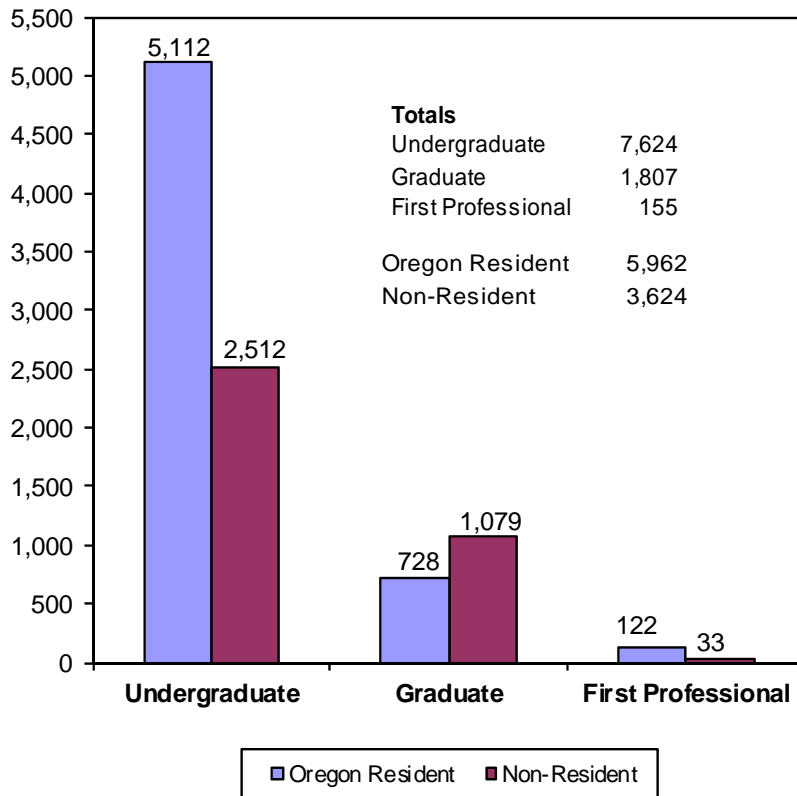

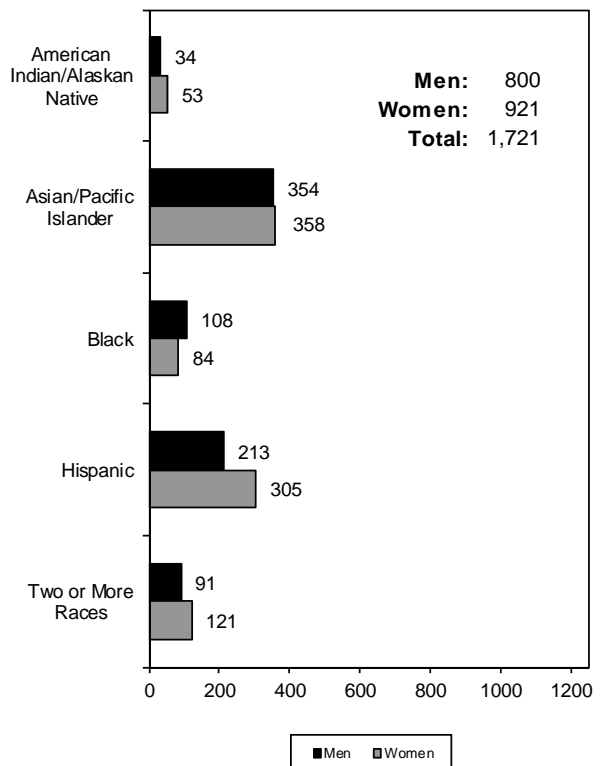

U.S. Minorities by Gender



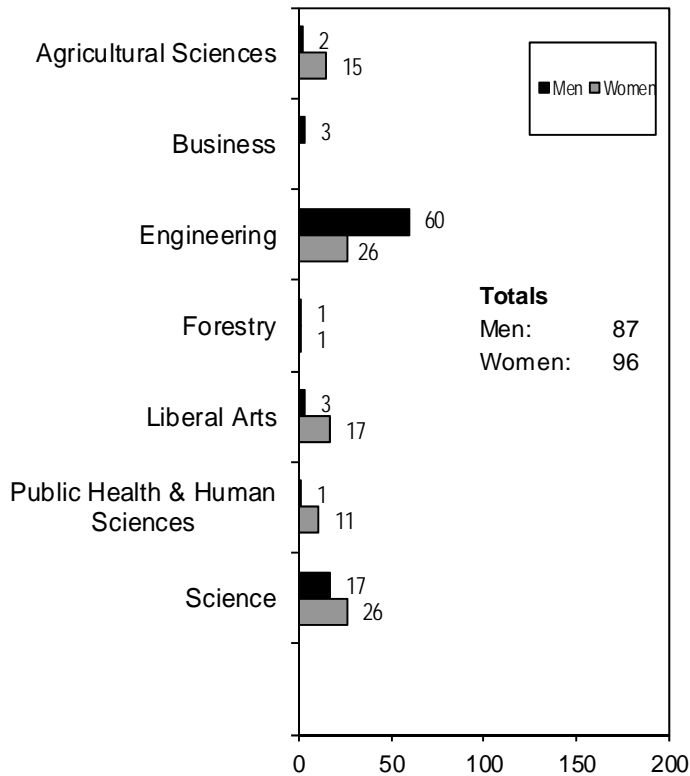

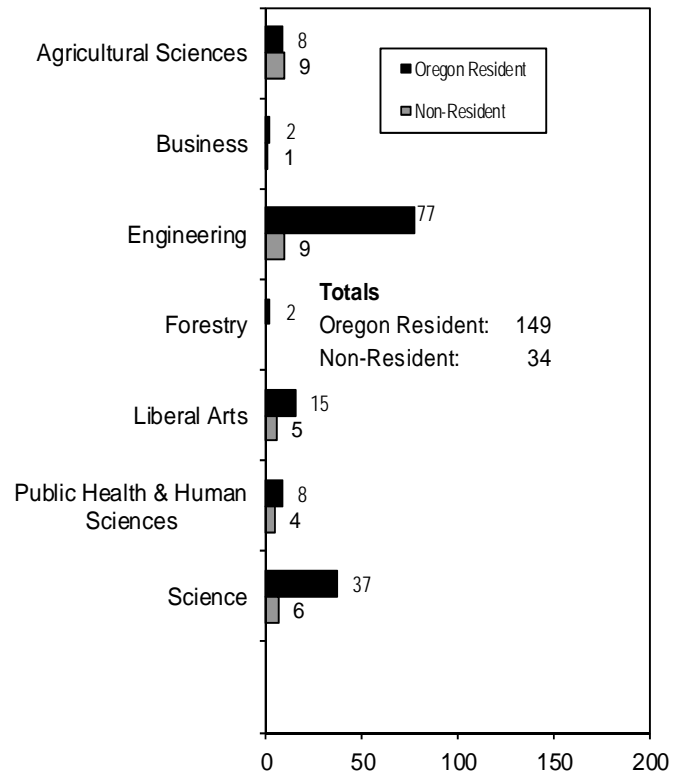

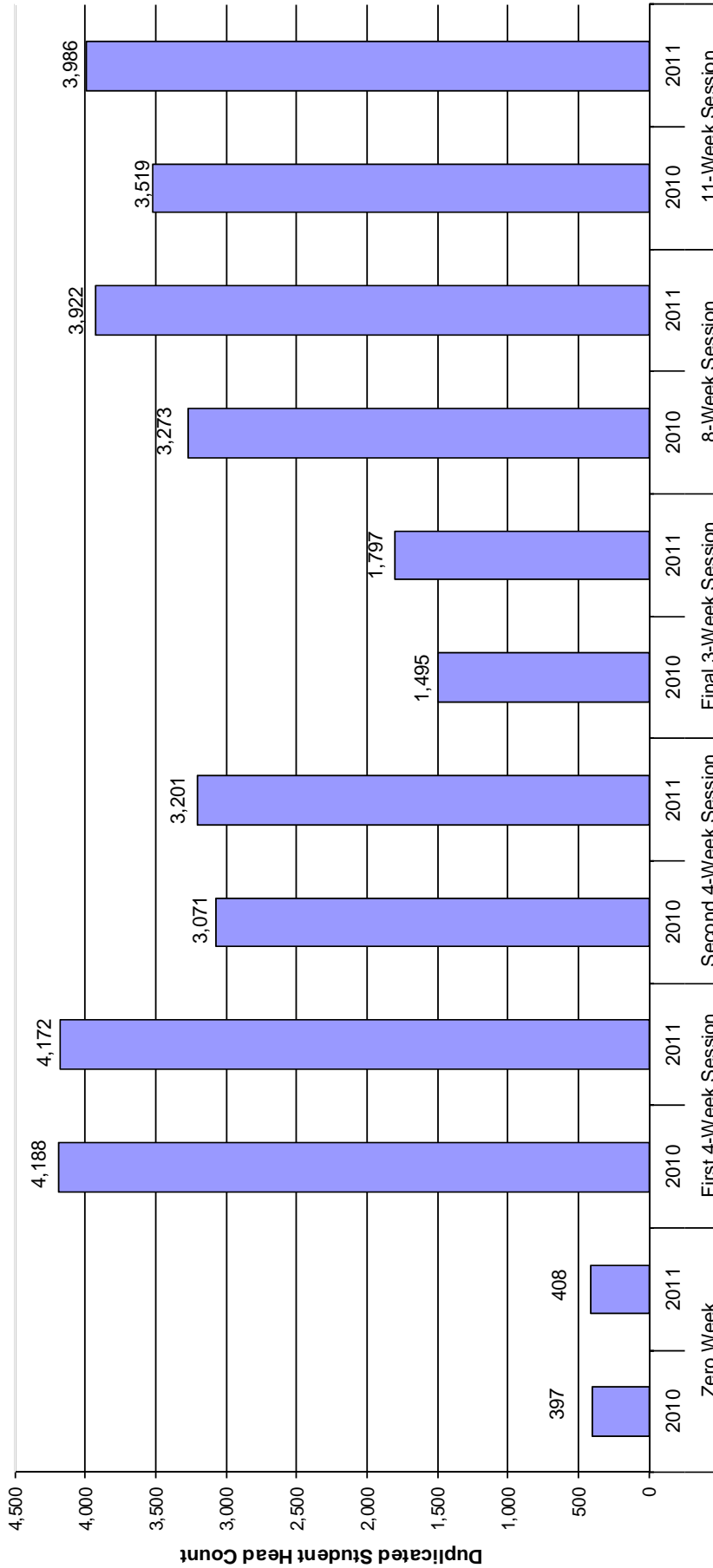

Highlights

- The Summer Session 2011 total enrollment of 9,586 was 787 more than Summer 2010 - an increase of 8.9%.
- There were more female students than male students in Summer 2011. Female students accounted for 52.2% of total students, while male students accounted for 47.8%.
