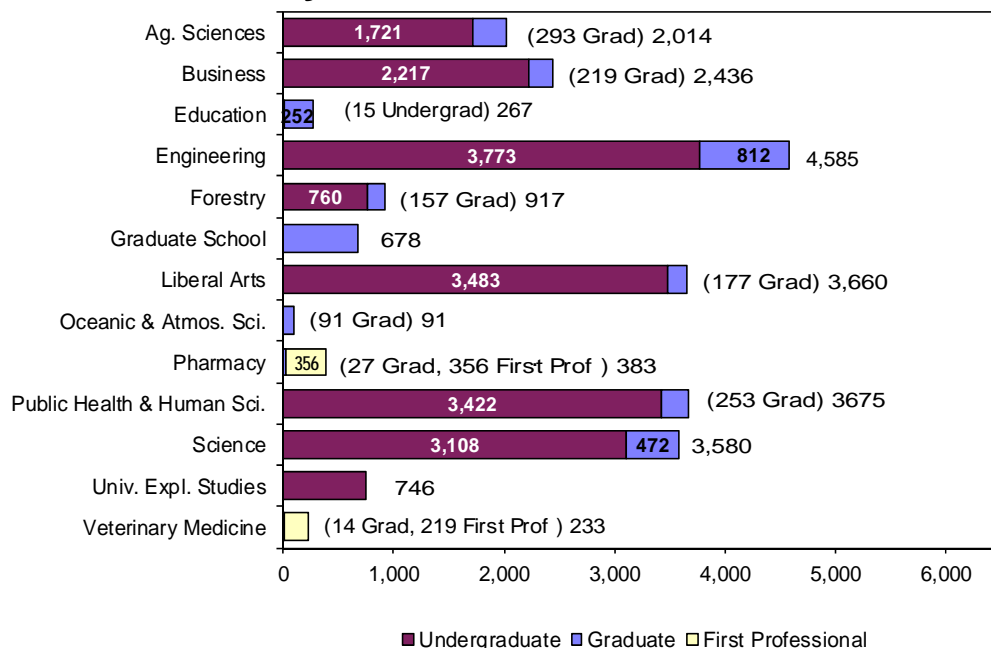

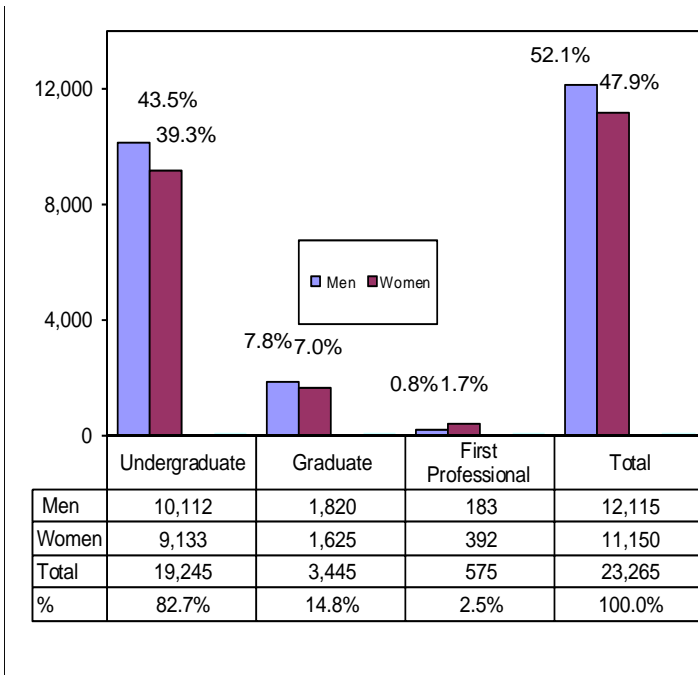

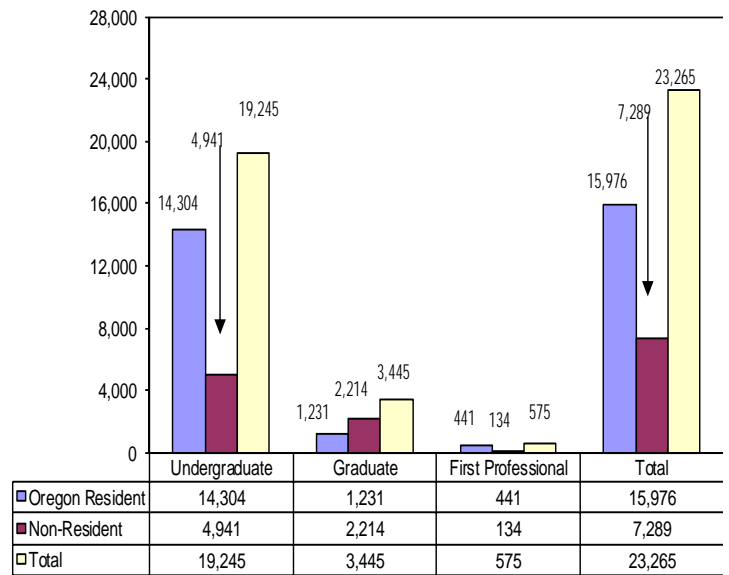

## By Residency\* and Student Level

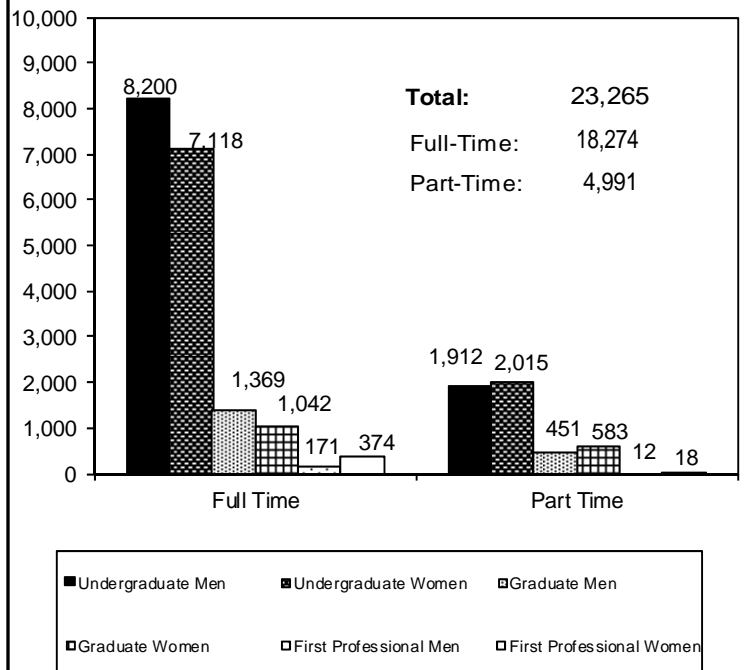

## Student Enrollment Full Time and Part Time, by Gender

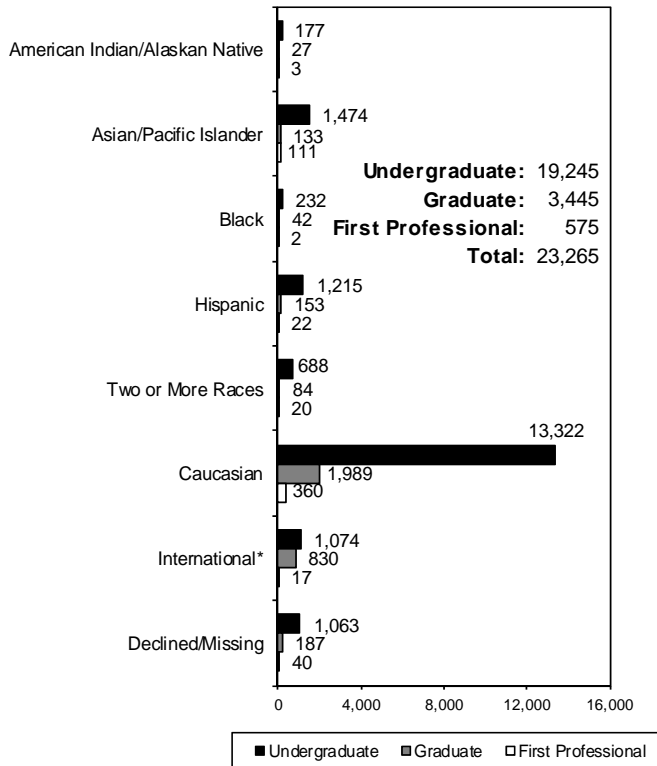

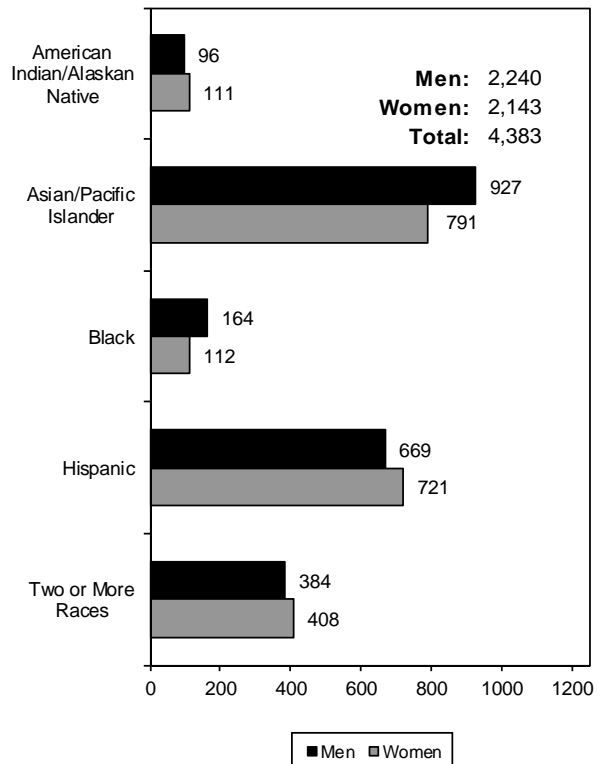

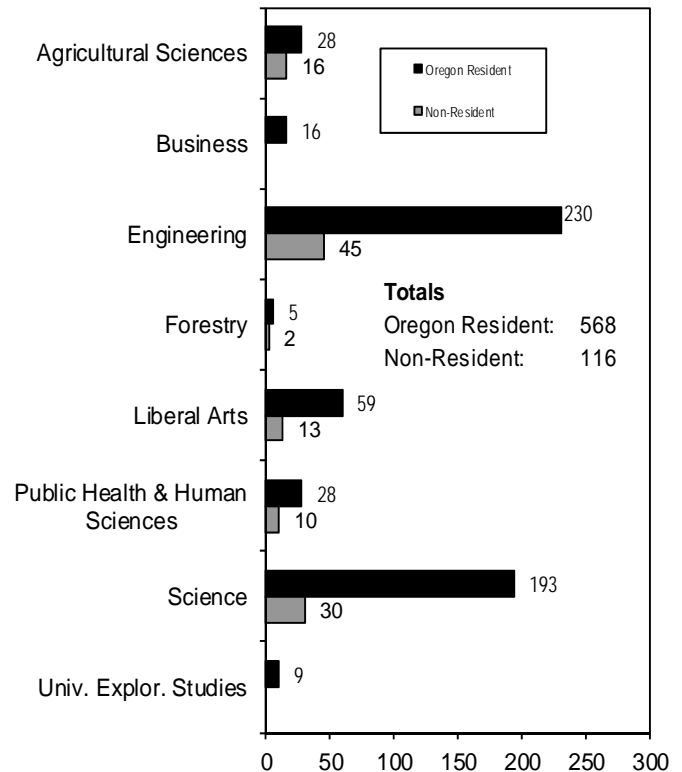

## Highlights

■ When Spring 2011 and Spring 2012 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 995 students, or 4.5% (from 22,270 to 23,265). At the same time, the total student FTE increased by 624.6, or 3.1% (from 19,987.7 to 20,612.3), and the student credit hours increased by 8,637, or 3.1% (from 282,752 to 291,389).

