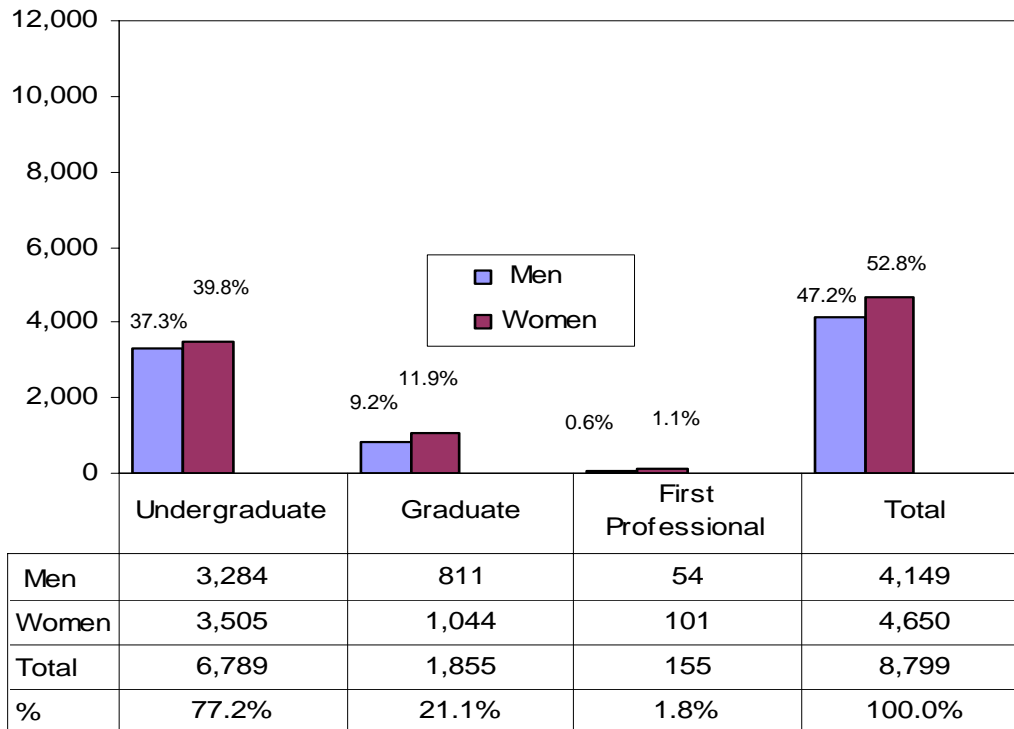

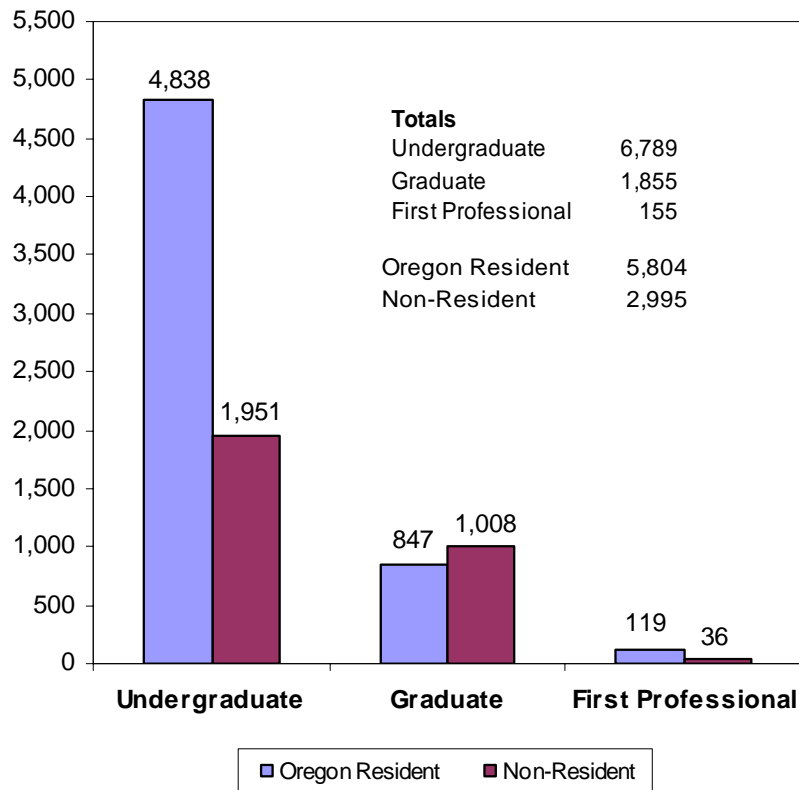

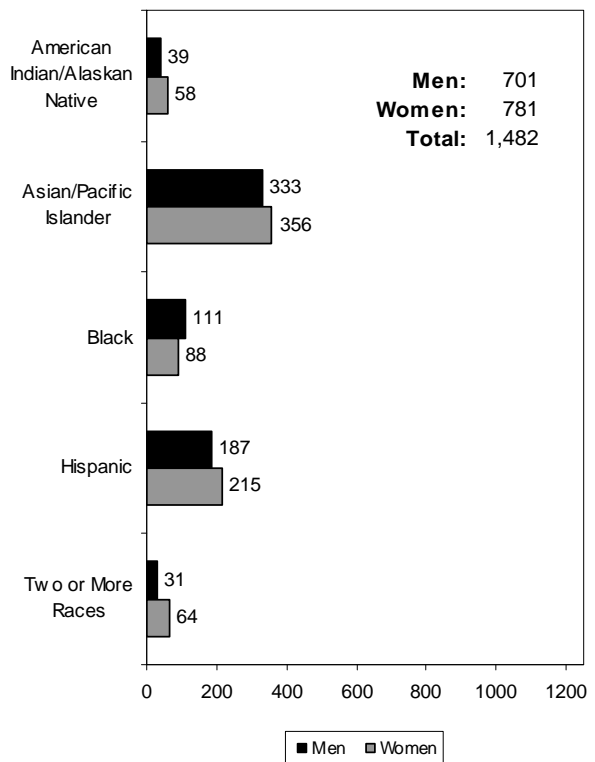

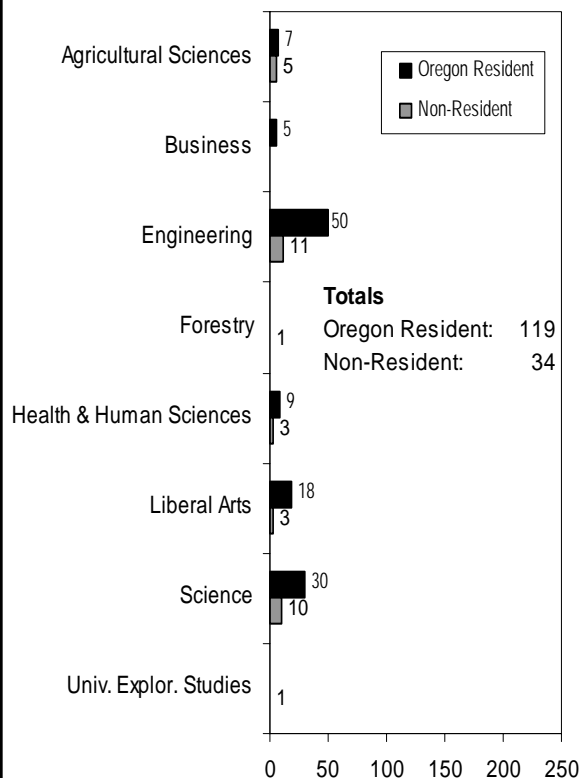

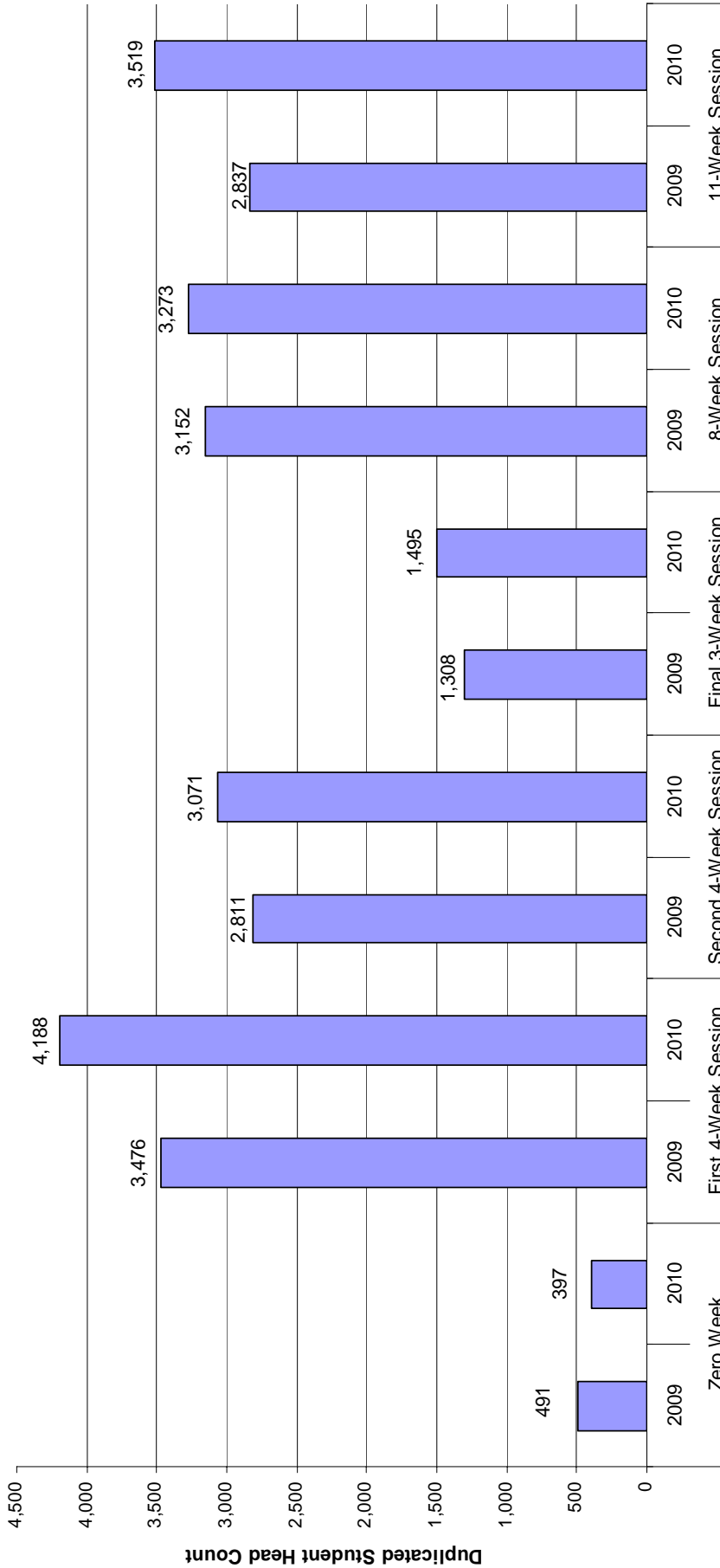

Highlights

- The Summer Session 2010 total enrollment of 8,799 was 967 more than Summer 2009 - an increase of 12.3%.
- There were more female students than male students in Summer 2010. Female students accounted for 52.8% of total students, while male students accounted for 47.2%.
