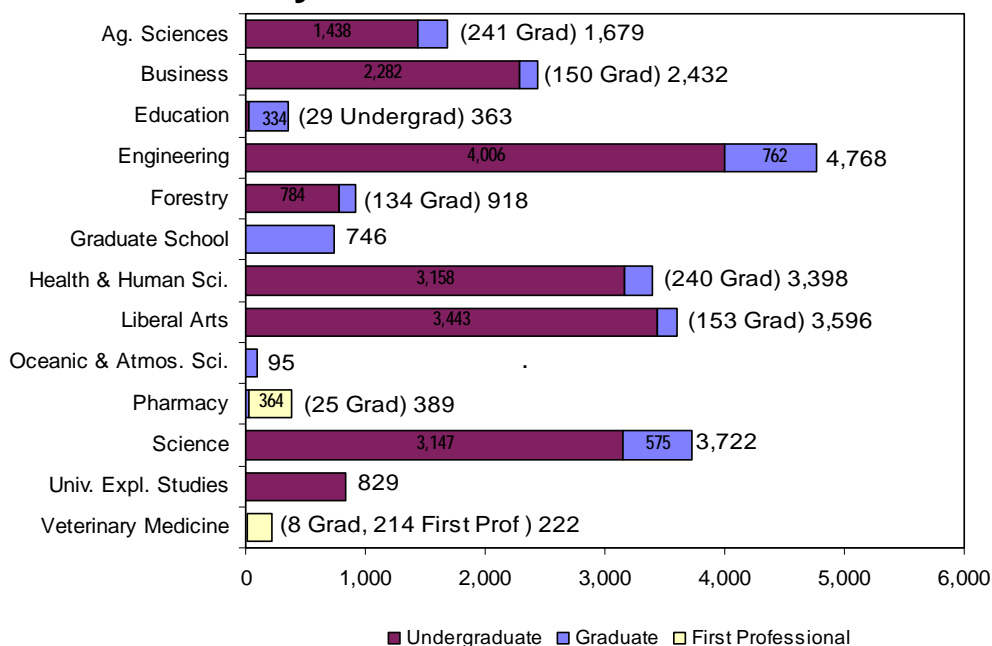

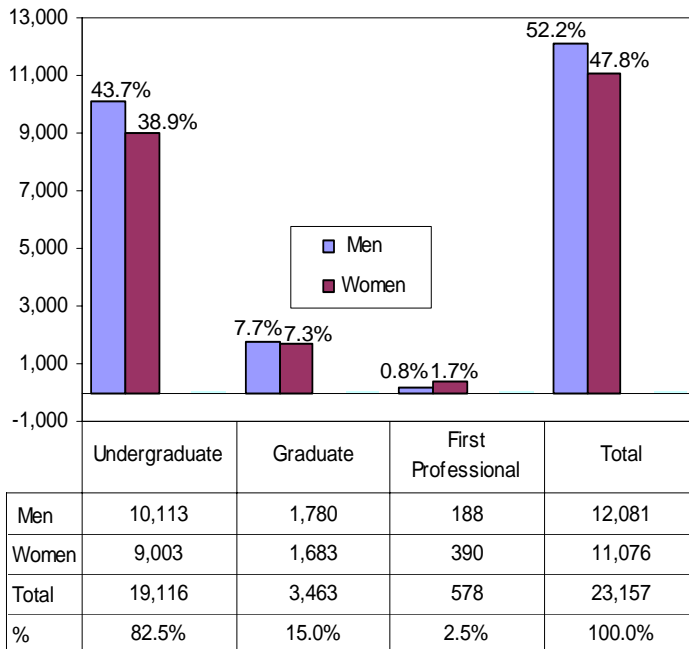

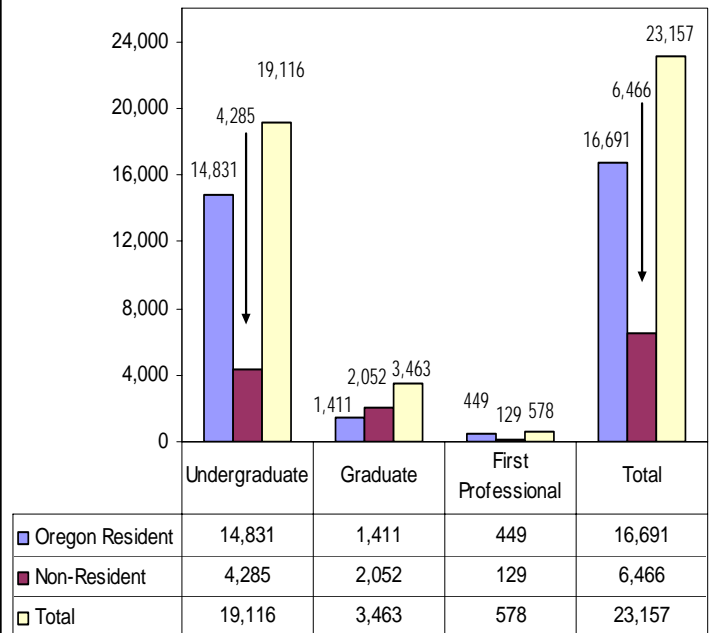

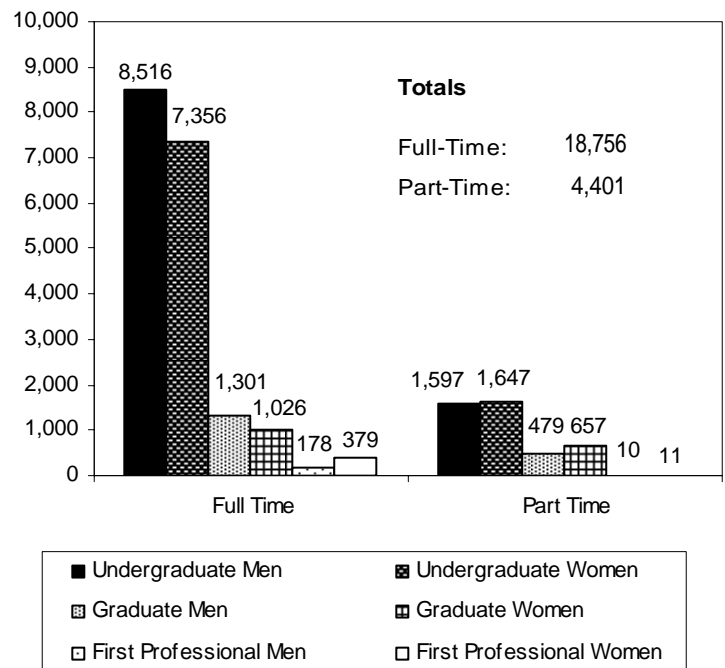

Student Enrollment Full Time and Part Time, by Gender

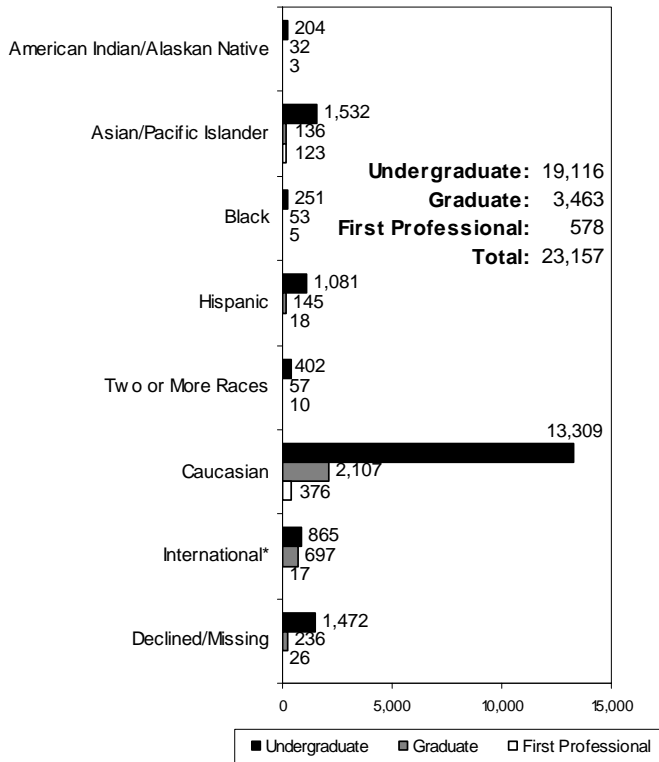

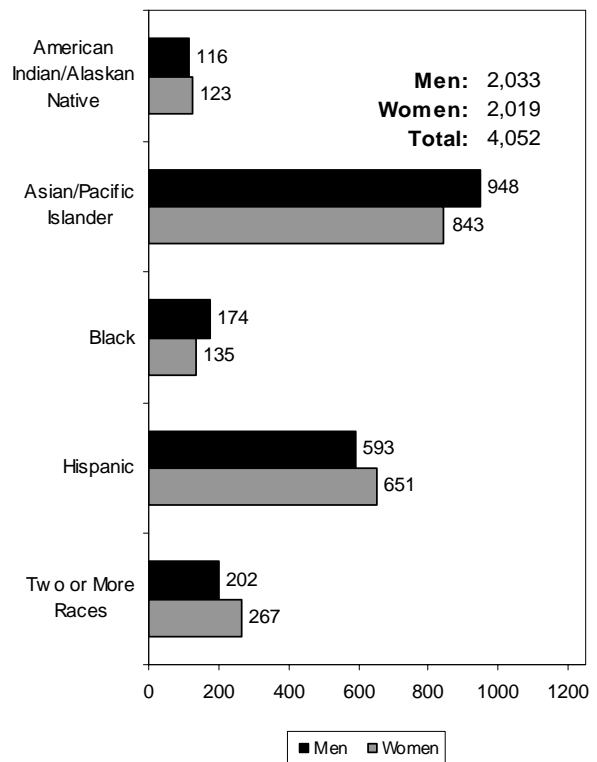

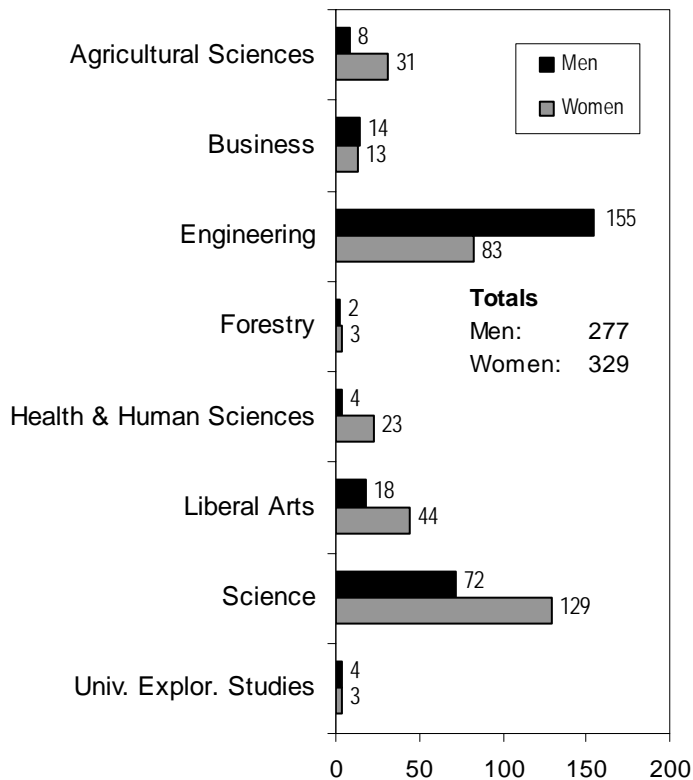

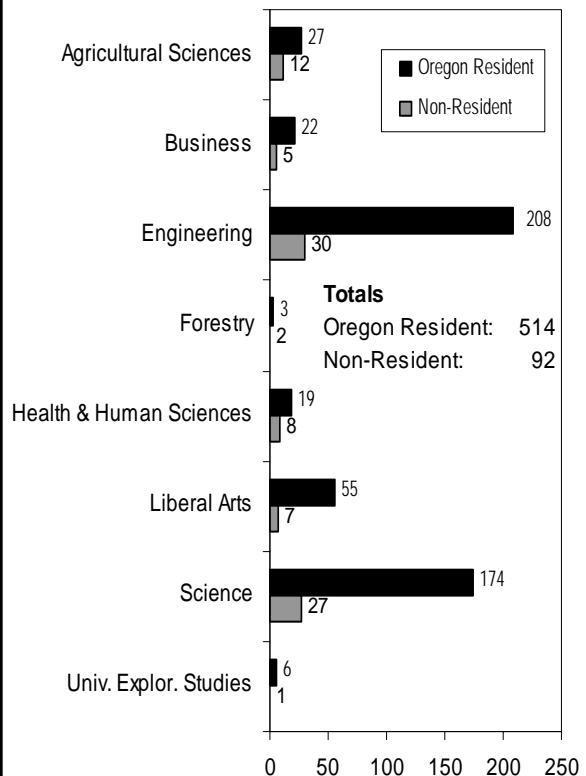

Highlights

■ When Winter 2010 and Winter 2011 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 1,714 students, or 8.0% (from 21,443 to 23,157). At the same time, the total student FTE increased