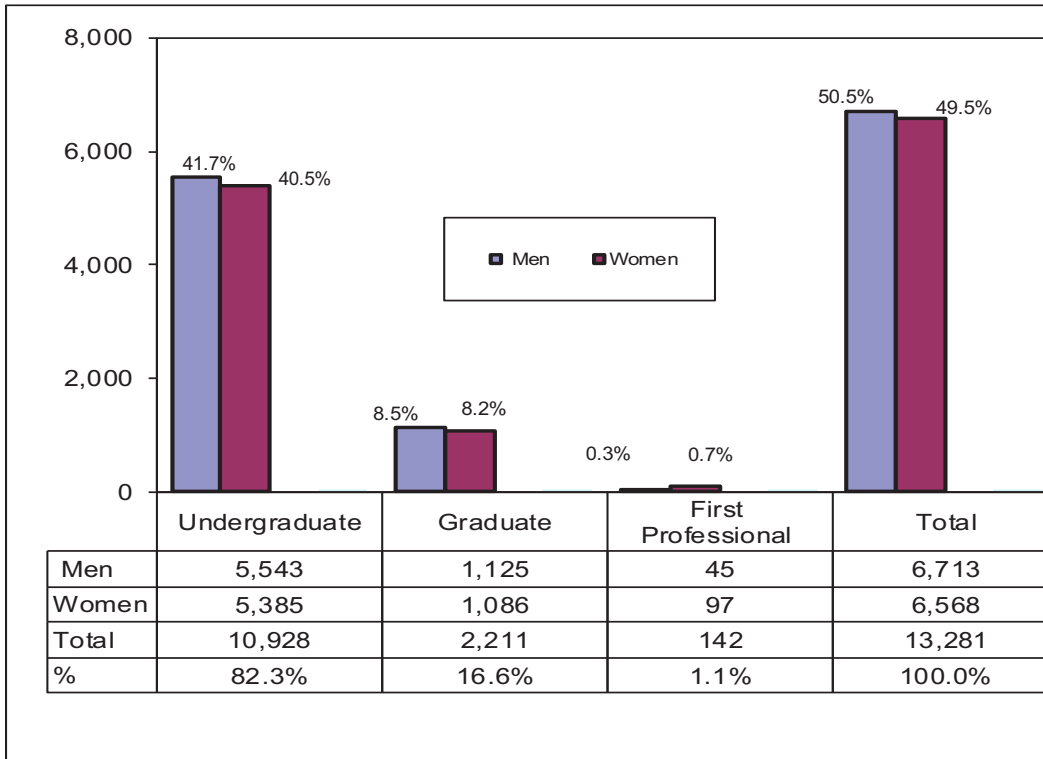

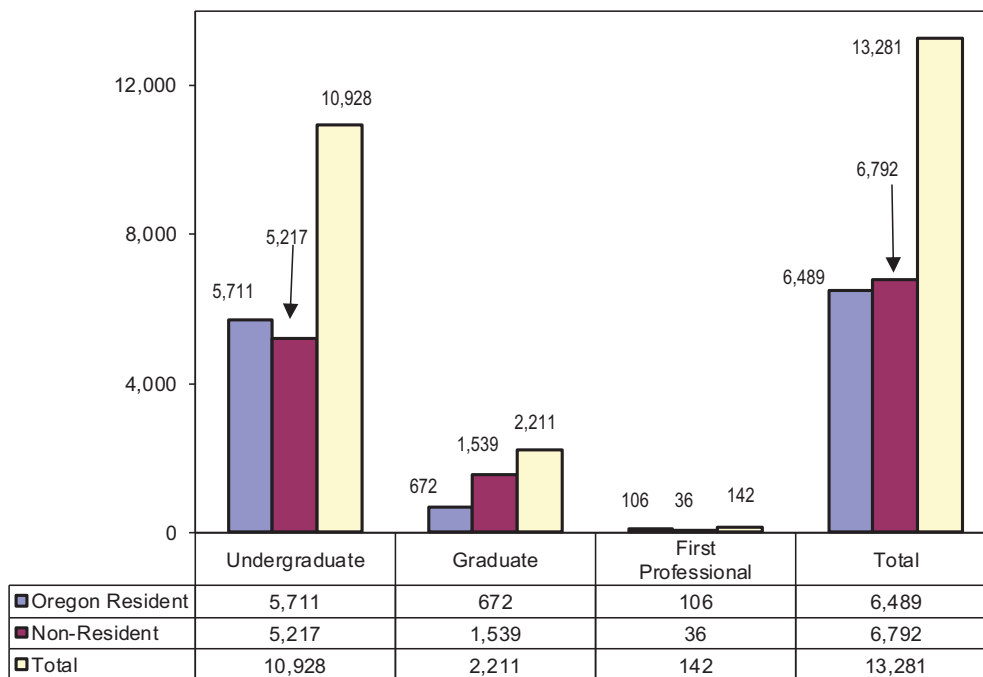

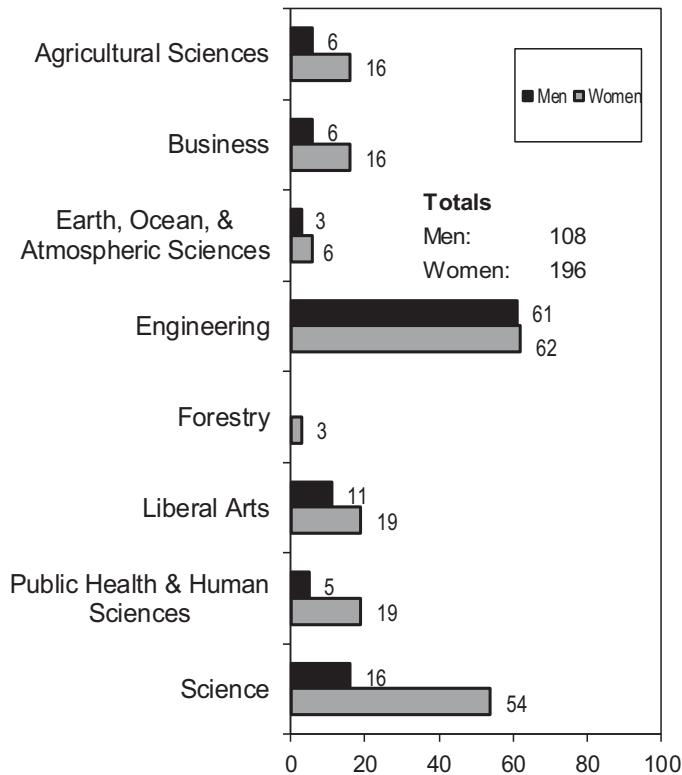

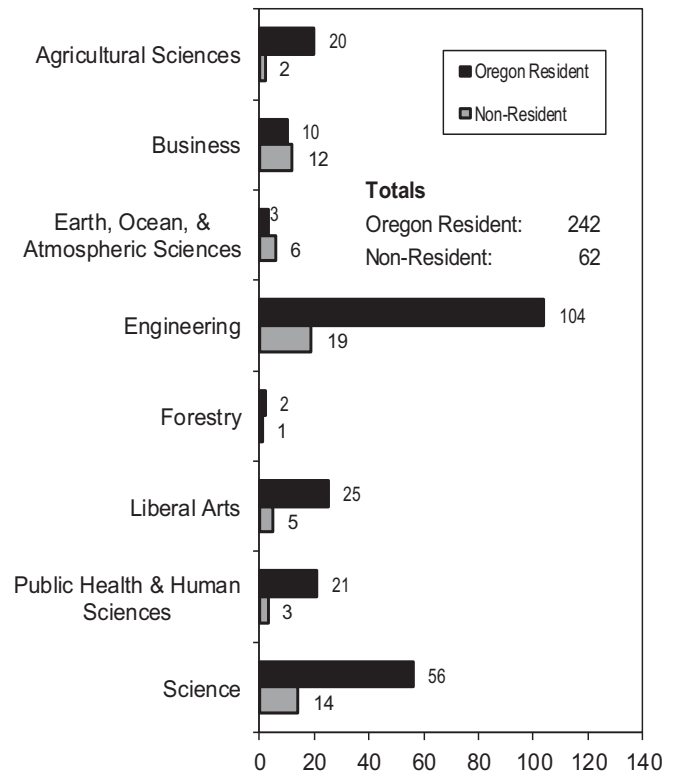

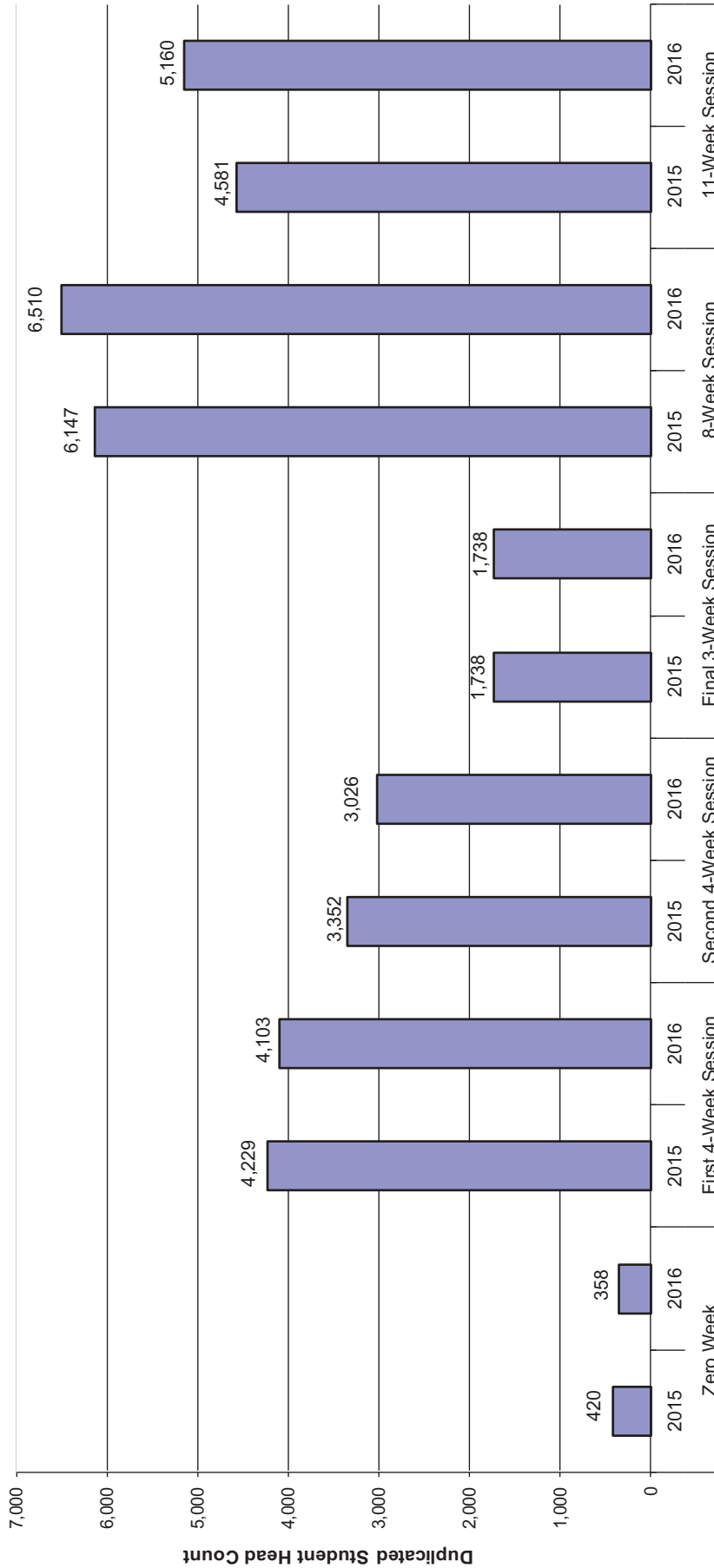

## Highlights

- The Summer Session 2016 total enrollment of 13,281 was 863 more than Summer 2015 - an increase of 6.9%.
- There were more male students than female students in Summer 2016. Female students accounted for 49.5% of total students, while male students accounted for 50.5%.