- 71.1% of students were enrolled on a part-time basis.
- The College of Science had the largest unduplicated student enrollment (1,549) when compared to the other academic units.
- About 61.1% of the total student credit hours (66,057) were from the College of Science (32.1%) and the College of Liberal Arts (29.0%).
- OSU Extended Campus had a total enrollment of 3,766 students. These students were enrolled for 18,800 credit hours. About 42.1% of those credit hours were from the College of Liberal Arts.
- 156 new undergraduate students from high school enrolled for courses.
- The percentage of U.S. minority students was 16.8%.

■ For Summer 2010, more students (4,188) enrolled in the First 4-Week Session (June 21 - July 16). The 11-Week Session (June 21 - September 3) had 3,519 students (second-largest enrollment).

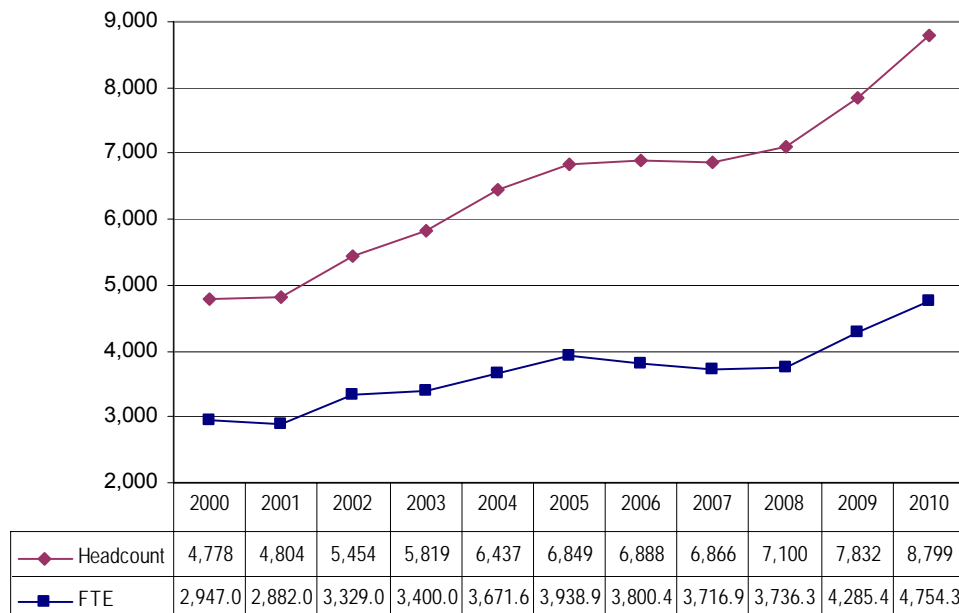
