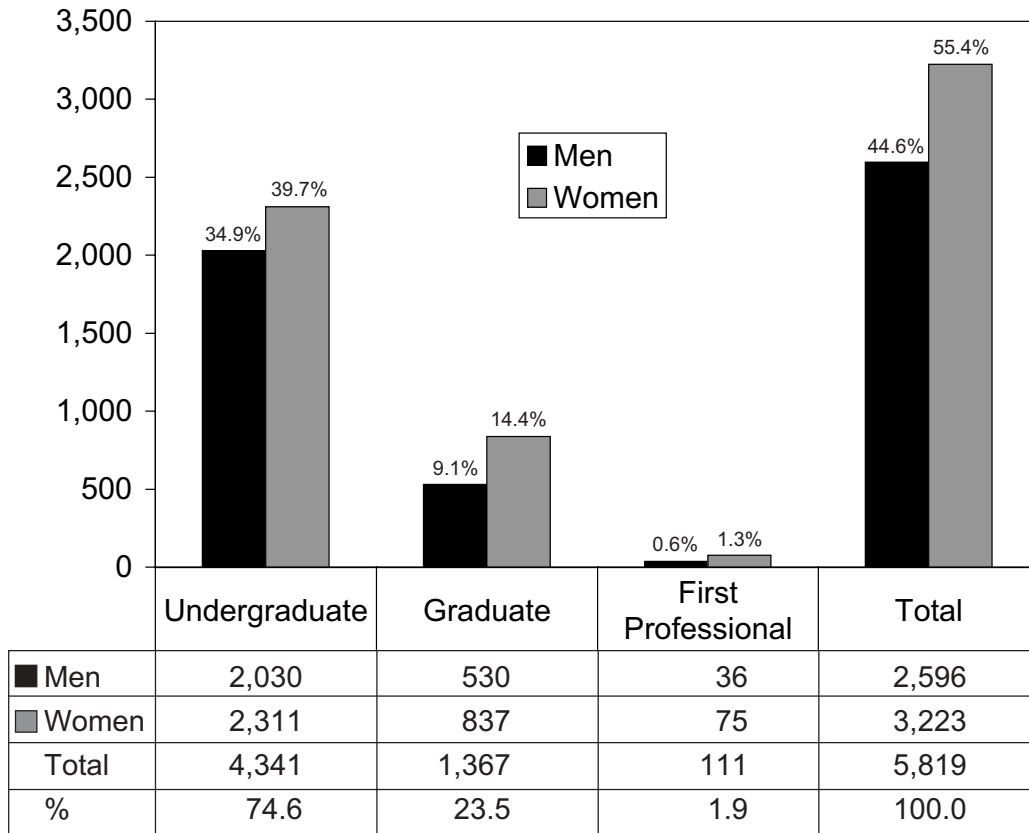

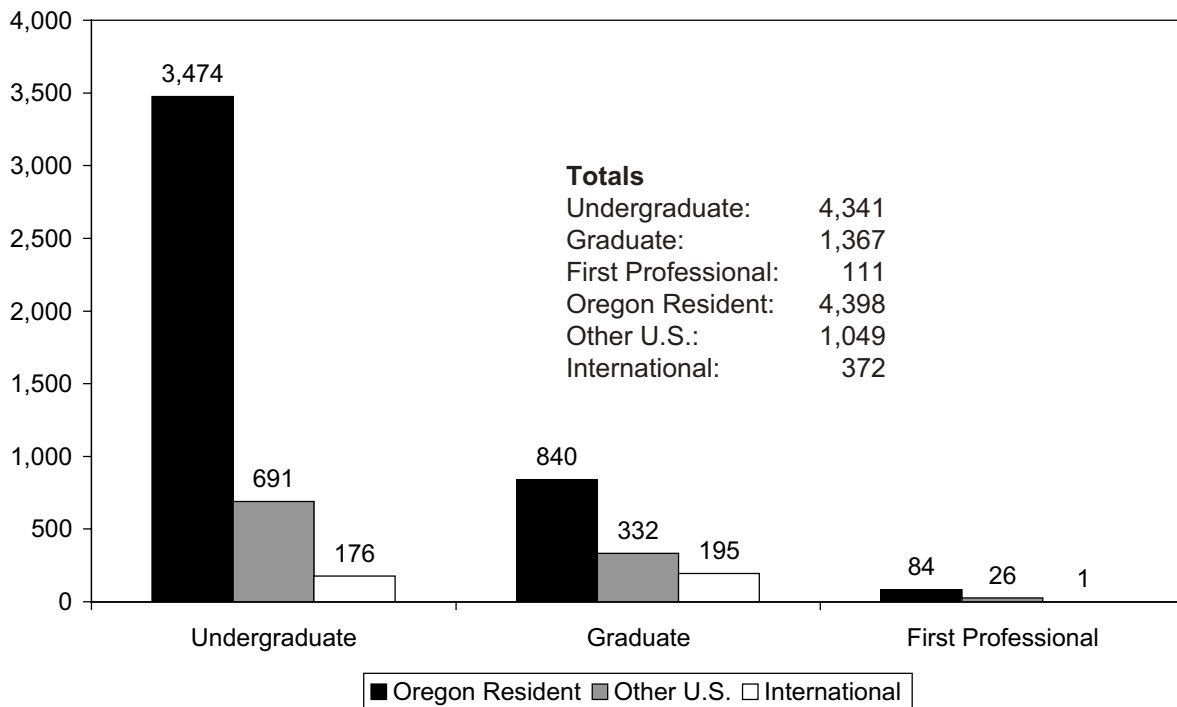

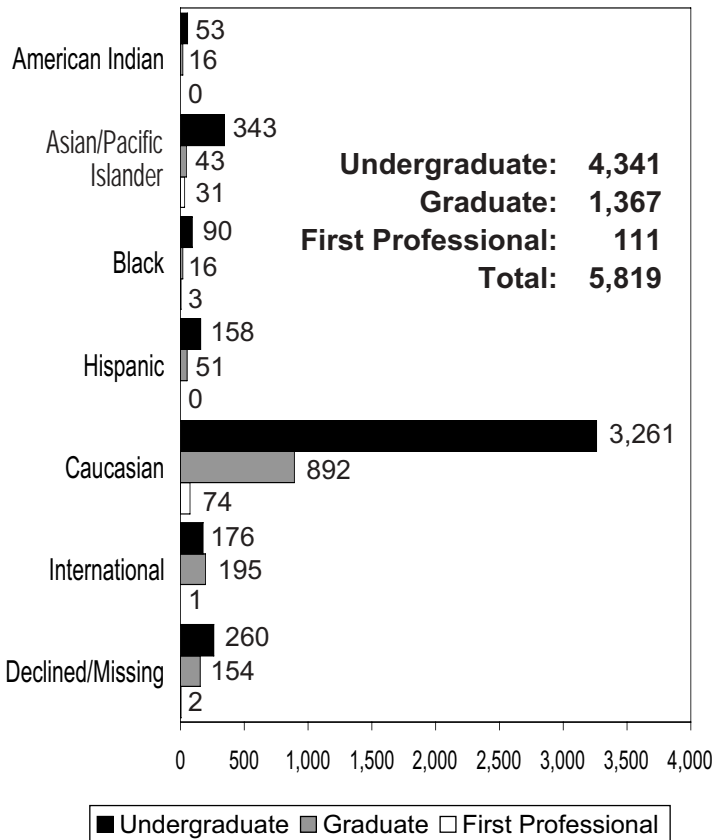

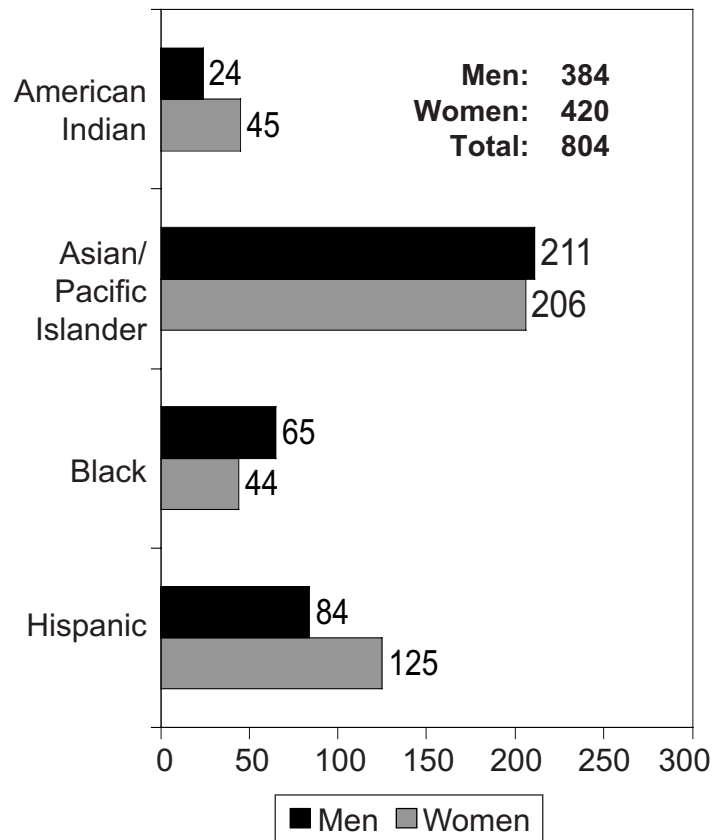

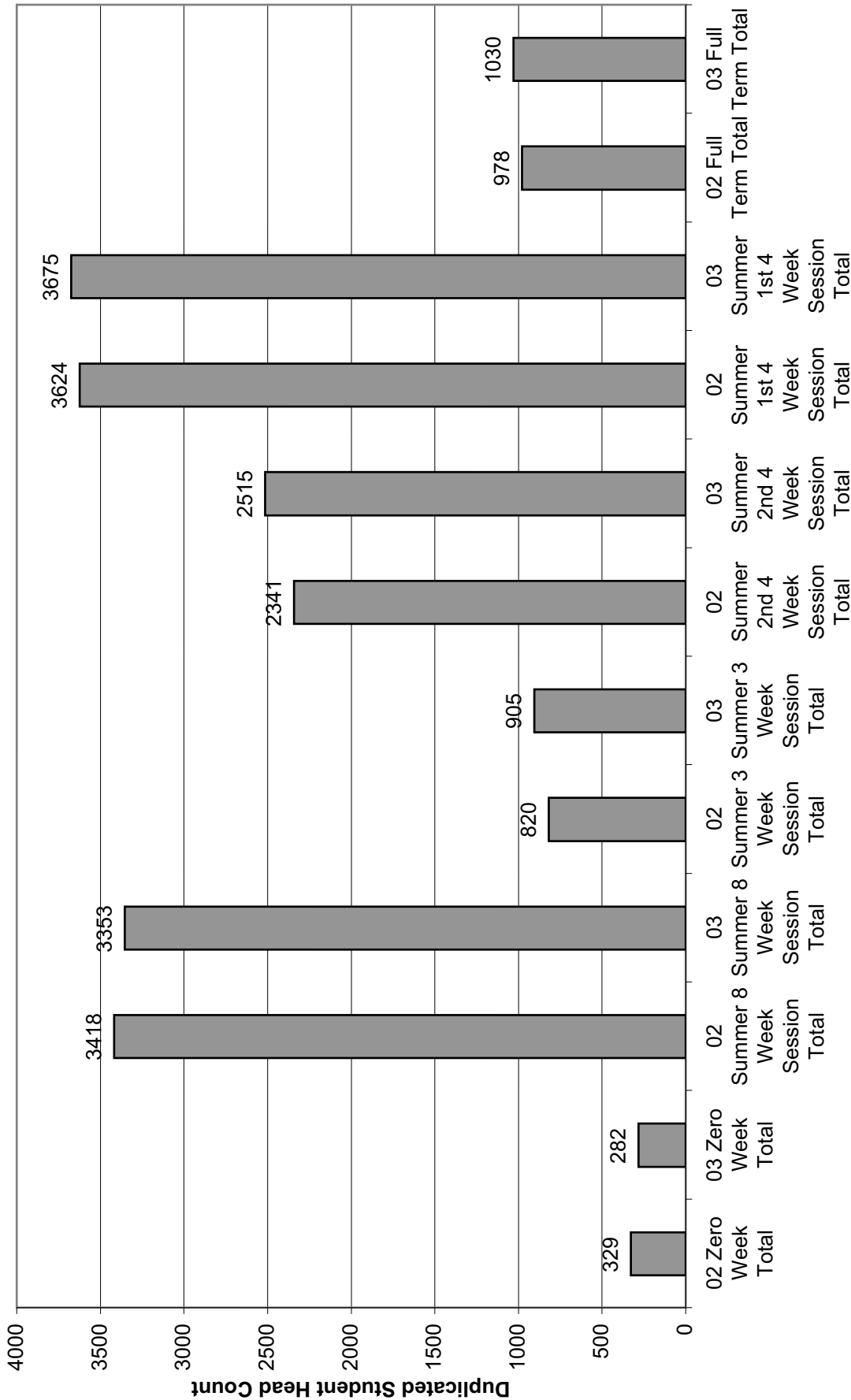

Summer Session Comparisons: 2002 and 2003

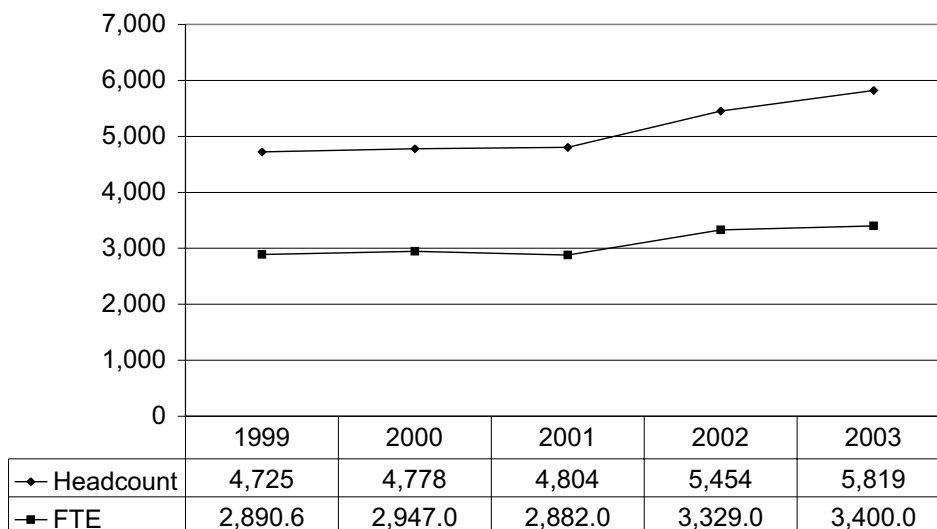

Summer Session 2003 Enrollment Highlights

- The Summer Session 2003 total enrollment of 5,819 was 365 more than Summer 2002—an increase of 6.7%. When compared with Summer 1999, there was a 23.2% increase in total enrollment.
- There were more female students than male students in Summer 2003. Female students accounted for 55.4% of total students, while male students accounted for 44.6%.
- About two-thirds (66.4%) of all students were enrolled on a part-time basis.
- The College of Liberal Arts had the largest student enrollment (1,197) when compared to the other academic units.
- Over 56% of the total student credit hours (47,455) were from the College of Liberal Arts (31%) and the College of Science (25%).
- OSU Extended Campus had a total enrollment of 1,161 students. These students were enrolled for 4,880 credit hours. About 54% of those credit hours were from the College of Liberal Arts.
- Only 28 new freshmen enrolled for courses.
- The percentage of U.S. minority students was 13.8%.
- More students (3,675) enrolled in Summer 1st 4-week session (June 23–July 18). Summer 8-week session (June 23–August 15) had 3,353 students.
