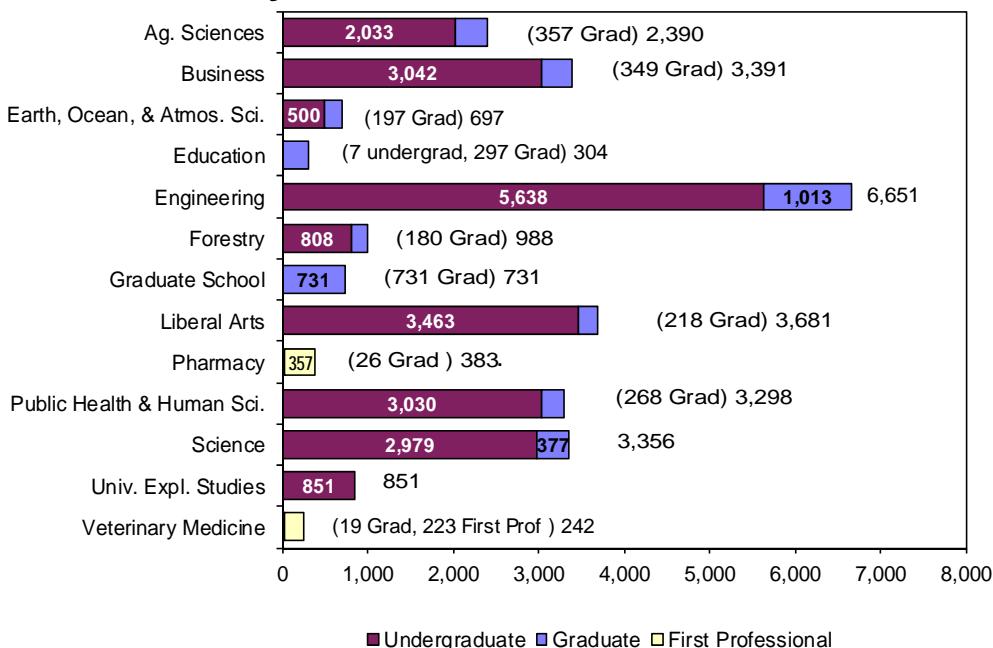

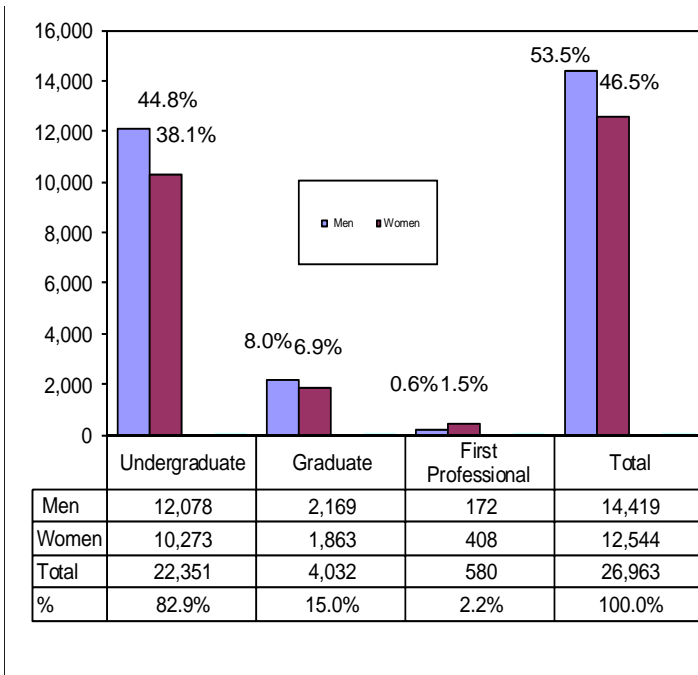

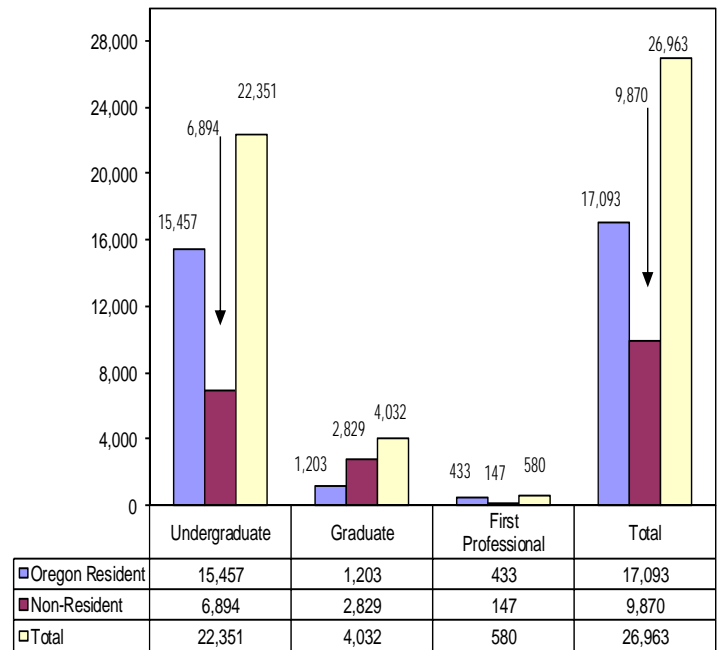

