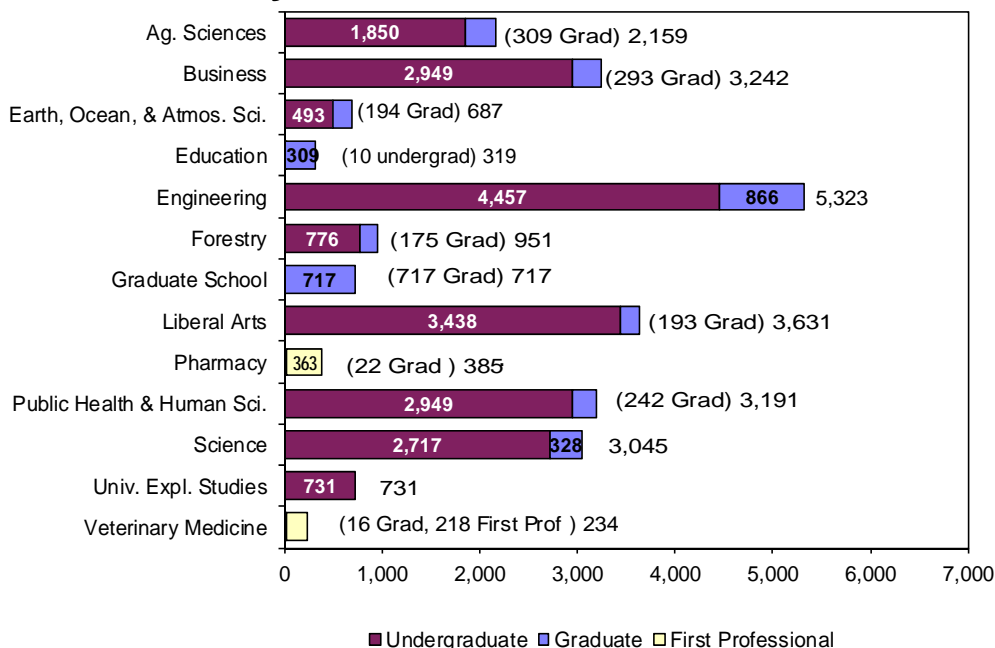

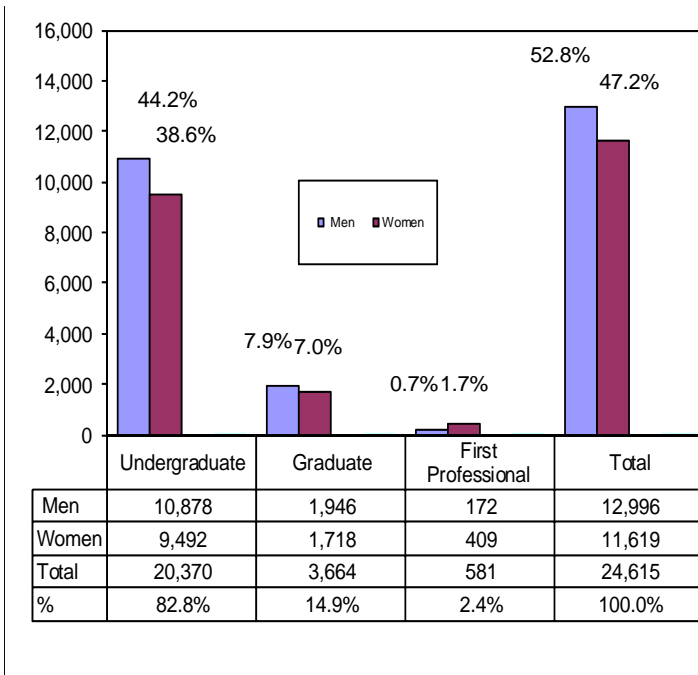

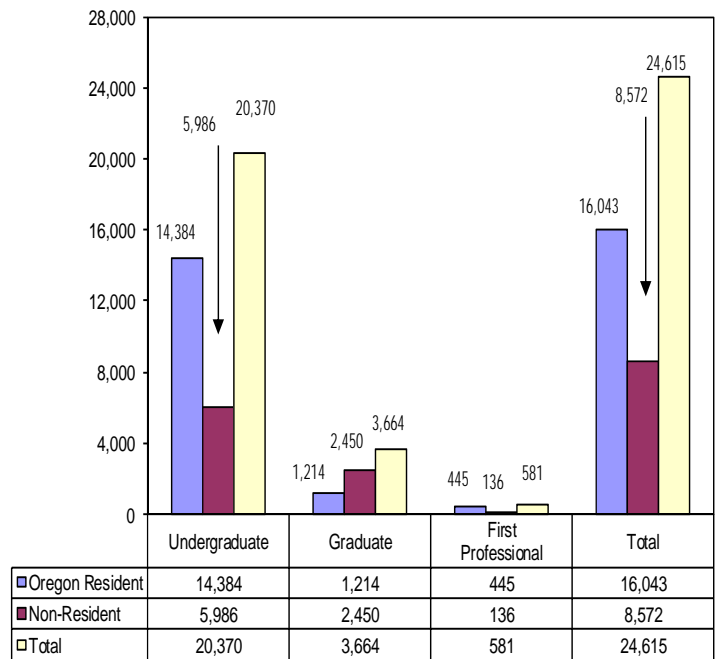