■ When compared to Spring 2011, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 836 students, or 4.5% (from 18,409 to 19,245); the graduate enrollment increased by 4.8% (from 3,287 to 3,445); the first professional enrollment increased by 0.2% (from 574 to 575).

■ When compared to Spring 2011, Oregon residents increased by 0.1%; non-residents increased by 15.5%.

■ International student enrollment increased by 19.2%.

■ For Spring 2012, the percentage of U.S. minority students was 18.8% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 11.9% when compared to Spring 2011 (from 3,918 to 4,383).

■ The College of Engineering, College of Public Health and Human Sciences, and College of Liberal Arts had the largest student enrollments (4,585, 3,675, and 3,660 respectively) when compared to the other academic units.

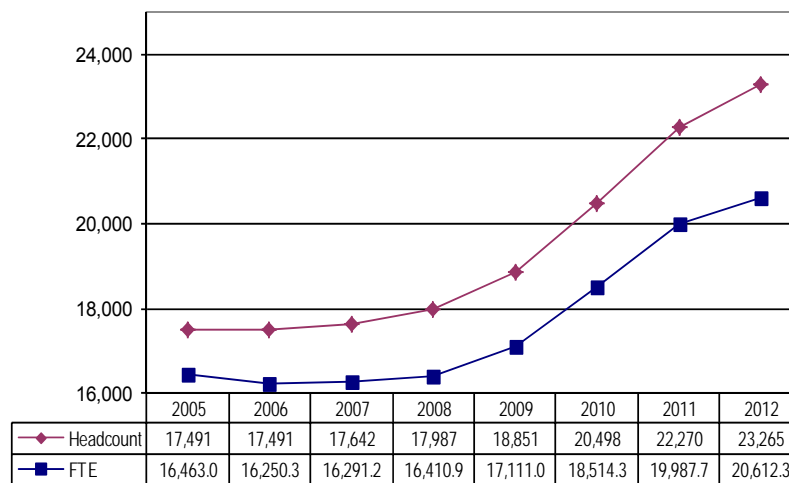
■ OSU Extended Campus had 6,100 students, an increase of 9.4% compared to Spring 2011. These students took 29,603 credits, of which 42.0% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 16.5% were from the College of Science.

■ During Spring 2012, a total of 936 students received services from OSU Cascades Campus.

■ Other increases that occurred when comparing Spring 2011 and Spring 2012 are as follows:

- Undergraduate students age 25 and older: 10.4%
- Part-time students: 9.4%
- Graduate students under age 25: 8.0%
- Male students: 4.8%
- Female students: 4.1%
- Graduate students age 25 and older: 3.9%
- Undergraduate students under age 25: 3.3%
- Full-time students: 3.2%
- First Professional students 25 and older: 0.9%