- 77% of students were enrolled on a part-time basis.
- The College of Engineering had the largest unduplicated student enrollment (3,592) when compared to the other academic units.
- About(49.4%.) of the total student credit hours (25,141) were from College of Liberal Arts (26.0%.) and the College of Science(23.4%.).
- OSU Extended Campus had a total enrollment of 8,115 students. These students were enrolled for 46,438 credit hours. About 33.7% of those credit hours were from the College of Liberal Arts.
- 129 new undergraduate students from high school enrolled for courses.
- The percentage of U.S. minority students was 22.8%.

■ For Summer 2016, more students (6,510) enrolled in the Eight Week Session (June 20 - August 12). The Eleven Week Session (June 20 - September 2) had 5,160 students (second-largest enrollment).

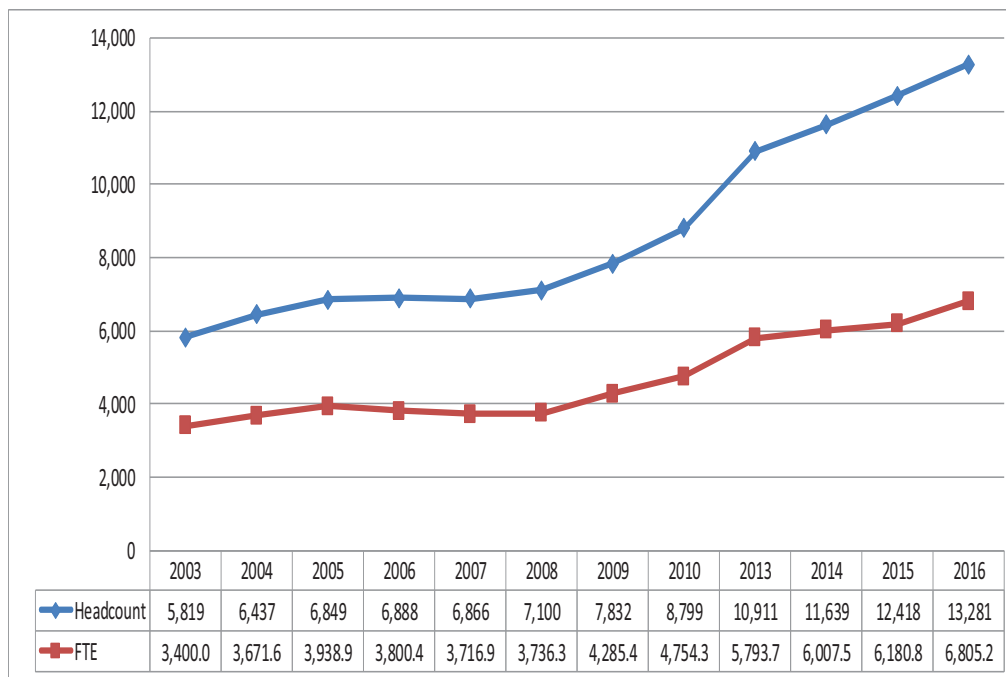