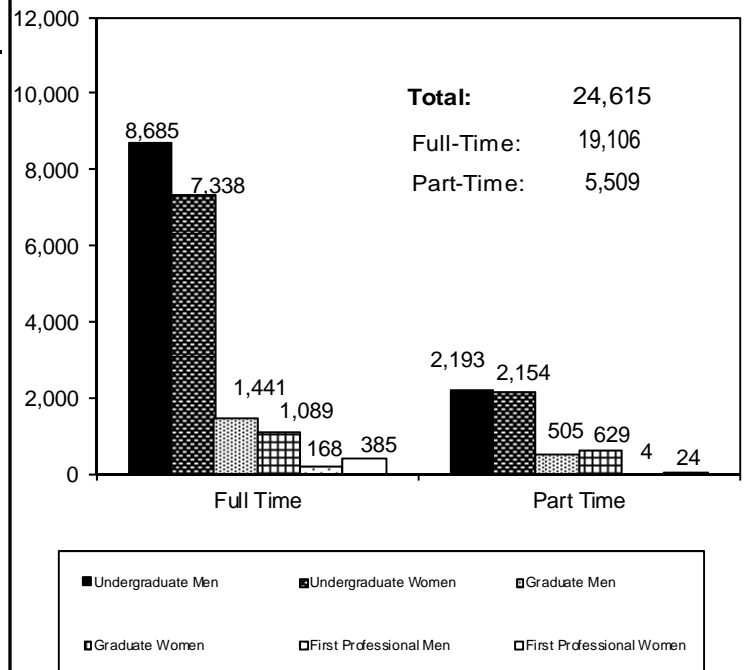

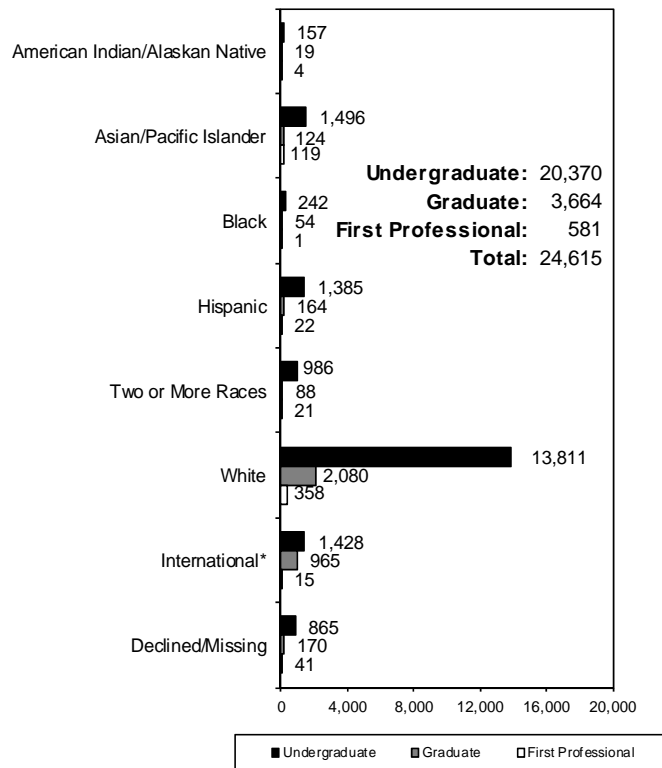
Student Enrollment Full Time and Part Time, by Gender



