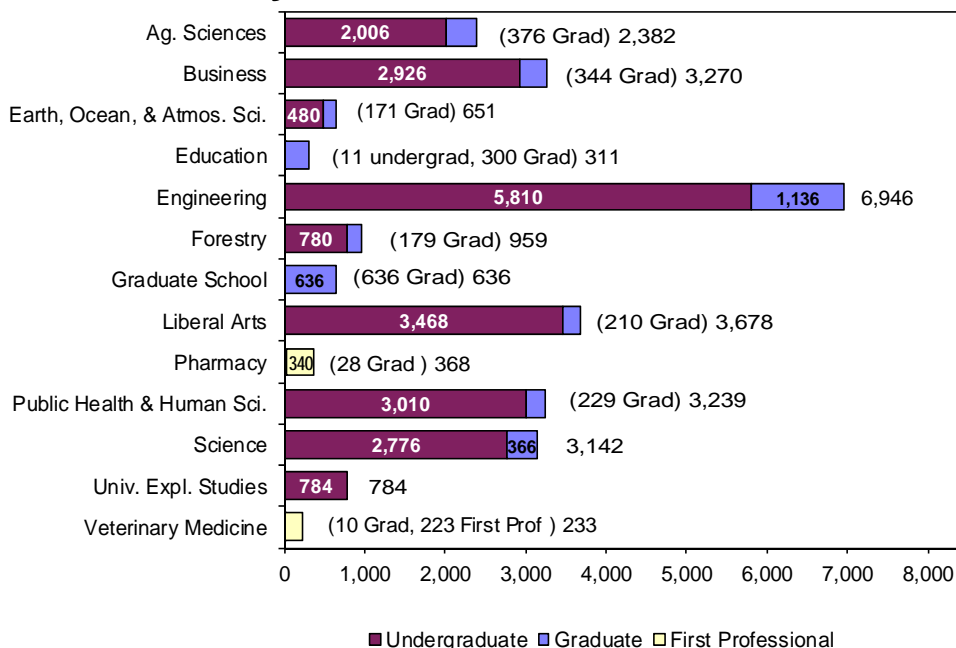

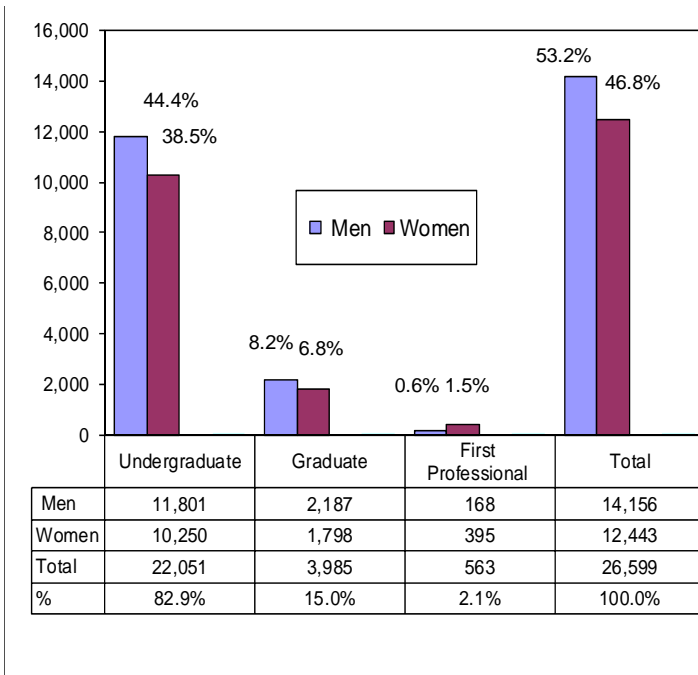

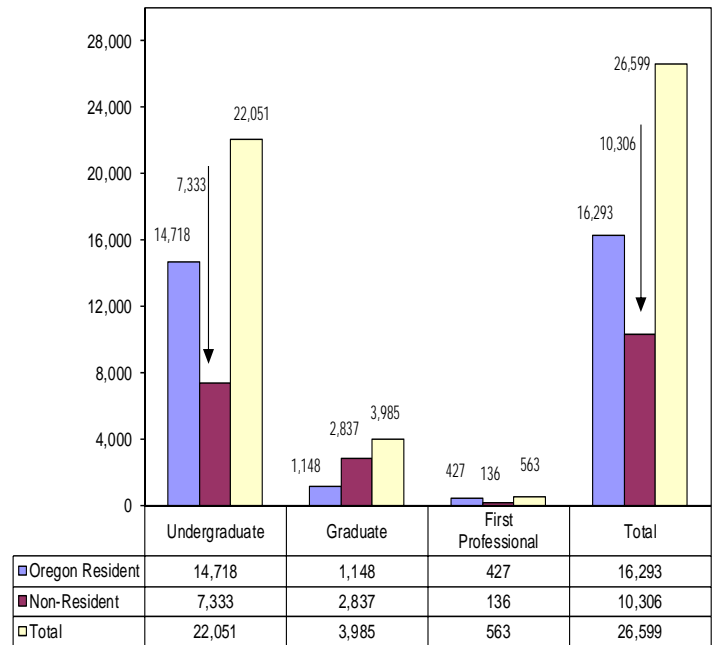

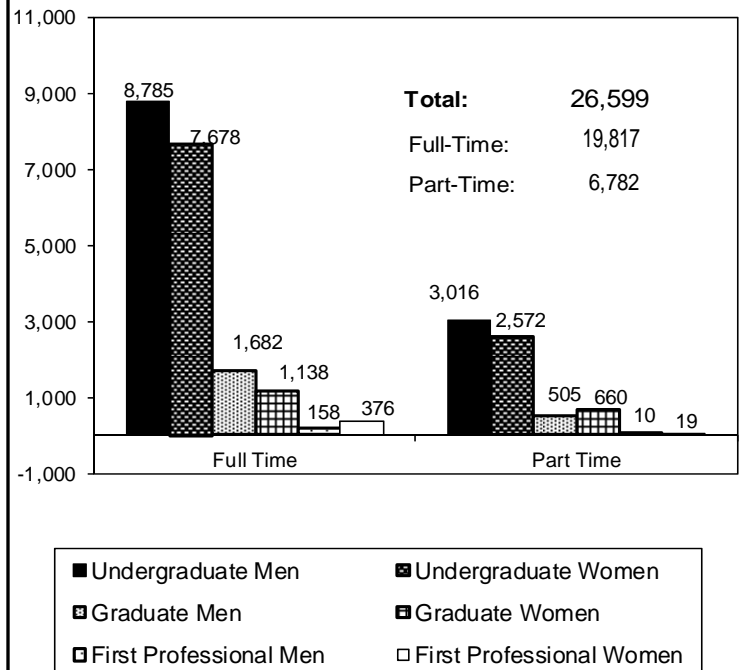

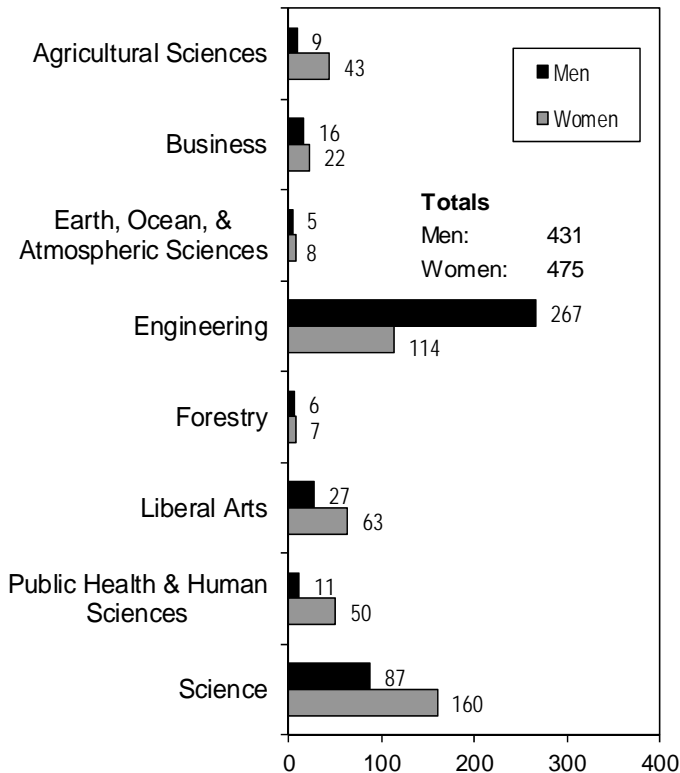

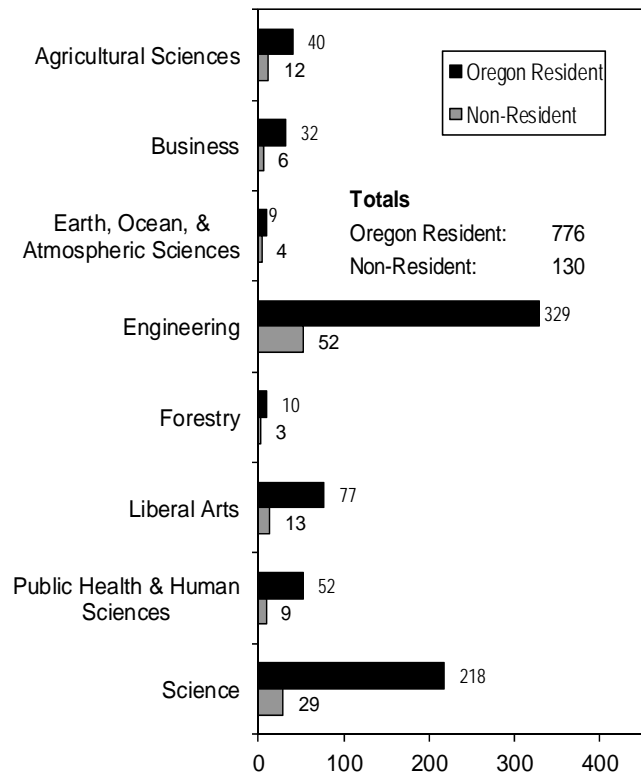

## Highlights

■ When Spring 2014 and Spring 2015 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 898 students, or 3.5% (from 25,701 to 26,599). At the same time, the total student FTE increased by 586.3, or 2.6% (from 22,277.9 to 22,864.2), and the student credit hours increased by 8,374, or 2.7% (from 315,068 to 323,442).

■ When compared to Spring 2014, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 738 students, or 3.5% (from 21,313 to 22,051); the graduate enrollment increased by 4.6% (from 3,810 to 3,985); the first professional enrollment decreased by 2.6% (from 578 to 563).

