








Student Enrollment Full Time and Part Time, by Gender









Highlights

■ When Winter 2011 and Winter 2012 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 1,268 students, or 5.5% (from 23,157 to 24,425). At the same time, the total student FTE increased by 1,019.0, or 4.8% (from 21,051.3 to 22,070.3), and the student credit hours increased by 14,469, or 4.9% (from 298,138 to 312,607).

■ When compared to Winter 2011, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 1,093 students, or 5.7% (from 19,116 to 20,209); the graduate enrollment increased by 5.1% (from 3,463 to 3,639); the first professional enrollment decreased by 0.2% (from 578 to 577).

■ When compared to Winter 2011, Oregon residents increased by 0.8%; non-residents increased by 17.6%.

■ International student enrollment increased by 20.6%.

■ For Winter 2012, the percentage of U.S. minority students was 18.7% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 12.8% when compared to Winter 2011 (from 4,052 to 4,571).

■ The College of Engineering, College of Science, and College of Liberal Arts had the largest student enrollments (5,052, 3,780, and 3,699 respectively) when compared to the other academic units.


■ OSU Extended Campus had 5,731 students, an increase of 9.8% compared to . These students took 29,003 credits, of which 40.2% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 16.8% were from the College of Science.

■ During Winter 2012, a total of 908 students received services from OSU Cascades Campus.

■ Other increases that occurred when comparing Winter 2011 and Winter 2012 are as follows:

- Undergraduate students age 25 and older: 14.2%
- Part-time students: 9.8%
- Graduate students under age 25: 8.2%
- Male students: 6.1%
- Female students: 4.8%
- Full-time students: 4.5%
- Graduate students age 25 and older: 4.1%
- Undergraduate students under age 25: 4.1%
- First Professional students 25 and older: 0.6%