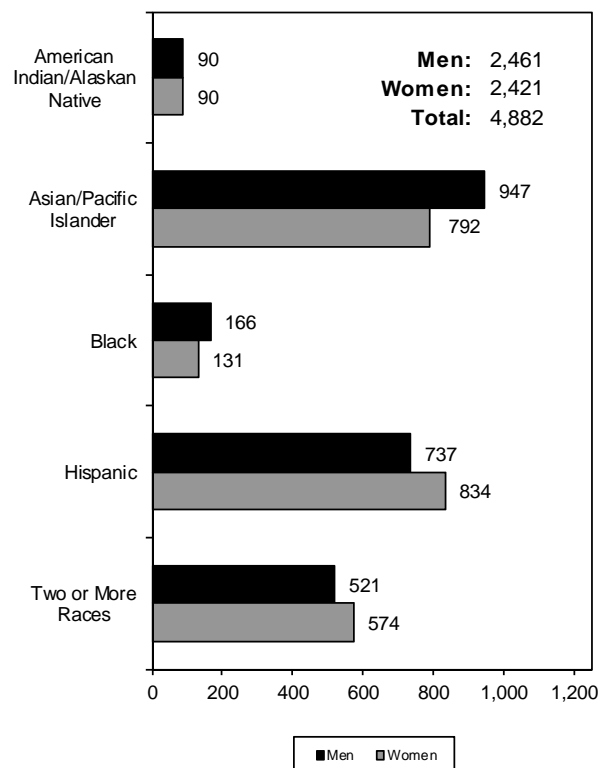

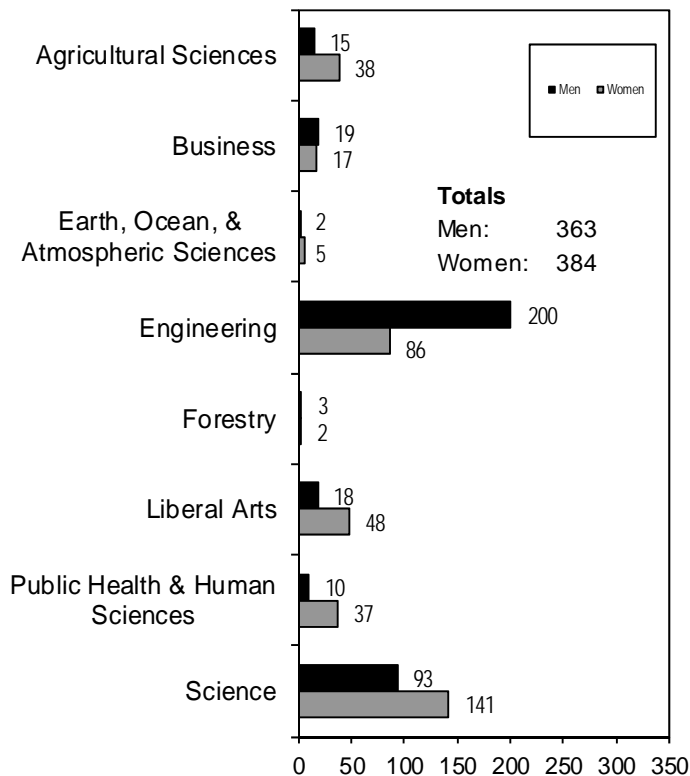

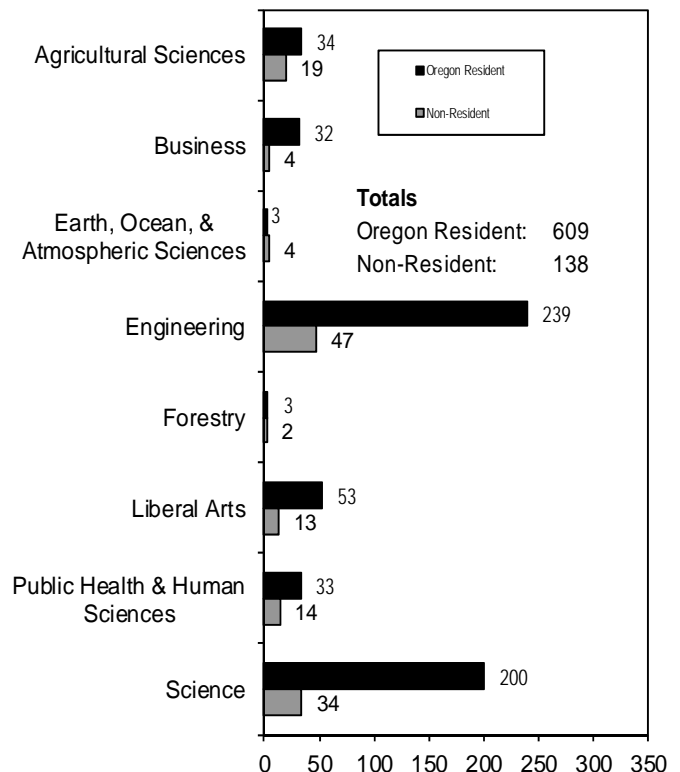

Highlights

■ When Spring 2012 and Spring 2013 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 1,350 students, or 5.8% (from 23,265 to 24,615). At the same time, the total student FTE increased by 1,040.9, or 5.0% (from 20,612.3 to 21,653.2), and the student credit hours increased by 14,991, or 5.1% (from 291,389 to 306,380).

■ When compared to Spring 2012, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 1,125 students, or 5.8% (from 19,245 to 20,370); the graduate enrollment increased by 6.4% (from 3,445 to 3,664); the first professional enrollment increased by 1.0% (from 575 to 581).

■ When compared to Spring 2012, Oregon residents increased by 0.4%; non-residents increased by 17.6%.

■ International student enrollment increased by 25.4%.

■ For Spring 2013, the percentage of U.S. minority students was 19.8% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 11.4% when compared to Spring 2012 (from 4,383 to 4,882).