- 71% of students were enrolled on a part-time basis.
- The College of Science had the largest unduplicated student enrollment (1,637) when compared to the other academic units.
- About 59.0% of the total student credit hours (72,771) were from the College of Science (31.1%) and the College of Liberal Arts (27.9%).
- OSU Extended Campus had a total enrollment of 4,215 students. These students were enrolled for 21,429 credit hours. About 42.3% of those credit hours were from the College of Liberal Arts.
- 201 new undergraduate students from high school enrolled for courses.
- The percentage of U.S. minority students was 18%.

■ For Summer 2011, more students (4,172) enrolled in the First 4-Week Session (June 20 - July 15). The 11-Week Session (June 20 - September 2) had (3,986) students (second-largest enrollment).

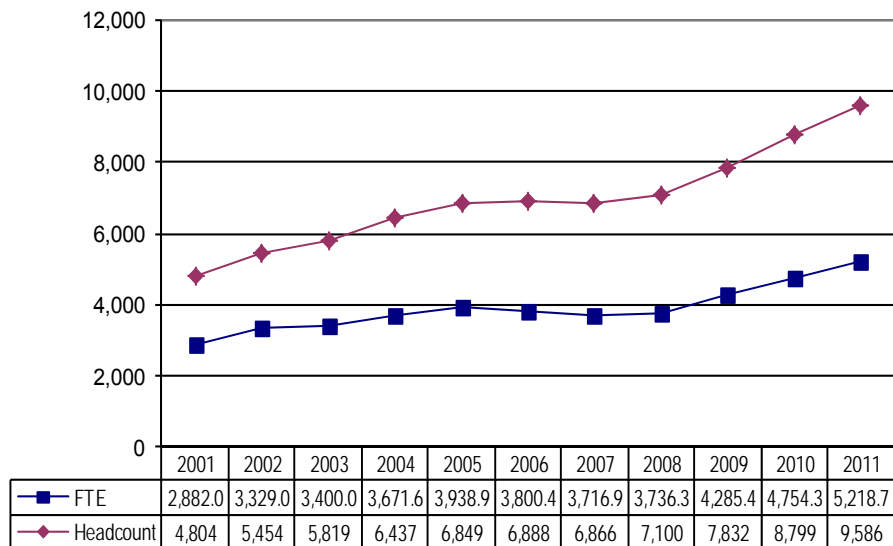
