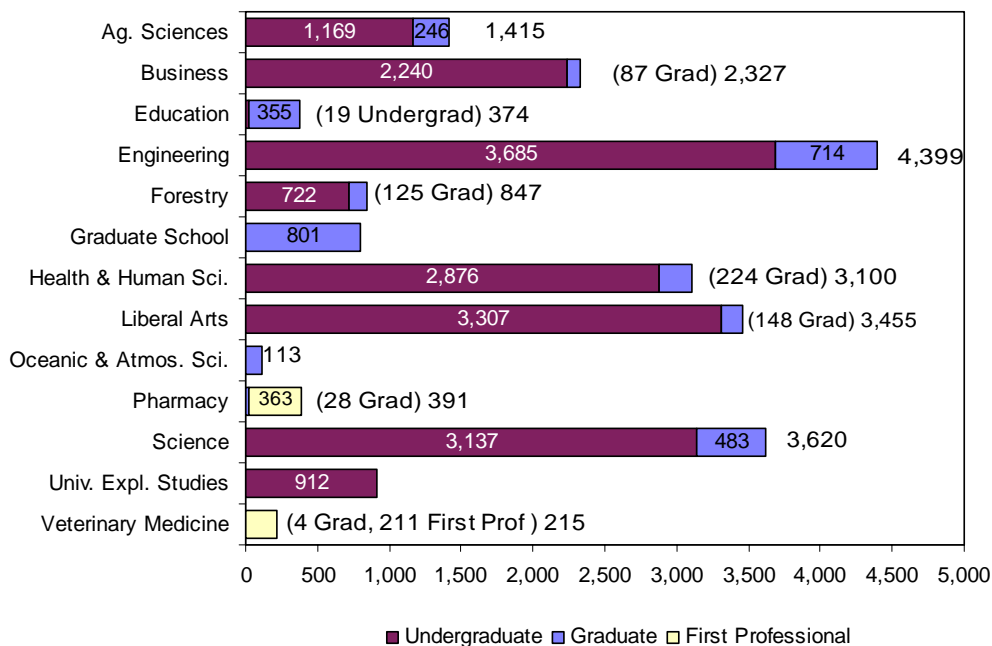

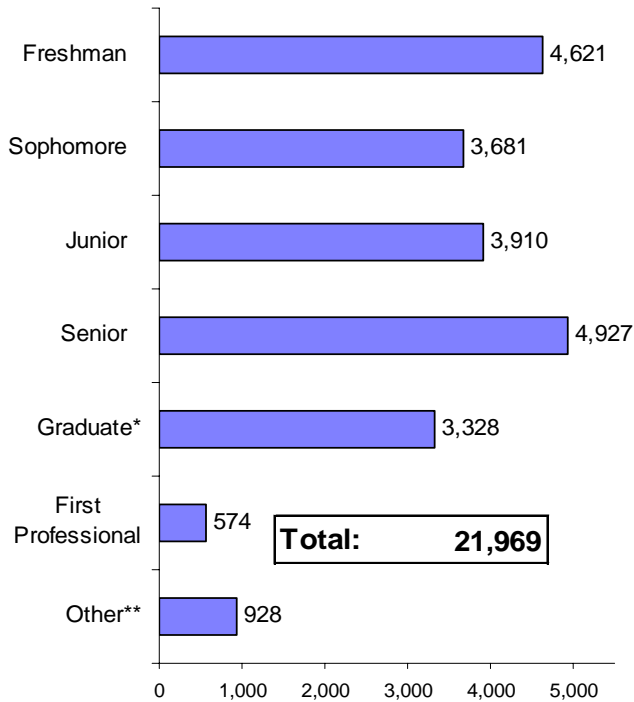

## Headcount Enrollment by Class Standing



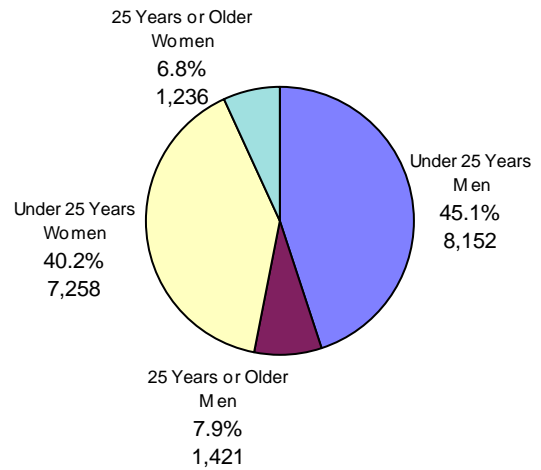

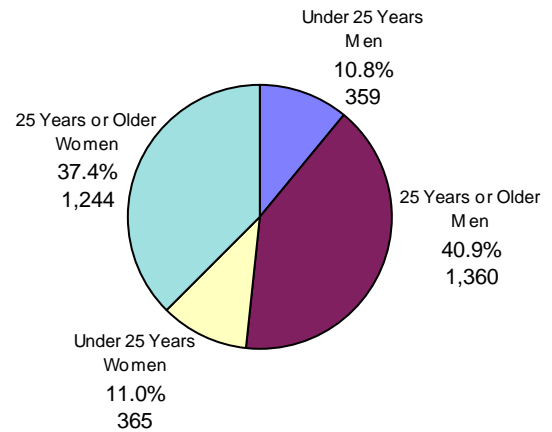

## Enrollment by Gender and Student Level

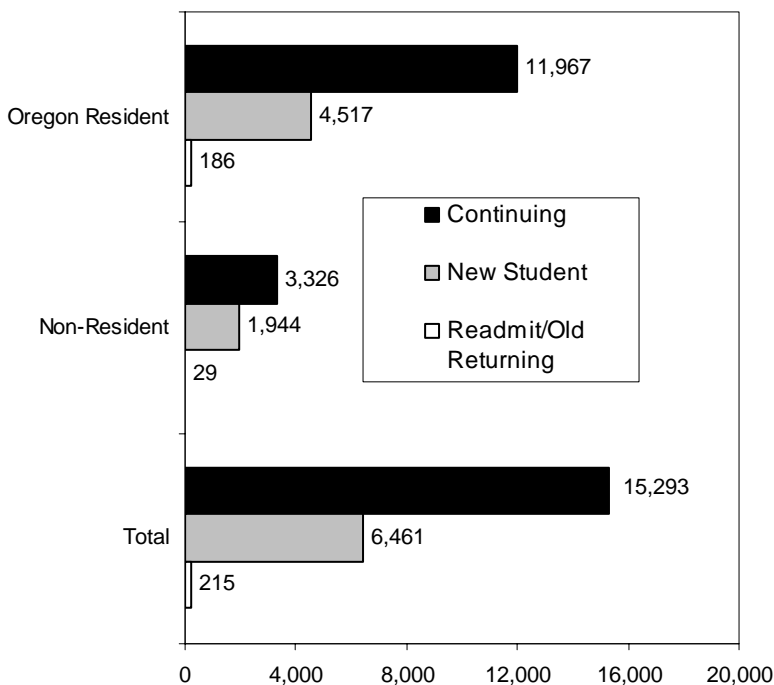

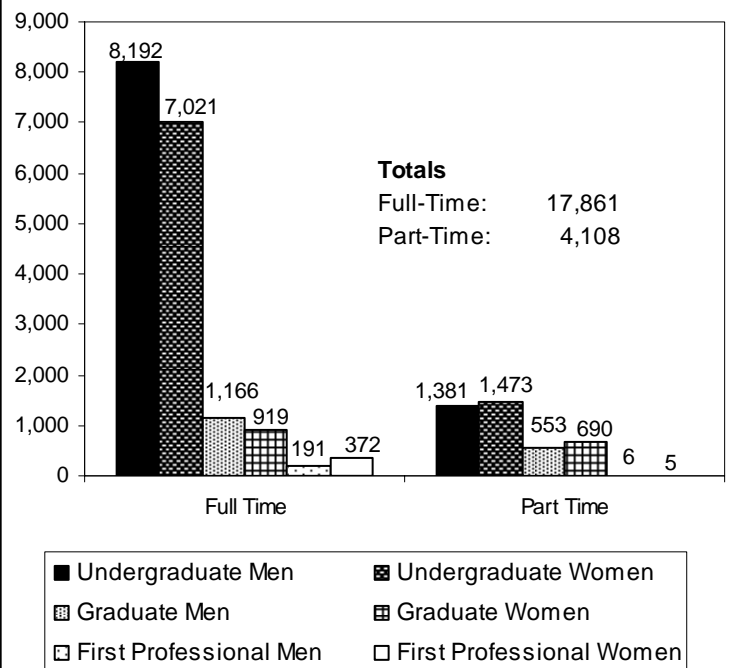

## Student Enrollment Full Time and Part Time, by Gender

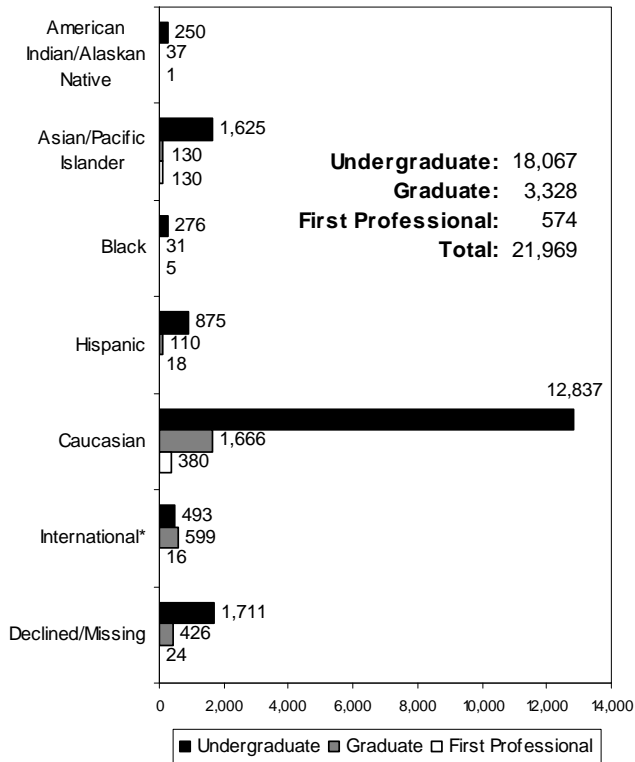

