#### By Residency\* and Student Level







For Fall 2014, total enrollment was 28,886 students.

■ When Fall 2013 and Fall 2014 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 961 students or 3.4% (from 27,925 to 28,886), the FTE increased by 1.5%, and the Student Credit Hours increased by 1.5%.

■ The number of part-time students increased by 14.6% (from 5,962 to 6,834).

■ When compared to Fall 2013, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 742 students, or 3.2% (from 23,161 to 23,903); the graduate enrollment increased by 5.5% (from 4,179 to 4,410); the first professional enrollment decreased by 2.1% (from 585 to 573).

■ When compared to Fall 2013, Oregon residents increased by 0.3%; non-resident increased by 8.9%; and international student enrollment increased by 12.0%.

University Honors College had an enrollment of 990.

INTO OSU had a total enrollment of 430: 712 in Academic English program, 81 INTO OSU General Pathways, 280 INTO OSU Graduate Pathways, 51 in OSU-Student-Cap, 6 in Study Aboad, and 366 in Undergraduate Pathway program. ■ The College of Engineering had the largest student enrollment (7,617) when compared to the other academic units.

■ OSU Extended Campus had 8,862 students, an increase of 14.2% compared to 2013. These students took 46,278 credits, of which 32.8% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 16.1% were from the College of Agricultural Sciences.

■ The percentage of U.S. minority students was 21.9% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 9.6% when compared to Fall 2013 (from 5,764 to 6,320).
