






Student Enrollment Full Time and Part Time, by Gender









Highlights

■ When Winter 2006 and Winter 2007 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 354 students, or 1.9% (from 18,421 to 18,775). At the same time, the total student FTE increased by 198.3, or 1.1% (from 17,280.9 to 17,479.2), and the student credit hours increased by 2,256, or 0.9% (from 244,919 to 247,175).

■ When compared to Winter 2006, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 296 students, or 2.0% (from 15,138 to 15,434); the graduate enrollment increased by 1.6% (from 2,774 to 2,817); the first professional enrollment increased by 2.9% (from 509 to 524).

■ When compared to Winter 2006, Oregon residents increased by 0.8%; students from other U.S. states increased by 8.3%; and international student enrollment increased by 3.5%.

■ For Winter 2007, the percentage of U.S. minority students was 14.4% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 3.6% when compared to Winter 2006 (from 2,614 to 2,708).

■ The College of Engineering, College of Science, and College of Liberal Arts had the largest student enrollments (3,476, 3,076, and 2,917 respectively) when compared to the other academic units.

■ OSU Extended Campus had 2,837 students, an increase of 11.3% compared to Winter 2006. These students took 11,452 credits, of which 44.7% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 19.3% were from the College of Science.

■ During Winter 2007, a total of 613 students received services from OSU Cascades Campus.


■ Other increases that occurred when comparing Winter 2006 and Winter 2007 are as follows:

- First Professional students under age 25: 25.1%
- Part-time students: 10.7%
- Graduate students under age 25: 4.7%
- Undergraduate students age 25 and older: 3.5%
- Male students: 2.8%
- Undergraduate students under age 25: 1.7%
- Female students: 1.0%
- Graduate students age 25 and older: 0.8%
- Full-time students: 0.3%

■ Decreases that occurred when comparing Winter 2006 and Winter 2007 are as follows:

- First Professional students 25 and older: -8.7%
