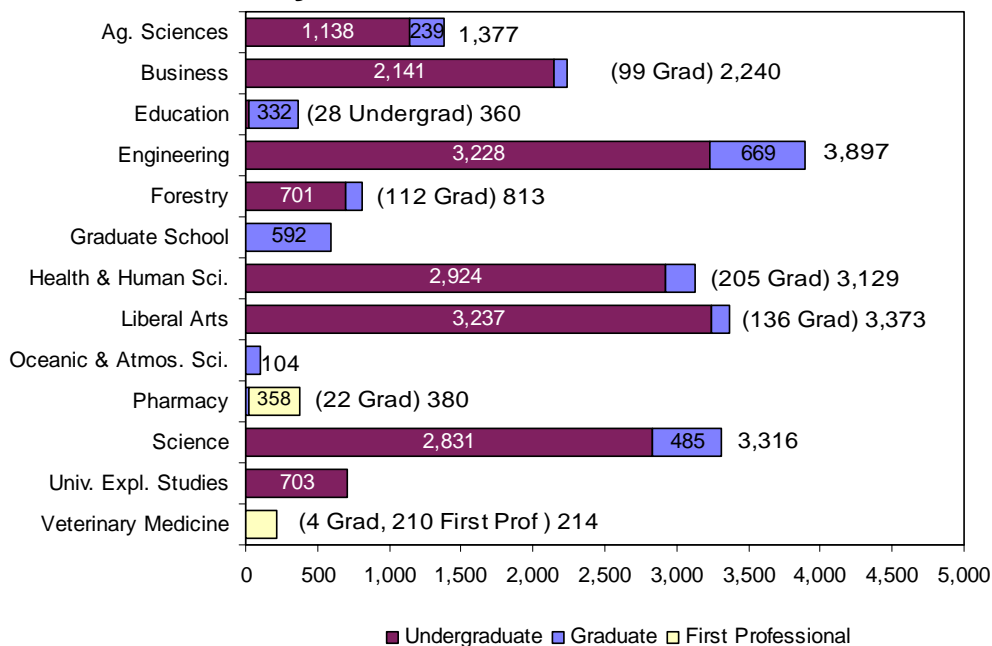

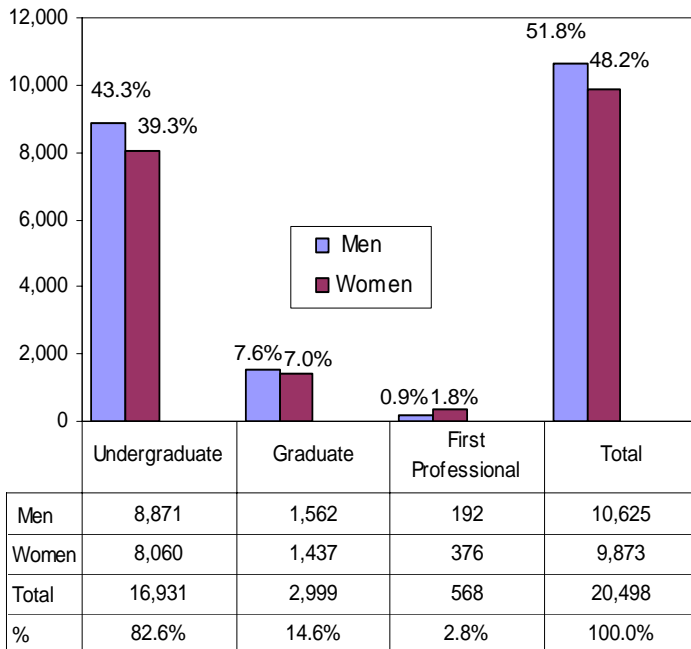

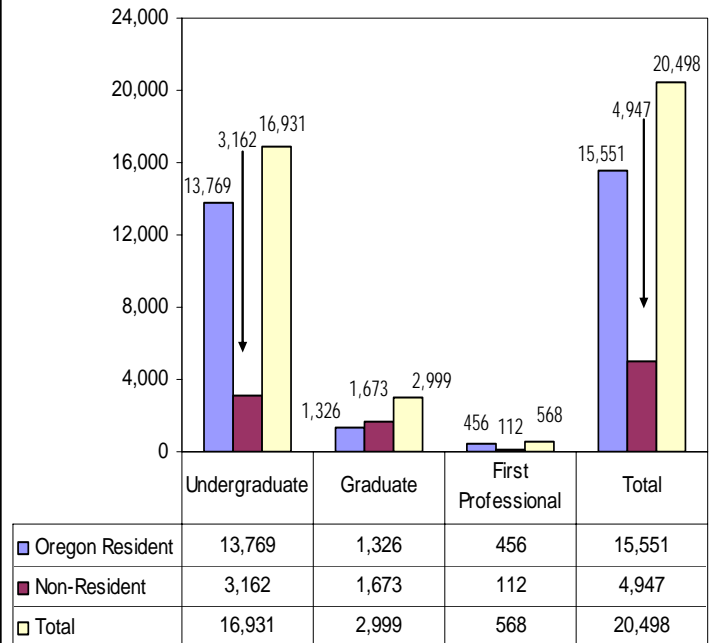

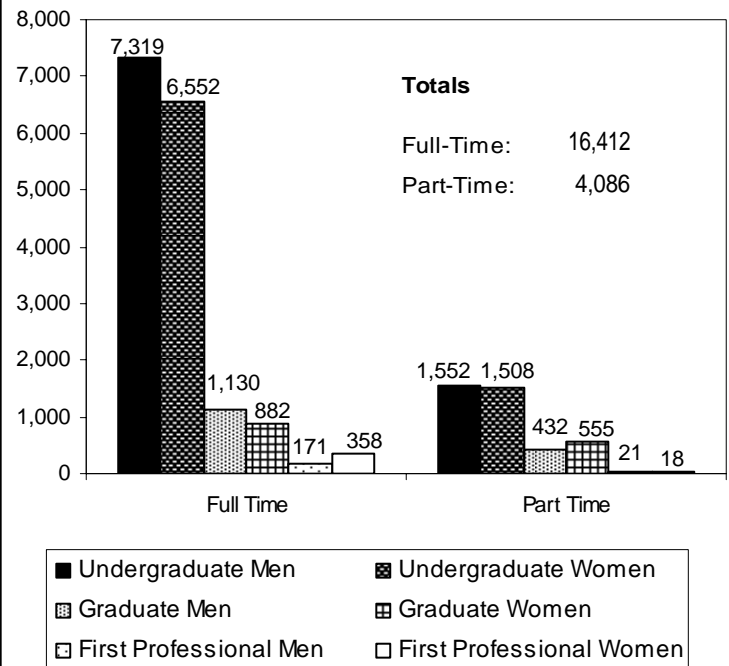

Student Enrollment Full Time and Part Time, by Gender

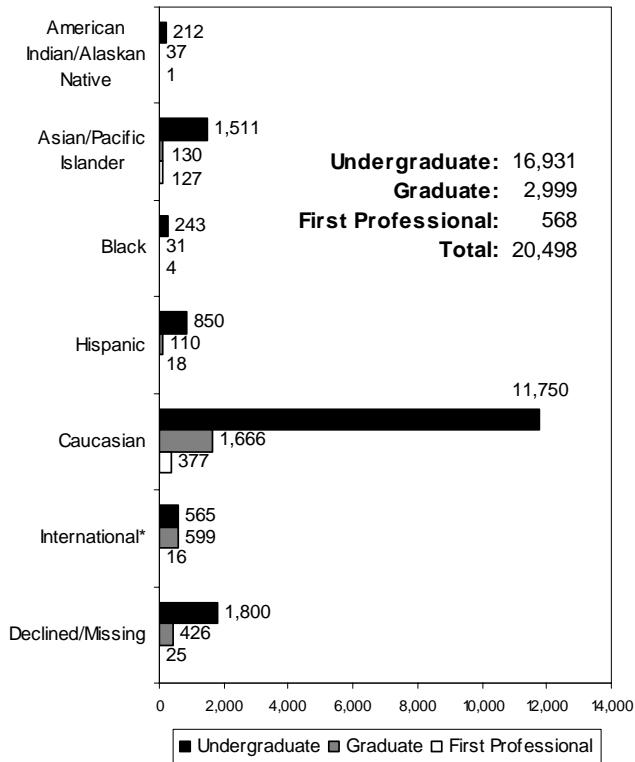

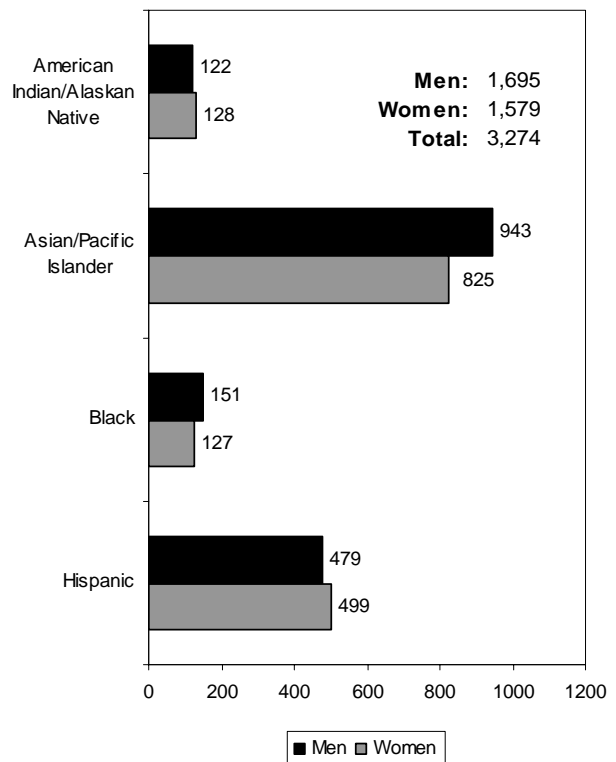

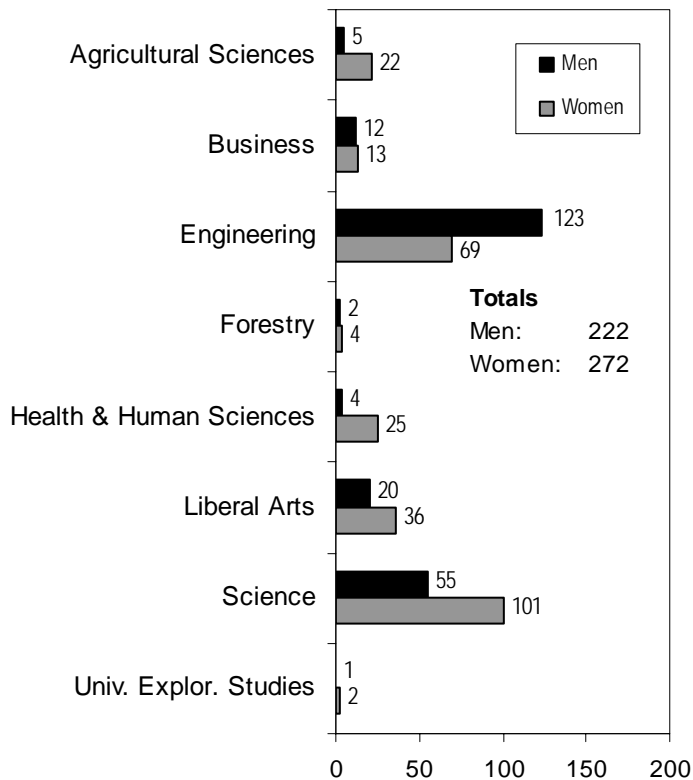

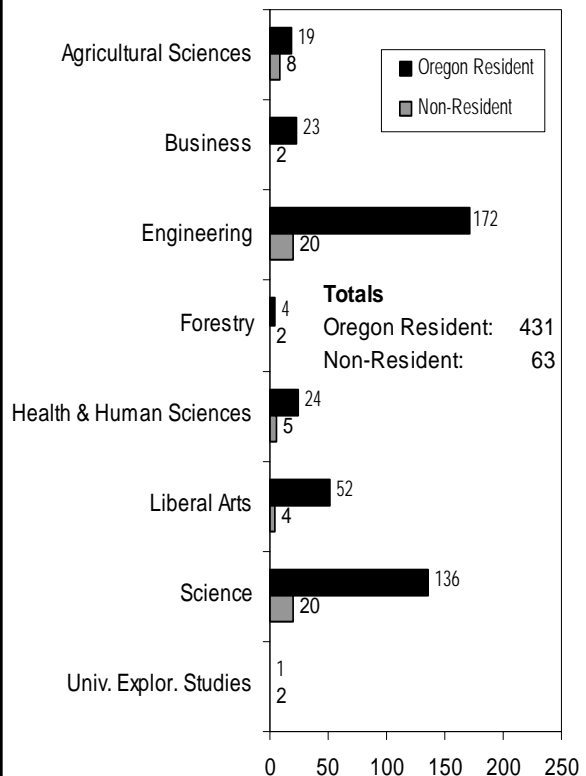

Highlights

■ When Spring 2009 and Spring 2010 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 1,647 students, or 8.7% (from 18,851 to 20,498). At the same time, the total student FTE increased