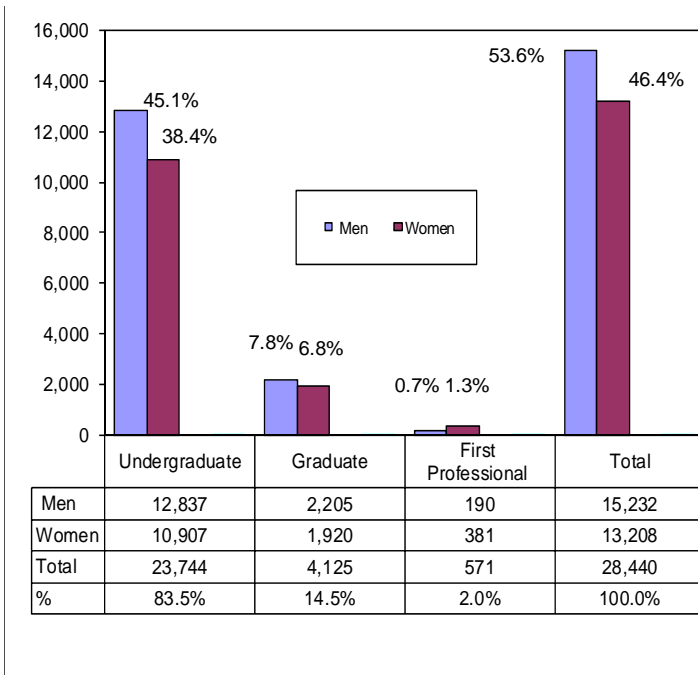

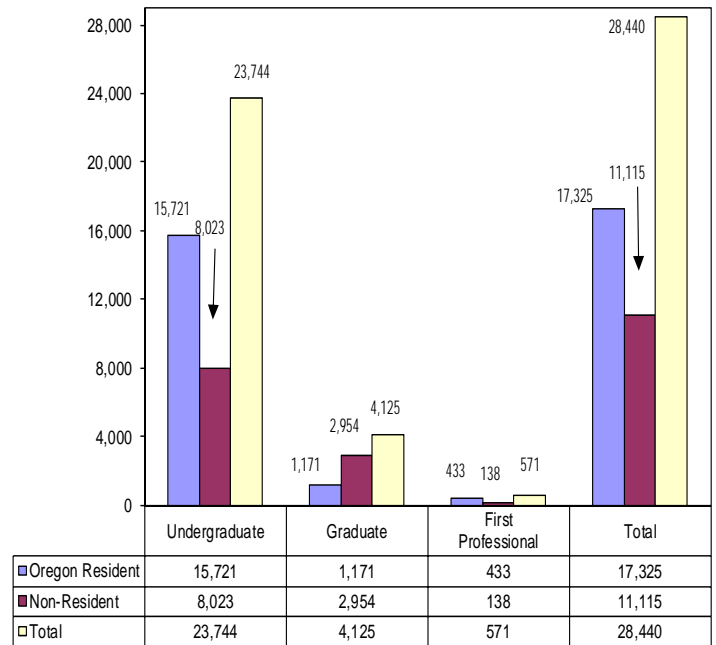

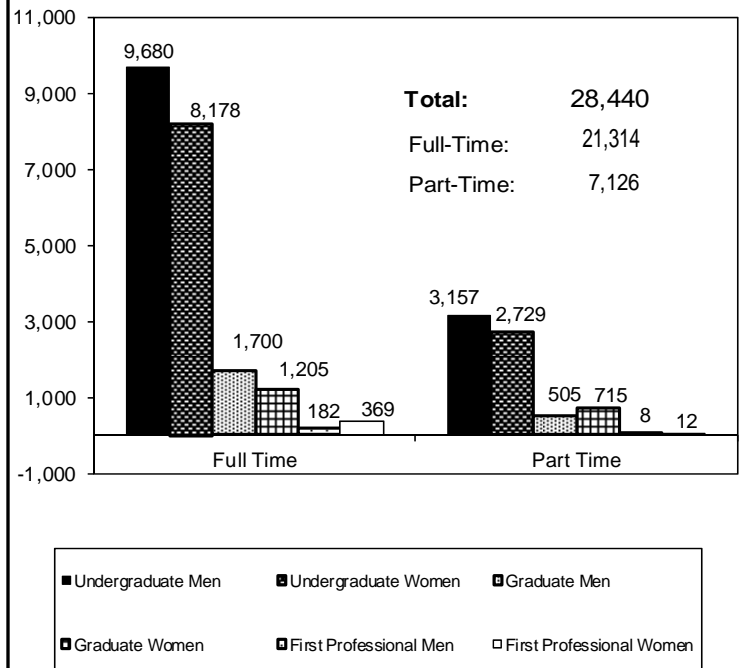

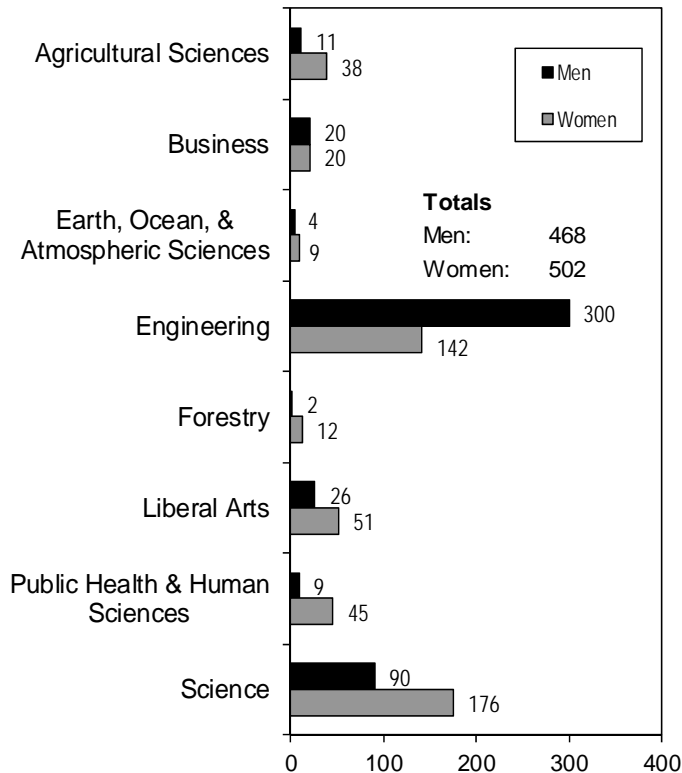

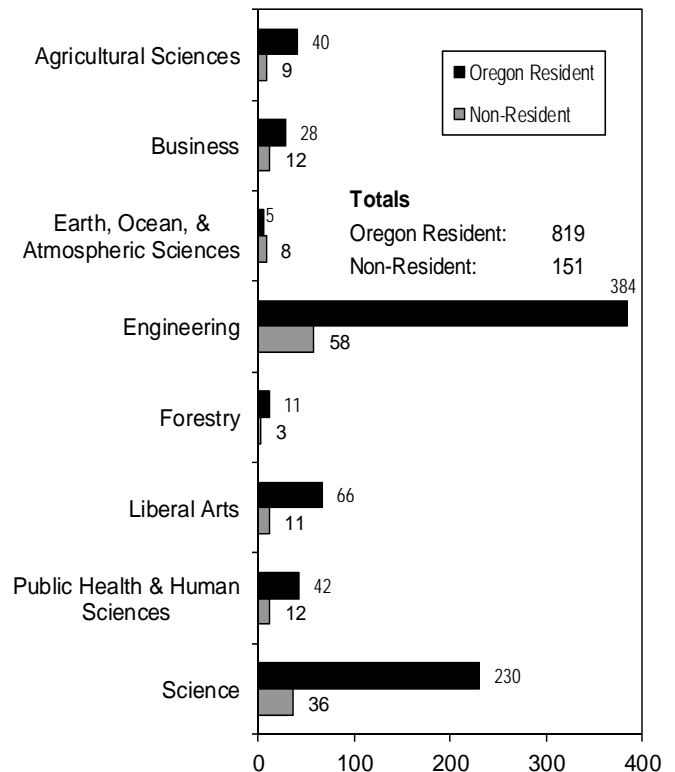

## Highlights

■ When Winter 2015 and Winter 2016 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 694 students, or 2.5% (from 27,746 to 28,440). At the same time, the total student FTE increased by 332.1, or 1.4% (from 24,202.9 to 24,535.0), and the student credit hours increased by 5,015, or 1.5% (from 342,678 to 347,693).

■ When compared to Winter 2015, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 773 students, or 3.4% (from 22,971 to 23,744); the graduate enrollment decreased by 1.9% (from 4,204 to 4,125); the first professional enrollment 0.0% (from 571 to 571).