■ When compared to Spring 2014, Oregon residents increased by 0.5%; non-residents increased by 8.5%.

■ International student enrollment increased by 9.0%.

■ For Spring 2015, the percentage of U.S. minority students was 22.0% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 9.9% when compared to Spring 2014 (from 5,332 to 5,861).

■ The College of Engineering, College of Liberal Arts, and College of Business had the largest student enrollments (6,946, 3,678, and 3,270 respectively) when compared to the other academic units.

■ OSU Extended Campus had 9,916 students, an increase of 15.3% compared to Spring 2014. These students took 50,607 credits, of which 32.6% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 17.6% were from the College of Engineering.

■ During Spring 2015, a total of 1,096 students received services from OSU Cascades Campus.

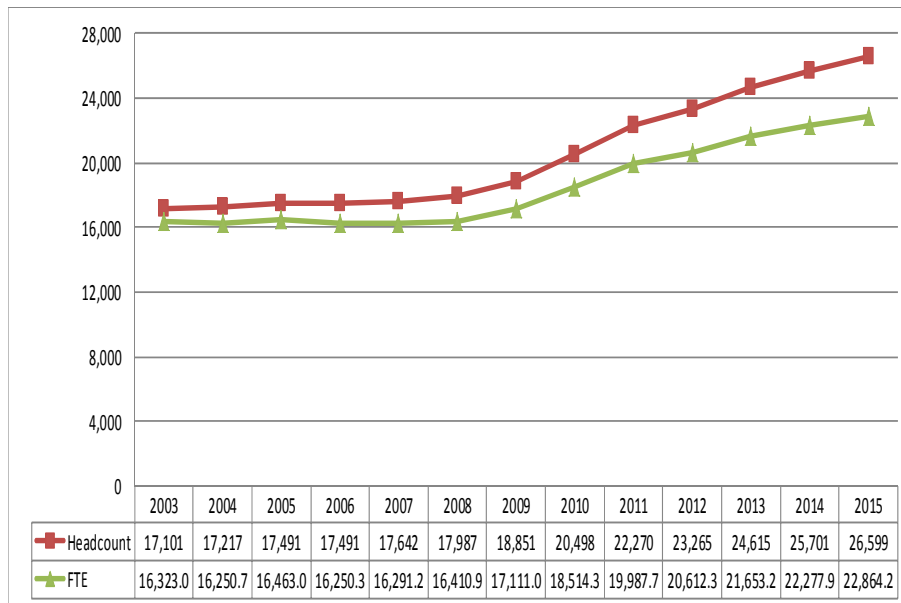
■ Other increases that occurred when comparing Spring 2014 and Spring 2015 are as follows:

- Part-time students: 10.6%
- Undergraduate students age 25 and older: 7.5%
- Graduate students age 25 and older: 6.4%
- Female students: 3.5%
- Male students: 3.5%
- Undergraduate students under age 25: 2.4%
- Full-time students: 1.3%

■ Other decreases that occurred when comparing Spring 2014

- First Professional students under age 25: -6.0%
- Graduate students under age 25: -1.0%
- First Professional students 25 and older: -0.8%
