







U.S. Minorities by Gender









Highlights

- The Summer Session 2014 total enrollment of 11,639 was 728 more than Summer 2013 an increase of 6.7%.
- There were more male students than female students in Summer 2014. Female students accounted for 49.8% of total students, while male students accounted for 50.2%.
- 75% of students were enrolled on a part-time basis.
- The College of Engineering had the largest unduplicated student enrollment (2,546) when compared to the other academic units.
- About(52.0%.) of the total student credit hours (85,031) were from College of Science (26.0%.) and the College of Liberal Arts (26.0%.).
- OSU Extended Campus had a total enrollment of 6,390 students. These students were enrolled for 34,465 credit hours. About 35.1% of those credit hours were from the College of Liberal Arts.
- 122 new undergraduate students from high school enrolled for courses.
- The percentage of U.S. minority students was 20.7%.

- For Summer 2014, more students (5,091) enrolled in the Eleven Week Session (June 23 September 5). The Eight Week Session (June 24 August 16) had 4,860 students (second-largest enrollment).


