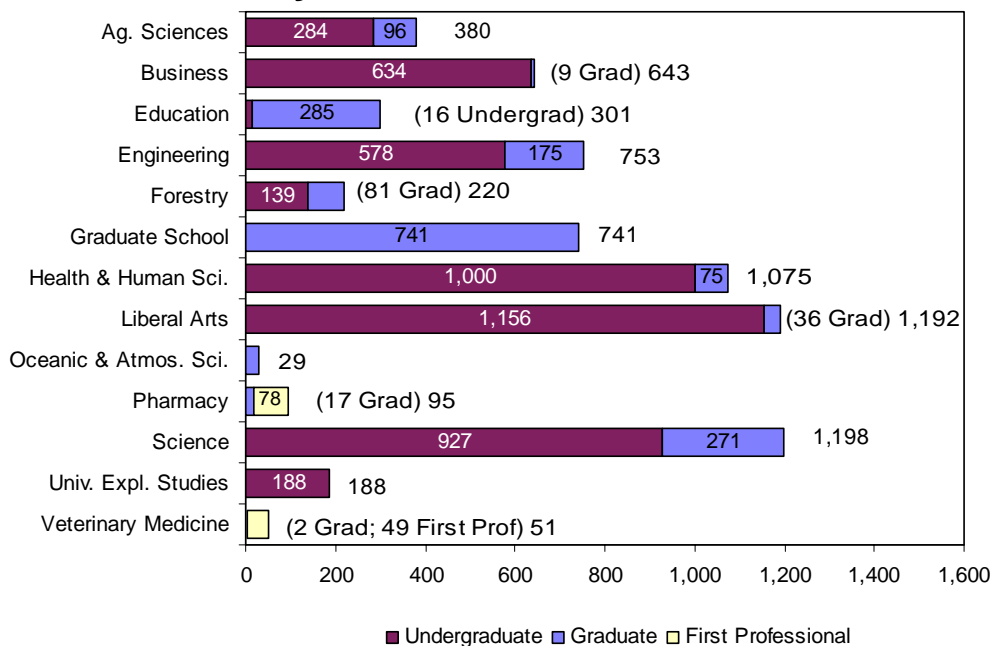

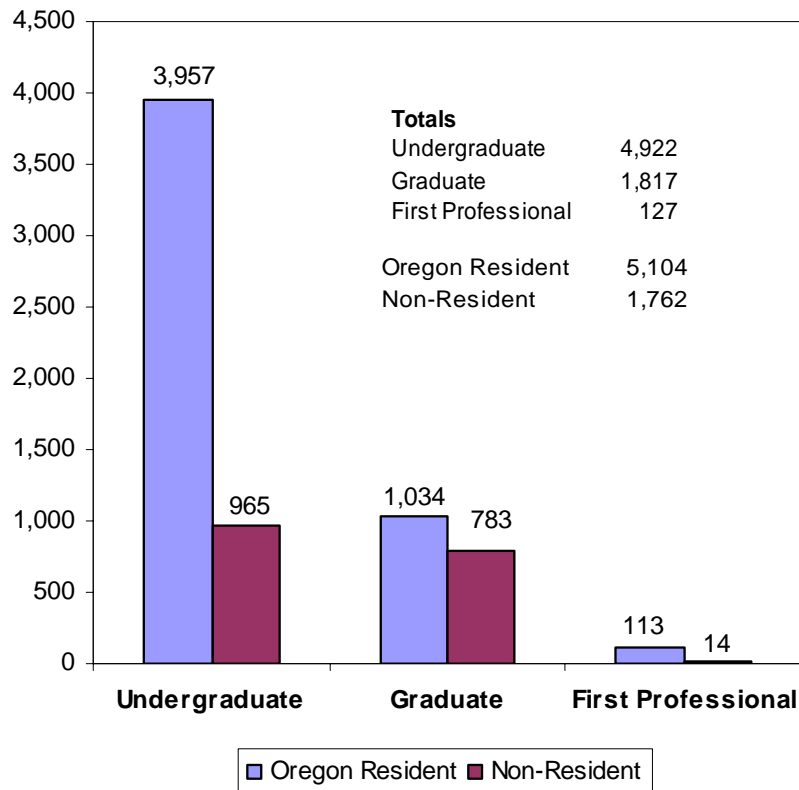

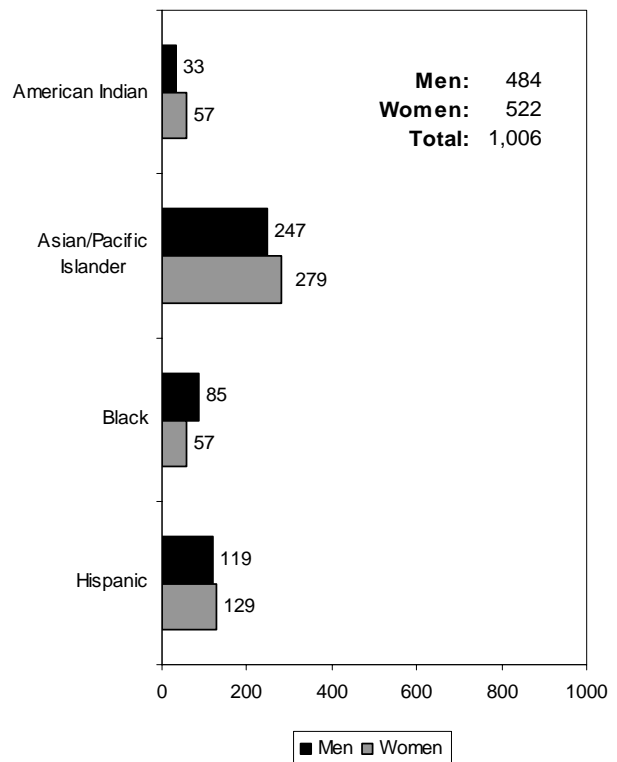

U.S. Minorities by Gender



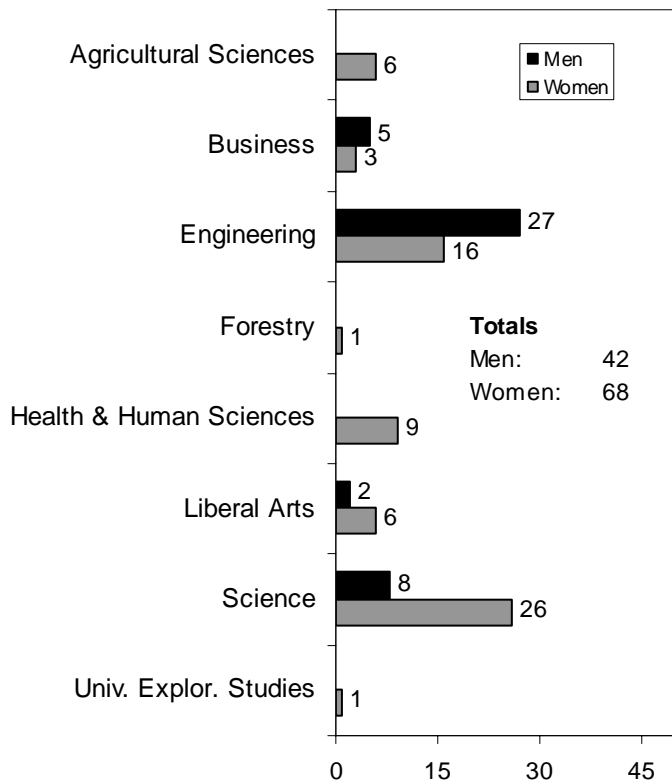

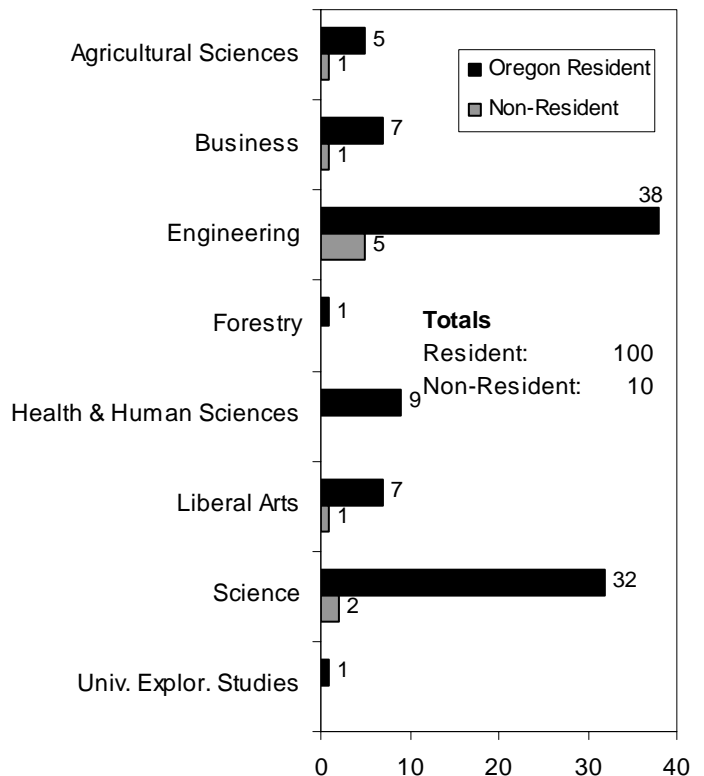

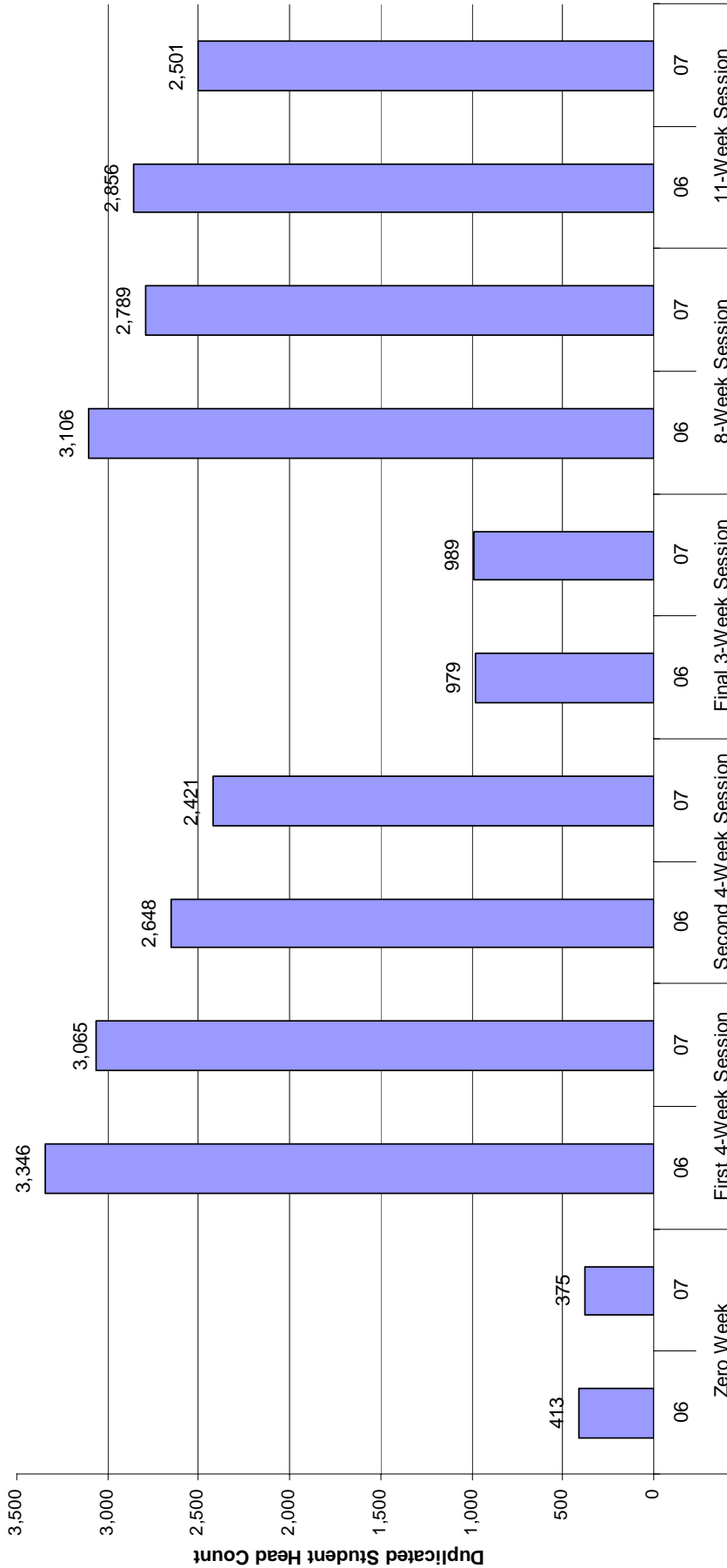

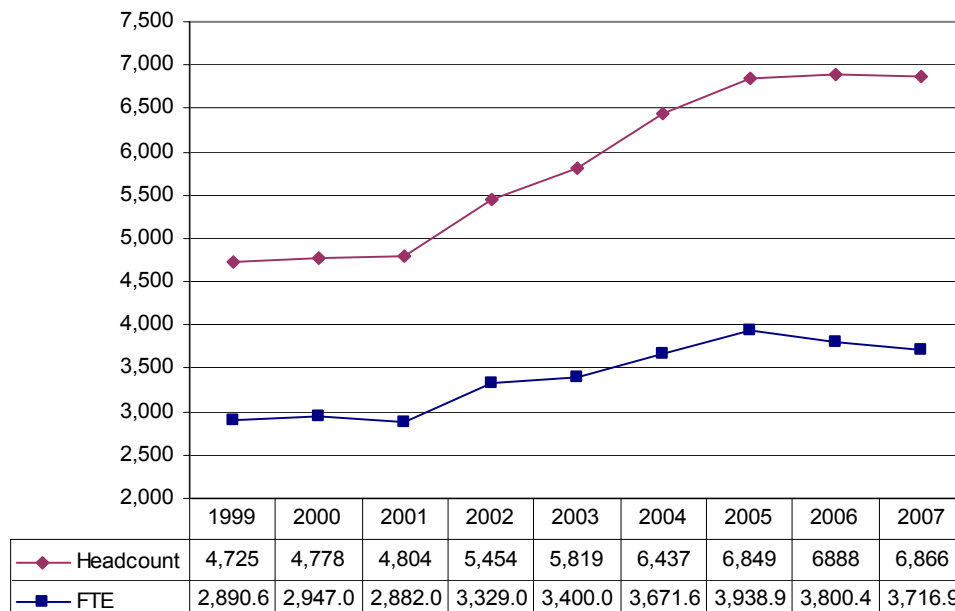

Highlights

- The Summer Session 2007 total enrollment of 6,866 was 22 less than Summer 2006 - a decrease of .3%.
- There were more female students than male students in Summer 2007. Female students accounted for 55.7% of total students, while male students accounted for 44.3%.
- 70.7% of students were enrolled on a part-time basis.
- The College of Science had the largest unduplicated student enrollment (1,198) when compared to the other academic units.
- About 60.5% of the total student credit hours (51,079) were from the College of Science (32.1%) and the College of Liberal Arts (28.3%).
- OSU Extended Campus had a total enrollment of 2,293 students. These students were enrolled for 10,398 credit hours. About 49.4% of those credit hours were from the College of Liberal Arts.
- 59 new undergraduate students from high school enrolled for courses.
- The percentage of U.S. minority students was 14.7%.

- For Summer 2007, more students (3,065) enrolled in the First 4-Week Session (June 25 - July 20). The 8-Week Session (June 25 - August 17) had (2,789) students (second-largest enrollment).