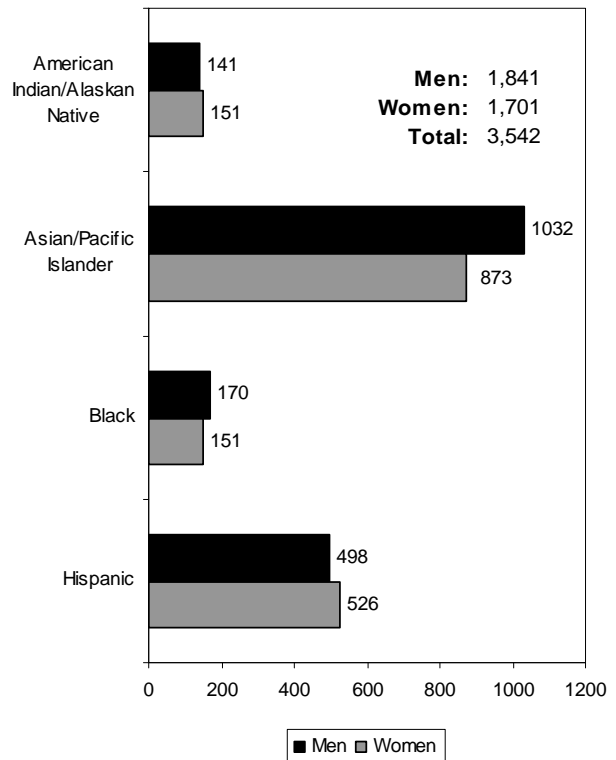

### Ethnicity — All Students — by Level

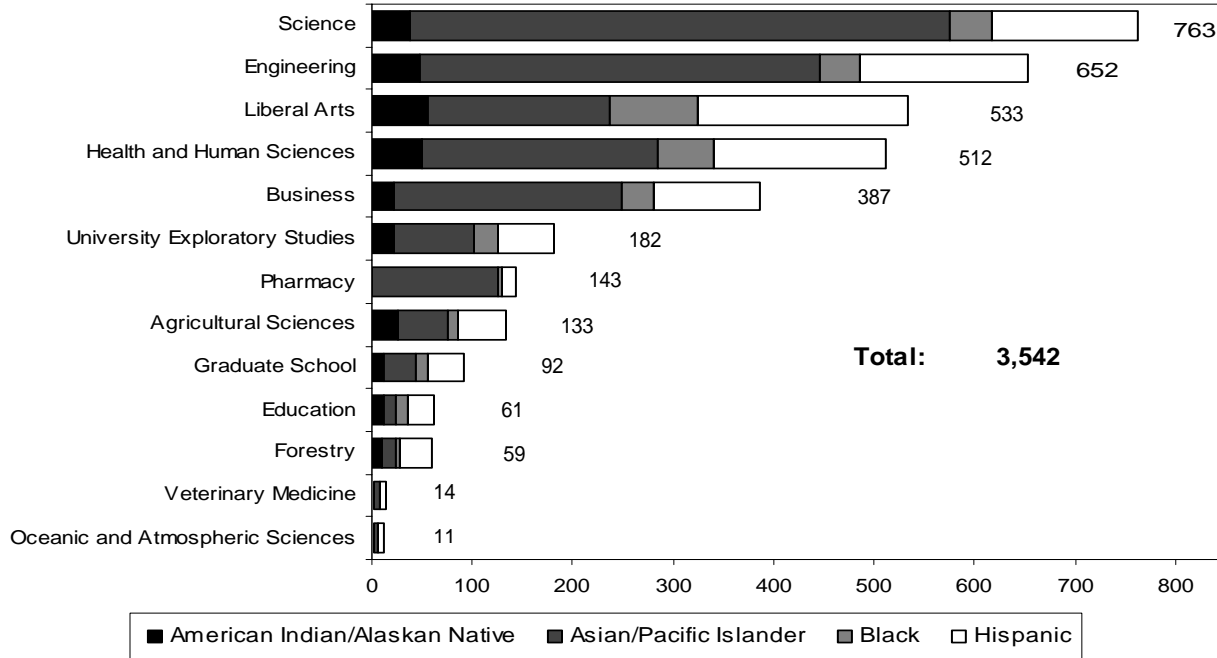


### U.S. Minorities by Gender

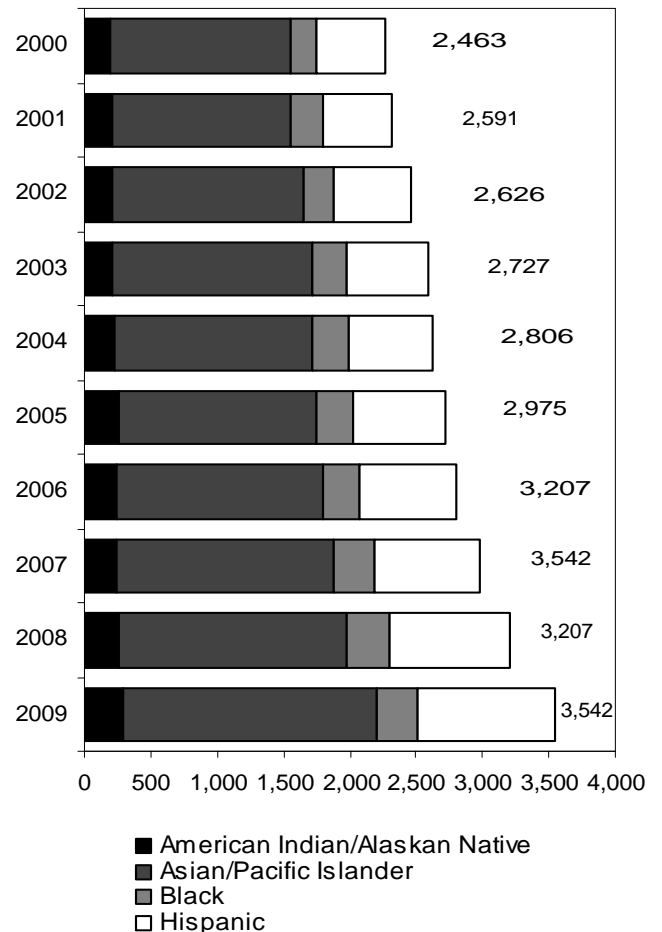

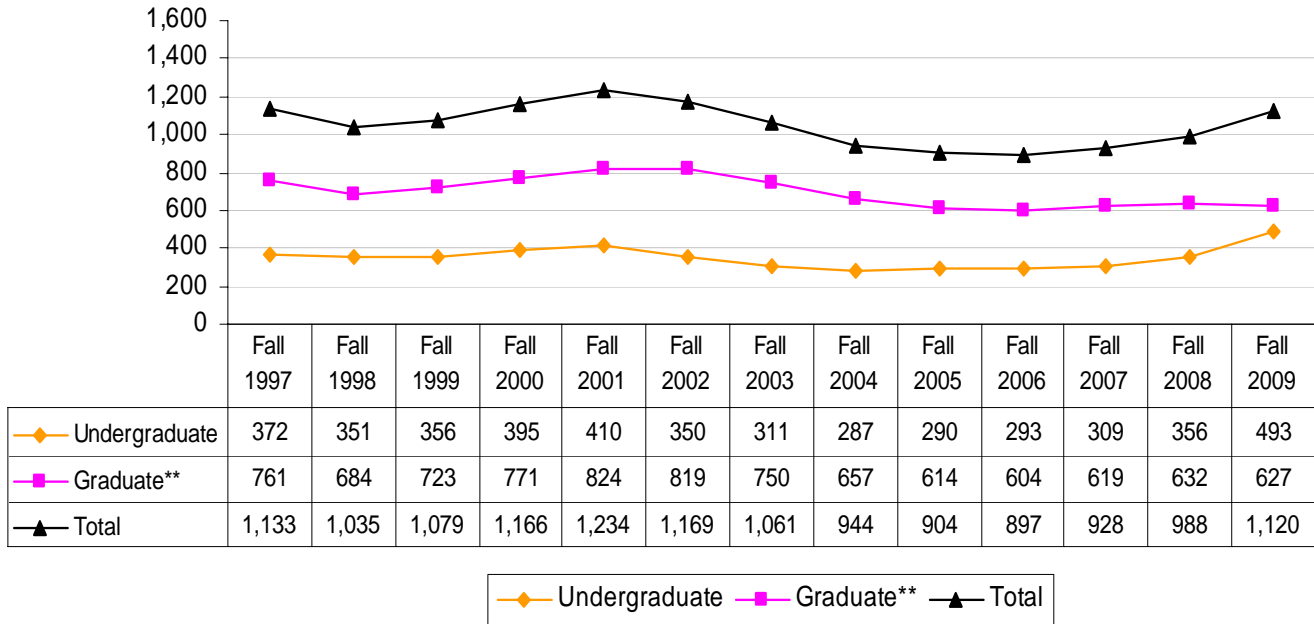

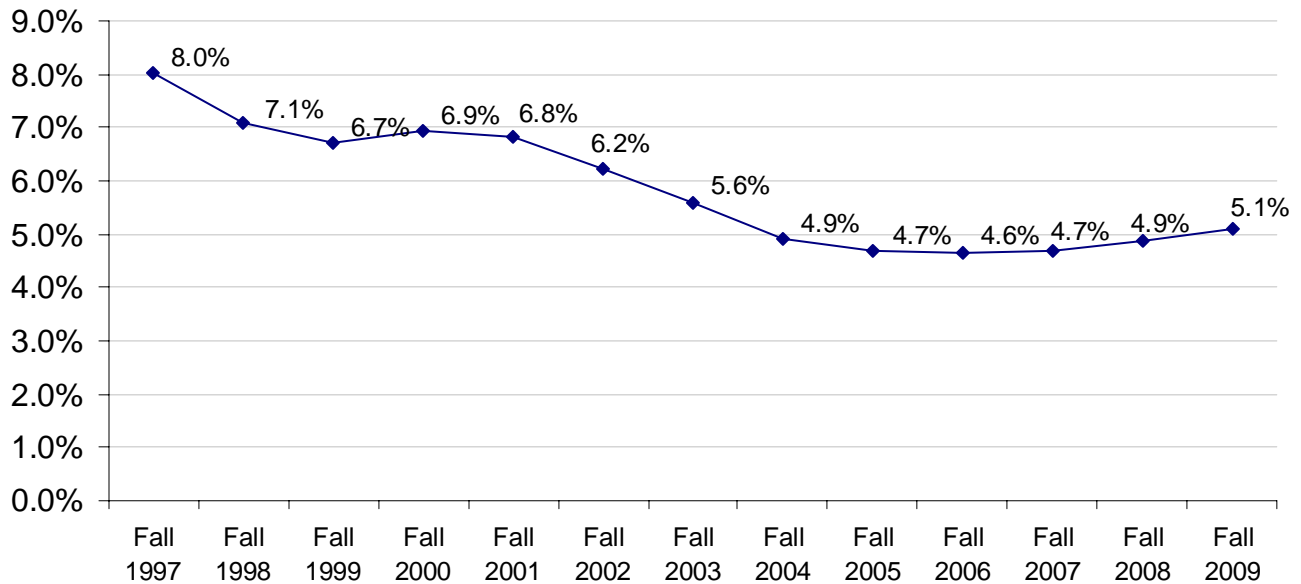

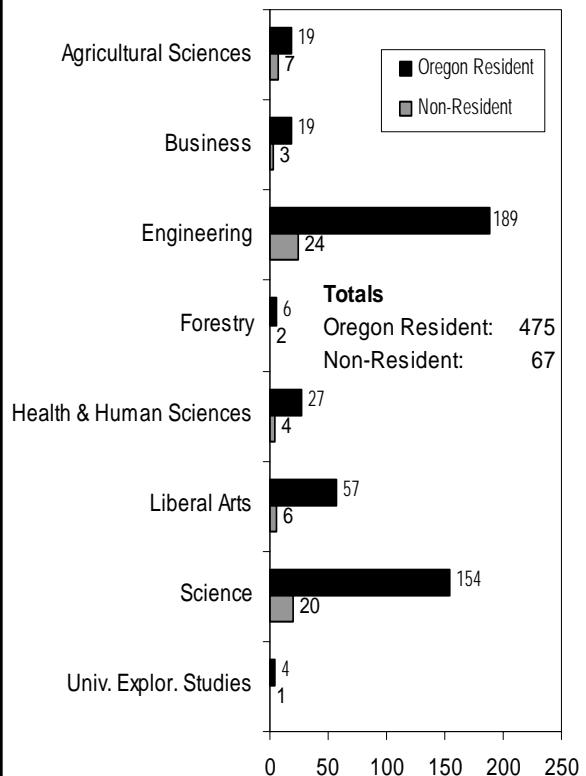

## Highlights

- For Fall 2009, total enrollment was 21,969 students.
