

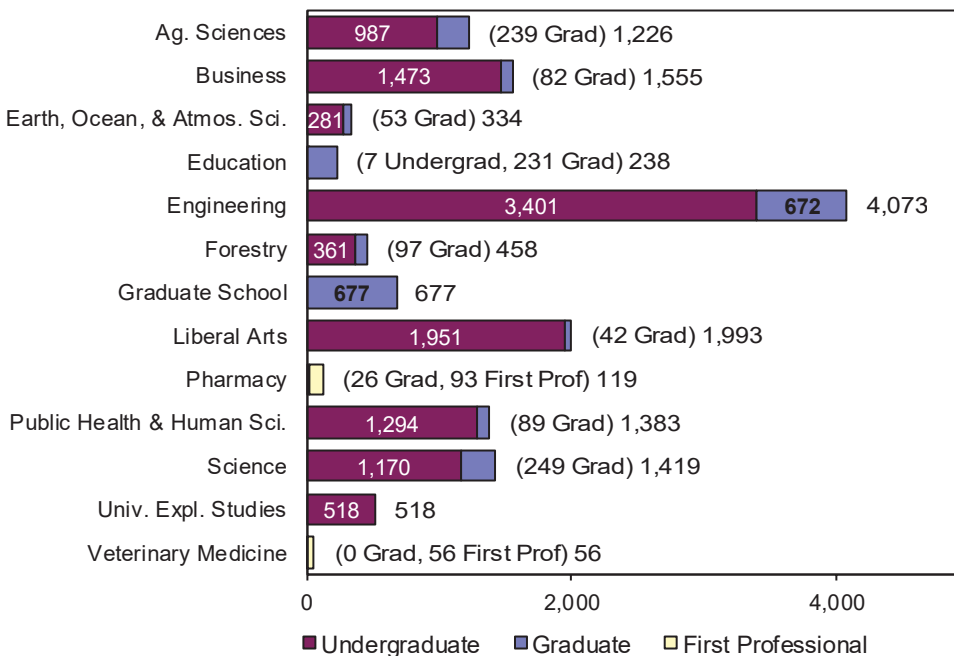

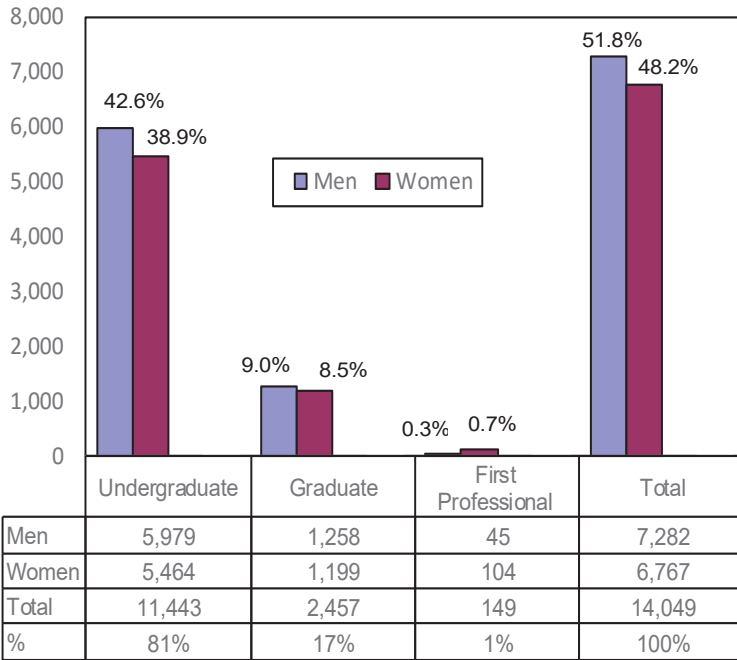

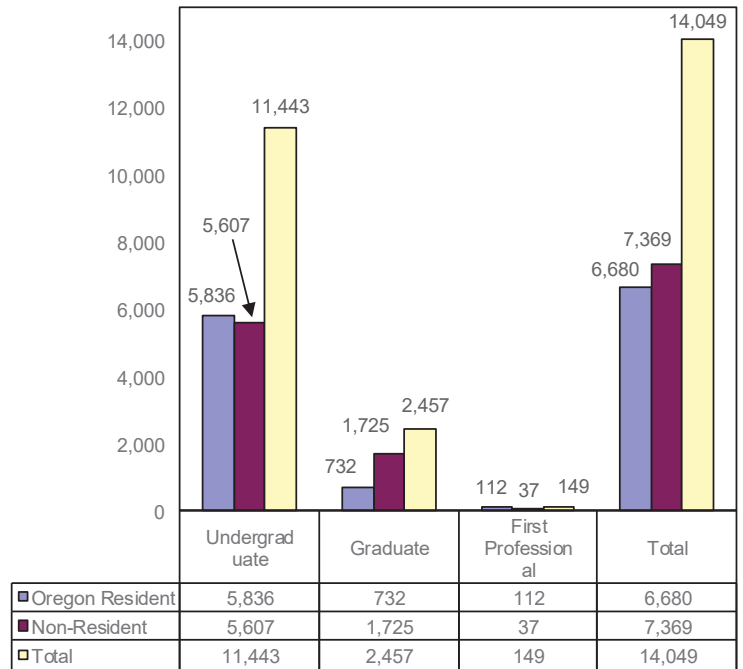

Enrollment by Sex—Binary and Student Level

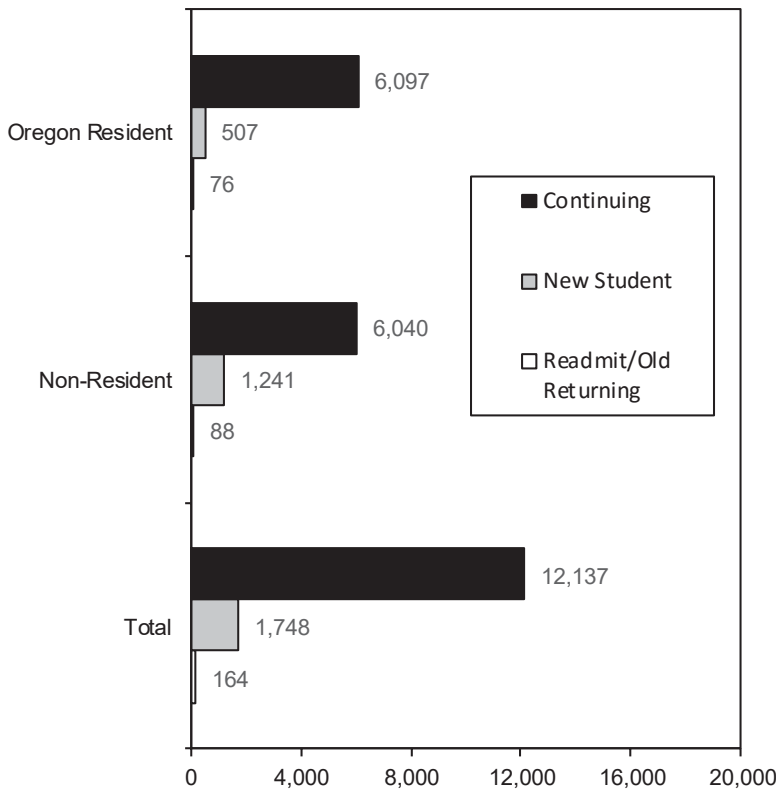


By Residency* and Student Level



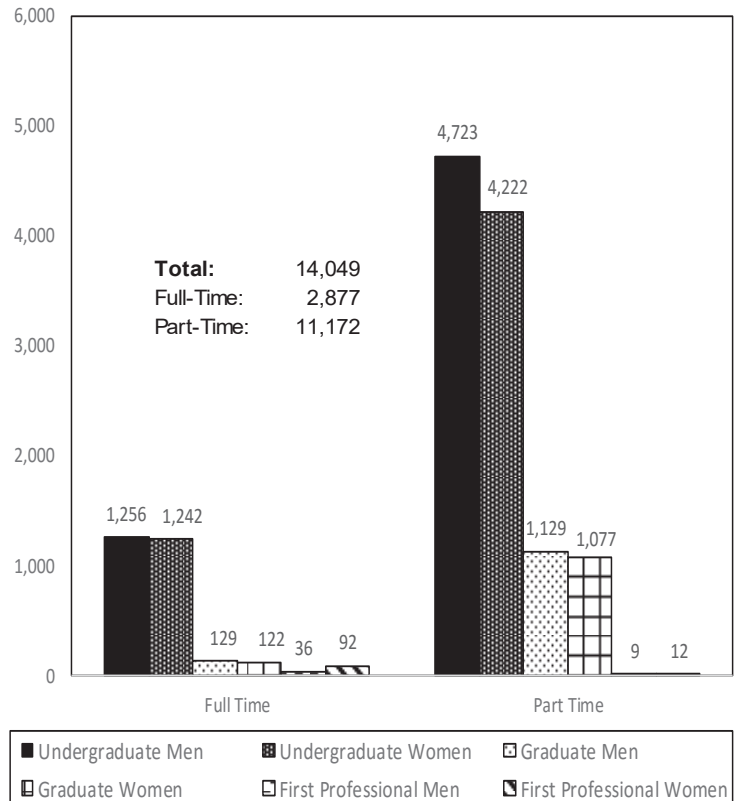

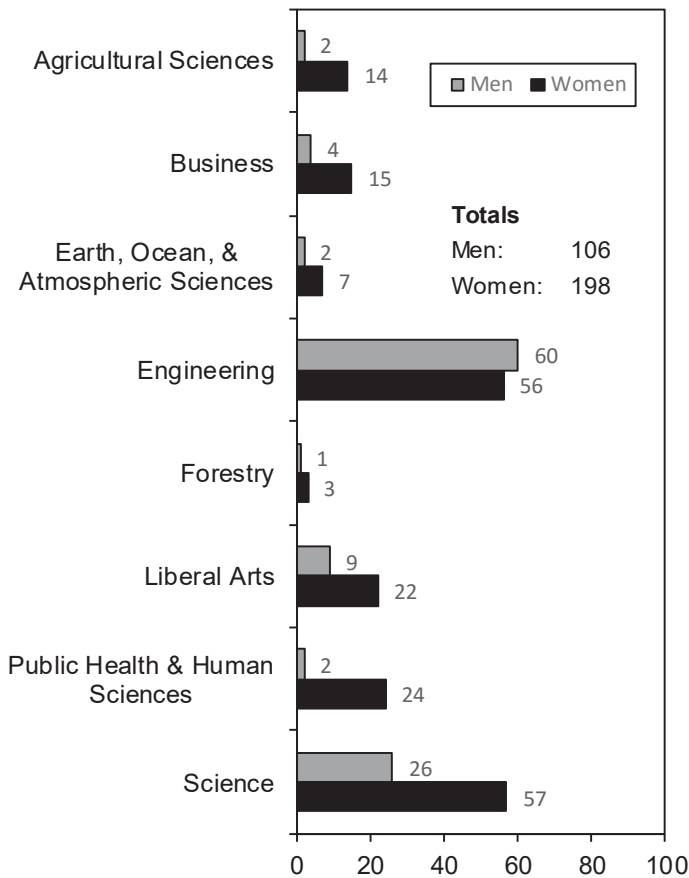

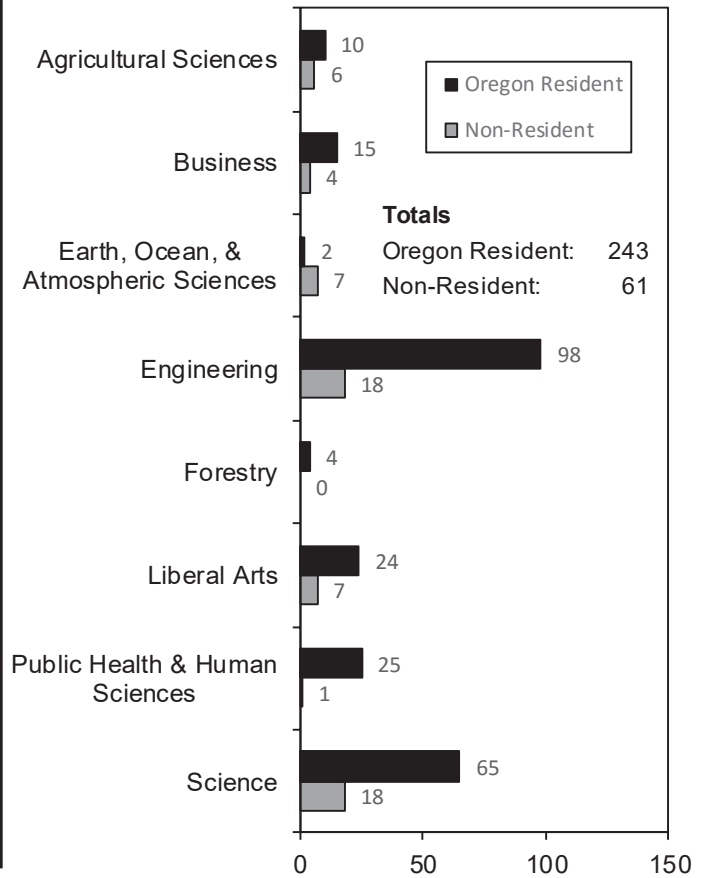

