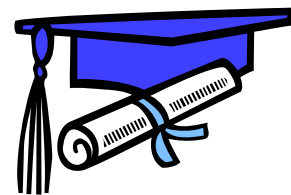

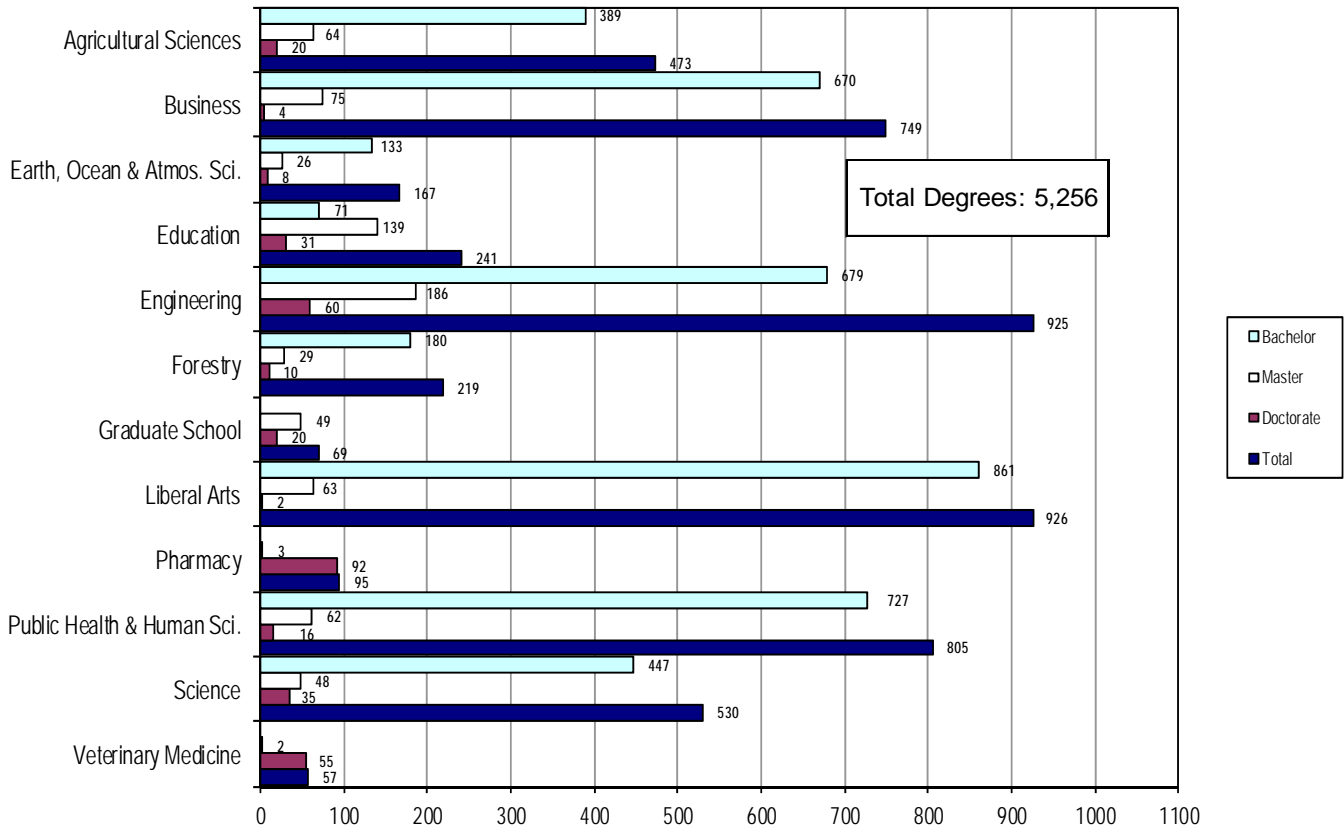

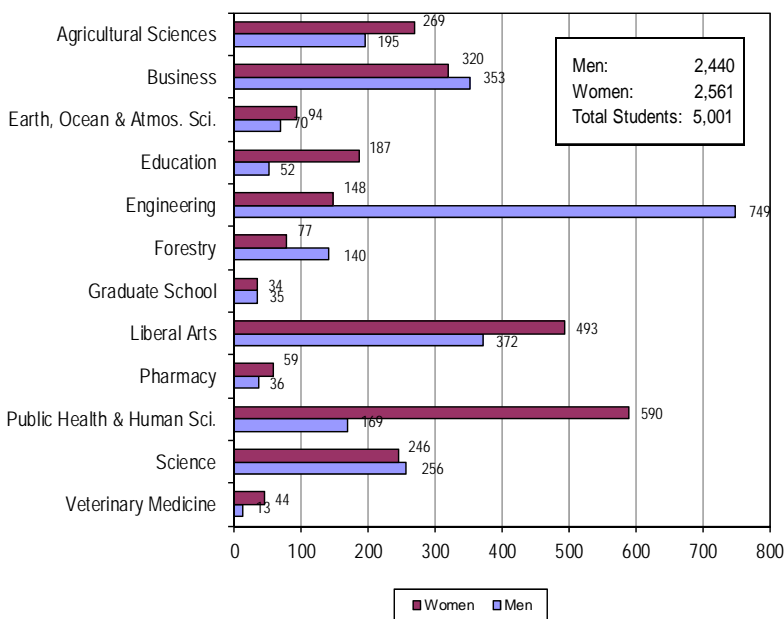
Degrees Conferred by Academic Unit and Degree Type