- When Fall 2008 and Fall 2009 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 1,649 students or 8.1% (from 20,320 to 21,969), the FTE increased by 7.9%, and the Student Credit Hours increased by 8.0%.
- The number of part-time students increased by 9.1% (from 3,764 to 4,108).
- When compared to Fall 2008, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 1,394 students, or 8.4% (from 16,673 to 18,067); the graduate enrollment increased by 7.5% (from 3,095 to 3,328); the first professional enrollment increased by 4.0% (from 552 to 574).
- When compared to Fall 2008, Oregon residents increased by 5.4%; non-resident students including those from other U.S. states and international students increased by 17.7%; and international student enrollment increased by 13.4%.
- University Honors College had an enrollment of 542.
- INTO OSU had a total enrollment of 284: 197 in Academic English program, and 87 in Undergraduate Pathway program.
- The College of Engineering had the largest student enrollment (4,399) when compared to the other academic units.
- OSU Extended Campus had 4,282 students, an increase of 19.8% compared to 2008. These students took 19,959 credits, of which 38.2% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 24.7% were from the College of Science.
- The percentage of U.S. minority students was 16.1% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 10.4% when compared to Fall 2008 (from 3,207 to 3,542).
- Most popular undergraduate majors for Fall 2009 were:

- The ratio of Admitted to Applications was 71.5%. The ratio of Enrolled to Admitted was 50.7%.