■ The College of Engineering, College of Liberal Arts, and College of Business had the largest student enrollments (5,323, 3,631, and 3,242 respectively) when compared to the other academic units.

■ OSU Extended Campus had 7,355 students, an increase of 20.6% compared to Spring 2012. These students took 36,984 credits, of which 36.3% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 16.7% were from the College of Agricultural Sciences.

■ During Spring 2013, a total of 1,015 students received services from OSU Cascades Campus.

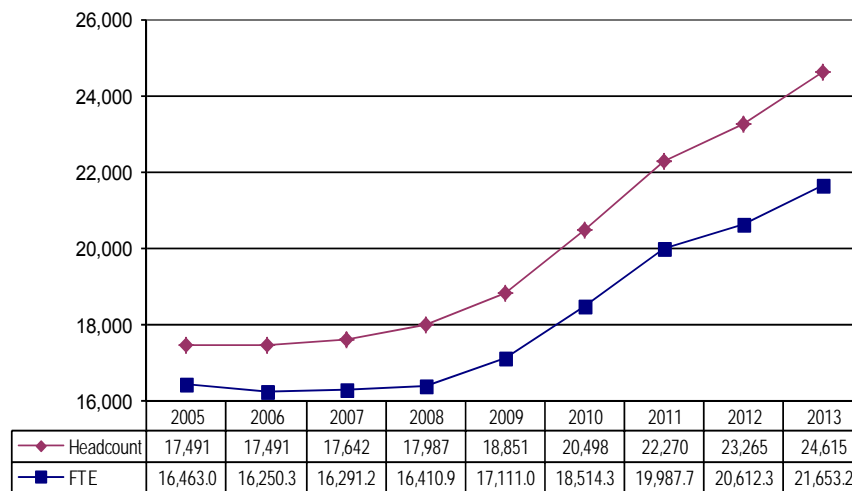
■ Other increases that occurred when comparing Spring 2012 and Spring 2013 are as follows:

- Undergraduate students age 25 and older: 13.1%
- Part-time students: 10.4%
- Graduate students under age 25: 8.6%
- Male students: 7.3%
- Graduate students age 25 and older: 5.7%
- Full-time students: 4.6%
- Undergraduate students under age 25: 4.2%
- Female students: 4.2%
- First Professional students 25 and older: 4.0%

■ Other decreases that occurred when comparing Spring 2012 and Spring 2013 are as follows:

- First Professional students under age 25: -3.6%
