
















Highlights

- When Winter 2008 and Winter 2009 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 685 students, or 3.6% (from 18,960 to 19,645). At the same time, the total student FTE increased by 574.6, or 3.3% (from 17,535.5 to 18,110.1), and the student credit hours increased by 8,011, or 3.2% (from 248,269 to 256,280).
- When compared to Winter 2008, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 538 students, or 3.4% (from 15,657 to 16,195); the graduate enrollment increased by 4.6% (from 2,777 to 2,904); the first professional enrollment increased by 3.8% (from 526 to 546).
- When compared to Winter 2008, Oregon residents increased by 1.6%; non-residents increased by 11.5%.
- International student enrollment increased by 2.9%.
- For Winter 2009, the percentage of U.S. minority students was 15.7% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 7.2% when compared to Winter 2008 (from 2,876 to 3,083).
- The College of Engineering, College of Science, and College of Liberal Arts had the largest student enrollments (3,866, 3,150, and 3,087 respectively) when compared to the other academic units.

- OSU Extended Campus had 3,463 students, an increase of 15.4% compared to . These students took 16,011 credits, of which 41.3% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 21.8% were from the College of Science.
- During Winter 2009, a total of 673 students received services from OSU Cascades Campus.
- Other increases that occurred when comparing Winter 2008 and Winter 2009 are as follows:
