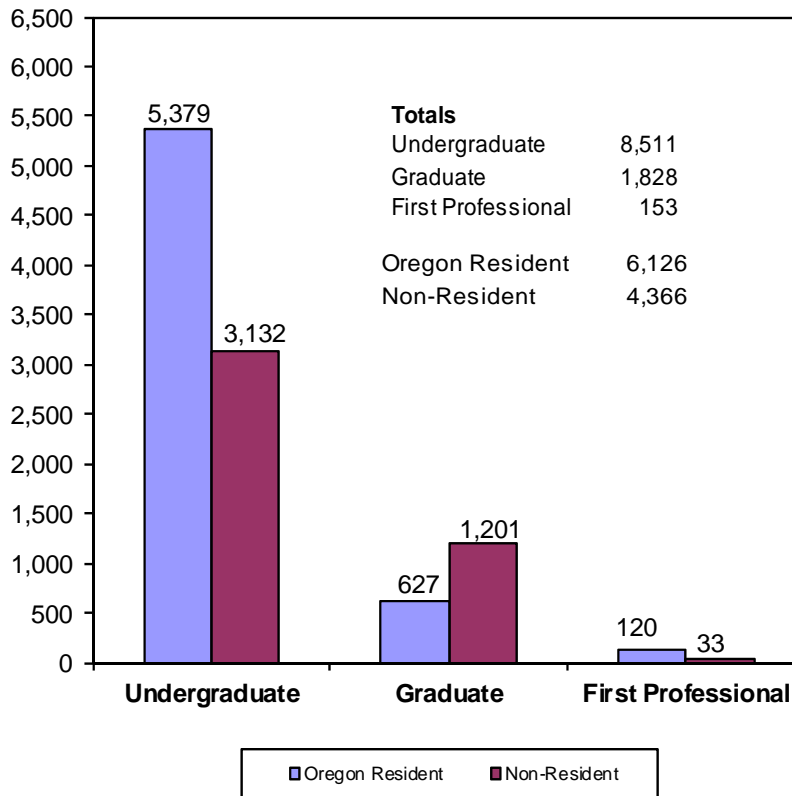

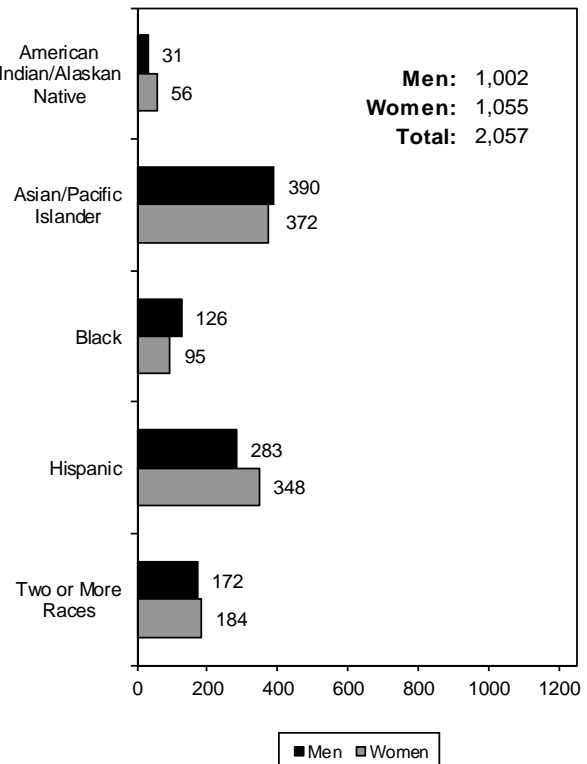

U.S. Minorities by Gender



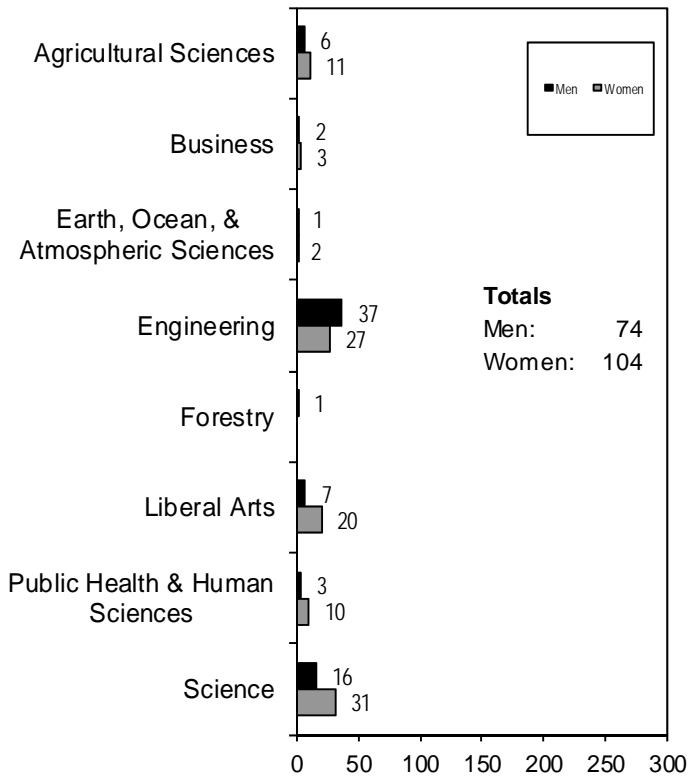

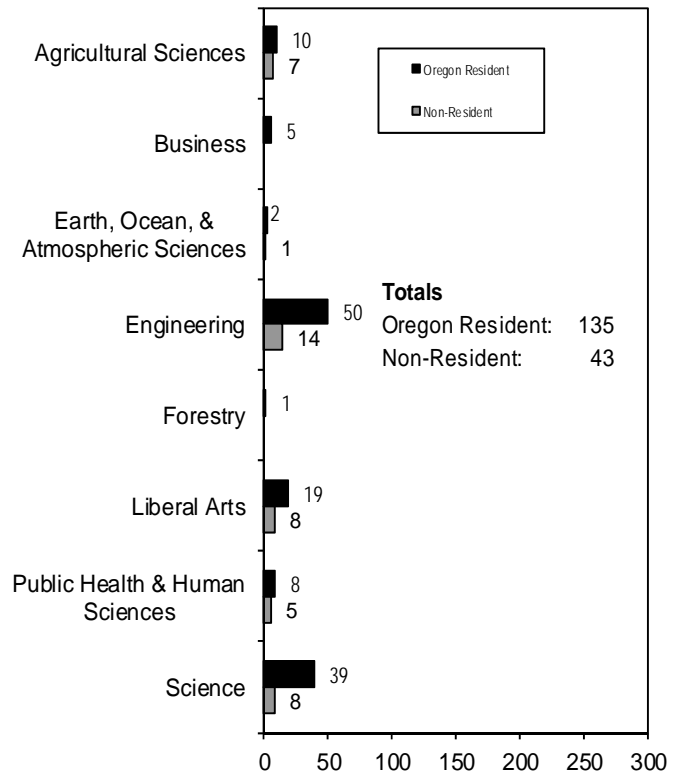

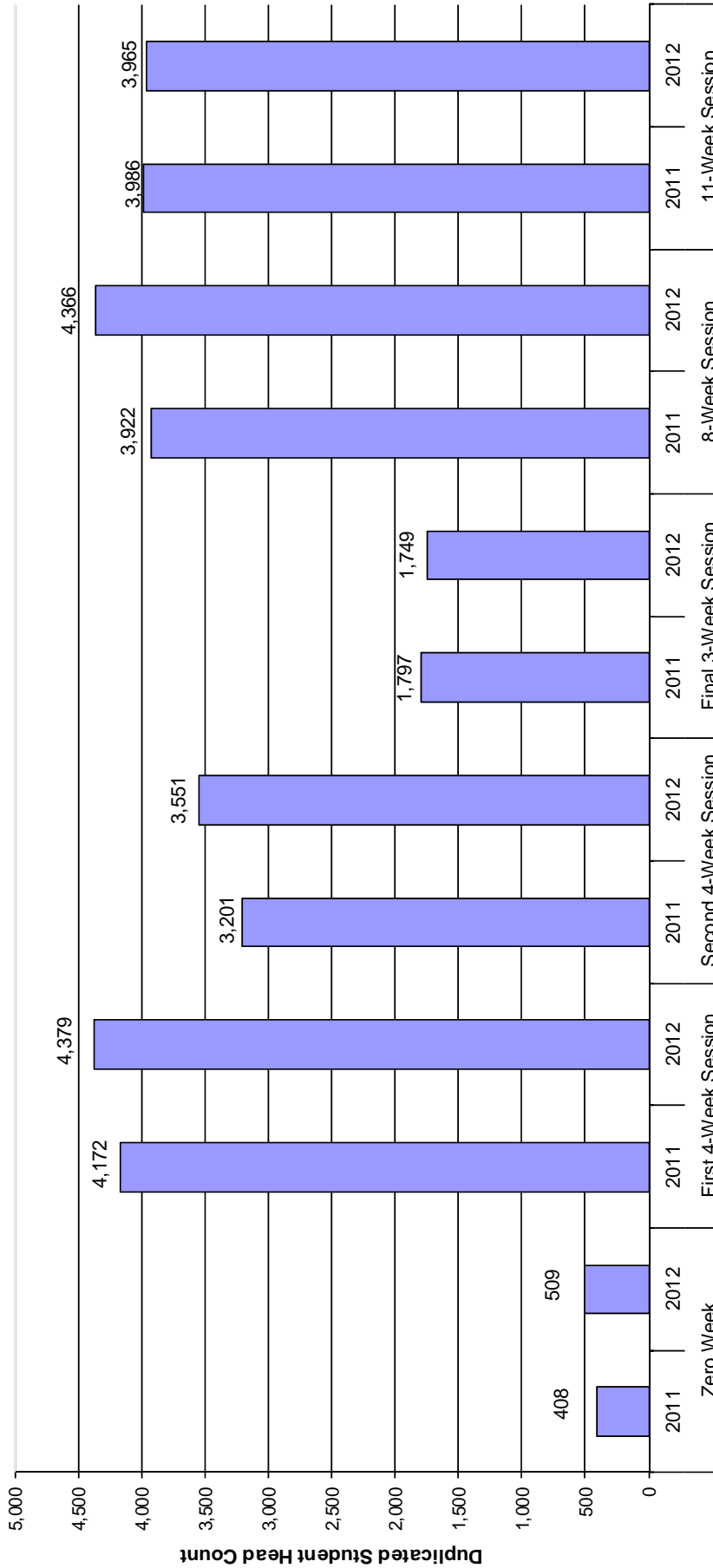

Highlights

- The Summer Session 2012 total enrollment of 10,492 was 906 more than Summer 2011 - an increase of 9.5%.
- There were more female students than male students in Summer 2012. Female students accounted for 51.6% of total students, while male students accounted for 48.4%.