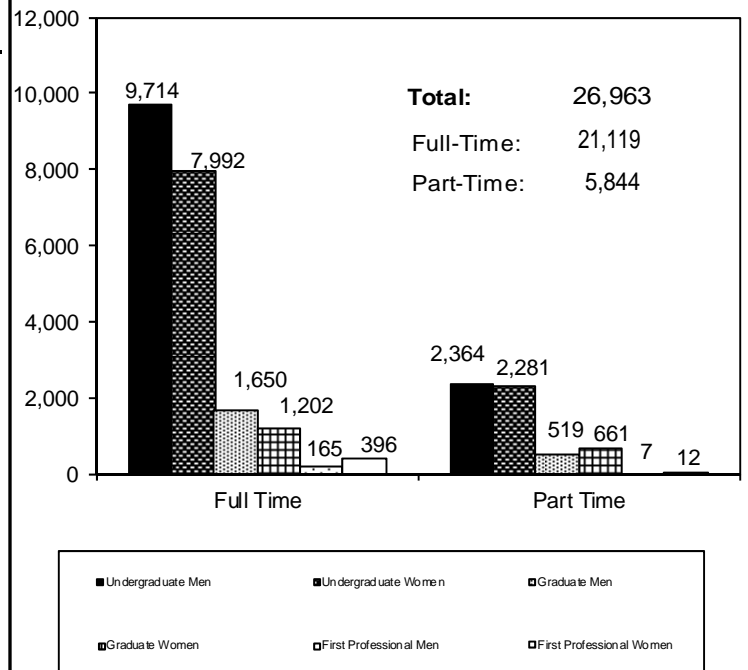

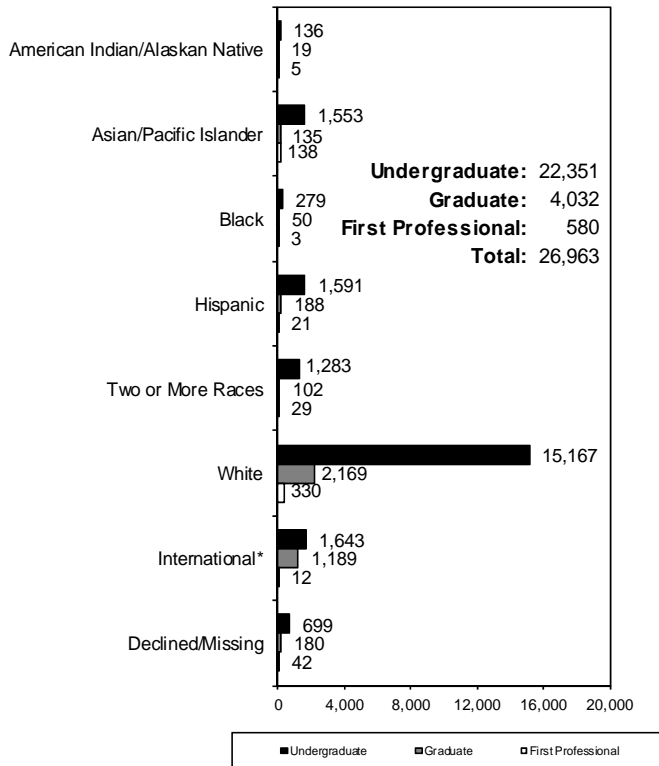
Student Enrollment Full Time and Part Time, by Gender



