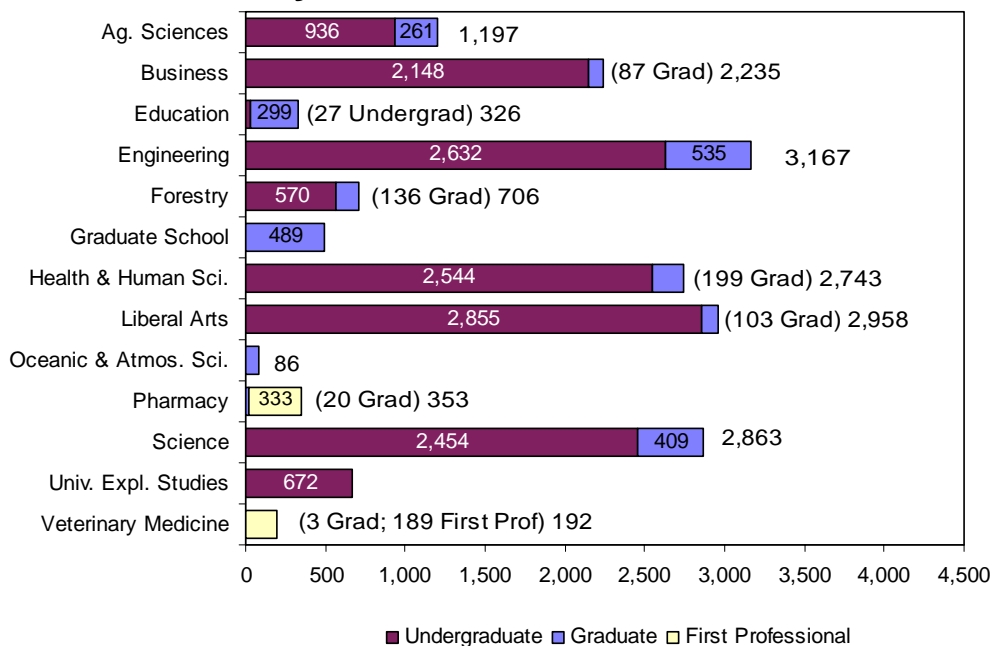

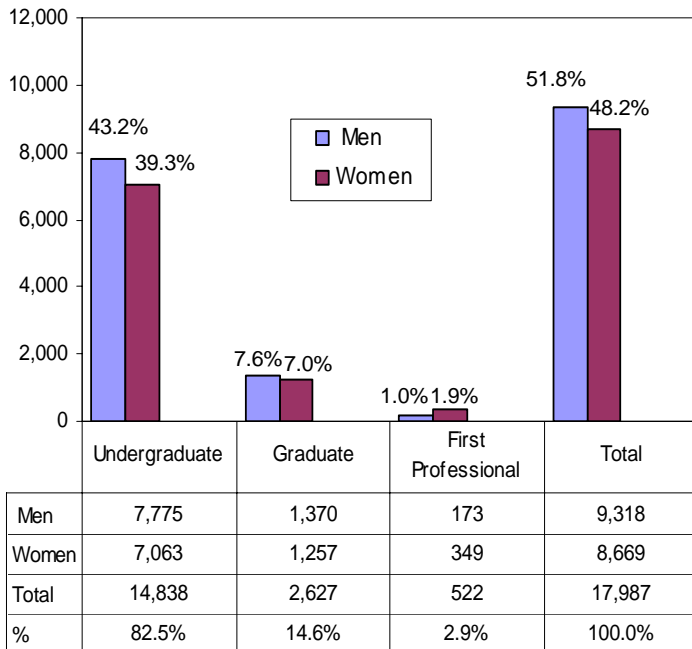

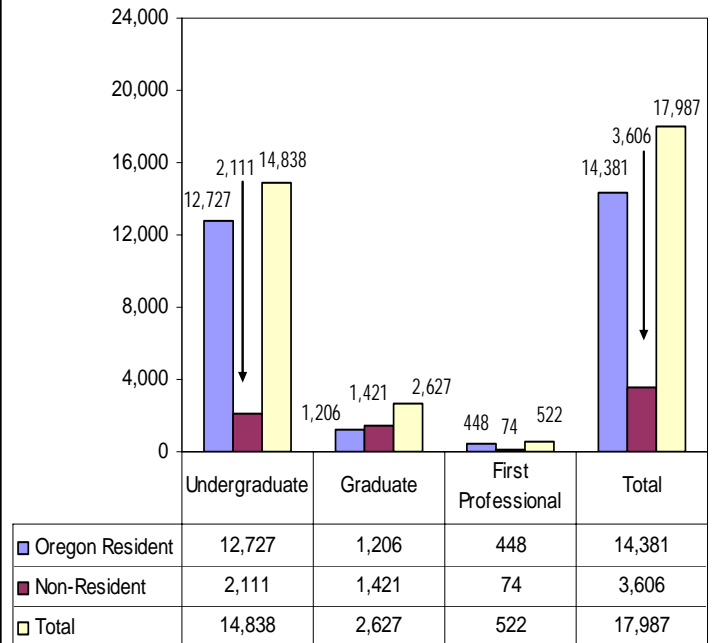

By Residency* and Student Level

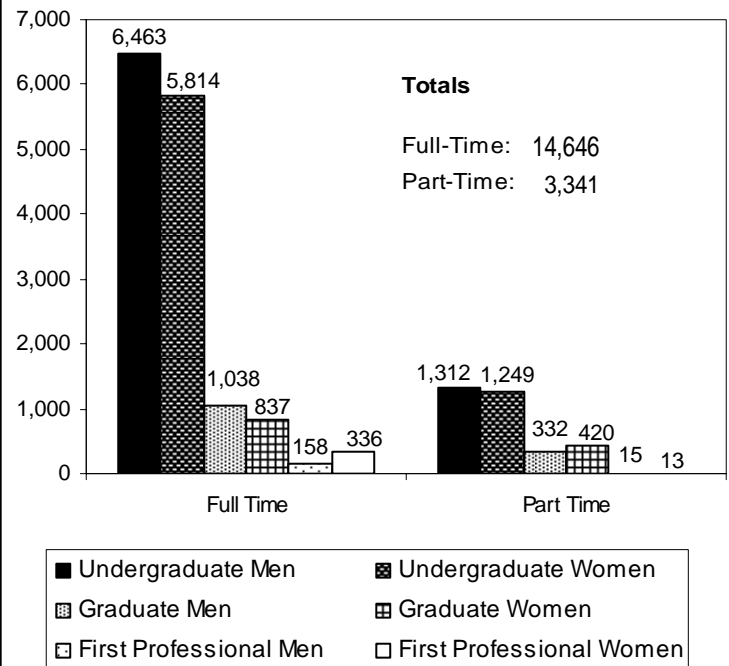

Student Enrollment Full Time and Part Time, by Gender

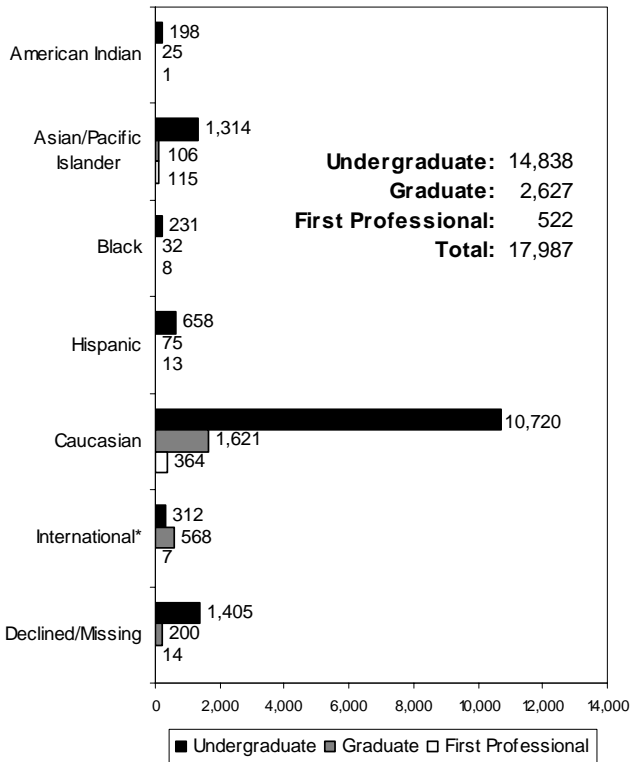

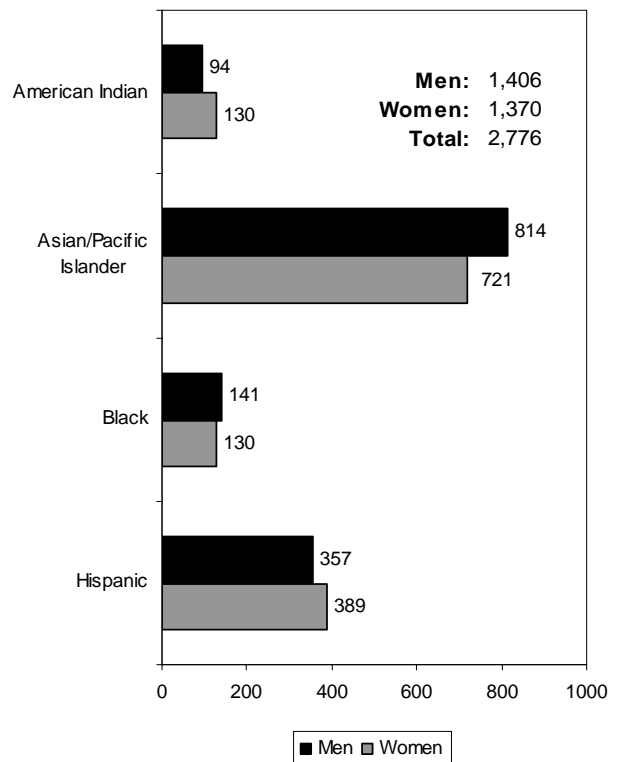

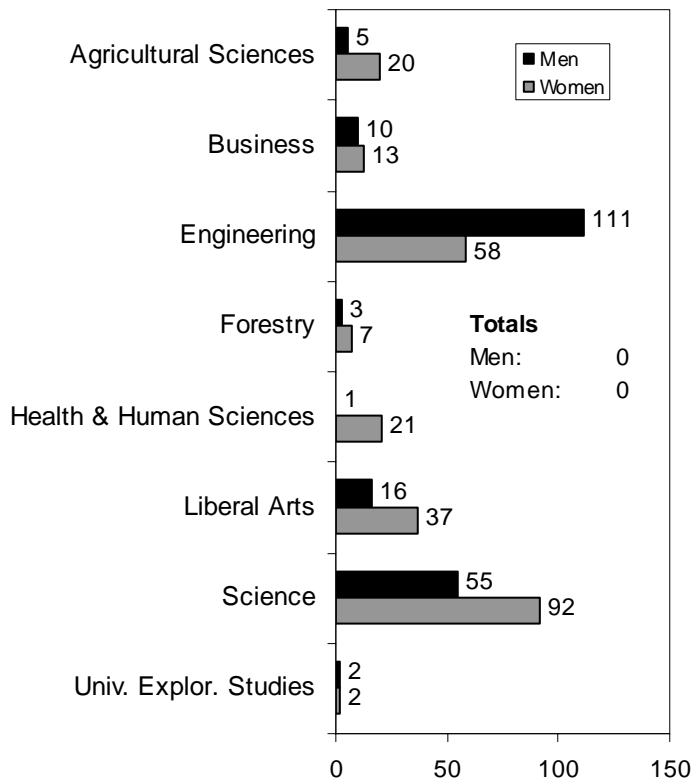

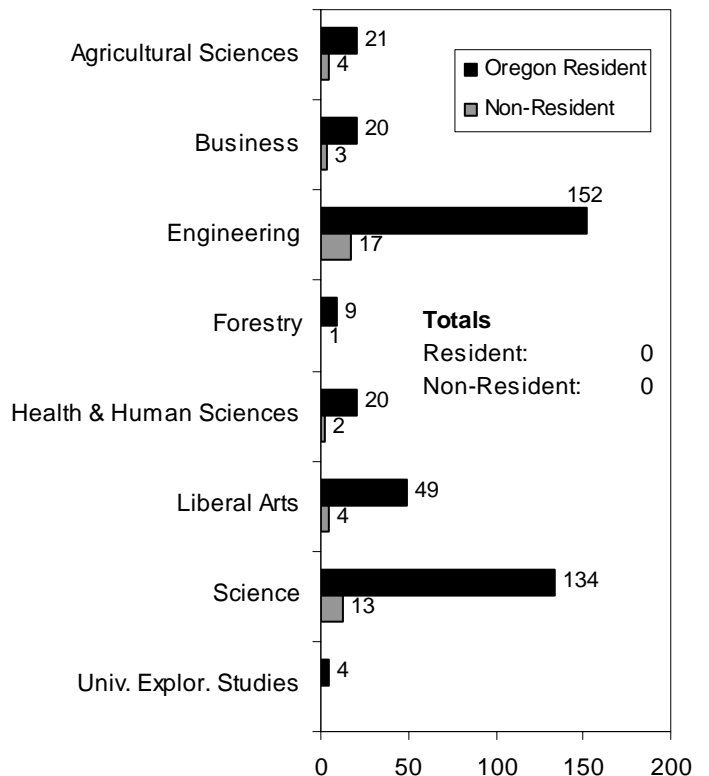

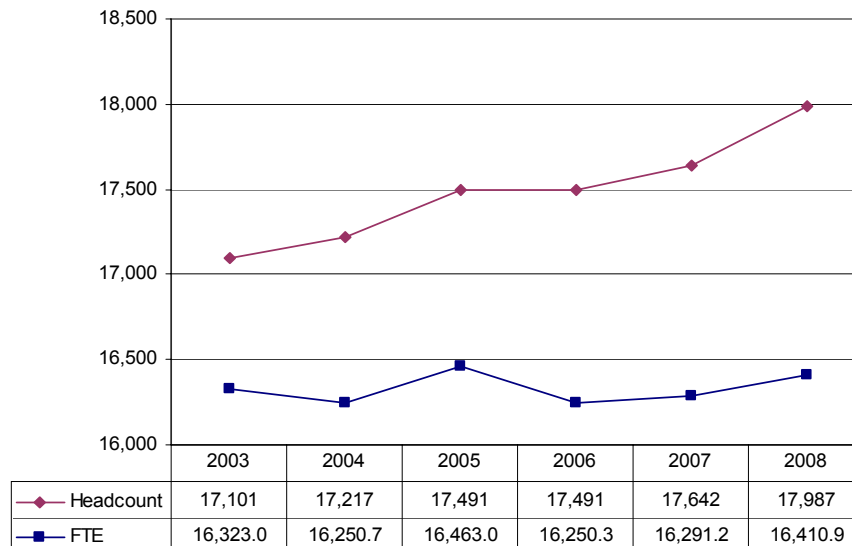

Highlights

- When Spring 2007 and Spring 2008 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 345 students, or 2.0% (from 17,642 to 