- 72% of students were enrolled on a part-time basis.
- The College of Engineering had the largest unduplicated student enrollment (1,755) when compared to the other academic units.
- About 55.7% of the total student credit hours (78,718) were from the College of Science (28.0%) and the College of Liberal Arts (27.7%).
- OSU Extended Campus had a total enrollment of 5,020 students. These students were enrolled for 26,156 credit hours. About 40.1% of those credit hours were from the College of Liberal Arts.
- 168 new undergraduate students from high school enrolled for courses.
- The percentage of U.S. minority students was 19.6%.

■ For Summer 2012, more students (4,379) enrolled in the First 4-Week Session (June 25 - July 20). The Eight Week Session (June 25 - August 17) had (4,366) students (second-largest enrollment).

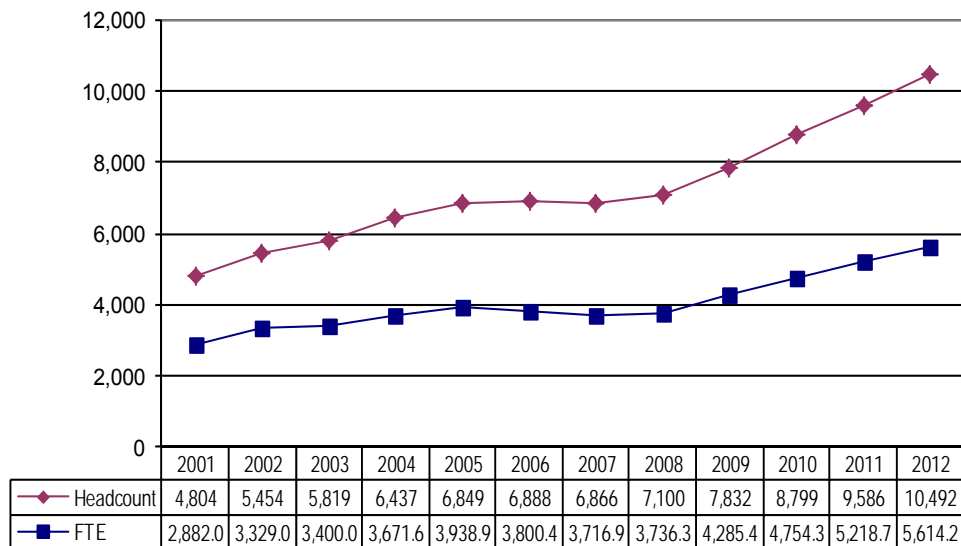
