







Student Enrollment Full Time and Part Time, by Gender









Highlights

■ When Spring 2010 and Spring 2011 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 1,772 students, or 8.6% (from 20,498 to 22,270). At the same time, the total student FTE increased by 1,473.4, or 8.0% (from 18,514.3 to 19,987.7), and the student credit hours increased by 20,838, or 8.0% (from 261,914 to 282,752).

■ When compared to Spring 2010, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 1,478 students, or 8.7% (from 16,931 to 18,409); the graduate enrollment increased by 9.6% (from 2,999 to 3,287); the first professional enrollment increased by 1.1% (from 568 to 574).

■ When compared to Spring 2010, Oregon residents increased by 2.6%; non-residents increased by 27.6%.

■ International student enrollment increased by 36.5%.

■ For Spring 2011, the percentage of U.S. minority students was 17.6% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 19.7% when compared to Spring 2010 (from 3,274 to 3,918).

■ The College of Engineering, College of Liberal Arts, and College of Science had the largest student enrollments (4,346, 3,562, and 3,502 respectively) when compared to the other academic units.


■ OSU Extended Campus had 5,575 students, an increase of 20.1% compared to Spring 2010. These students took 27,200 credits, of which 41.6% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 23.1% were from the College of Science.

■ During Spring 2011, a total of 866 students received services from OSU Cascades Campus.

■ Other increases that occurred when comparing Spring 2010 and Spring 2011 are as follows:

- Non-Resident Undergraduate: 33.3%
- Graduate students under age 25: 25.1%
- Non-Resident Graduate: 17.8%
- Undergraduate students age 25 and older: 17.3%
- Non-Resident First Professional: 14.3%
- Part-time students: 11.7%
- Male students: 8.8%
- Female students: 8.4%
- Full-time students: 7.9%
- Undergraduate students under age 25: 7.1%