17,987). At the same time, the total student FTE increased by 119.7, or 0.7% (from 16,291.2 to 16,410.9), and the student credit hours increased by 1,990, or 0.9% (from 229,914 to 231,904).
- When compared to Spring 2007, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 370 students, or 2.6% (from 14,468 to 14,838); the graduate enrollment decreased by 1.0% (from 2,653 to 2,627); the first professional enrollment increased by 0.2% (from 521 to 522).
- When compared to Spring 2007, Oregon residents increased by 0.7%; non-residents increased by 7.5%.
- International student enrollment increased by 5.3%.
- For Spring 2008, the percentage of U.S. minority students was 15.4% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 7.8% when compared to Spring 2007 (from 2,575 to 2,776).
- The College of Engineering, College of Liberal Arts, and College of Science had the largest student enrollments (3,167, 2,958, and 2,863 respectively) when compared to the other academic units.

- OSU Extended Campus had 3,045 students, an increase of 2.4% compared to Spring 2007. These students took 13,628 credits, of which 45.4% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 24.6% were from the College of Science.
- During Spring 2008, a total of 599 students received services from OSU Cascades Campus.
- Other increases that occurred when comparing Spring 2007 and Spring 2008 are as follows:
 - Part-time students: 5.0%
 - Undergraduate students age 25 and older: 3.0%
 - Female students: 2.6%
 - Undergraduate students under age 25: 2.5%
 - Graduate students under age 25: 1.6%
 - Male students: 1.4%
 - Full-time students: 1.3%
 - First Professional students under age 25: 0.5%
- Other decreases that occurred when comparing Spring 2007 and Spring 2008 are as follows:
 - Graduate students age 25 and older: -1.6%