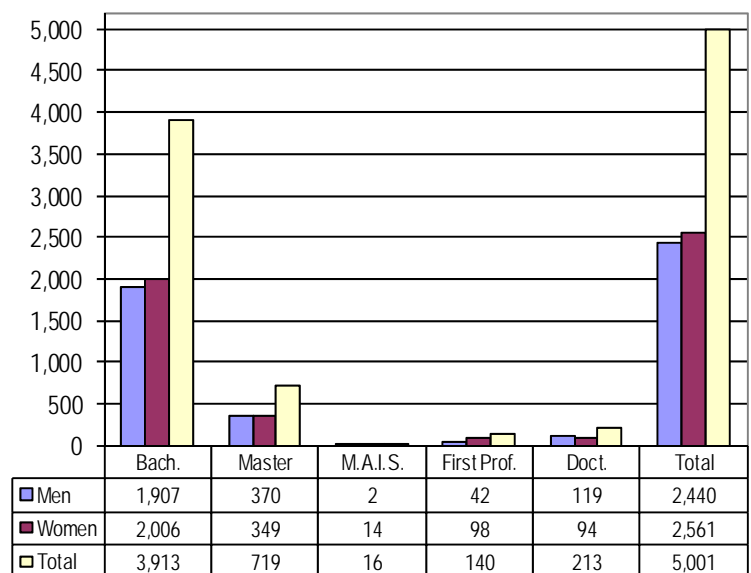

By Academic Unit and Gender



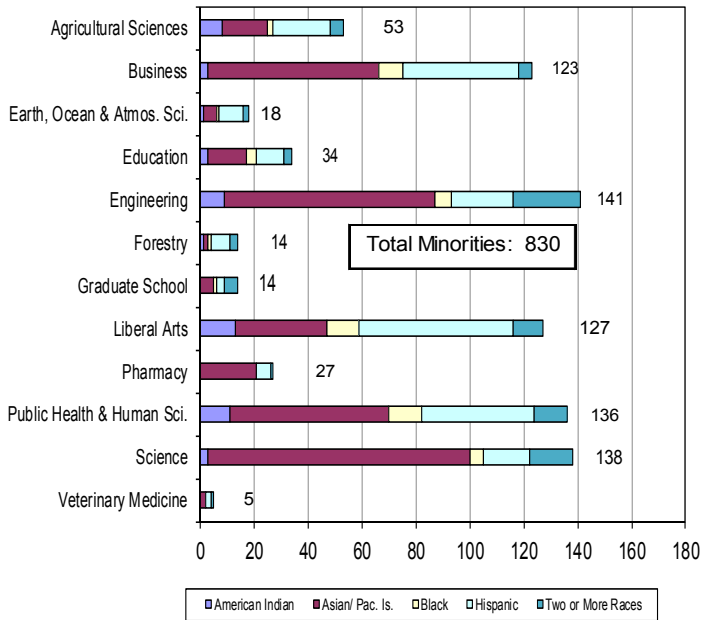
By Gender and Degree Type



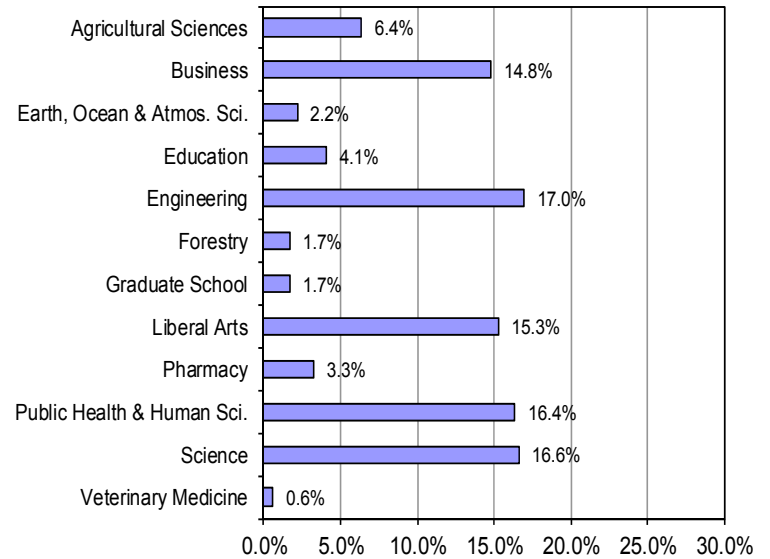

Percentage of Total U.S. Minority Graduates



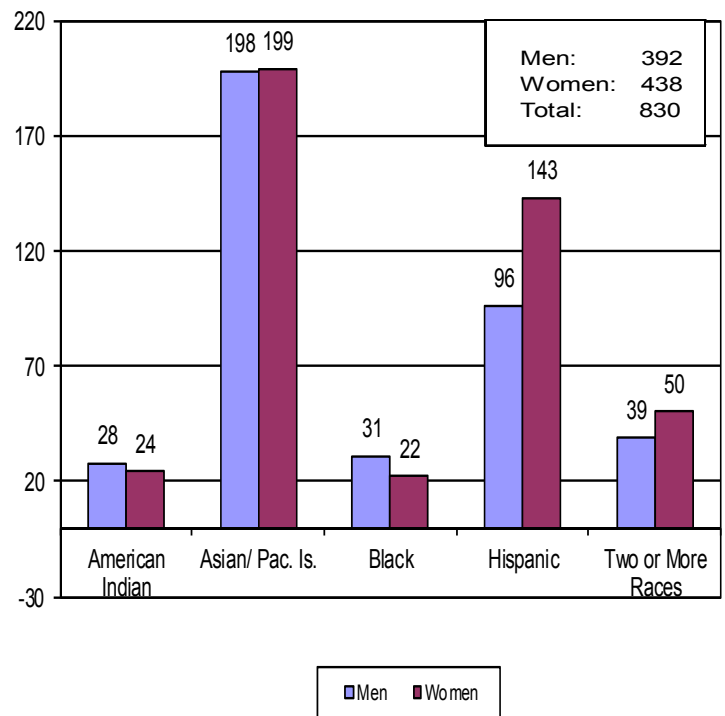

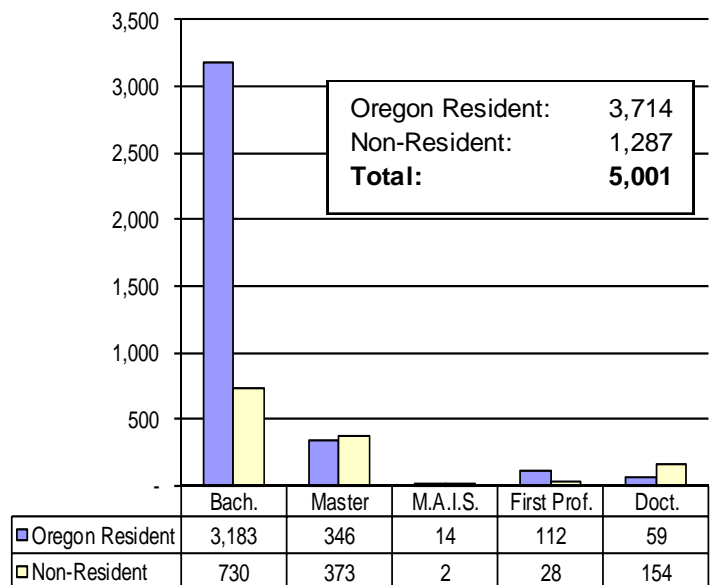

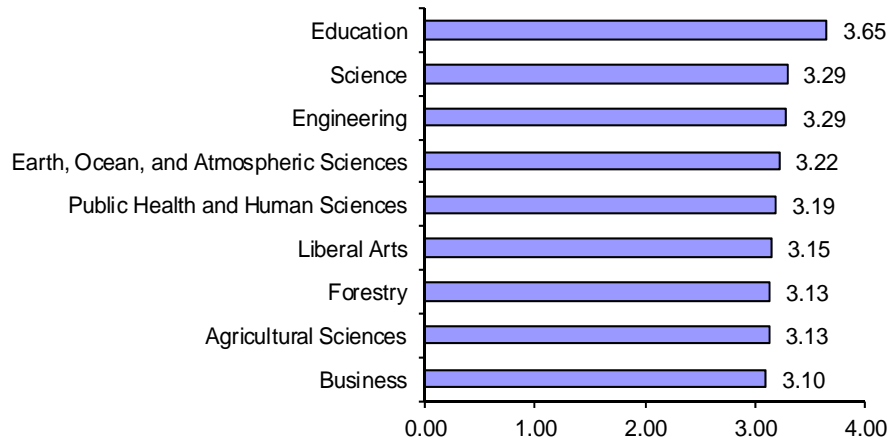

Grade Point Average of Graduates

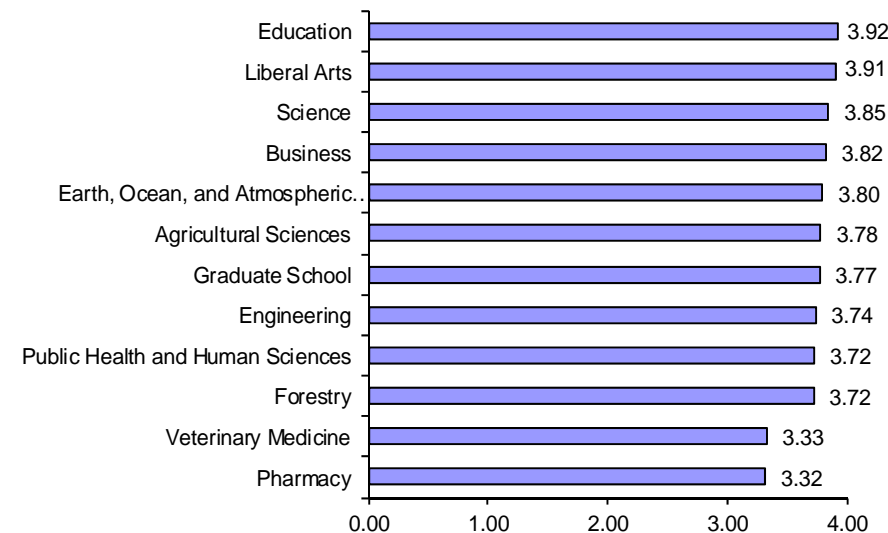

