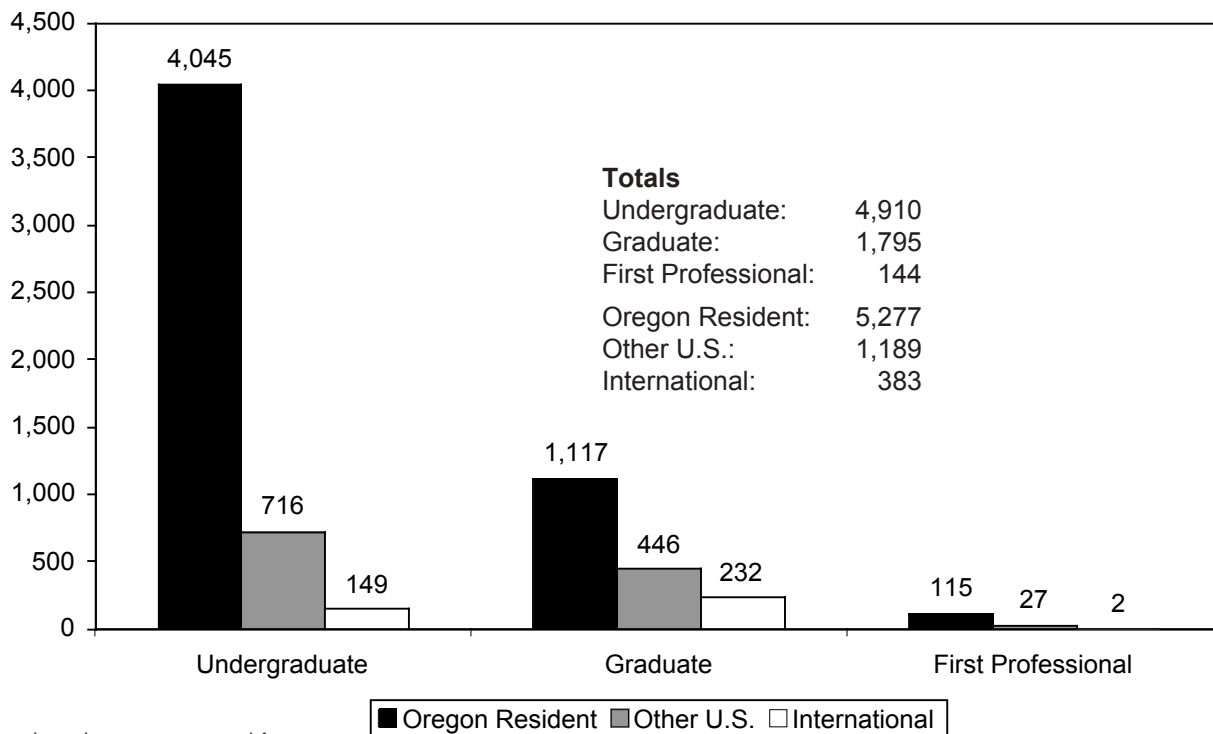

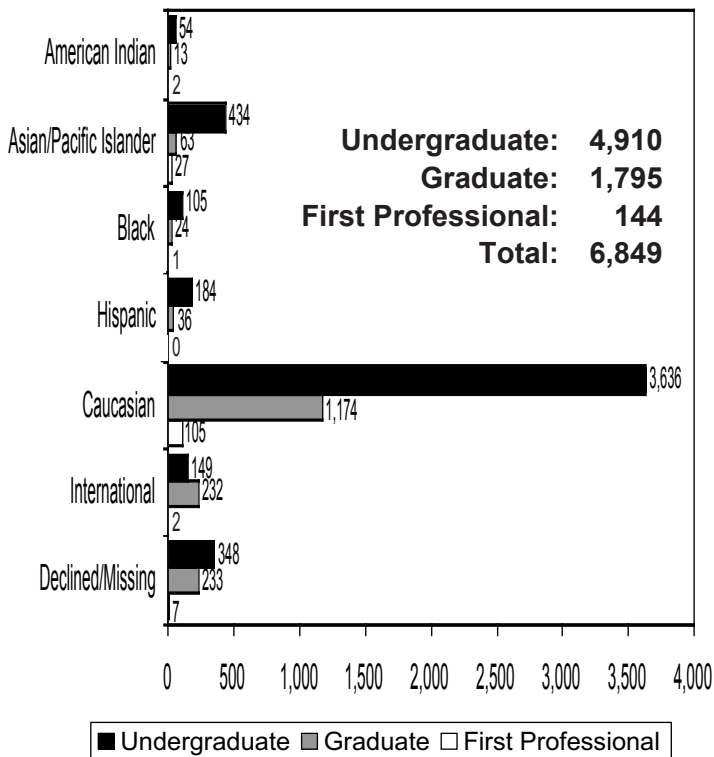

### U.S. Minorities by Gender



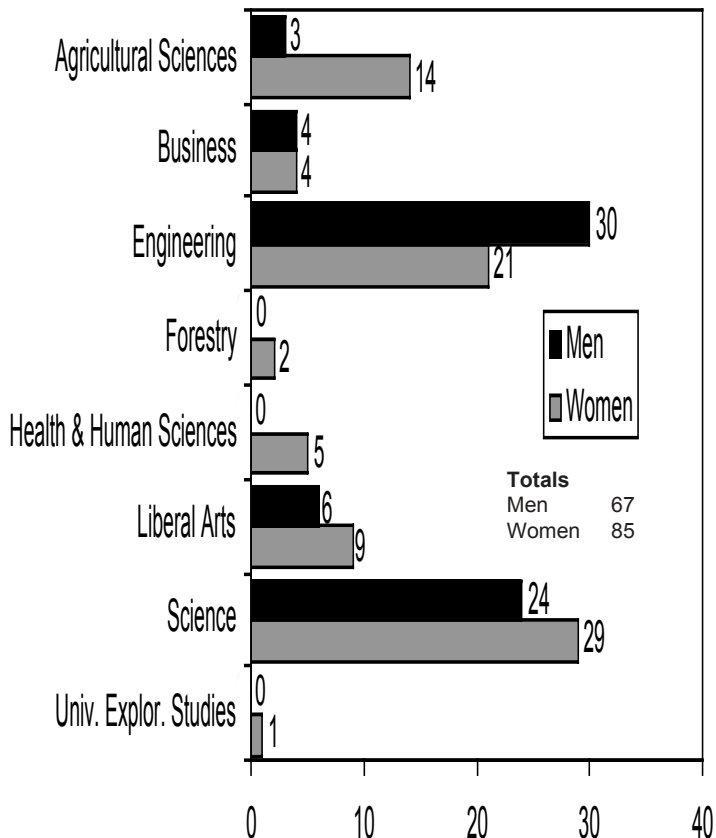

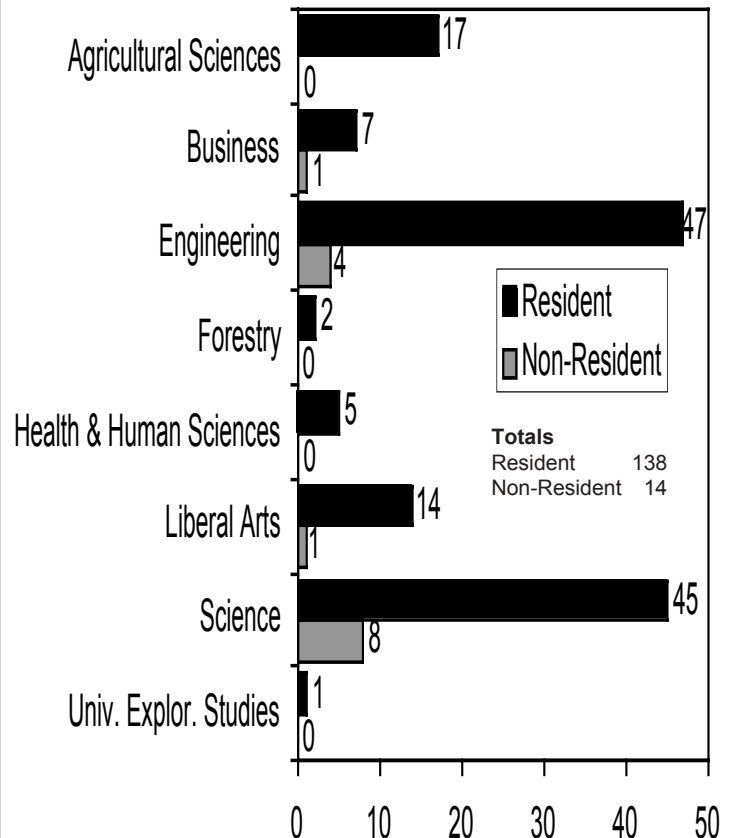

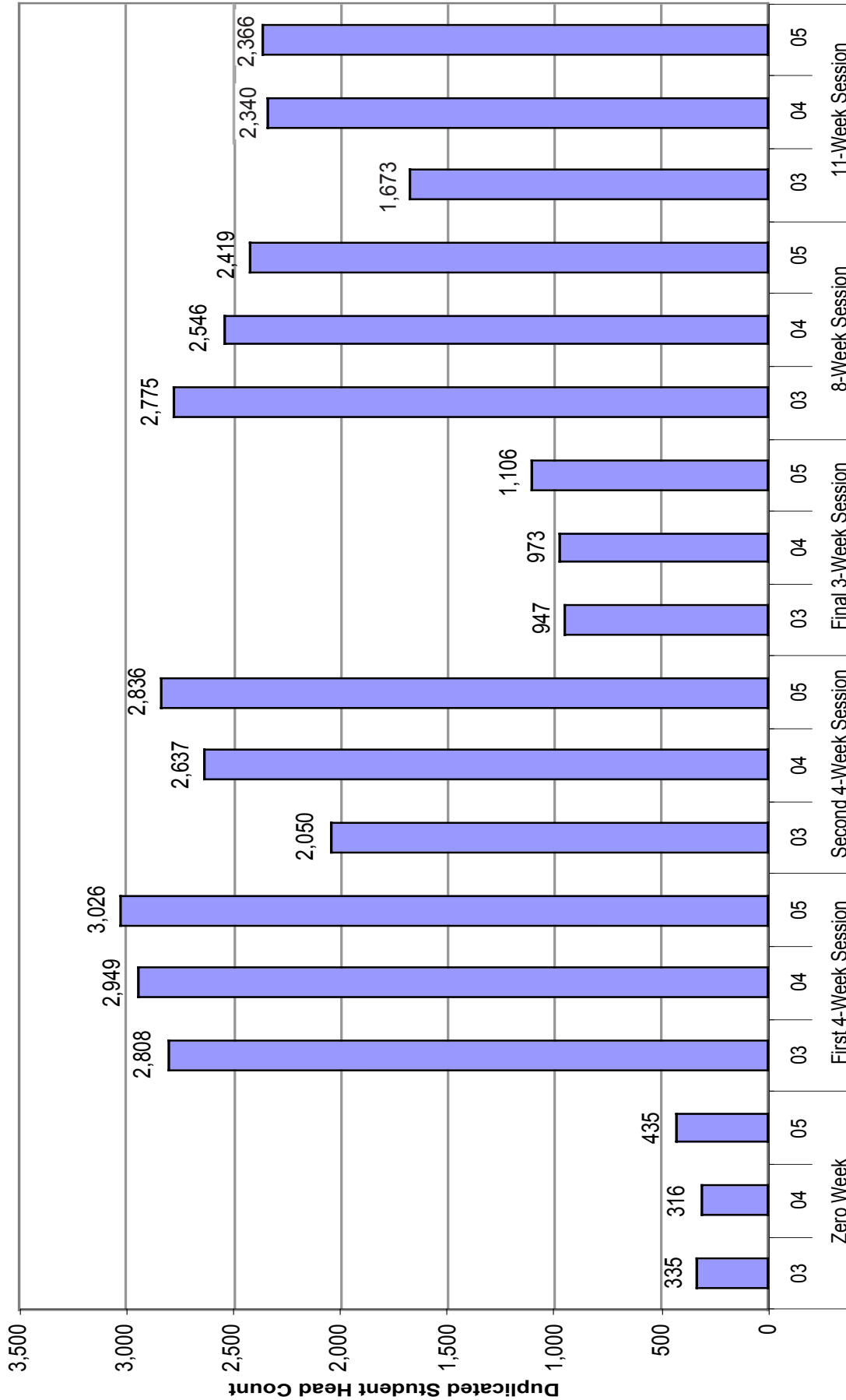

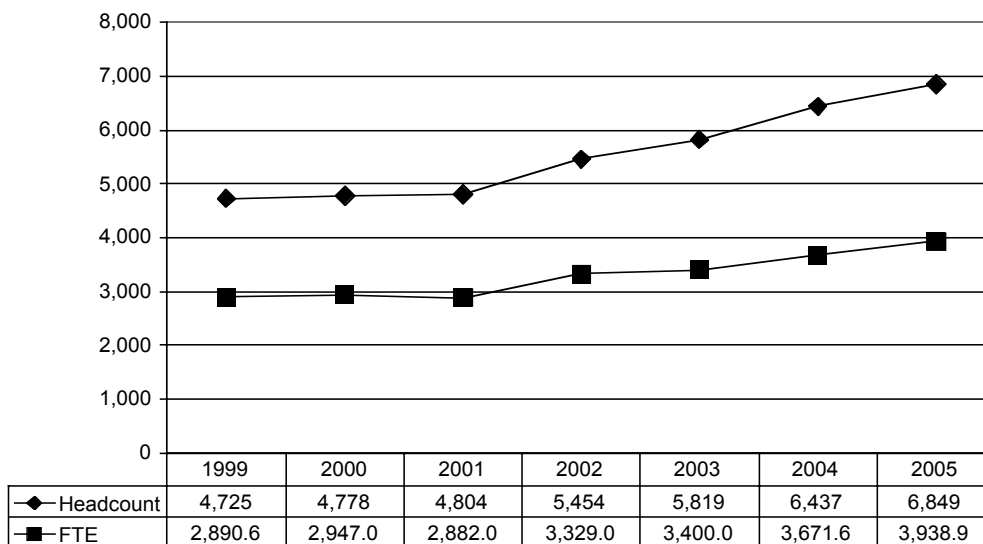

## Summer Session 2005 Enrollment Highlights

- The Summer Session 2005 total enrollment of 6,849 was 412 more than Summer 2004—an increase of 6.4%. When compared with Summer 2000, there was a 36.2% increase in total enrollment.
- There were more female students than male students in Summer 2005. Female students accounted for 55.6% of total students, while male students accounted for 44.4%.
- More than two-thirds (67.9%) of all students were enrolled on a part-time basis.
- The College of Liberal Arts had the largest student enrollment (1,303) when compared to the other academic units.
- About 60% of the total student credit hours (54,419) were from the College of Liberal Arts (31%) and the College of Science (29%).
- OSU Extended Campus had a total enrollment of 1,963 students. These students were enrolled for 8,554 credit hours. About 52% of those credit hours were from the College of Liberal Arts.
- Only 36 new undergraduate students from high school enrolled for courses.
- The percentage of U.S. minority students was 14%.
- More students (2,949) enrolled in the first 4-week Summer session (June 20–July 15). The second 4-week Summer session (July 18–August 12) had 2,637 students (second-largest enrollment).