Highlights

- The Summer Session 2017 total enrollment of 14,049 was 768 more than Summer 2016 - an increase of 5.8%.
- There were more male students than female students in Summer 2017. Female students accounted for 48.0% of total students, while male students accounted for 51.8%.
- 80% of students were enrolled on a part-time basis.
- The College of Engineering had the largest unduplicated student enrollment (4,073) when compared to the other academic units.
- About 46.1% of the total student credit hours were from the College of Liberal Arts (25.2%) and the College of Science (20.9%).
- OSU Extended Campus had a total enrollment of 9,041 students. These students were enrolled for 52,355 credit hours. About 31.8% of those credit hours were from the College of Liberal Arts.
- 118 new undergraduate students from high school enrolled for courses.
- The percentage of U.S. minority students was 23.7%.

■ For Summer 2017, more students (7,112) enrolled in the Eight Week Session (June 26 - August 18). The Eleven Week Session (June 26 - September 8) had 5,620 students (second-largest enrollment).

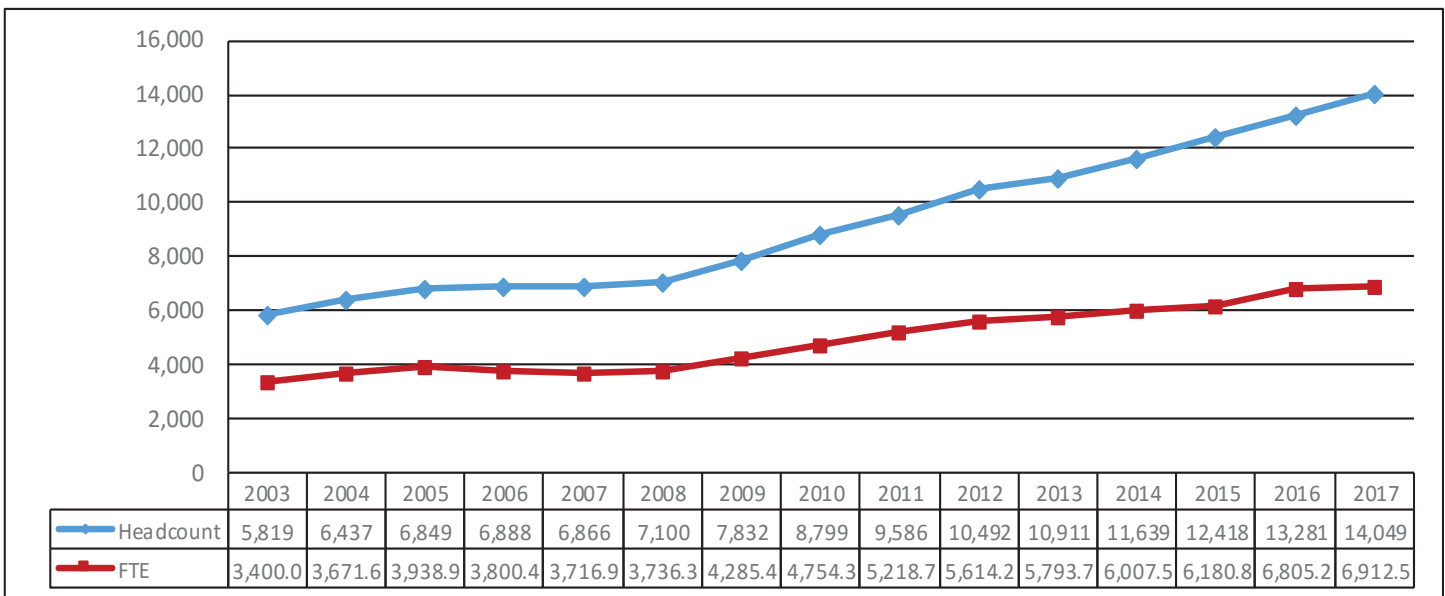