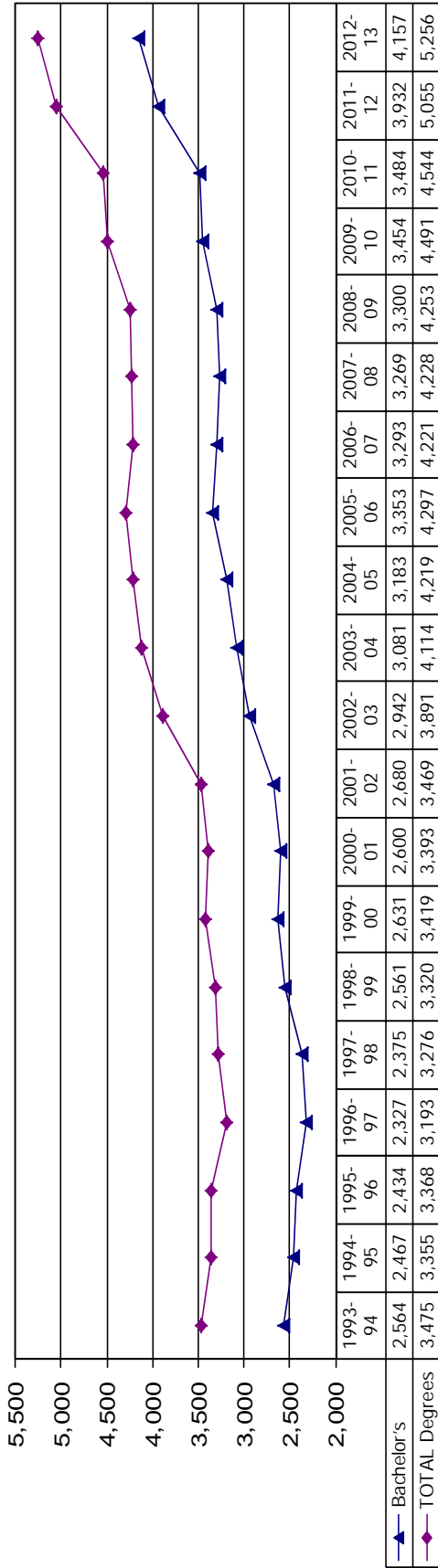
Doctorate and First Professional

Highlights

- The number of degrees awarded during the 2012-13 academic year was 5,256. In all, OSU has awarded 219,316 degrees through 144 annual commencements.
- Compared to 2011-12, the total number of degrees awarded increased by 15.7%. The number of Bachelor degrees increased by 19.3%; First Professional degrees decreased by -.7%; Masters degrees increased by .1%; and Doctoral degrees increased by 22.4%.
- 8 students received three degrees; and 239 students received two degrees.
- The College of Liberal Arts awarded the largest number of degrees (926) when compared to the other academic units.
- The average age for Bachelor, Master, M.A.I.S, First Professional, and Doctorate degree recipients was 25.3, 29.8, 31.0, 28.5, and 35.1, respectively.
- The College of Engineering had the largest percentage of U.S. minority graduates: 17.0%.
- The number of U.S. minority graduates was 830 or 16% of all graduates in 2012-13. More U.S. minority women (438) than men (392) earned degrees in 2012-13 at OSU.
- 74.3% of the graduates were Oregon residents; 25.7% of the graduates were non-residents.

- The grade point average (GPA) for students receiving Bachelor, Master, M.A.I.S, First Professional, and Doctorate degrees was 3.19, 3.71, 3.78, 3.30, and 3.79, respectively.