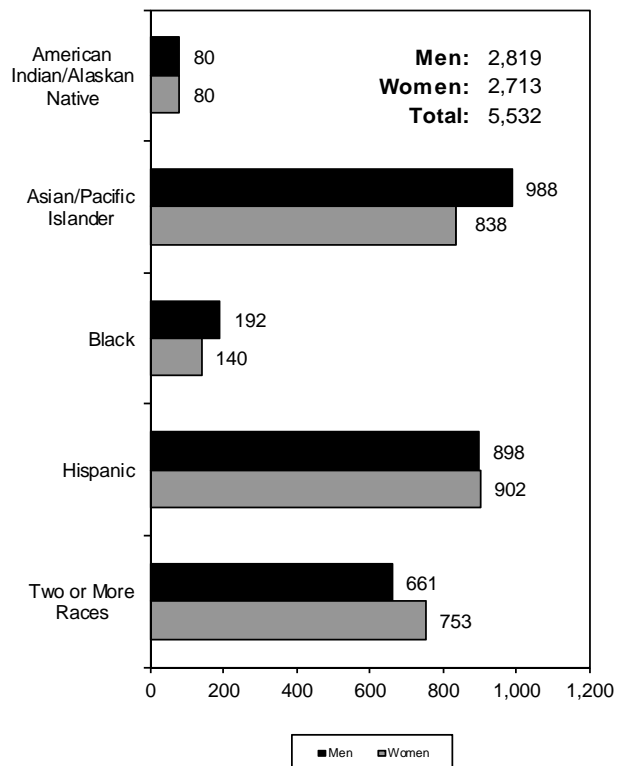

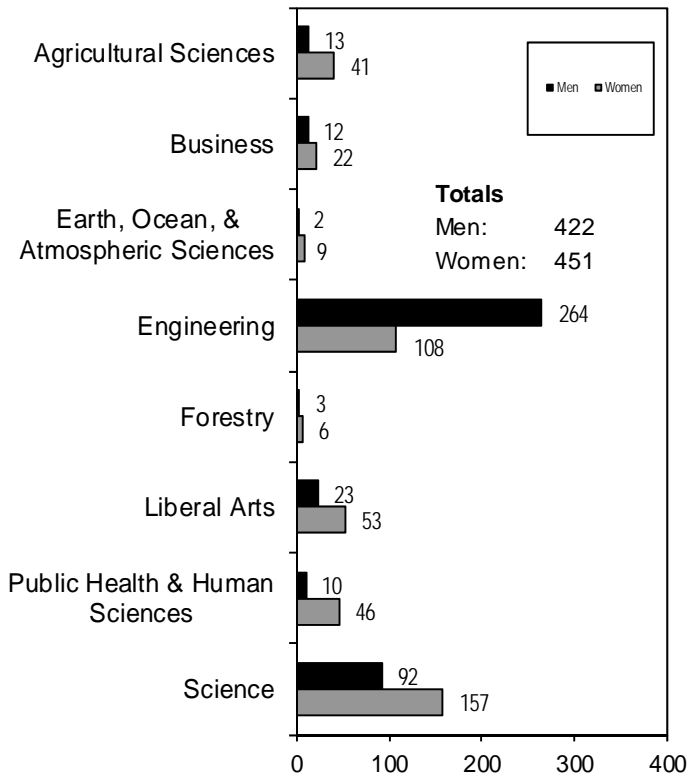

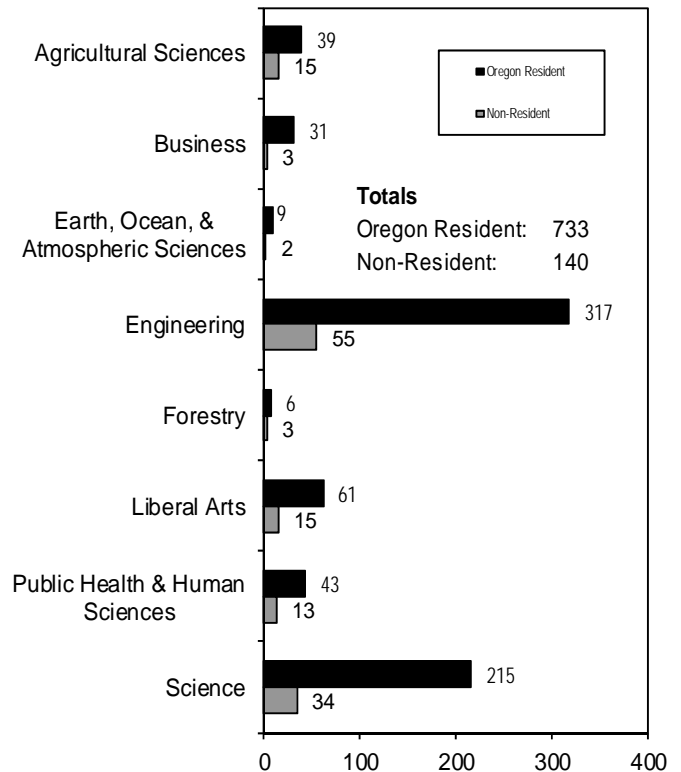

Highlights

■ When Winter 2013 and Winter 2014 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 1,242 students, or 4.8% (from 25,721 to 26,963). At the same time, the total student FTE increased by 814.8, or 3.5% (from 23,012.5 to 23,827.3), and the student credit hours increased by 11,332, or 3.5% (from 326,067 to 337,399).

■ When compared to Winter 2013, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 1,039 students, or 4.9% (from 21,312 to 22,351); the graduate enrollment increased by 5.4% (from 3,826 to 4,032); the first professional enrollment decreased by 0.5% (from 583 to 580).

■ When compared to Winter 2013, Oregon residents increased by 0.8%; non-residents increased by 12.6%.

■ International student enrollment increased by 19.1%.

■ For Winter 2014, the percentage of U.S. minority students was 20.5% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 9.5% when compared to Winter 2013 (from 5,052 to 5,532).