■ When compared to Winter 2015, Oregon residents increased by 1.5%; non-residents increased by 4.2%.

■ International student enrollment increased by 4.9%.

■ For Winter 2016, the percentage of U.S. minority students was 22.9% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 7.3% when compared to Winter 2015 (from 6,069 to 6,513).

■ The College of Engineering, College of Liberal Arts, and College of Business had the largest student enrollments (8,016, 3,820, and 3,492 respectively) when compared to the other academic units.

■ OSU Extended Campus had 10,396 students, an increase of 13.1% compared to Winter 2015. These students took 55,788 credits, of which 32.4% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 16.9% were from the College of Engineering.

■ During Winter 2016, a total of 1,092 students received services from OSU Cascades Campus.

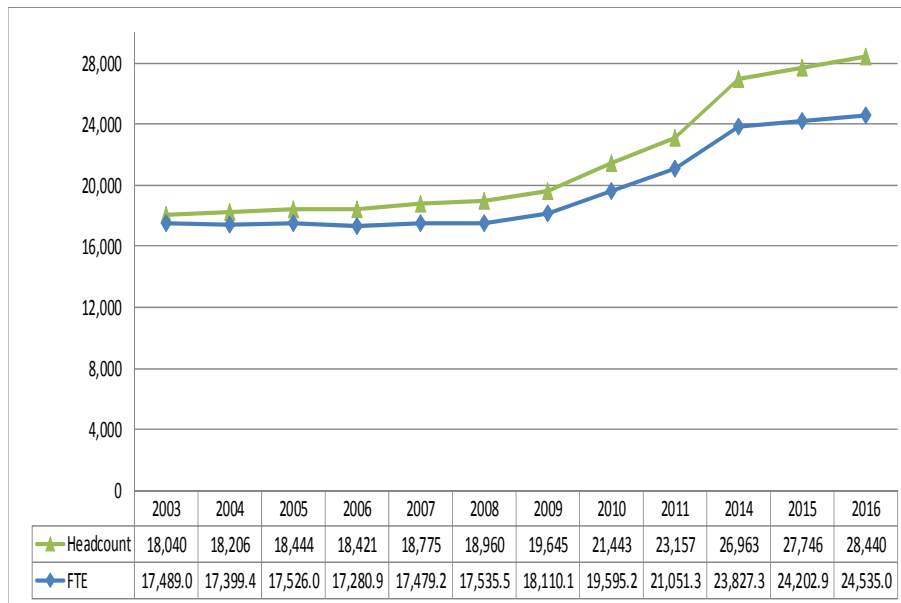
■ Other increases that occurred when comparing Winter 2015 and Winter 2016 are as follows:

- Part-time students: 8.1%
- Undergraduate students age 25 and older: 7.5%
- Female students: 2.7%
- First Professional students 25 and older: 2.5%
- Male students: 2.3%
- Undergraduate students under age 25: 2.3%
- Full-time students: 0.7%

■ Other decreases that occurred when comparing Winter 2015 and Winter 2016 are as follows:

- Graduate students under age 25: -7.2%
- First Professional students under age 25: -4.1%
- Graduate students age 25 and older: -0.2%