by 1,453.2, or 7.4% (from 19,598.1 to 21,051.3), and the student credit hours increased by 20,177, or 7.3% (from 277,961 to 298,138).

■ When compared to Winter 2010, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 1,365 students, or 7.7% (from 17,751 to 19,116); the graduate enrollment increased by 10.9% (from 3,122 to 3,463); the first professional enrollment increased by 1.4% (from 570 to 578).

■ When compared to Winter 2010, Oregon residents increased by 2.6%; non-residents increased by 24.8%.

■ International student enrollment increased by 35.9%.

■ For Winter 2011, the percentage of U.S. minority students was 17.5% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 18.7% when compared to Winter 2010 (from 3,414 to 4,052).

■ The College of Engineering, College of Science, and College of Liberal Arts had the largest student enrollments (4,768, 3,722, and 3,596 respectively) when compared to the other academic units.

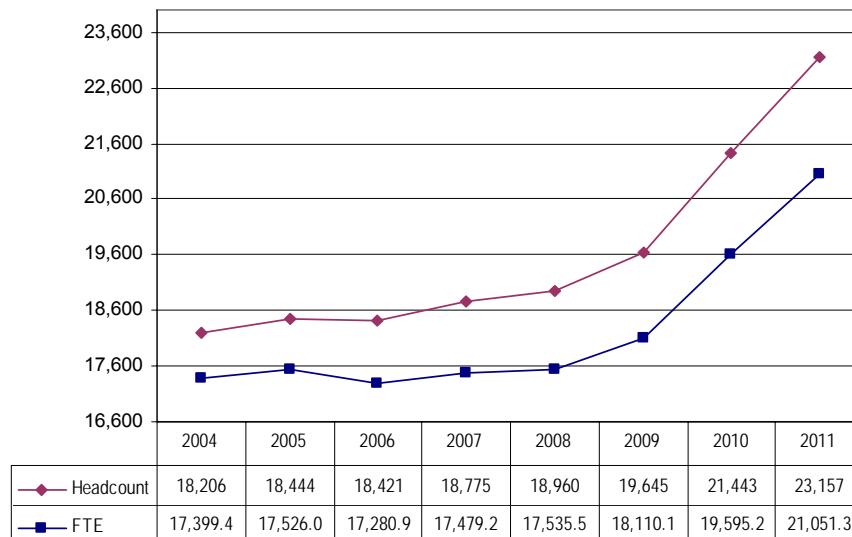
■ OSU Extended Campus had 5,219 students, an increase of 18.0% compared to Winter 2010. These students took 25,031 credits, of which 40.0% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 19.7% were from the College of Science.

■ During Winter 2011, a total of 840 students received services from OSU Cascades Campus.

■ Other increases that occurred when comparing Winter 2010 and Winter 2011 are as follows:

- Graduate students under age 25: 32.0%
- Undergraduate students age 25 and older: 12.1%
- Part-time students: 10.1%
- Female students: 8.2%
- Male students: 7.8%
- Full-time students: 7.5%
- Undergraduate students under age 25: 6.9%
- Graduate students age 25 and older: 5.5%
- First Professional students 25 and older: 1.5%
- First Professional students under age 25: 1.2%