by 1,403.3, or 8.2% (from 17,111.0 to 18,514.3), and the student credit hours increased by 20,134, or 8.3% (from 241,780 to 261,914).

■ When compared to Spring 2009, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 1,482 students, or 9.6% (from 15,449 to 16,931); the graduate enrollment increased by (from 2,859 to 2,999); the first professional enrollment increased by 4.6% (from 543 to 568).

■ When compared to Spring 2009, Oregon residents increased by 5.8%; non-residents increased by 19.3%.

■ International student enrollment increased by 30.7%.

■ For Spring 2010, the percentage of U.S. minority students was 16.0% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 8.5% when compared to Spring 2009 (from 3,018 to 3,274).

■ The College of Engineering, College of Liberal Arts, and College of Science had the largest student enrollments (3,897, 3,373, and 3,316 respectively) when compared to the other academic units.

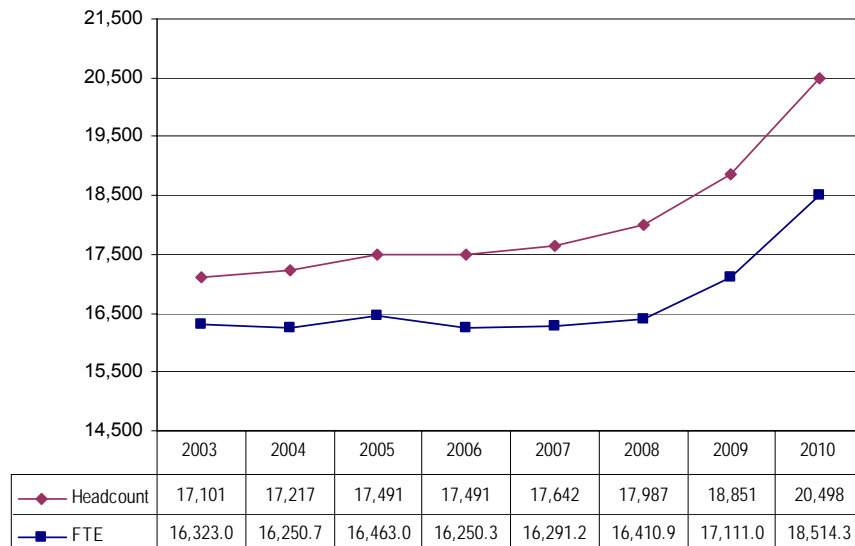
■ OSU Extended Campus had 4,641 students, an increase of 23.1% compared to . These students took 21,869 credits, of which 39.5% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 20.9% were from the College of Science.

■ During Spring 2010, a total of 816 students received services from OSU Cascades Campus.

■ Other increases that occurred when comparing Spring 2009 and Spring 2010 are as follows:

- Undergraduate students age 25 and older: 17.5%
- Female students: 9.4%
- Graduate students under age 25: 8.9%
- Full-time students: 8.7%
- Part-time students: 8.7%
- Undergraduate students under age 25: 8.2%
- Male students: 8.1%
- First Professional students under age 25: 7.8%
- Graduate students age 25 and older: 3.9%
- First Professional students 25 and older: 2.7%
