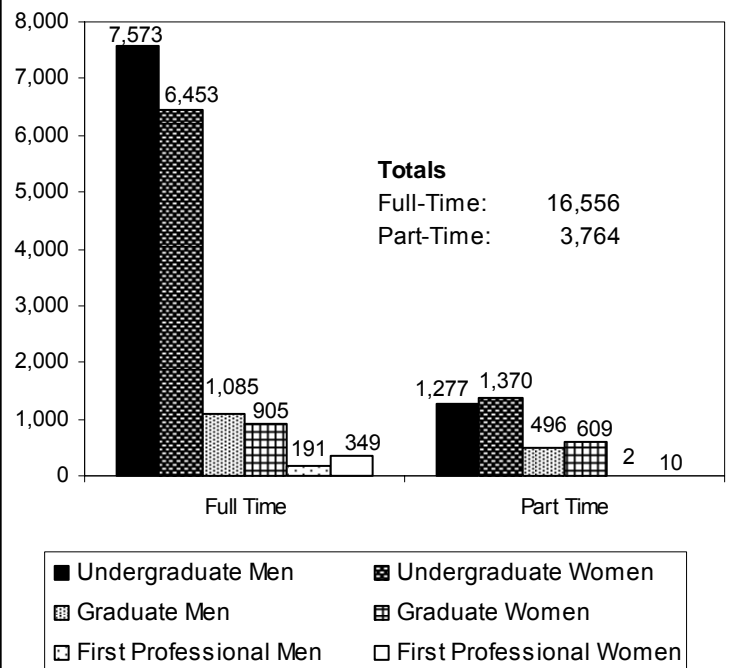

Student Enrollment Full Time and Part Time, by Gender



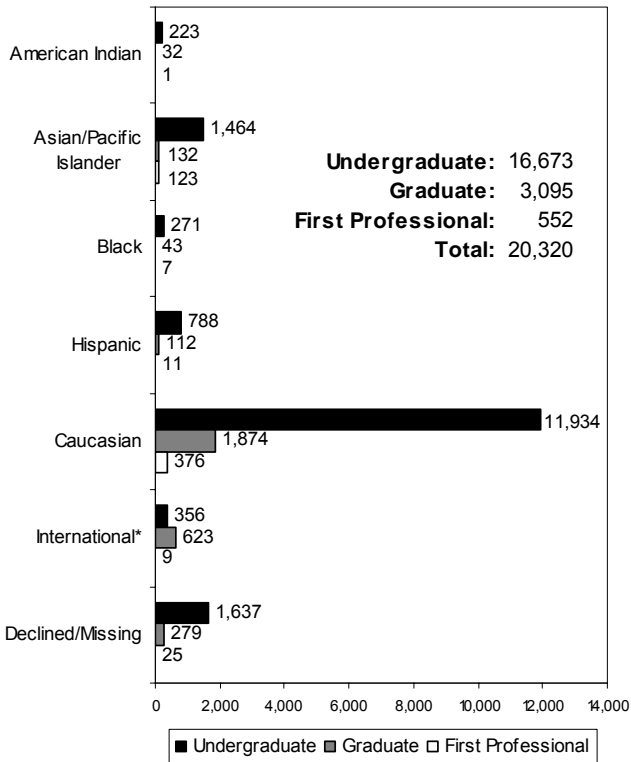

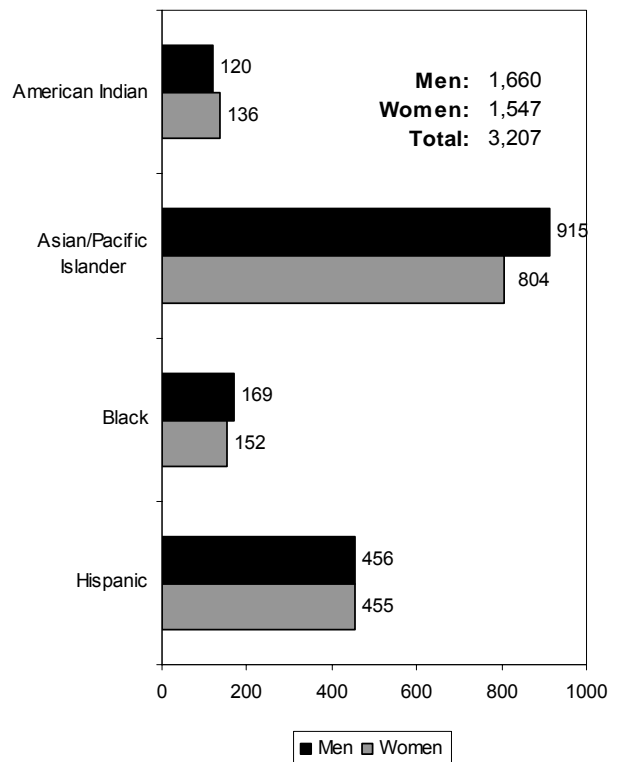

Ethnicity — All Students — by Level

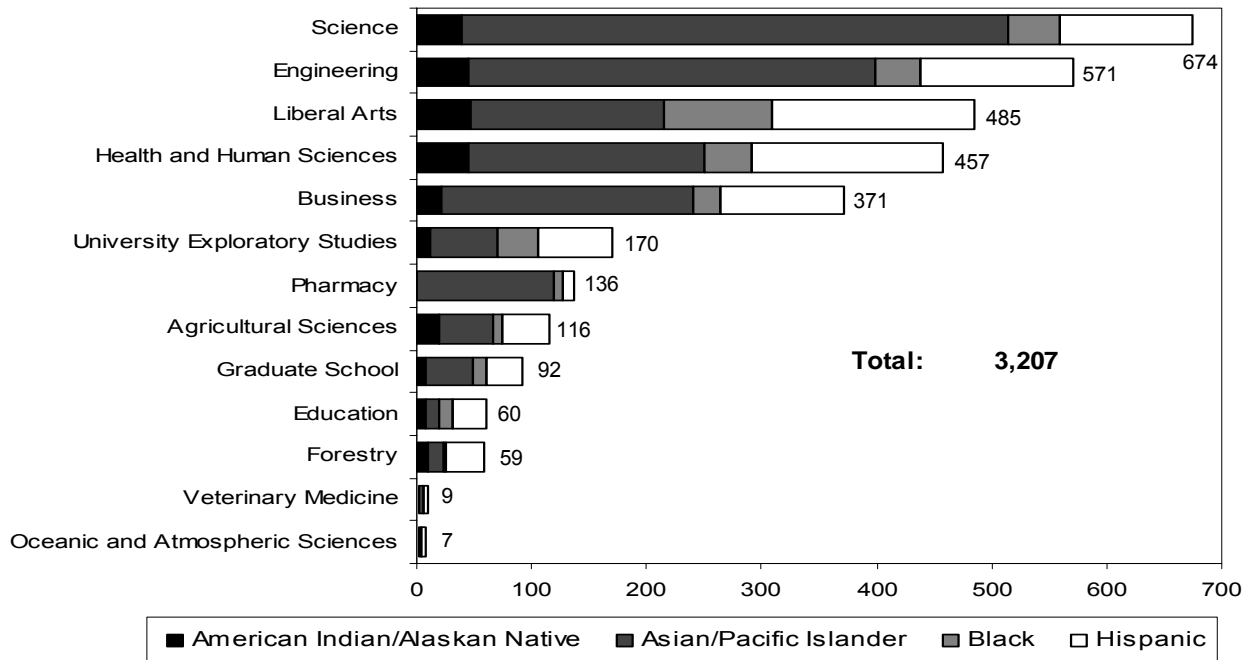


U.S. Minorities by Gender

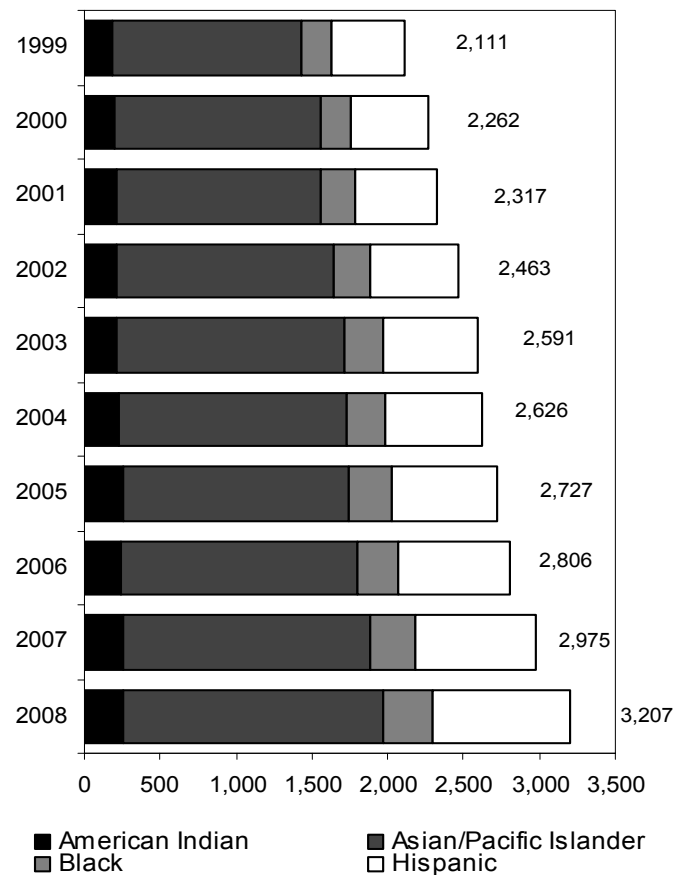

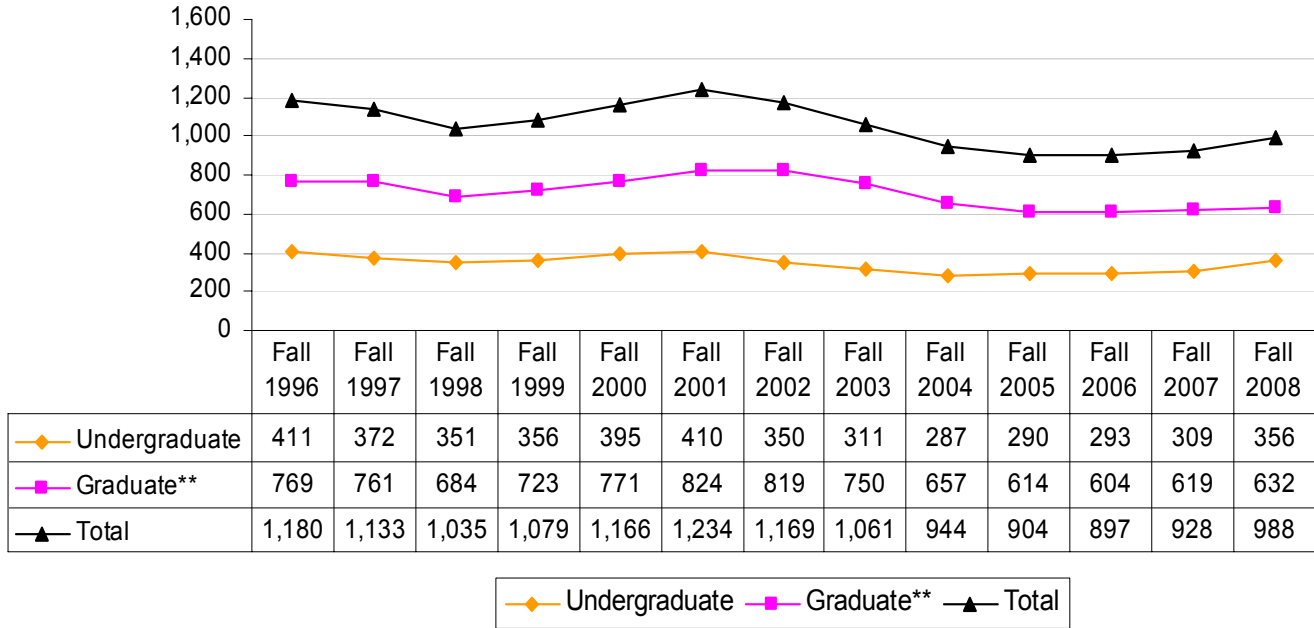

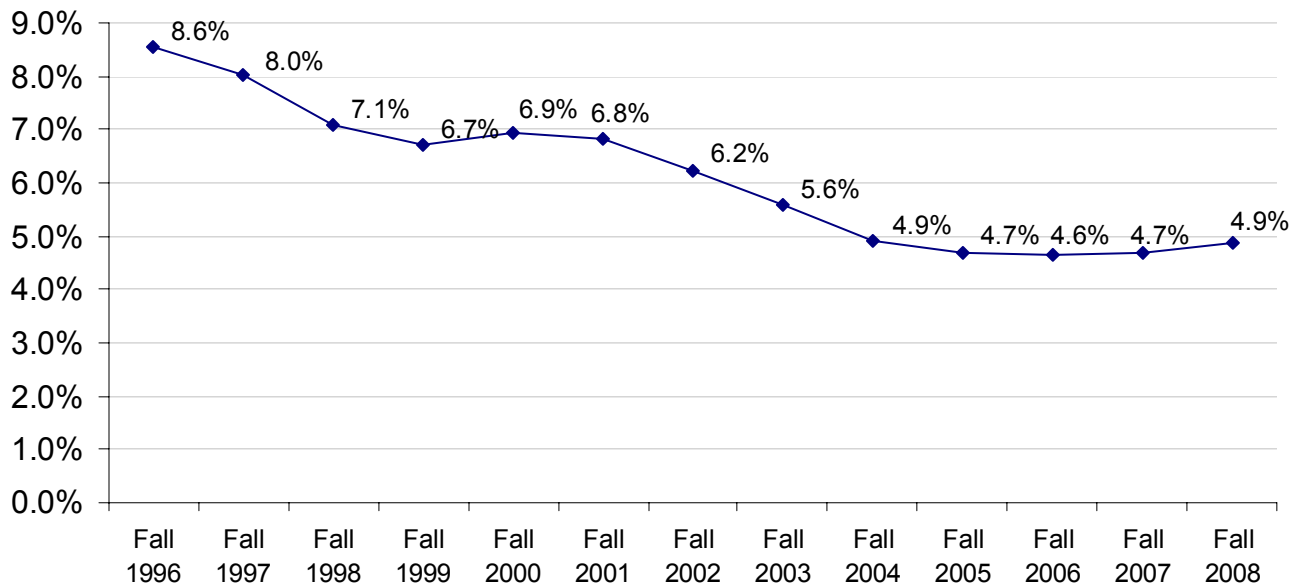

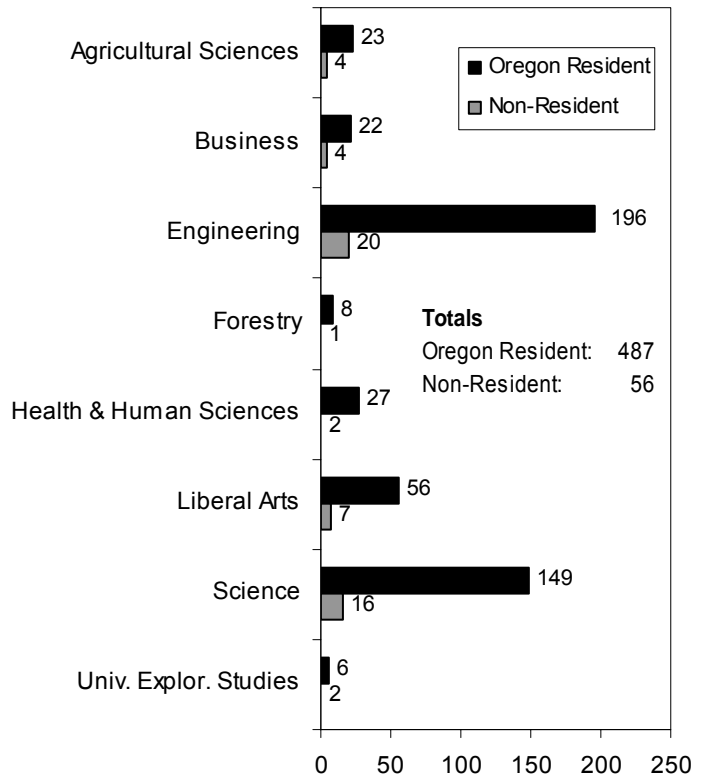

Highlights

- For Fall 2008, total enrollment was 20,320 students.
- When Fall 2007 and Fall 2008 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 567 students or 2.9% (from 19,753 to 20,320), the FTE increased by 2.1%, and the Student Credit Hours increased by 2.1%.
- The number of part-time students increased by 10.3% (from 3,414 to 3,764).
- When compared to Fall 2007, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 445 students, or 2.7% (from 16,228 to 16,673); the graduate enrollment increased by 3.4% (from 2,994 to 3,095); the first professional enrollment increased by 4.0% (from 531 to 552).
- When compared to Fall 2007, Oregon residents increased by 0.4%; non-resident students increased by 12.8%; and international student enrollment increased by 6.5%.
- University Honors College had an enrollment of 543.
- The College of Engineering had the largest student enrollment (4,021) when compared to the other academic units.
- OSU Extended Campus had 3,575 students, an increase of 12.8% compared to 2007. These students took 16,115 credits, of which 45.4% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 24.6% were from the College of Science.
- The percentage of U.S. minority students was 15.8% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 7.8% when compared to Fall 2007 (from 2,975 to 3,207).
