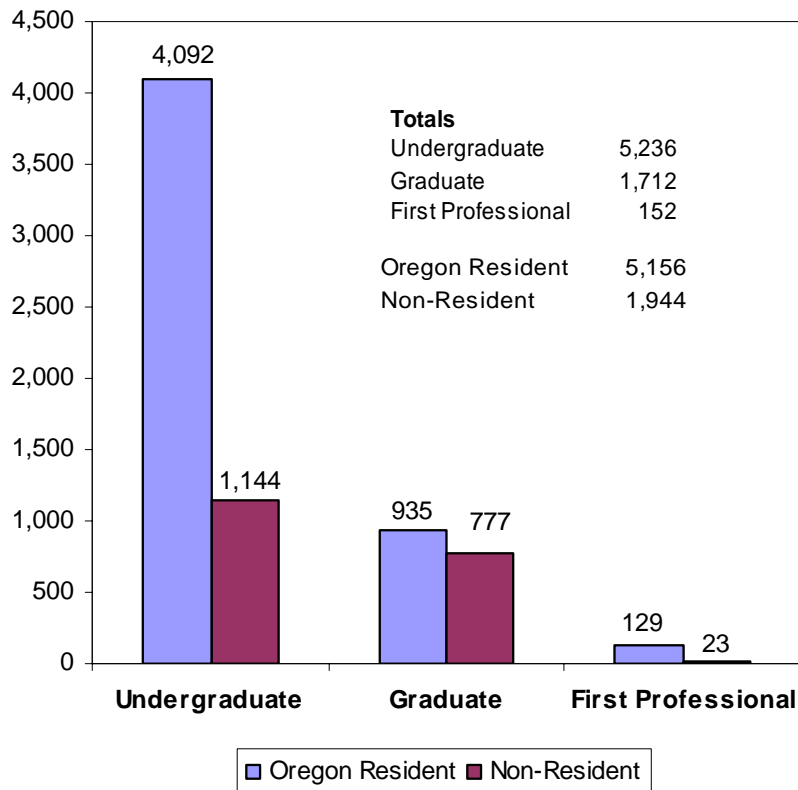

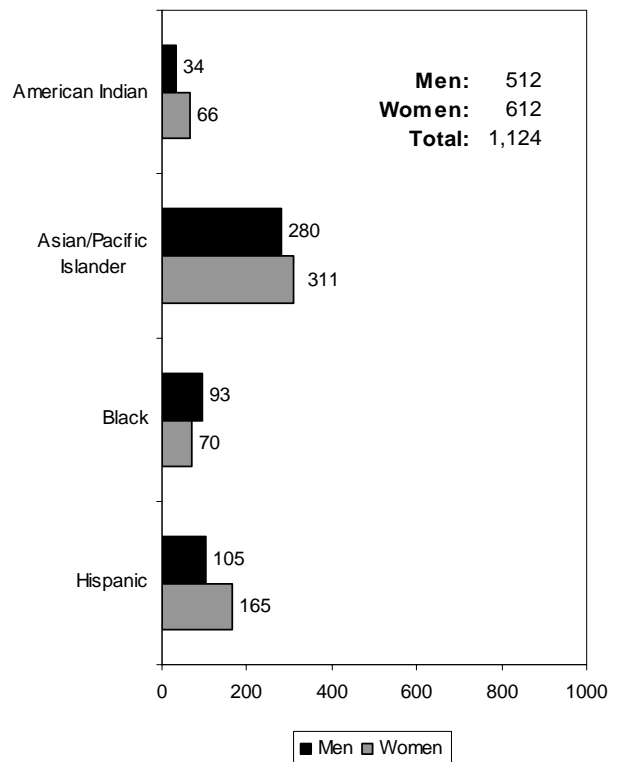

U.S. Minorities by Gender



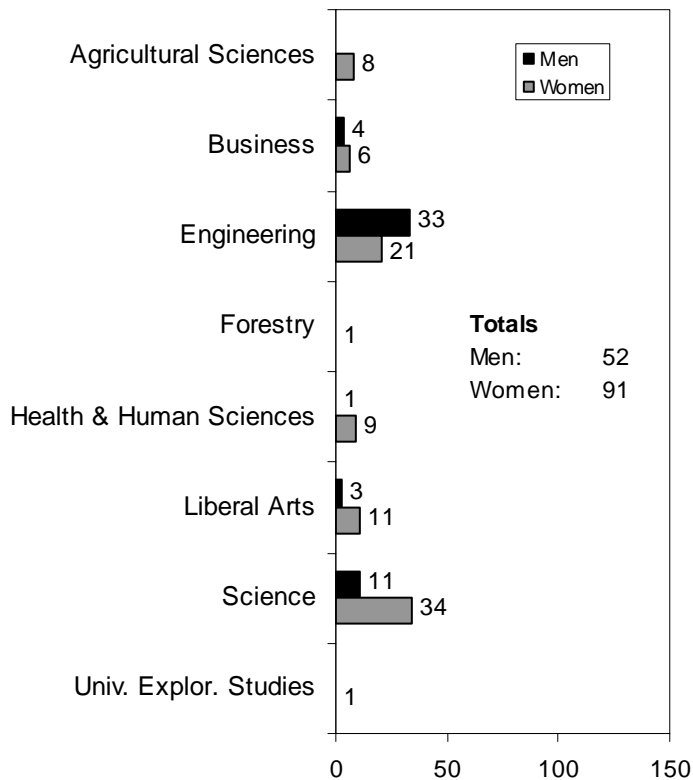

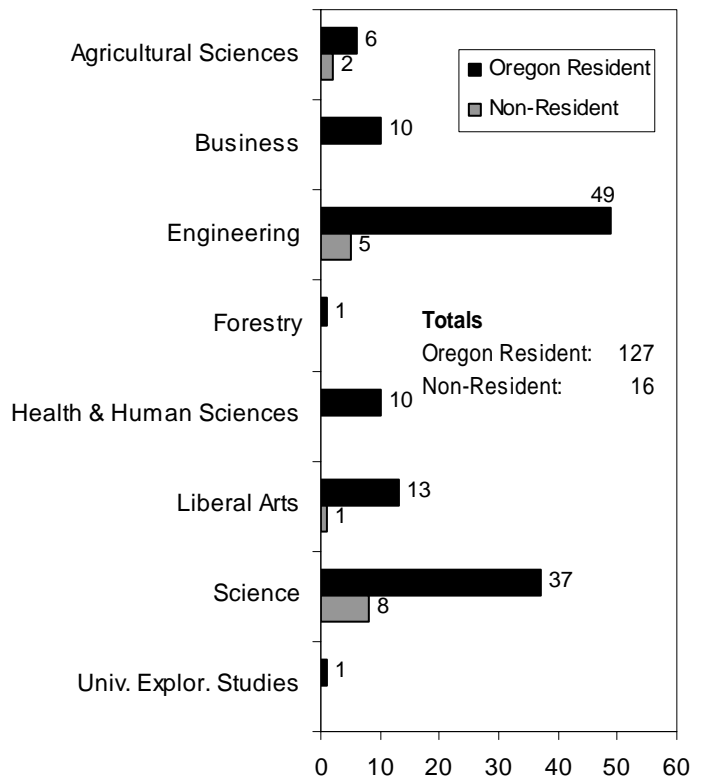

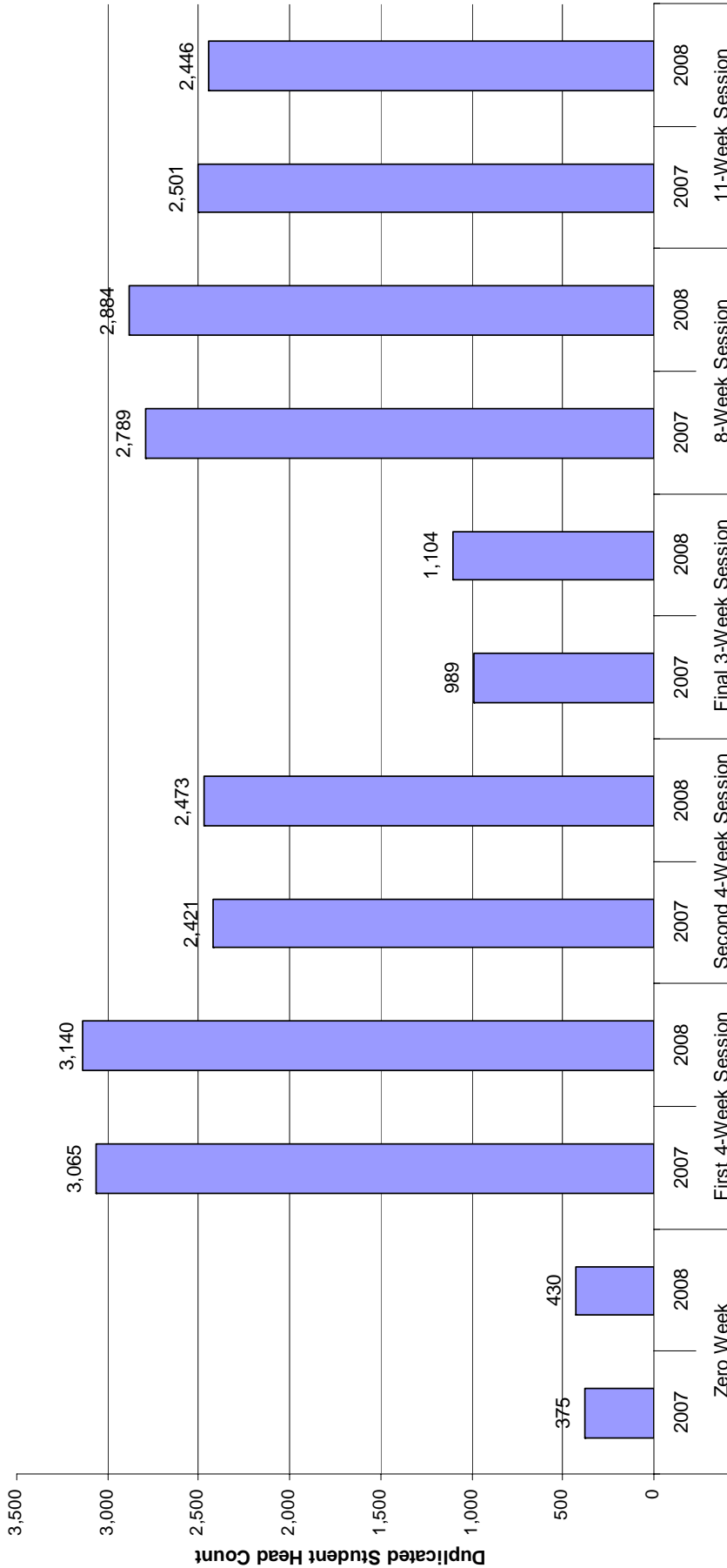

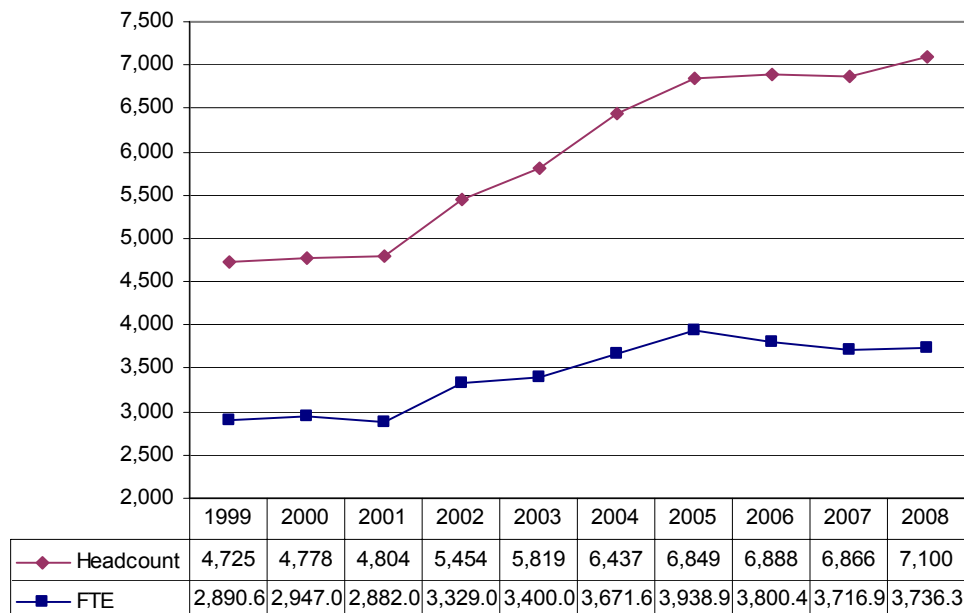
Highlights

- The Summer Session 2008 total enrollment of 7,100 was 234 more than Summer 2007 - an increase of 3.4%.
- There were more female students than male students in Summer 2008. Female students accounted for 55.7% of total students, while male students accounted for 44.3%.
- 72.7% of students were enrolled on a part-time basis.
- The College of Liberal Arts had the largest unduplicated student enrollment (1,245) when compared to the other academic units.
- About 60.5% of the total student credit hours (51,536) were from the College of Science (31.2%) and the College of Liberal Arts (29.4%).
- OSU Extended Campus had a total enrollment of 2,618 students. These students were enrolled for 11,863 credit hours. About 45.4% of those credit hours were from the College of Liberal Arts.
- 61 new undergraduate students from high school enrolled for courses.
- The percentage of U.S. minority students was 15.8%.

- For Summer 2008, more students (3,140) enrolled in the First 4-Week Session (June 23 - July 18). The 8-Week Session (June 23 - August 15) had (2,884) students (second-largest enrollment).