■ The College of Engineering, College of Liberal Arts, and College of Business had the largest student enrollments (6,651, 3,681, and 3,391 respectively) when compared to the other academic units.

■ OSU Extended Campus had 7,999 students, an increase of 14.6% compared to Winter 2013. These students took 41,334 credits, of which 34.6% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 15.2% were from the College of Agricultural Sciences.

■ During Winter 2014, a total of 1,056 students received services from OSU Cascades Campus.

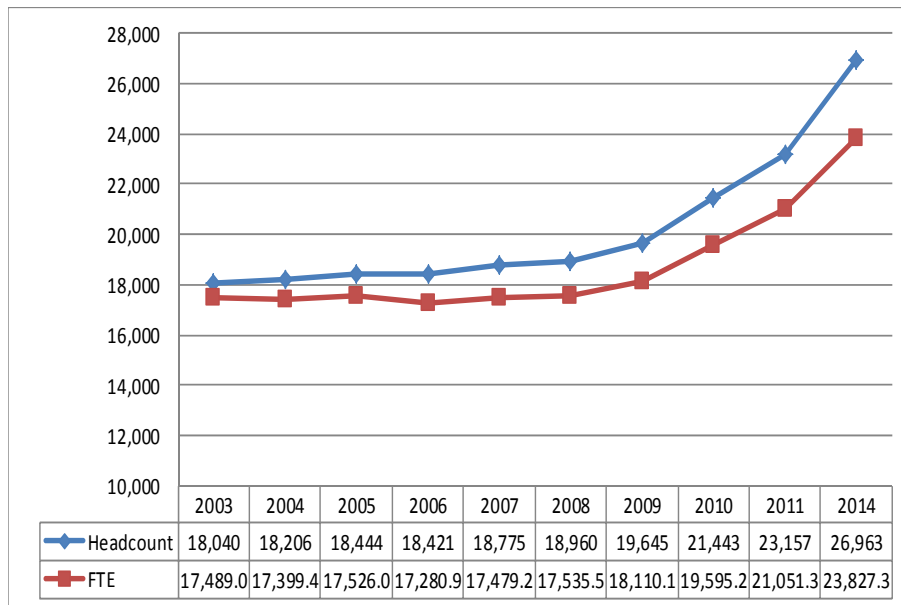
■ Other increases that occurred when comparing Winter 2013 and Winter 2014 are as follows:

- Part-time students: 11.6%
- Graduate students under age 25: 7.4%
- Undergraduate students age 25 and older: 7.4%
- Male students: 5.9%
- First Professional students 25 and older: 5.0%
- Graduate students age 25 and older: 4.7%
- Undergraduate students under age 25: 4.3%
- Female students: 3.6%
- Full-time students: 3.1%

■ Other decreases that occurred when comparing Winter 2013 and Winter 2014 are as follows:

- First Professional students under age 25: -8.3%
